Supervisor McKay entered the meeting at 3:20 p.m.

Chairman Fore called a 25 minute recess at 4:36 p.m.

Chairman Fore called the meeting back to order at 5:00 p.m. for the purpose of hearing the Presentation of the Prince Edward County Public Schools FY12-13 Proposed Budget.

Dr. K. David Smith, Superintendent of the Prince Edward County Schools, stated there are many variables from the state that will change the school's budget. He stated the School Board focused on priority items and attempted to protect operation functions, core programs and maintain class size.

Ms. Cindy Wahrman, Division Director of Finance, reviewed the Prince Edward County Public Schools FY2012-2013 proposed budget. She concluded by stating the School Board is requesting an increase in Local Support of \$785,334, with a total budget of \$26,132,027.

Discussion followed regarding the changes dependent upon the state budget and the General Assembly.

Supervisor Gantt suggested restructuring existing debt to include costs of upcoming repairs. Dr. Smith stated he will research that option.

Discussion followed regarding the mandate set forth on the payment of the VRS by employees.

Dr. Smith stated the challenges to the FY12-13 budget are the significant budget reductions. He said the reductions in previous years means loss of electives, programs, language instruction in the high school, art and music courses, and is a dangerous downward spiral. He then discussed grant funding.

Notice is hereby given that the Board of Supervisors of Prince Edward County, Virginia, proposes the following tax levies for the tax year 2012:

To determine the amount of tax owed, divide the property's assessed value by 100 then multiply by the appropriate tax rate. Prince Edward County determines the assessed valuation for Machinery & Tools, Merchant's Capital, and all Business Tangible Personal Property tax classifications by taking a percentage of the original cost of the property as shown in the chart below. Real estate is assessed at fair market value. Tangible Personal Property owned by individuals such as vehicles, trailers, motorcycles, etc. are assessed using the National Automobile Dealers Association (NADA) Guide Loan Value.
