- Each Board member shall be allotted an opportunity to speak for a maximum of one (1) minute; unless additional time is yielded by another member of the Board. In the event a Board member or member(s) shall be absent, unallocated time shall not be allocated to Board members in attendance.
- Following each Board member's comment period, the remaining two (2) minutes shall be set aside for appropriate response, and shall be divided equally between those members of the Board wishing to respond, and as directed by the Chairman.

opportunity to review related materials regarding items addressed by the Board. To further assist public

information, the Board requests our Administrator, Attorney or county staff immediately correct any

factual error that might occur.

1 **22**  In Re: Board of Supervisors Comments

Supervisor Campbell inquired about the limit on the real estate tax relief for the elderly. Mr. Wade

Bartlett, County Administrator, said a limit is placed on the total assets for the household; he will contact

the Commissioner of Revenue for details to report to Supervisor Campbell.

Supervisor Wilck stated citizens have expressed concerns regarding the amount that could be

required of the taxpayers if the developer cannot pay the bonds for the debt service [on the Granite Falls

project]. He stated a public hearing is needed in advance of the second vote on the bonds. The developer

has refused to give him the names of his associates and his lending source. He contacted an attorney who

stated as there are taxpayer funds involved, the developer is required to disclose those names so we have

time to vet the people and make sure the lending source is credible.

Supervisor Wilck, seconded by Supervisor Cooper-Jones, made a motion to hold a public hearing

on the funding of the Granite Falls Project four weeks in advance of the second bond vote, and that the

developer be present at the meeting to disclose who his associates are and the lending institution.

Discussion followed on the County's liability for the debt if the bonds fail. Supervisor McKay

asked if a public hearing was already required. Mr. Bartlett stated there already must be a public hearing in

the process; he said the County's bond attorneys and financial advisors will be asked what the timeline will

be.

Chairman Fore restated Supervisor Wilck's motion to hold a public hearing on the Granite Falls

Project four weeks in advance of the second bond vote, and that the developer is present at the meeting to

disclose the associates and lending institution; the motion carried:

#### In Re: Economic Development Department Report

Mrs. Sharon Carney, Economic Development Director, presented an update on the activities of the Prince Edward Economic Development Office from 2004 through April 2012, including active projects, inquiries and grant projects closed out. She stated there has been a marked increase in inquiries regarding business and industries locating to Prince Edward County. She stated the strong support demonstrated by the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors has been the primary reason for the success in acquiring financing and grants for economic development projects, even in tough economic times. She stated the office is working with 12 business and industry recruitment projects and from 2004 through 2010, there have been 42 Enterprise Zone grants totaling over \$3,032,000.

#### In Re: Highway Matters

Mr. Kevin Wright, VDOT, gave a verbal update on the recent activities, including mowing and resurfacing of secondary roadways, and normal maintenance. There is no major construction.

Supervisor Jones stated that on Route 736, trees are over-hanging the road and there are several potholes that need filled. He questioned the funding allotted for snow removal and where it will be used since there was none needed. Mr. Wright stated the funding went to repairs and VDOT was able to continue working through the winter doing surfacing; he added there was not a huge savings.

Supervisor Simpson asked about the status of Scott Drive; Mr. Wright said he has not received information at this time.

Supervisor Campbell reported a large oak tree appears ready to fall on the eastbound lane of Route 460; he added Route 663 is now in very poor shape, down to Rosson Mill; it appears the road is giving away.

Mr. Wright stated slope-clearing is being completed; more clean-up will be done in addition to the trees that have been removed along the highway.

Supervisor Campbell reported that along Route 460 Eastbound, near Dowdy's Corner and the Tuggle Road Bridge, several dead trees have been cut down but not removed.

He said there are two projects currently: Route 643 (Back Hampden-Sydney Road), which is in the design stage; and Route 601 (Aspen Hill Road), which is also in the design stage and is expected to begin construction next spring. He stated there were funds available to develop a new project; the Route 725, Watson Bridge Road, project matched well with the funding available. The project is in draft plan and is expected to begin in June 2015. It is in the draft Plan that the road be added.

There being no one wishing to speak, Chairman Fore closed the Public Hearing.

Chairman Fore explained that in April, the Citizen Committees presented their lists of candidates interested after they had been interviewed. Mr. Bartlett added the Citizen Committees had not met to interview all of the candidates by the April 10 regular meeting date. Discussion followed.

Melvin Reynolds, Jr., stated his reason to serve on the School Board is that change is needed in the schools.

Russell Dove stated he has the passion and commitment to serve all of the students at Prince Edward County Schools.

Virginia Dillard, Leigh District, questioned the process of the School Board appointments; Chairman Fore explained that the Citizen Committee is to interview the nominees and have the task of finding people that qualify for the position. The entire Board of Supervisors has the sole responsibility of appointing the candidate; neither the Supervisor for the district nor the Citizen Committee selects the candidate. Discussion followed.

Virginia Dillard, Donna Pride, Brenda Gray, and Barbara Shepperson spoke in support of Mrs. Fentress.

Craig Reed, Pamela Hurak, Sasha Trent, Kenneth Jackson, Jerry Townsend, and Bemeche Hicks spoke in support of both incumbents, Mrs. Fentress and Mr. Dove.

Brock Robinson stated the School Board needed new members because the schools are failing.

Billy Sublett and Wayne O'Brien expressed their support for Mr. Dove.

Supervisor Gantt stated that many citizens requested change in the schools and that the Prince Edward County Schools are in the bottom five percent in the nation. He stated the mission statement states we have a world class school system but there is a wide difference between expectation and delivery.

Chairman Fore stated that during this public hearing, he broke protocol of allowing only the normal three to five minutes for a citizen to present their opinion, because this is an important issue.

In Re: School Budget Procedures

Mr. Bartlett stated the Board of Supervisors discussed, during its April 26, 2012 meeting, the procedures currently in place for appropriating funds to the schools. There were two major points of discussion; the first was regarding the appropriation of funds annually by Category, as is the current practice, vice appropriating funds in a lump sum. The school desires the funds to be appropriated in a lump sum vice by category. This would allow the School Board greater flexibility in the use of funds and allow a faster response whenever situations arise that would require a shift in funds between categories. Currently, for funds to be moved between categories, the School Board would have to meet and approve such a request from the Superintendent and then request a meeting of the Board of Supervisors to request approval of the same action.

Supervisor Gantt said they should provide the school any relief possible.

Dr. Smith stated passing the first topic provides more flexibility for the School Board. Discussion followed.

Mr. Bartlett then said that the second topic of discussion was to allow the School Board to retain any unspent funds in the School Fund. Current practice is for the General Fund to only provide the exact amount required to balance the School Fund after taking into account the state and federal revenues received and comparing them to the actual expenses, subject to the maximum amount of local funds approved and appropriated by the Board of Supervisors. This request would require the Board of Supervisors to appropriate the entire amount of local funds when all budget items are appropriated, normally during the June Board of Supervisors meeting. While all funds would be appropriated, due to cash flow purposes the funds would not be moved from the General Fund to the Schools fund except on a monthly or quarterly as the Board desires.

At the end of the fiscal year, any funds not expended from the School Fund would be retained in the School Fund. This would allow the School Board flexibility in building the school budget for the next year. If the Board of Supervisors approves this request, it is recommended that the Board of Supervisors requires the School Board to make a specific request for the use of any funds from the fund balance which would require the Board of Supervisors to vote on the request. Mr. Bartlett also recommended such funds only be used for one-time costs such as capital items (equipment or projects costing \$5,000 or greater) until such time as the fund balance accumulates to an amount sufficient enough to allow funding operational expenses during times of economic downturn.

Discussion followed regarding the current practice and the proposed change.

Supervisor Jones questioned the effect it would have if a decision would be delayed until next month; Dr. Smith indicated that he understood this would not apply to the current years' ending balances.

The Board concurred to table this agenda item until the June 12, 2012 meeting.

**FY13 COUNTY BUDGET** 

**Summary:** At its April 26, 2012 meeting the Board of Supervisors approved the County Ordinance setting the 2012 tax rates and the FY13 total County Budget in the amount of \$50,944,692.

Attachment 1 is the annual resolution of appropriations for the County of Prince Edward for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2013. Attachment 2 is the listing of the amount of funds specifically appropriated by the Board of Supervisors by department or fund.

Please note that sections 3, 5 and 13 of attachment 1 require a decision by the Board. The Board of Supervisors has been requested by the School Board to appropriate money to the School fund in a lump sum instead of by category as has been the practice for the last several years.

Additionally, Supervisor Gantt has proposed the School Fund be allowed to maintain a fund balance to be achieved from expenditures being less than the adopted budget. Current practice is to only transfer the exact amount of money from the General Fund to the School Fund required to pay all expenses after deducting revenues received from the state/federal governments and other revenues (tuition, rebates/refunds, recovered costs) identified as revenue from local sources. The result is that all savings have accrued to the General Fund.

To allow a fund balance to accumulate in the School Fund would require the transfer of all funds from the General Fund as budgeted regardless of actual expenditures. In that way any savings would then accrue to the School Fund. To allow proper cash flow management a transfer schedule must be developed. If the Board of Supervisors allows the creation of a fund balance in the School Fund I would recommend for the first six months of the FY (July – December) only the amounts required to balance expenditures in the School Fund be transferred from the General Fund. Then the remaining balance be transferred in equal amounts monthly from January – June or as agreed upon by the Superintendent and County Administrator.

## ANNUAL RESOLUTION OF APPROPRIATION OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2013

A resolution to appropriate designated funds and accounts from specified estimated revenues for FY 2013 for the operating budget and the Capital Improvements Program for the County of Prince Edward and to authorize and empower County officers to expend funds and manage cash assets; and to establish policies under which funds will be expended and managed.

The Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors does hereby resolve on this 12th day of June 2012 that, for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2012, and ending on June 30, 2013, the following sections are hereby adopted:

- Section 1. The cost centers shown on the attached letter labeled FY2012-2013 Appropriations are hereby appropriated from the designated estimated revenues as approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 26, 2012 for FY 2012-2013.
- Section 2. Appropriations, in addition to those contained in this general Appropriations Resolution, may be made by the Board of Supervisors only if deemed appropriate and there is available in the fund unencumbered or unappropriated sums sufficient to meet such appropriations.
- Section 3. All appropriations herein authorized shall be on the basis of cost centers for all departments and agencies and by **Category/Lump Sum** for the Schools.
- Section 4. The Social Services Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. By this resolution the Social Services Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within its respective funds in any amount.
- Section 5. The School Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. Appropriations for the School Board are by <a href="Category/Lump Sum">Category/Lump Sum</a>. By this resolution the School Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within a category. Transfer of funds between categories requires prior Approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 6. The County Administrator is expressly authorized to approve transfers of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within the same Fund with the exception of Constitutional Officers for the efficient operation of government. Transfers into or out of a department of a Constitutional Officer requires prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.

- Section 7. All outstanding encumbrances, both operating and capital, at June 30, 2012\* shall be reappropriated to the FY2013 fiscal year to the same cost center and account for which they are encumbered in the previous year.
- At the close of the fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriations lapse for budget items other than those involving ongoing operational projects, or programs supported by grants or County funds, which must be preapproved by the County Administrator or his designee and submitted to the Board of Supervisors for final approval. Such funds must be applied to the purpose for which they were originally approved.
- Appropriations previously designated for capital projects will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until the completion of the project if funding is available from all planned sources, or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate ordinance, resolution or other action changes or eliminates the appropriation. Upon completion of a capital project, the County Administrator is hereby authorized to close out the project and return to the funding source any remaining balances. This section applies to all existing appropriations for capital projects at June 30, 2012 and appropriations as they are made in the FY 2013 Budget. The County Administrator is hereby authorized to approve construction change orders to contracts up to an increase of \$10,000.00 as long as funds are available from the funding sources and approve all change orders for reduction of contracts.
- Section 10. The approval of the Board of Supervisors of any grant of funds to the County shall constitute the appropriation of both the revenue to be received from the grant and the County's expenditure required by the terms of the grant, if any. The appropriation of grant funds will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until completion of the project or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate action, changes or eliminates the appropriation. The County Administrator may increase or reduce any grant appropriation to the level approved by the granting agency during the fiscal year. The County Administrator may approve necessary accounting transfers between departments and funds to enable the grant to be accounted for in the correct manner. Upon completion of a grant project, the County Administrator is authorized to close out the grant and return to the funding source any remaining balance. This section applies to appropriations for grants outstanding at June 30, 2012 and appropriations in the FY 2013 Budget.
- Section 11. The County Administrator may reduce revenue and expenditure appropriations related to programs funded all or in part by the Commonwealth of Virginia and/or the Federal Government to the level approved by the responsible state or federal agency.
- Section 12. The County Administrator is authorized to make transfers to the various funds for which there are transfers budgeted. The County Administrator shall transfer funds as deemed necessary up to amounts budgeted or in accordance with any existing bond resolutions that specify the matter in which transfers are to be made.
- Section 13. The Treasurer may advance monies to and from the various funds of the County to allow maximum cash flow efficiency. The advances must not violate County bond covenants or other legal restrictions that would prohibit an advance. The Treasurer is authorized and directed to credit all interest received from the investment of all County funds to the

General fund, with the exception of the <u>School Fund (which will be allowed to maintain a fund balance)</u> School Construction Fund, Economic Development Fund, Recreation Fund, Forfeited Assets Fund, Landfill Fund, D.A.R.E. Fund, VDOT Revenue Sharing Fund (non-local money only) and the Piedmont Court Services Fund, wherein all interest earned will be credited to the respective funds.

- Section 14. All procurement activities with funds appropriated herein shall be made in accordance with the County purchasing policy and applicable state statutes.
- Section 15 It is the intent of this resolution that funds be expended for the purpose indicated in the budget; therefore, budgeted funds may not be transferred from operating expenditures to capital projects or from capital projects to operating expenses without the prior approval from the Board of Supervisors. Also, funds may not be transferred from one capital project to another without the prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 16. The County Administrator is authorized, pursuant to State statute, to issue orders and checks for payments where funds have been budgeted, appropriated, and where sufficient funds are available. A listing of vendor payments shall be presented to the Board of Supervisors for information not less frequently than monthly.
- Subject to the qualifications in this resolution contained, all appropriations are declared to be maximum, conditional and proportionate appropriations the purpose being to make the appropriations payable in full in the amount named herein if necessary and then only in the event the aggregate revenues collected and available during the fiscal year for which the appropriations are made are sufficient to pay all the appropriations in full. Otherwise, the said appropriations shall be deemed to be payable in such proportions as the total sum of all realized revenue of the respective funds is to the total amount of revenue estimated to be available in the said fiscal year by the Board of Supervisors.
- All revenues received by an agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board not included in its estimate of revenue for the financing of the fund budget as submitted to the Board of Supervisors may not be expended by said agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board without the consent of the Board of Supervisors being first obtained, and those sums appropriated to the budget. Any grant approved by the Board for application shall not be expended until the grant is approved by the funding agency for drawdown. Nor may any of these agencies or boards make expenditures which will exceed a specific item of an appropriation.
- Allowances out of any of the appropriations made in this ordinance by any or all County departments, commissions, bureaus, or agencies under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors to any of their officers and employees for expense on account of the use of such officers and employees of their personal automobiles in the discharge of their official duties shall be paid at the same rate as that established by the internal revenue service and shall be subject to change by the County Administrator from time to time to maintain like rates.

**Commercial Cannery Operations** 

## Summary:

At the November 17, 2011 meeting, the Board of Supervisors discussed a Feasibility Study proposal evaluating the potential use of the Cannery as a Food Enterprise Center and agreed to consider engaging in a partnership with Homegrown Virginia to have a role in the operation and management of the Cannery based upon the findings of the Feasibility Study. A Preliminary Report on Establishing the Prince Edward Community Cannery as a Center for Production, Marketing, and Education of Value-Added Food Processing serving Virginia Farm-Based Producers was released in April 2012.

Two findings that are particularly related to further consideration of this partnership follow:

A measured demand exists from farm-based producers for services that will help them enter value-added food products businesses. These services may include contract manufacturing on growers' behalf by a qualified co-packing business housed at the cannery. Other services with demand include focused training and education on food entrepreneurship, and collaborative efforts with the state's research universities to provide community outreach and to research commercializing certain farm based production requiring specialized value-added processing;

Adequate raw product supplies can be sourced at either the farm level or the wholesale level for manufacturing of high-acid canned products for wholesale distribution by a business using the cannery's production space. Fixed prices for raw product cannot be determined due to annual and seasonal swings in prices due to weather and other factors. Regardless, the state has many growers willing and able to sell such commodities as apples, peaches, tomatoes, and small fruit for further processing. Most of the growers interviewed have an interest in supplying raw produce to the cannery for further processing into their own branded products. Their goals range from direct retailing canned or jarred products at their roadside stands to entering larger distribution systems serving supermarkets and specialty shops.

The Board recognizes the significant economic impact of a successful food canning establishment and demonstrates this through its commitment to the upgrades at the Cannery. Since embarking on the project, staff has identified significant regulatory requirements, equipment inspections and operations procedures which must be adhered to in order to provide a safe and sanitary processing environment.

The reality of providing a commercial facility is much more involved than simply making equipment available for a grower to utilize; recipes and processes have to be approved by VDACS, critical equipment operation procedures must be followed, sanitation requirements met, and record-keeping requirements need strict attention, to name a few.

During the past two years, the Cannery has not been able to achieve the commercial agri-business development outcomes as quickly as we would have liked. I have determined the current staffing levels and management methods will not allow us to obtain the results we desire. The Preliminary Findings of the Feasibility Study are very encouraging for this project to continue to develop toward a Food Enterprise Center, with focused planning on the facility's improvements and expansion. Certain key fixed-asset improvements and acquisition of a few important pieces of equipment will allow the facility to serve the needs of most farm-based producers with an interest in using the services of the facility. However, to make progress toward the goals of providing a means for local growers to expand into a value-added product line and expand their markets, commercial operations management must be changed at the Cannery.

I believe a more entrepreneurial focus is needed to continue developing the commercial component of the Cannery to reach its full potential as a small scale food business generator and fully utilize this part of Prince Edward County's infrastructure. This can best be achieved by contracting the commercial portion of the Cannery operations to a private entity.

It is estimated that the cost would be offset by \$13,100 presently budgeted in the Cannery Budget for commercial operations.



Bush River 4B (Mountain Creek Lake)

### Summary:

In the past, the Board of Supervisors has determined that the County has an obligation to fulfill the verbal promise to the Jackson Estate of providing a driveway access as close as possible to the edge of Mountain Creek Lake. Previously, in conversation with Mr. Pickett, the Board of Supervisors discussed the project and an estimated cost of \$15,000 to complete the last ½ mile of the driveway was suggested. The first six-tenths of a mile of the driveway was part of the overall construction contract for the lake and is already completed.

At the September 14, 2010 Board of Supervisors meeting, county staff was asked to seek bids to build the access driveway. In May 2012, a Request for Bids was advertised in *The Farmville* Herald and a mandatory pre-bid meeting was conducted at the site on May 17, 2012. Interested contractors were provided with a site plan and asked to provide bids for the construction of a driveway measuring 1300'LF x 10'W x 4"D and a 2,000SF turn-around area using VDOT # 357 gravel, applying erosion and sediment control practices; and provide a project timeline, references, proof of insurance, contractor's license, and Responsible Land Disturber certification. They were also allowed to describe any changes to the project site plan based upon the site visit and include an estimated cost for the proposed changes.

Bids were due May 31. All three bids received range from \$24,000 to \$25,565, which exceeds the proposed cost set in 2010. All three bidders have been verbally asked to provide an addendum to the bid based on an allowance of 250tons of gravel for the 800LF section of driveway and turn-around area and providing a cost-per-ton unit price for overages; due by COB Friday, June 8. Staff recommends that a 10% increase on the estimated cost be considered by the Board for gravel overages because of the soil types and conditions where the driveway will be constructed. One bid estimates up to three weeks to complete the work following a two week notice, another estimates four weeks beginning June 25, and one provided no timeline.







UTILITY LINE CONSTRUCTION

**Summary:** Various Supervisors have expressed interest in obtaining cost estimates to construct water and sewer lines running parallel to the new Route 786. The premise is the construction of such a line would be more economical now when the road is being built than later. Such lines could foster development of the land the County purchased from Glad Hill and the remaining Glad Hill Property depending on where the lines would be located.

I obtained cost estimates from two engineering firms to run a 12 inch water line along Route 786 with three options, all such options assume the water line would commence from the existing line near Highway 15. Option A – run the line midway through the Glad Hill Property. The engineering cost of such a line is estimated at \$20,000 - \$30,000 with a construction of \$100,000 - \$120,000. Option B – run the line to the entrance of Granite Falls. The engineering cost would be \$50,000 - \$60,000 with a construction cost of \$350,000 - \$400,000. Option C – run a line to the intersection of 786 and 628. The engineering cost would be \$60,000 - \$70,000 with a construction cost of \$400,000 - \$70,000 with a construction cost of \$400,000 - \$500,000.

The preferred method of constructing sewer lines is to build gravity lines versus force mains due to the long-term maintenance and operational costs associated with the pump station required with a force main. Since no plans currently exist to develop the property along Route 786 it is impossible to ascertain the proper elevations for a gravity sewer line. I would not recommend the construction of sewer lines at this time.

The current elevations appear to show the most economical option to provide sewer service to the eastern most portion of the Glad Hill property that the County purchased would be a gravity line running east to the Granite Falls project then tying into the line serving Granite Falls that then empties into the existing pump station. This would require the upsizing of the sewer line serving Granite Falls. It is estimated the engineering cost of that project would be \$5,000-\$6,000 with an increase in construction cost of \$30,000 - \$40,000. The engineering and construction cost of a sewer line running from route 786 to the Granite Falls project would be \$300,000 - \$350,000.

**Recommendation:** Determine which options are of greatest interest, if any, and authorize a change order to the current contract with Hurt & Profitt to complete the engineering. This would not obligate the County to expend any funds on construction but would provide a better cost estimate at which time a decision could be made.

Rt. 786 Update

**Summary:** The project is slightly ahead of schedule and in budget except for inspection, which is discussed below. Storm water structures have been completed, rough grading is nearing completion, in the next two weeks installation of the stone base, under drains and curbs will commence. Movement of the electrical lines has commenced and all utilities should be moved in the next two months. Once the underground utilities are relocated work will commence on the Highway 15 portion of the project.

During the Board of Supervisors meeting on February 14, 2012, the Board appropriated \$3,694,600 for the 786 project. This amount consisted of \$2,677,477 for construction, \$572,541 for property acquisition, \$160,000 for inspection, \$2,088 for utility relocation and \$282,494 in contingency. Final cost for property acquisition will exceed the budgeted amount by \$44,720 which will be expended from the contingency.

Due to a change in inspection requirements by VDOT for the construction of Rt. 786, it is anticipated the inspection cost will increase by \$120,000. This increase will be deducted from the contingency. After deducting the funds required for the property acquisition and the inspection a total of \$117,774 will be left in the contingency.

When H&P developed cost estimates in 2010, VDOT had previously allowed part-time inspection on Locally Administered Revenue Sharing funded projects and H&P developed their fees based on this understanding. The part-time inspection fee of \$100,000 was covered under H&P's original fee proposal. With the addition of the work on the intersection an additional \$60,000 was budgeted for inspection bringing the total to \$160,000 as appropriated in February 2012. VDOT is now requiring full-time inspection causing an increase of \$120,000 for a total final inspection cost of \$280,000.

A review of the contract with H&P found the need to approve a change order increasing the cost from the original amount of \$100,000 by \$180,000 to \$280,000, which includes the \$60,000 for the intersection which had already been appropriated and the \$120,000 listed above which will be expended from the contingency.

1. The Scope of Services currently authorized to be performed by Engineer in accordance with the Agreement and previous amendments, if any, is modified as follows:

#### **Full Time Construction Inspection Services:**

The initial scope of work covered under our fee proposal included a lump sum fee of \$100,000.00 for part time inspection of the construction of Alternate Route 628. At that time our team member for inspection work NXL, Inc. had performed part time inspection services on Locally Administered projects that VDOT had accepted. Unfortunately since that time there have been some changes within VDOT and the Local Assistance Program. The current requirement is that the project be inspected as if it were a VDOT project. This requires that we add considerable manpower to the construction inspection of the project in order to meet VDOT's requirements.

This change, in addition to the increased scope of the project from the inclusion of the turn lanes on US Route 15, has resulted in an increased cost for the Resident Project Representative Services. In an effort to minimize the impact of this change, we propose to change from a Lump Sum of method of payment for these services, as set up in the current contract, to a standard hourly rate plus expenses.

2. For the additional Services or the modifications to services set forth above, Owner shall pay Engineer the following additional or modified compensation:

#### **Full Time Construction Inspection Services:**

The original contract amount was a lump sum of \$100,000, which will be increased by \$180,000 to an amount of \$280,000.00 billed at standard hourly rates plus expenses. This estimated amount is based on the construction being completed by November 30, 2012.

i-Flow Grant

Summary: Since the May Board meeting, the County was approached by the Piedmont Soil and Water Conservation District about participating with them in a grant application to the Virginia Dam Safety, Flood Prevention & Protection Assistance Fund. The purpose of the grant would be to help fund and install "i-flow" devices at one or more of the watershed dams in the County for public safety purposes. An "i-flow" is a monitoring device which consists of water level and precipitation station equipment. The grant application proposes that one be installed on three (3) High Hazard Dams and one (1) Significant Hazard Dam in Prince Edward County. Sandy River Reservoir (Bush #12) is owned by Prince Edward County and three dams (Buffalo #4, Buffalo #5 and Bush #4B) are owned by Piedmont Soil & Water Conservation District (PSWCD) with Prince Edward County being a co-sponsor. All sites have staff gages installed that requires a person on site to read the gage and monitor conditions. IFLOWS are needed on these dams because either access to monitor the dams in a storm event is unsafe and/or loss of life and property due to dam overtopping or flooding could occur.

This is a 50/50 matching grant and the application was due June 1. The application requests funding for four i-flow systems, which would total \$86,120 (\$43,060 – state, \$43,060 – local); however, due to the limited amount of state funding, we do not anticipate the grant being fully funded.

I have attached a copy of the grant application. No Board action is required at this time. After grant awards are announced, the Board will wish to consider if it wishes to pursue, in partnership with the District, the installation of i-flow devices on one or more of the higher hazard dams in the County.

**Description of Project:** Grant funds will provide IFLOW monitoring devices on three (3) High Hazard Dams and one (1) Significant Hazard Dam in Prince Edward County. Sandy River Reservoir (Bush

#12) is owned by Prince Edward County and three dams (Buffalo #4, Buffalo #5 and Bush #4B) are owned by Piedmont Soil & Water Conservation District (PSWCD) with Prince Edward County being a co-sponsor. All sites have staff gages installed that requires a person on site to read the gage and monitor conditions. IFLOWS are needed on these dams because either access to monitor the dams in a storm event is unsafe and/or loss of life and property due to dam overtopping or flooding could occur. The IFLOW system consists of water level and precipitation station equipment, FCC licensing, installation, calibration and one year maintenance of the system. It also includes a radio repeater (site inspection to determine if signal is sufficient) and MT-IV monitoring software for emergency services management and dam owners. Computer hardware is provided by the users.

### Prince Edward County Owned Dam:

Sandy River Reservoir Bush #12, Inventory #14735, classified as High Hazard and located in the eastern part of Prince Edward County, was constructed in the 1980's to serve multiple purposes including providing a public water supply and recreational facilities for the citizens of the county as well as constituting an integral part of the flood control project for the Bush River Watershed. The reservoir is a 740 acre lake and the impoundment is 3 miles from US 460, a major highway in Southside Virginia. The flood inundation study and mapping has been completed and the modeling shows 80 miles of potential impact areas downstream, with the end of the breach flood area located approximately 1 mile upstream of Lake Chesdin headwaters. Within the potential flood area, 10 bridge crossings (including US 460 and US 360), 44 addresses, and over 1200 parcels of property could be affected. While there is easier access to the lake for monitoring, the potential for major flooding, loss of lives, and property is catastrophic.

### **PSWCD Owned Dams:**

Buffalo #4 Spring Creek Dam, Inventory # 14703, classified as High Hazard, is located on Spring Creek in the western part of Prince Edward County in the Buffalo Creek watershed. The location is the most western point for the series of dams in the Buffalo Watershed and is the largest impoundment (70 acres) in the watershed. A residence is located approximately 100 yards from the outlet pipe of the dam. Upstream of the dam is an industrial waste pond that served a former mining operation that discharges into the lake. The area has been reclaimed. The impoundment, owned by Kyanite Mining Corporation, has auxiliary spillway capacity to meet a 100 year storm event. Access to the staff gage and lake would require entering the site from the downstream side of the dam. In addition to the residence that would be flooded, overtopping of six secondary roadways would occur. Additional flooding of US 15/460 Business (West Third Street, a primary roadway in the Town of Farmville) could occur and inundate commercial structures. Third Street is a primary thoroughfare to the Centra Southside Hospital.

Buffalo #5 Buffalo Creek Lake, Inventory Number 14707, is located on Morris Creek in the western part of Prince Edward County in the Buffalo Creek watershed. Access to the staff gage and lake would require entering the site from the downstream side of the dam. This dam has been classified as Significant Hazard due to the overtopping of several secondary roadways and possible flooding of US15/460 Business (West Third Street) in Farmville.

The Buffalo watershed dams were installed in the 1960's to provide flood control and, after the recent completed inundation studies, were reclassified as High and Significant Hazard. Buffalo #4 & #5 are part of the 9 flood control structures for the Buffalo Creek Watershed. Installing a remote monitoring device on 2 structures in the Buffalo watershed would give the dam owners and emergency services

staff, an indication of possible rising water levels during storm events at the other 7 sites in the Buffalo watershed. The additional seven sites are classified as Significant Hazard. The FEMA Flood Insurance Study provides detailed information for the downstream reach of Buffalo Creek at the confluence of the Appomattox River in Farmville. The downstream flow conditions in the Buffalo Creek are significantly influenced by coinciding peak flows in the Appomattox River. Dam overtopping will exacerbate the flooding in this area (US15/460 Business Third Street, Farmville).

Bush #4B Mountain Creek Lake, Inventory #14741, is located on Mountain Creek in the eastern part of Prince Edward County in the Bush River watershed. Access to the 100 acre lake is by a forest service road approximately 1 mile long. It is most probable that the road would not be accessible due to the many trees that would fall in a storm. The inundation study for this dam is in the process of being performed. It is expected to be reclassified as High Hazard as was the case with the 4 other dams located in the Bush River watershed. The High Hazard classification is due to possible flooding that would inundate areas of US 460 (a major highway), several secondary roads in Prince Edward County, and several commercial structures.



Dear Members of the Board of Supervisors:

After lengthy discussions with the Sheriff's Department, the Commonwealth's Attorney, the Animal Warden, and the County Administrator's office, we are dismayed to find that there is presently no ordinance in effect in Prince Edward County to protect citizens from nuisance barking. My family is asking that the Board of Supervisors consider a nuisance law in subdivisions within Prince Edward County in order to address the torment we continue to endure.

My family resides in Hunter's Ridge, a platted subdivision in Rice where we have lived happily since 2001. However, over the past few years we have suffered interruptions of normal life undertakings by neighboring dogs who bark at any activity in our yard and at other environmental stimuli. Not only does the barking inhibit our outside activities, but the noise is often audible inside our home waking us and our house guests from sleep in the early morning hours or impeding study and online course work. We have documented nearly 50 instances of sustained barking of over 20 minutes and over 100 total events over the past three years. We have lacked the energy to document all experiences.

We cannot partake in normal activities inside or outside of our home without intrusion. We are held hostage by a pack of dogs. Even our beagle is relegated to one side of our yard. As a result of this continued nuisance, our quality of life has deteriorated. We are also gravely concerned about the possible adverse impact on property value and our ability to resell should we need or want to relocate. We respectfully request that you protect us and other citizens of Prince Edward County who may suffer emotional stress from similar plight.

We are unavailable to address the Board in public participation until August 2012; however, we respectfully request that you consider limiting disturbances caused by dogs in subdivided housing areas where dwellings are considerably closer to one another.

SERVICE CHARGE IN LIEU OF REAL PROPERTY TAXATION

### Summary:

Section 58.1, Chapter 34 of the *Code of Virginia* authorizes localities to impose service charges on otherwise tax exempt property. In 1981, the General Assembly restricted the use of the service charge on real estate owned by the Commonwealth to only those localities where such property – excluding state owned hospitals, educational institutions, roadway property or property held for future roadway construction – exceeds 3% of the value of all real estate located within the locality. That is a very high hurdle to clear and for Prince Edward County would require the state to own real estate valued at approximately \$57,566,678 excluding the property defined above.

County staff has begun the slow tedious process of determining if this threshold can be met in order to levy a service charge on real estate owned by the Commonwealth. Work completed to date has determined approximately 660 tax parcels must be examined to determine which parcels can be used to meet the 3% threshold. The County Attorney and the Commissioner of Revenue are providing substantial assistance in this project.

Currently, both Longwood University/Real Estate Foundation and Hampden-Sydney College are paying real estate taxes on some of the land they own. The Commissioner of the Revenue is researching. Additionally, the County Attorney is researching the *Code of Virginia* to determine the appropriate legal interpretations of the specific *Code* sections that apply to Prince Edward County, and if previous Attorney General opinions and/or court decisions on the correct interpretation have been made either by Attorney General or actual court cases.

### Summary:

The Personnel Committee met on May 30, 2012. The Committee comprises of Supervisor Simpson – Chair, Supervisor Campbell and Supervisor Wilck. Also present was County Administrator Wade Bartlett.

The Committee reviewed a request by the Clerk of Circuit Court to increase the salary for the Clerk's Chief Deputy. The request was to increase the salary from the current amount of \$46,286 which equates to a grade 16 step 7 to \$49,945 or a grade 16 step 10. The Clerk based the request on the fact that the work load of the Chief Deputy has increased since the resignation of the administrative associate for the Circuit Court Judge. When the administrative associate resigned the workload fell onto the Chief Deputy. Additionally, due to the vacancy of the judgeship new tasks are being performed by the Chief Deputy that never had to be performed when there was a sitting judge. These new tasks involve the coordination of the various Circuit Judges that now preside in Farmville with each other, the Commonwealth Attorney and the Sheriff, and the delivery of various documents to the appropriate judges. Attachment 1 contains a list of duties of the Chief Deputy prior to the resignation and the additional duties added.

Upon review of the position it was found that the Clerk's Chief Deputies salary was not in line with the salaries of the Chief Deputies of the Sheriff and Commonwealth's Attorney. When compared to the Constitutional Officer the Chief Deputies of the Sheriff and Commonwealth's Attorney are both approximately 59% of the amount of the respective Constitutional Officer. The Chief Deputy of the Clerk is only at 43% of the Clerk's salary.

The total net increase, when including benefits, would increase personnel cost by \$4,769. The Clerk is willing to reduce the budget for Repairs and Maintenance by an equivalent amount to make this request revenue neutral in the FY13 budget. When the Clerk's budget is constructed it is not known if the state will provide and Technology Trust Fund (TTF) money to the localities. Thus, this line item contains enough funds to pay all necessary costs without any TTF funding. Since the budget was approved we have learned TTF funds will be approximately the same as the current FY. This will allow the decrease in the Repairs and Maintenance line to ensure this action is revenue neutral in FY13.

The Committee voted 2-0 to approve the request. Chairman Simpson abstained

Dear Bobby,

I have received a copy of a letter from a Ms. Schumacher regarding the Granite Falls project. The letter makes many false assertions and comes to several incorrect conclusions. It appears that Ms. Schumacher wasn't even a resident of the County until 2009 so she seems hardly competent to opine on events occurring prior to that. Below are some of my comments regarding the contents of the letter.

- The Poplar Hill project was conceived and promoted by a group of local businessmen and community leaders. The County's only involvement in that project was creating the Poplar Hill CDA at the request of the Poplar Hill landowner. Three private development entities undertook the residential component and the CDA pursued the golf and hotel/conference center. After creating that CDA, the County had no involvement in that project's development efforts.
- The Poplar Hill CDA Project, as we all know, is just a golf course. A conference center
  was originally planned but never financed or constructed. It was not my project, but my
  firm did serve as financial advisor to the CDA from 2000 to 2007 and assisted in
  arranging the financing for the golf course.
- There is no correlation between the success or failure of a golf course/residential project and a hotel /conference center project. The golf course's financial feasibility was based in part on the residential development of the surrounding lands and development of a hotel/conference center, both of which would have augmented local golf play. As we are all painfully aware, neither the residential nor hotel/conference center projects were ever developed.
- Since 2000, a variety of hospitality experts have examined the Farmville area and have unanimously opined that a hotel/conference center in the County would be successful.
   In 2001 as the Poplar Hill CDA pursued development of its hotel, there were many in the community who questioned whether there was sufficient demand in the Farmville area

to support additional hotels. One only has to look at the success of the Hampton Inn which opened in 2005 to receive that answer.

- I am not aware of the conference center referred to by Ms. Schumacher. The 252-room Hilton Hotel and Conference Center opened in Short Pump in 2010. Also, the Westin Hotel at Reynolds Crossing recently undertook a major expansion of its meeting space. The Boars Head Inn and Conference Center in Charlottesville recently undertook a major renovation and expansion of its meeting space. To my knowledge all of these hotel/conference centers are a success.
- The County is not being asked to fund the "reserve fund", they are being asked to replenish it if there is a draw and the Hotel fails to replenish the fund. The Bonds are being repaid from taxes, not net revenues of the hotel. Most of the taxes (transient occupancy & food/beverage) are paid by customers of the hotel, not the hotel itself.
- Anyone who follows the hospitality industry knows that room and occupancy rates vary annually depending, among other things, general economic conditions. In Farmville, the Great Recession caused room revenues to drop. Revenues in 2008 and 2009 dropped from 2007 levels. In 2010 and 2011 revenues increased over 2009 levels. If the same rate of increase occurs for 2012, room revenues should reach the levels achieved in 2007.
- It appears that Ms. Schumacher's entire legal career was a corporate attorney for an insurance company in New Jersey. The practice of municipal securities law is a specialty and there is no indication that she has any experience in municipal securities law.
- If there is a draw on the reserve and the Hotel and any of Granite Falls' lenders or investors fail to replenish during the following 6 months, the County would be asked to replenish the draw. The Board of Supervisors sitting at the time of the request will have to agree to appropriate the replenishment. This "subject to appropriation" caveat is the difference between the County's "general" and "moral obligation".
- There is no basis for the contention that the County's moral obligation to replenish will result in higher property taxes. Six months after a County replenishment, the County can conduct a tax sale of the Hotel. The Hotel is currently appraised at \$27 million upon completion of construction. The proceeds from the tax sale will first be applied to reimburse the County for its replenishment. In addition, the County will be receiving a portion of the incremental taxes generated by the Hotel. Initially, the County's annual share of incremental taxes is estimated to approximate \$300,000.
- The plan of finance calls for the CDA bonds will be issued only after the Hotel equity and debt is in place. I doubt that the Hotel financings will close if those lenders and investors believe that it is "a project doomed to fail from the start". There seems to be

a misconception that the County will proceeds with issuing the Bonds and building the conference center if the Hotel were not financed at the same time.

• A preliminary limited offering memorandum (LOM) is one of the documents that will be presented for preliminary approval at the next CDA board meeting. This is a roughly 400 page document with detailed information on the Project, the Bonds, the Financing Plan, the Special Assessments, the Developer and the Landowner. The Bond Underwriter and its counsel will prepare the LOM and determine the content of disclosure. The LOM will disclose potential risk factors, one of which being the County "appropriation risk" and will include a copy of the independent Appraisal Report on the hotel.

I hope this letter helps correct the false statements, conclusions and inaccuracies contained in Ms. Schumacher's letter.

Prince Edward County's adoption of the Commonwealth Regional Council Hazard Mitigation Plan dated February 14, 2012 has been received by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The plan is now approved with the receipt and acceptance of the formal adoption resolution. As such, Prince Edward County is now eligible to apply for federal disaster assistance until the Commonwealth Regional Council Hazard Mitigation Plan expires on April 30, 2017.

We reviewed the plan based on the criteria contained in 44 Code of Federal Regulations (CFR), Part 201, as authorized by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000 (DMA2K). These criteria address the planning process, risk assessment (including hazard identification), mitigation strategy and plan maintenance process requirements.

The Commonwealth Regional Council Hazard Mitigation Plan received a "satisfactory" rating for all required criteria. However, the DMA2K also includes a provision to encourage communities to continuously strive to improve their plans and resulting mitigation actions. Therefore, the plan must be reviewed, revised if appropriate, and resubmitted for approval within five years of the initial approval date of April 30, 2012 in order to continue to be eligible for federal disaster assistance.

We encourage you to participate in the expansion and documentation of the plan's assessment and analysis of mitigation measures. We also encourage you to follow the schedule for regular evaluation, updating, and monitoring, and have enclosed a list of specific recommendations for improving the plan.

I commend you for your dedication demonstrated in preparing and adopting a strategy to reduce future disaster losses.

### Recommendations for Improvements Local Hazard Mitigation Plan Virginia – Region III

Commonwealth Regional PDC, Prince Edward County, Virginia Hazard Mitigation Plan

- 1. The lowest floor elevation of the most vulnerable structures could be determined and kept as an annex to the plan.
- 2. The planning committee should consider using social media outlets to obtain additional public participation in the next updated plan.
- 3. A complete analysis of the NFIP in each jurisdiction should be included in the next plan update. Items to consider include: how new construction is inspected to ensure compliance with the local floodplain ordinance, how residents and others are assisted with mapping questions, how violations are dealt with.
- 4. Vulnerability described in potential dollar losses for flood is noted as a high priority for each jurisdiction. The planning committee should require each jurisdiction to provide this data. This information should be included in the next plan update.
- 5. A thorough reporting on the progress to implement mitigation projects should be included in the next updated plan.
- 6. The committee should consider developing additional mitigation strategies and include these new strategies in the next plan update.

The SCWIB is applying for a \$50,000 incentive grant to hire a facilitator for a strategic planning process for the WIB area. The process would help identify local occupations in demand in real time as defined by local employers and economic development directors. Ms. Crowder has requested that the CRC serve as a Partner in the program by having the Acting President/CEO participate in planning sessions and assist in notifying localities of participation in the process. This would allow the SCWIB to count time spent as an in-kind contribution by the CRC towards to grant request. Ms. Hickman stated only staff time would be utilized as the in-kind contribution towards the project. Ms. Hickman stated the request was received on April 25<sup>th</sup> with the SCWIB needing an answer by Friday, April 27, 2012.

Ms. Hickman stated she had contacted the CRC Executive Committee to request authorization to approve the request for staff time in-kind contribution towards the SCWIB project due to the time constraints. The Executive Committee unanimously approved the request.

**Report on Chief Administrative Officers Meeting:** Ms. Hickman stated a copy of the Chief Administrative Officers meeting agenda was provided in the Council packet for information.

### **Old Business**

### **President & Staff Reports:**

**Status Report – CRC Charter Amendments-Attorney General Opinion:** Ms. Hickman stated the CRC had not received any additional information as of this date.

**May Presentations of CRC FY10-11 Annual Report:** Ms. Hickman stated the staff will be wrapping up the Annual Report presentations in the month of May. Ms. Hickman stated she will be attending Town Council meetings in Dillwyn and Blackstone in May of 2012.

**Status –CRC FY 12-13 Budget Request:** Ms. Hickman stated FY 12-13 Budget Requests have been sent to all current CRC member entities as well as Nottoway County, the Town of Farmville, Town of Blackstone, Longwood University and Hampden-Sydney. Ms. Hickman stated she had not received a response from Hampden-Sydney, Farmville or Blackstone concerning the request. Ms. Hickman clarified with Mr. Wingold that the CRC's budget request was in Lunenburg County's budget. Ms. Hickman stated localities are in different stages of approving their budgets for the upcoming fiscal year.

**Update on CRC Rural Transportation Planning Program:** Ms. Foster reported as part of the Rural Planning Program, VDOT has requested the CRC host a Road Project Ride Along Day in the district. Ms. Foster stated staff reviewed the CRC's Projects of Regional Significance that was adopted on February 2, 2012 to select three projects that were representative of the region for the event. The projects selected were: 1) VA Primary 307 (Amelia, Nottoway & Prince Edward), 2) VA Secondary 610 (Cumberland & Buckingham) and 3) VA Primary 40 (Lunenburg & Charlotte). Participants invited would include a County staff or Board member, CTB member (covering this area), VDOT Resident Administrator, and a CRC Staff member. Ms. Foster stated the day-long event would take place on May 17, 2012. Ms. Foster stated it is hoped that by having a site visit to locations that includes locality representatives, VDOT and CTB members; relationships could be built to understand the problems/solutions first hand.

**Status of CRC Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update:** Mr. Fortune stated all of the localities have adopted Resolutions of approval of the CRC Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update. The Update has been submitted to FEMA for final approval. Once final approval from FEMA has been received, the project will be closed out.

**Submission of Town of Victoria Recreational Trail Grant Application:** Mr. Fortune stated the CRC submitted, on behalf of the Town of Victoria, a Recreational Trail Grant to the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation. The Town is requesting funds to expand the Town's Trail network towards the Lunenburg Airport. The ultimate goal, once the entire network is completed, is to connect to the Tobacco Heritage Trail near the Airport. The Town is requesting \$55,000 in funds, with the grant program requiring an 80/20 match.

**Council Member Comments:** There were none.

### **New Business**

### **President & Staff Reports**

**CRC Contract Amendment-Town of Victoria Safe Routes to School Project:** Mr. Fortune stated due to unavoidable delays in the project it has become necessary to request an extension of the CRC's contract with the Town of Victoria to provide administrative and technical assistance services for the Town of Victoria's Safe Routes to School Project. Mr. Fortune stated the CRC is requesting that the

contract be extended for twelve months. Ms. Stish moved and Mr. Wingold seconded to authorize Ms. Hickman to sign all necessary documents to extend the CRC's contract with Victoria for the Safe Routes to School project. Motion carried.

**2012 Tentative VDOT Enhancement Allocations FY13:** Mr. Gilliam stated enclosed in the Council members packet is a listing of Tentative VDOT Enhancement Allocations for FY2013. Mr. Gilliam stated three projects were listed from the region including the following: Buckingham Streetscape Project, Town of Farmville, Robert Russa Moton Museum Project, and the Town of Dillwyn Streetscape Project. Ms. Hickman noted the CRC assisted the Town of Dillwyn and Buckingham County in applying for funds. The CRC did not assist the Town of Farmville in applying for funds for the Moton Museum project; however the CRC did submit a proposal for grant administration.

**Governor's Announcement-Submission of Phase II Chesapeake Bay Watershed Implementation Plan:** Ms. Hickman stated the CRC assisted impacted localities within PD 14 in January 2012 in gathering information for the submission of the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Implementation Plan. Ms. Hickman stated the State has announced a 60-day public comment period on the submitted Phase II Chesapeake Bay Watershed Implementation Plan that will run through May 31<sup>st</sup>. Ms. Hickman stated localities in the CRC region that are affected by the Chesapeake Bay include: Amelia, Buckingham, Cumberland, Nottoway and Prince Edward.

**Virginia Association of Planning District Commission (VAPDC) Survey:** Ms. Hickman stated she sent each CRC member a notification of a survey the VAPDC is conducting to request input from stakeholders for a Strategic Plan. Ms. Hickman stated this was just a reminder for council members to complete the survey.

**Council Member Comments: None** 

**Commonwealth Intergovernmental Review Process:** Ms. Foster stated the CRC received two CIRPs for review after the packet had been mailed and requested that review on the following:

- DEQ/Yogaville Reissuance of VPDES Permit for Satchidananda Ashram Yogaville WWTP
- DEQ/Dillwyn-Reissuance of VPDES Permit for Buckingham County Water System/Dillwyn STP

Council provided Level One, no comment on listed CIRPs.
