At the regular meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Prince Edward County, held at the Court House,

Chairman Fore called the meeting to order. Rev. Calvin Gray, New Jerusalem Baptist Church, offered the invocation.

In Re: Public Participation

Chairman Fore read the Public Participation Policy, adopted at the September 2009 meeting:

Public Participation is a time set aside for citizens to share their thoughts, ideas and concerns. An official

record is made of each person's contribution tonight and will be directed to the County Administrator for

follow-up; any necessary follow-up will be noted and tracked. Follow-up may consist of an immediate

response, or planned action by the County Administrator or Board, or by placement on a future Board

agenda. Tonight's agenda cannot be changed because the public needs advance knowledge of and the

opportunity to review related materials regarding items addressed by the Board. To further assist public

information, the Board requests our Administrator, Attorney or county staff immediately correct any

factual error that might occur.

Jimmy Johnson, President of Downtown Farmville, thanked the Board for working with Downtown Farmville and the Main Street Program. He introduced Helen Person, Executive Director for Downtown Farmville. Ms. Person thanked the Board for its support and for all the assistance given to help enhance life in Prince Edward County and the Town of Farmville.

Sam Campbell, Prospect District, expressed his concern regarding the information presented at the Industrial Development Authority meeting and Prince Edward Development, LLC. He asked the Board not to extend the Agreement concerning the Granite Falls Project until the taxes owed on the Poplar Hill development are paid.

Michele Schumacher, Lockett District, expressed her disapproval of extending the agreement concerning the Granite Falls Project. She requested information on the status of the Granite Falls CDA.

Jack Houghton, Farmville District, spoke in opposition extending the agreement concerning the Granite Falls Project.

Bill Powers, Hampden District, expressed his concern regarding receiving attendant service at the dumpster site in Worsham.

In Re: Board of Supervisors Comments

Supervisor Campbell stated there was a good turnout at the Community meeting at the Prospect Fire Hall on December 3 (2012); the five candidates for Treasurer attended, as did Mr. Kevin Wright of VDOT, to answer questions. He added that on Thursdays through Saturdays, the Prospect dumpster site has excellent help.

Supervisor Cooper-Jones thanked Sam Campbell, Michele Schumacher and Jack Houghton for their investigations into the issues and for being involved.

Chairman Fore stated the results were in from the election for Treasurer; Donna Bowman Nunnally is the Treasurer-Elect.

Supervisor Gantt stated that the road project is all but complete. He said the road, with the underemployment and unemployment currently, will become a commercial artery; he added that successful communities invest in themselves and see infrastructure as opportunities. Supervisor Gantt said the County must work with businesses that have an interest in investing in the community and the schools. The County is seeing improvements in the schools, and asked the Board to find more ways to make opportunities happen. Supervisor Gantt reminded all that the new road offers opportunity.

In Re: FY 13 Budget Amendment

Chairman Fore announced that this was the date and time scheduled for a public hearing on proposed amendments to the FY 13 County Budget related to the Route 786 construction project. Notice of this hearing was advertised according to law in the Friday, November 30, 2012 and Friday, December 7, 2012 editions of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

Mr. Wade Bartlett, County Administrator, stated that the proposed amendment amends the VDOT Revenue Sharing Fund to reflect the receipt of \$1,759,980 in State revenue sharing funds, \$500,000 from the Virginia Department of Transportation, \$1,152,489 from Virginia Resource Authority Series 2011B bonds, and \$255,671 from the Fund Balance of the Revenue Sharing Fund. These funds will be used to pay \$2,062,140 for construction costs, \$171,380 for engineering/inspection services and \$1,434,620 to be transferred to the General Fund to repay for an advance of funds to start the Route 786 project.

Chairman Fore opened the public hearing.

There being no one wishing to speak, Chairman Fore closed the public hearing.

Supervisor Simpson made a motion to approve the FY 13 Budget Amendment and necessary appropriations. Supervisor Wilck questioned the total cost of the project; Mr. Bartlett stated it was approximately \$4 million; almost \$2.3 million came from the Revenue Sharing Program and VDOT and the County's cost has been approximately \$2 million.

Chairman Fore repeated Supervisor Simpson's motion to approve the FY 13 Budget Amendment and appropriate as follows:

In Re: Tri-Boro Rack and Storage Products TROF Grant

Mrs. Sharon Lee Carney, Director of Economic Development, stated Prince Edward County has recently been notified of the Tobacco Commission's award for a Tobacco Regional Opportunity Fund (TROF) grant on behalf of Tri-Boro Rack and Storage Products, LLC in the amount of \$95,000. Tri-Boro Rack was not eligible for Governor's Opportunity Funds (GOF).

The Tobacco Commission will hold Prince Edward County liable for the reimbursement of TROF funds in the event of a failure by Tri-Boro Rack to meet certain performance agreement provisions. To protect the County from any potential "claw-back" implications, Mr. DeMaio has agreed to provide a Letter of Credit or a Performance Bond, suitable to the County, with Prince Edward County as the beneficiary, in an amount equal to the amount of the grant awards. The Letter of Credit or Performance Bond will not be released until the County is released by the Tobacco Commission from any obligation for the TROF funds. All requirements must be met within 36 months, commencing September 30, 2012.

In Re: Granite Falls – Extension of Economic Development Grant Agreement

Mr. Bartlett stated the developer of the Granite Falls Hotel & Conference Center has stated he has

obtained commitments from necessary investors and the bank for financing. The only piece missing to

allow the project to move forward is obtaining an allocation for the New Market Tax Credit Program. It is

anticipated this issue will be resolved early in 2013. The developer, Bob Fowler, will provide additional

information concerning this issue.

To date, the County and the Economic Development office have received no contacts from any

developers or other individuals expressing interest in this property. Staff sees little downside risk in

approving the requested extension, but considerable upside potential if the project moves forward.

Mr. Bartlett stated that a Board decision not to extend the Agreement will result in the developer

abandoning the project. This will effectively eliminate the possibility of the County experiencing an

investment of approximately \$54 million, 140 new jobs and the accompanying tax revenues.

The changes contained in the proposed one-year renewal are:

1. A new paragraph in the recitals clarifying that all previous agreements are terminated.

2. In Section 2.04, an extension of the grant termination date from December 31, 2038 to

December 31, 2039.

3. In Section V, an extension of the agreement termination from December 31, 2038 to

December 31, 2039.

Route 786 Update – Mr. Bartlett stated that representatives of VDOT and the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) conducted an inspection of the new road on November 27, 2012. As of this date the VDOT punch list has not been received. The DCR punch list has been received with work concerning erosion and sediment control required that can be completed in approximately one week; a reinspection was tentatively scheduled for December 10, 2012 by DCR, but has not received any news regarding that inspection.

<u>Court House Roof</u> – Mr. Bartlett advised the Board that Kenbridge Construction has been contacted regarding the courthouse roof; the manufacturer of the shingles has been verified and documentation is being assembled to substantiate our claim of a product defect. Additionally, research and documentation continues regarding the proper installment and any remedies in case it was not.

In Re: Appropriation – Piedmont Regional Jail

Mr. Bartlett stated that the Regional Jail's expenses are exceeding revenues and it is now at the point when the member localities will have to begin paying each month based on inmate population. Expenses and revenues have stabilized and the estimate of total cost for Prince Edward County for the remainder of FY13 will be approximately \$400,000. Currently only \$60,000 is budgeted for that expense. After reviewing collections, certain accounts have been identified whose actual collections already exceed budgeted amounts. Those include Public Service Corporations, Grantee's Recordation Tax (Local), Sale of Land for Delinquent Taxes, Prince Edward Forest, Motor Vehicle Carrier Tax, and Fire Programs. The additional amount for the Fire Programs was due to both Fiscal Years 2012 and 2013 revenues being received in Fiscal Year 2013. Additionally, after reviewing expenses for the Juvenile Detention Center, Mr. Bartlett recommended reducing the amount budgeted by \$30,000. These actions reduce the amount required to be appropriated from the Fund Balance to \$86,000.

Mr. Bartlett stated the Jail is in negotiations to house 100-200 new prisoners from a non-member county which would provide enough funding to take care of this issue.

In Re: Request from Treasurer: Delinquent Tax Sale Properties
