Chairman William G. Fore, Jr. called the meeting to order. Supervisor James C. Moore offered the invocation.

In Re: Public Participation

Chairman Fore said one citizen had signed up to address the Board.

Mr. George Welch, of Buffalo District, said he appeared before the Board previously regarding the Pamplin sewer project. He said he raises beef cattle on a portion of land within the town limits since 1995, and said that portions of his property have been taken. Mr. Welch stated the Town of Farmville surveyed the land, and added that although Pamplin has no municipal sewer, the Town Council met at a public hearing last week at 5:00 p.m. to discuss adoption of a new sewer ordinance. He added the meetings are held during the day and the working class cannot attend, and added that there was no representative from Prince Edward County in attendance. Mr. Welch said that at that Town Council meeting, the sewer ordinance was adopted, which outlaws pasturing cows on land that is in town. He said all of Prince Edward County land within the town limits is zoned agricultural by the County of Prince Edward. He said there are

a number of other significant restrictions placed on the citizens on the east side of the tracks that are not the same as in western Pamplin in Appomattox County. He added that Mr. Craft, a supervisor from Appomattox County, makes a concerted effort to attend the Pamlin Town Council meetings. Mr. Welch said he had a Freedom of Information request for Chairman Fore, regarding the Memorandum of Understanding between Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors and the Appomattox County Board of Supervisors.

In Re: Highway Matters

Chairman Fore stated Alan Leatherwood, Resident Highway Engineer, was unable to attend the Board meeting, but said any comments or questions could be given to staff.

Jonathan Pickett, Director of Planning and Community Development, said a resident in a subdivision in the Prospect district had questioned him about the state taking over the subdivision roads. Mr. Pickett said the state would not take over the road unless it had been built to state standards. He stated there were three problems with the Elam Country Estates Subdivision: 1) it was recorded after a certain date, so the citizens on the road would have to have it built to state specifications for the state to take it over, 2) there is still speculative interest, and 3) there are problems with dedicated right-of-way, and in this case the citizens own to the middle of the road and each citizen would have to give an easement. Mr. Pickett added the citizens would have to pay to have the road brought up to state specifications before the state could consider taking them over.

Mr. Moore said there is a bump in the road on Route 607 which is causing problems. He also thanked VDOT for the repairs on Route 460.

Mr. Pickett also said he received a letter from Bill Hogan regarding the area in Pamplin on Route 460 where accidents have been reported, and he would check with Mr. Leatherwood on that as well.

Chairman Fore said on Route 643, approximately one-half mile from the Town line going west, the road has given away and is lower than the ditch line on the right side.

Mr. Simpson said he received a report that on Germantown Road, the south side of the bridge is giving away, and that on Route 628 by the school crossing, two areas of the roadway were broken.

In Re: Longwood University Master Plan

Mr. Jerry Jerome, Longwood University Campus Master Plan Coordinator, said they are in the process of updating the University's master plan, which are the long-term plans for the physical part of the campus. He said they were seeking comments and concerns from the Board of Supervisors.

Mr. David Harnage, Mosely Architects, said they were hired to look at the physical campus to define a long-term strategy for the evolution and development of the campus, to include an enrollment projection of 5,600 students. He added the process would be based on input from the community in order

to understand the important planning issues. He said the university is an integral part of the community and vice versa, and success for both ingredients comes when solutions are found that mutually aid the institution and community in which it exists. He then asked for advice, counsel and input for the planning process.

Mr. McKay said a major concern would be both pedestrian and automobile traffic to and from the old shopping center [on Main Street].

Mr. Moore asked if the university owns enough property to accommodate the growth, and added his concern that eminent domain not be used to acquire surrounding properties from the residents.

Mr. Harnage said he was unaware of any previous acquisitions, and that there is a recently adopted policy stating they may only obtain property as they go forward with the use of eminent domain.

Mrs. Gilfillan said preserving the historic homes in the High Street and the train station areas is very important. She added the amount of parking areas is a concern, and the increase pavement would affect the character of the area and water drainage. Mrs. Gilfillan added her concerns regarding the Convention Center, and said no one has shown research on there being a market or need for it. She also said the road from the dining hall to Main Street [Madison Street] seemed to impact danger for the students in the crossing, and may need to be closed.

Mr. Harnage said part of their scope would be to look at the traffic and parking issues.

Mr. Jones asked if there were plans to provide a bridge for foot traffic to Lancer Park. Mr. Harnage said the project to create a pedestrian access point as well as a different vehicular access point is active, but he could not provide details at that time.

Mrs. Gilfillan asked if the growth is anticipated to require more rental property, or how much would be dormitory housing and how much would be private housing.

Mr. Harnage said that issue will be studied. He said they will be meeting with 30 different groups to gather information, and would then do the analytical work, and describe issues and alternative strategies. He said this is the very beginning of the process.

Mrs. Gilfillan said the revenue and property tax issues could present a number of alternatives, such as payments in lieu of tax.

Mr. Harnage said there are currently about 4,000 students enrolled at Longwood University, and the enrollment plan is looking long-range, not just next year.

Mr. McKay said the apartments next to the train station crossing will be part of the State Park next year.

Mr. Harnage closed by saying that strong universities have strong, positive impact on the communities.
