All projects in the SYIP that are eligible for federal funding will be included in the Statewide Transportation Improvement Program, which documents how Virginia will obligate its share of federal funds.

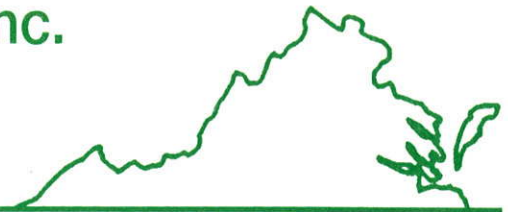

Dear Mr. Bartlett,

In the late 60's, a Cumberland County resident traveled nearly an hour one way to her doctor's appointment in Charlottesville, VA. Frustrated that a simple trip to the doctor could take up a whole day, and realizing that many people in her rural community were unable to get to the doctor at all, Beulah Wiley galvanized others in her community. Together, they were able to win grant funding from the Office of Economic Opportunity to start the first community health center in Virginia; opening in 1970. Since then, Central Virginia Health Services has grown to 14 sites, covering fifteen counties and three cities. Last year, we saw 47,000 patients across the entire organization; over 7,000 patients were seen at CVCHC. 2009 also marked the third consecutive year that we have seen at least a 30% increase in uninsured patients.

2010 marks the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary for Central Virginia Community Health Center, making it Virginia's largest and oldest community health center. To celebrate this milestone, CVCHC will host a "Healthy Birthday" Celebration on August 7<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. This event will kickoff the start of National Community Health Center Week.

We invite to you to attend our opening ceremony at 10:00 a.m. at CVCHC, located in Buckingham County. This will also be a perfect time for you to see the tremendous impact that CVCHC has in the community. There will be a brief, formal opening ceremony at which you are invited to speak. A member of our Development staff will be in contact with your office regarding your attendance plans.
