# Summary:

The Board of Supervisor and the Planning Commission will conduct a JOINT Public Hearing on June 9, 2015 to consider a request from Ellington Energy Services, Inc. to permit the installation of one internally lighted free-standing sign with LED digital display located at 3810 West Third Street on Tax Map Parcel 022-A-70A1 owned by Cheun Hampton. The parcel is located in the C1, General Commercial District; the installation of the internally lighted signs requires a Special Use Permit.

# **Special Use Permit:**

The County has received a special use permit application to permit the installation of one internally lighted free-standing sign with LED digital display located at 3810 W. Third Street on Tax Map Parcel 022-A-70A1.

The free-standing sign will be approximately 40 square feet in area and 22 feet in height and will replace the existing free-standing sign if approved.

The property is currently being used as a convenience store which is an allowed use in the C1, General Commercial District. Section 3-104.11 of the Prince Edward County Zoning Ordinance permits internally lighted signs by Special Use Permit.



- Following each Board member's comment period, the remaining two (2) minutes shall be set aside for appropriate response, and shall be divided equally between those members of the Board wishing to respond, and as directed by the Chairman.

### In Re: Re-Appropriation of Prospect Depot Grant Funds

Mr. Bartlett stated that after many months of developing the plans for the Prospect Depot and obtaining comments from the various government agencies involved, the Prospect Depot was finally put out to bid in December 2013. Unfortunately, the bid prices came in drastically over budget. Due to grant guidelines, negotiations with the lowest bidder were not acceptable, resulting in the building design having to be reworked.

Mr. Bartlett said a proposal was submitted to change the scope of work for the Depot. Due to the non-existence of remaining artifacts of the original building as a result of a devastating fire, the change in

the scope of work would allow for the building to be reconstructed with traditional modern materials instead of historically accurate materials and design.

In order to change the scope of work of the proposed design and materials, the concept needed to be approved by several agencies: Prospect Historical Society; VDOT; Tobacco Commission; Department of Conservation & Recreation (DCR): Bureau of Capital Oversight Management (BCOM); Department of Historic Resources (DHR) and lastly the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). Finally, the scope of work change request, along with an outline of the proposed changes, was submitted by VDOT to the FHWA on April 9, 2015. Currently the County is awaiting authorization to proceed from FHWA.

Completion is anticipated for no later than June 30, 2016. As of this date, the following funds are still available:

As of April 21, 2015, Prince Edward County is currently up to date on all outstanding reimbursements. There is one invoice still outstanding to CJMW Architects in the amount of \$11,734.44 for 60% plan revision for inclusion in the scope of work outline submittal.

Prince Edward County has not committed any County funds to be expended for this project. It is still not expected to require any County funds. The action required is revenue neutral to Prince Edward County.

Supervisor Timmons asked if a schedule for the project was available. Mrs. Sharon Carney, Director of Economic Development, stated there is no set schedule due to the various agency approvals. After some discussion, it was determined the project could begin building in the fourth quarter of this year.

Supervisor Gray introduced Darin Thomas; Mr. Thomas stated he has the same concerns as the Board, adding that "one person can stir the pot, but they can't do it themselves."

Discussion followed regarding the decline of academic performance, the summer school curriculum, and the goals of accreditation.

Chairman Simpson opened the public hearing.

There being no one further wishing to speak, Chairman Simpson closed the public hearing.

Chairman Simpson stated the Board will appoint School Board members at its June 9, 2015 meeting.

### In Re: Highway Matters (Cont.)

Mr. Bartlett stated there are no changes in the Six-Year Plan, and because the House Bill 1887 has not yet been finalized, there is no allocation for paved roads for FY21. There is also about \$300,000 needed for a few of Prince Edward County's last projects, and no additional projects will be added to this year's plan. The House Bill would regionalize VDOT funds by district; Lynchburg District will be the arbitrator for the distribution of funds for our district. Mr. Bartlett added it will be extremely difficult for rural counties with low vehicle counts to compete for funding in the future.

### In Re: Poplar Hill Community Development Authority Special Levy

Mr. Bartlett stated a resolution has been received from the Poplar Hill Community Development Authority for the Board's consideration, requesting that the Board set the 2015 CDA District Special Levy at \$1.00. As the Board will recall, an earlier resolution had requested the levy be set at \$0.25. The Board has acted on that request.

Mr. Jim Ennis, County Attorney, stated the Poplar Hill CDA made the request and following a review of the document pre-consent to a special tax levy in an amount up to \$1.00. This is not retained by the County; the County is simply the collection agent. It is billed as part of the real estate tax as a special assessment; the collected funds are remitted to the Poplar Hill CDA.

Supervisor Timmons questioned the County's responsibility for the dispersal of funds. Mr. Ennis stated the County's sole responsibility is to effect the collection and remit the funds to the CDA; there are statutes that govern what the money can be expended on by the CDA, such as infrastructure. There are four authorized expenditures set forth in the *Code of Virginia*.

### In Re: Contract for Landfill Operations

Mr. Bartlett stated the County's existing contract with the Contractor for landfill operation services expires on June 30, 2015. The contract allows the County to negotiate up to two additional one-year renewals.

Mr. Bartlett recommended the contract be extended for the following reasons:

- By focusing on compacting the trash to a greater extent than normal and the effective use of the daily cover, and the willingness to work in the restrictive airspace at the top of the highest cell, the Contractor has greatly extended the life of the landfill.
- During the last advertisement the only contractor willing to obtain a Class II Certified Waste Management Facility Operator's License was the current operator.
- The Contractor has full knowledge of Virginia Solid Waste Management Regulations, the County's Facility Permit issued and approved by DEQ and the County's operation manual.

- The Contractor has a long history of working at the County Landfill which provides it specific knowledge of the soils, types of refuse deposited, specific requirements imposed by DEQ and the County's Engineers and the County itself.
- DEQ has found no flaws in the operations conducted by the Contractor.
- DEQ has stated the Contractor is proactive, not reactive, which ensures small problems are resolved before DEQ must issue any notice of non-compliance.
- The Contractor has a long history of working with County residents and meeting their needs and expectations.
- The Contractor has provided services not contained in the contract for no additional cost collecting water samples, clearing land for a new cell, etc.
- The current Contractor has not issued a single change order nor billed the County for the additional work mentioned above.

Mr. Bartlett stated that if for any reason the contractor fails to provide the same level of service,

the existing contract allows the County to terminate the Contract with 90 days' notice with or without cause.

Supervisor Townsend made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Cooper-Jones, to negotiate a oneyear contract extension in accordance with the existing contract and authorize the Chairman of the Board of Supervisors and the County Administrator to sign all necessary documents after review by the County Attorney.

Supervisor Wilck questioned the use of competitive bid. Mr. Bartlett stated during the last competitive bid process, two of the three interested companies did not have a license to run a landfill.

In Re: Cannery Operations

Mr. Bartlett reported several changes to the operation of the Prince Edward County Cannery for the upcoming canning season as it relates to Home Users. "Home Users" are County residents who bring fresh fruits and vegetables to the Cannery and process it into containers for personal consumption.

A review of historic Cannery use patterns found minimal and inconsistent use of the Cannery at the beginning and end of the harvest season. This unpredictable and scattered use has caused high operating costs in relation to the service provided. To solve that problem, the Cannery will be open by appointment only during the off-season months of May, June, November, December and January. These off-season appointments must be made at least two days prior to the processing day and there must be a minimum of one bushel of produce to process. Two or more users may combine their efforts in order to reach the one-bushel minimum. The Cannery will not operate during the months of February, March and April.)

Mr. Bartlett said that during the months of July, August, September and October, the Cannery will be open three days per week for Home Users, as has been the practice for the last several years. For 2015, the days for Home Users will be Monday, Wednesday and Saturday. These days were selected in response to the following issues: 1) County residents who work a traditional work-week schedule of Monday – Friday have asked the Cannery to be available on Saturday mornings; 2) Residents have also requested the Cannery be open on the days following the Southside Produce Auction in Charlotte County, which is held on Tuesdays and Fridays.

As has been the practice for years, the Cannery will open at 7:00 a.m. with no new produce accepted after 10:00 a.m. Produce must be prepared (i.e. beans already snapped and apples already peeled) before arrival.

To meet another citizen request, the County is researching the feasibility of allowing home users to use glass jars for the home canning. This will save our citizens money as glass jars can be reused. Examples include the glass Mason and Ball-type quart and pint jars; additional information concerning glass jars will be disseminated once the County completes testing.

Mr. Bartlett stated the County will advertise this information throughout the community with local news media and will also post it on our website in order to notify residents of these changes.

### In Re: Planning & Community Development Report

Mr. Fowler stated the April 22, 2015 meeting of the Planning Commission was canceled after the scheduled public hearing item was withdrawn by the applicant.

Mr. Fowler reported the Planning Commission is scheduled to hold a Public Hearing on May 19, 2015 to hear a request by Grace Chapel Ministries to install a freestanding sign with an electronic message board, located at 45 Simpson Road. If approved, this matter will be scheduled for the Board of Supervisors meeting on June 9, 2015.

Mr. Fowler then stated two additional requests have been received from local businesses wishing to install lighted signs on their commercially-zoned properties. One business is under an extremely tight deadline to install the lighted sign in order to comply with his franchise agreement. Mr. Fowler requested the Board consider holding a joint meeting with the Planning Commission to conduct a public hearing prior to the scheduled June 9, 2015 Board of Supervisors meeting to expedite the request.

Mr. Fowler said that the Planning Commission will look at revisions to the Zoning Ordinance to allow lighted signs in the Commercial zones, by right.

Mr. James Sanderson, Davenport & Company, reviewed a presentation regarding bank solicitation results for the Lease Agreement for the Honeywell Project. He stated the Board of Supervisors authorized the issuance of an RFP to obtain bids for lease-financing to fund the school renovations spelled out in the technical energy audit performed by Honeywell on April 30, 2015.

Mr. Sanderson stated five lending institutions responded; these were reviewed and recommended the County accept the proposal received from Hancock Bank, which is a major regional bank primarily located in Alabama, Florida, Louisiana, Mississippi and Texas. Hancock Bank provided the lowest cost financing package with a fixed interest rate of 2.35% over 15 years. The debt service associated with Hancock's proposal is lower than the estimated costs associated with this project. Mr. Sanderson reviewed the proposed amortization schedule. He stated the revenues associated with the operation savings and the drop in debt service will be greater than the total annual cost. He said the next steps, if the Board wishes to move forward, would be to approve the Reimbursement Resolution to allow the County to reimburse itself from financing proceeds if the County finds it necessary to advance funds to begin the project before the financing documents are finalized and the funds are available. The proposal is good if accepted at this time and financing could close in early June.

# RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FROM THE PROCEEDS OF ONE OR MORE FINANCINGS FOR CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL PURPOSES

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, Virginia (the "County") has determined that it may be necessary or desirable to advance money to pay the costs of certain energy savings, capital projects and roof replacements for public school purposes (the "Projects").

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA:

- 1. The Board of Supervisors adopts this declaration of official intent under Treasury Regulations Section 1.150-2.
- 2. The Board of Supervisors reasonably expects to reimburse advances made or to be made by the County or the School Board to pay the costs of the Projects from the proceeds of its debt or other financings. The maximum amount of debt or other financing expected to be issued in one or more series for the Projects is \$5,200,000.
- 3. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption.

Mr. Bartlett stated McGuire Woods, the County's bond attorney, prepared the resolution authorizing the lease-financing of energy conservation and other improvements at the schools. He said the Board may choose to accept contract proposal of Hancock Bank, if it is the desire of the Board of Supervisors. He said the amount stated on the resolution which includes the fees by the Bond Attorney and Davenport & Company does not have to be dollar-specific on this document; it is unknown at this time what those fees will be. He said this is an IRS requirement for tax exempt purposes.

Mr. Sanderson stated the amount to specify is the dollar amount that will be borrowed and choosing who will hold the financing; it authorizes the Chairman and County Administrator to execute the documents on behalf of the Board. Mr. Bartlett stated the lease documents from the bank chosen will spell out the dollar amount, approximately \$5,125,482.

## A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA AUTHORIZING THE LEASE FINANCING OF CERTAIN ENERGY CONSERVATION AND OTHER IMPROVEMENTS FOR PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY SCHOOLS

**WHEREAS**, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County of Prince Edward, Virginia (the "County") has determined that it is necessary or advisable to finance the cost of the acquisition, construction and installation of certain energy conservation improvements and other improvements for the County's schools (the "Equipment") through a financing lease or other financing agreement providing financing for the cost of acquisition, construction and installation of the Equipment; and

**WHEREAS**, the Equipment will be constructed and installed in various County schools in accordance with an Agreement between the School Board of the County and Honeywell International, Inc., or an affiliate.

# NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA:

- 1. Acceptance of Proposal: Authorization and Execution of Documents. The proposal of \_\_\_\_\_\_\_ (the "Lessor") to provide lease financing for the Equipment is accepted. The County Administrator and the Chairman of the Board, or either of them, and such officers as either of them may designate are authorized to execute and deliver on behalf of the County an equipment lease purchase agreement or other similar financing agreement (the "Lease) with the Lessor providing financing for costs of the Equipment in the maximum principal amount of \$5,090,482 plus such amount as is necessary to pay the costs of preparation of the Lease and other financing documents. The County Administrator and the Chairman of the Board, or either of them, and such officers as either of them may designate are authorized to execute and deliver such instruments, agreements, documents or certificates, including an escrow or acquisition fund agreement governing the deposit of proceeds of the Lease, and to do and perform such things and acts, as they shall deem necessary or appropriate to carry out the transactions authorized by this Resolution; and all of the foregoing, previously done or performed by such officers or agents of the County, are in all respects approved, ratified and confirmed.
- 2. Nature of Obligations. The obligation of the County to make payments under the Lease will be subject to appropriation each year by the Board. Nothing in this Resolution or the Lease shall constitute a debt or a pledge of the faith and credit of the County.
- **3. Bank Qualification.** The Board of Supervisors designates the Lease as a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" eligible for the exception from the disallowance of the deduction of interest by financial institutions allocable to the cost of carrying tax-exempt obligations in accordance with the provisions of Section 265(b)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended. The County does not reasonably anticipate that it and any "subordinate entities" will issue more than \$10,000,000 in tax exempt obligations during calendar year 2015 and the County will not designate more than \$10,000,000 of qualified tax-exempt obligations pursuant to such Section 265(b)(3) in calendar year 2015.
- 4. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately.

### In Re: Public Hearing - Amendment to FY15 County Budget

Chairman Simpson announced that this was the date and time scheduled for a public hearing on the proposed amendment to the FY15 County General Fund Budget to reflect the receipt of up to \$5,200,000 of bank-qualified lease financing for a Prince Edward County Public School renovation project. Notice of this hearing was advertised according to law in the Friday, May 15, 2015 edition of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

Chairman Simpson opened the Public Hearing.

Mr. Bartlett stated the proposed amendments to the Fiscal Year 2015 and Fiscal Year 2016 budgets will reflect the receipt of up to \$5,200,000 of bank-qualified lease financing for a Prince Edward County Public School renovation project. The project will begin in FY15 and continue into FY16.

Mr. Sanderson stated when the loan closes, the full amount will be drawn down; if the money is not spent or is left over at the end of construction, typically it is set aside to pay the next debt service payment.

Mr. Bartlett said left-over funds could be spent on other school-related renovation projects or change orders.

There being no one further wishing to speak, Chairman Simpson closed the public hearing.

## In Re: Actions by the Prince Edward County School Board

Dr. David Smith, Superintendent, Prince Edward County Schools, stated the School Board unanimously approved the resolution to amend Sections of the Honeywell contract.

Supervisor Timmons raised several concerns regarding the contract with Honeywell. He stated that Article 6.2.2 of the contract sets forth that "If a payment is past due for any reason, Honeywell has the right to charge interest beginning 30 days after the due date." Supervisor Timmons requested it be amended to "charge interest beginning 30 days after the request for payment has been approved." He requested the same change be made in Article 8.6.1. Discussion followed.

Supervisor Timmons stated there is nothing in the contract regarding retainage and suggested the Board that it be included in the contract; he said typically it is set at 10%. Mr. Verlander stated typically in Virginia it is set at 5%; he asked that it would be released when that energy conservation work is complete and signed off as accepted by the School Board.

Supervisor Timmons then questioned the School Board how the contract with Honeywell will be managed or administered. Dr. Smith stated Honeywell will manage it; a project manager hasn't yet been appointed.

Mr. Bartlett said the retainage would be held until the School Board approved the completion of that portion of work; someone will need to make the approval. If necessary, someone will need to be hired.

Supervisor Timmons stated Honeywell is the contractor and is doing the work, and approving their own payments; this places then in an unfair position. He suggested we must find an entity that understands the work to be done to serve as the County's representative to make sure the material and work meet the specifications. It would be prudent on our part to spend extra money to make certain the materials and work meet all specifications by hiring an entity to perform that work for the County.

Following some discussion, the Board agreed to fund the cost out of the excess savings identified by Davenport.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has received citizen input on the proposed budget and proposed tax rates at a duly advertised Public Hearing held April 21, 2015; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Board of Supervisors that departments and agencies shall adhere to the budgeted funds in accordance with departmental budgets presented by the County Administrator and amended by the Board of Supervisors;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED,** by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, that the FY 16 Budget for Prince Edward County of \$51,577,461 is hereby approved and effective July 1, 2015.

# ANNUAL RESOLUTION OF APPROPRIATION OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2016

A resolution to appropriate designated funds and accounts from specified estimated revenues for FY 2016 for the operating budget and the Capital Improvements Program for the County of Prince Edward and to authorize and empower County officers to expend funds and manage cash assets; and to establish policies under which funds will be expended and managed.

The Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors does hereby resolve on this 9<sup>th</sup> day of June 2015 that, for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2015, and ending on June 30, 2016, the following sections are hereby adopted.

- Section 1. The cost centers shown on the attached letter labeled FY 2015-2016 Appropriations are hereby appropriated from the designated estimated revenues as approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 9, 2015 for FY 2015-2016.
- Section 2. Appropriations, in addition to those contained in this general Appropriations Resolution, may be made by the Board of Supervisors, only if deemed appropriate and there is available in the fund unencumbered or unappropriated sums sufficient to meet such appropriations.
- Section 3. All appropriations herein authorized shall be on the basis of cost centers for all departments and agencies and by Category.
- Section 4. The Social Services Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. By this resolution the Social Services Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within its respective funds in any amount.
- Section 5. The School Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. Appropriations for the School Board are by Category. By this resolution the School Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within or between a category.
- Section 6. The County Administrator is expressly authorized to approve transfers of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within the same Fund with the exception of Constitutional Officers for the efficient operation of government. Transfers into or out of a department of a Constitutional Officer requires prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 7. All outstanding encumbrances, both operating and capital, at June 30, 2015 shall be re-appropriated to the FY2016 fiscal year to the same cost center and account for which they are encumbered in the previous year.

- Section 8. At the close of the fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriations lapse for budget items other than those involving ongoing operational projects, or programs supported by grants or County funds, which must be preapproved by the County Administrator or his designee and submitted to the Board of Supervisors for final approval. Such funds must be applied to the purpose for which they were originally approved.
- Section 9. Appropriations previously designated for capital projects will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until the completion of the project if funding is available from all planned sources, or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate ordinance, resolution or other action changes or eliminates the appropriation. Upon completion of a capital project, the County Administrator is hereby authorized to close out the project and return to the funding source any remaining balances. This section applies to all existing appropriations for capital projects at June 30, 2015 and appropriations as they are made in the FY 2016 Budget. The County Administrator is hereby authorized to contracts up to an increase of \$10,000.00 as long as funds are available from the funding sources and approve all change orders for reduction of contracts.
- Section 10. The approval of the Board of Supervisors of any grant of funds to the County shall constitute the appropriation of both the revenue to be received from the grant and the County's expenditure required by the terms of the grant, if any. The appropriation of grant funds will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until completion of the project or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate action, changes or eliminates the appropriation. The County Administrator may increase or reduce any grant appropriation to the level approved by the granting agency during the fiscal year. The County Administrator may approve necessary accounting transfers between departments and funds to enable the grant to be accounted for in the correct manner. Upon completion of a grant project, the County Administrator is authorized to close out the grant and return to the funding source any remaining balance. This section applies to appropriations for grants outstanding at June 30, 2015 and appropriations in the FY 2016 Budget.
- Section 11. The County Administrator may reduce revenue and expenditure appropriations related to programs funded all or in part by the Commonwealth of Virginia and/or the Federal Government to the level approved by the responsible state or federal agency.
- Section 12. The County Administrator is authorized to make transfers to the various funds for which there are transfers budgeted. The County Administrator shall transfer funds as deemed necessary up to amounts budgeted or in accordance with any existing bond resolutions that specify the matter in which transfers are to be made.
- Section 13. The Treasurer may advance monies to and from the various funds of the County to allow maximum cash flow efficiency. The advances must not violate County bond covenants or other legal restrictions that would prohibit an advance. The

Treasurer is authorized and directed to credit all interest received from the investment of all County funds to the General fund, with the exception of the School Construction Fund, Economic Development Fund, Recreation Fund, Forfeited Assets Fund, Landfill Fund, D.A.R.E. Fund, VDOT Revenue Sharing Fund (non-local money only) and the Piedmont Court Services Fund, wherein all interest earned will be credited to the respective funds.

- Section 14. All procurement activities with funds appropriated herein shall be made in accordance with the County purchasing policy and applicable state statutes.
- Section 15 It is the intent of this resolution that funds be expended for the purpose indicated in the budget; therefore, budgeted funds may not be transferred from operating expenditures to capital projects or from capital projects to operating expenses without the prior approval from the Board of Supervisors. Also, funds may not be transferred from one capital project to another without the prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 16. The County Administrator is authorized, pursuant to State statute, to issue orders and checks for payments where funds have been budgeted, appropriated, and where sufficient funds are available. A listing of vendor payments shall be presented to the Board of Supervisors for information not less frequently than monthly.
- Section 17 Subject to the qualifications in this resolution contained, all appropriations are declared to be maximum, conditional and proportionate appropriations the purpose being to make the appropriations payable in full in the amount named herein if necessary and then only in the event the aggregate revenues collected and available during the fiscal year for which the appropriations are made are sufficient to pay all the appropriations in full. Otherwise, the said appropriations shall be deemed to be payable in such proportions as the total sum of all realized revenue of the respective funds is to the total amount of revenue estimated to be available in the said fiscal year by the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 18. All revenues received by an agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board not included in its estimate of revenue for the financing of the fund budget as submitted to the Board of Supervisors may not be expended by said agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board without the consent of the Board of Supervisors being first obtained, and those sums appropriated to the budget. Any grant approved by the Board for application shall not be expended until the grant is approved by the funding agency for drawdown. Nor may any of these agencies or boards make expenditures which will exceed a specific item of an appropriation.
- Section 19. Allowances out of any of the appropriations made in this resolution by any or all County departments, commissions, bureaus, or agencies under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors to any of their officers and employees for expense on account of the use of such officers and employees of their personal

automobiles in the discharge of their official duties shall be paid at the same rate as that established by the internal revenue service and shall be subject to change by the County Administrator from time to time to maintain like rates.

- Section 20. All previous appropriation ordinances or resolutions to the extent that they are inconsistent with the provisions *of* this resolution shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
- Section 21. This resolution shall become effective on July 1, 2015.



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#### CRITERIA FOR SELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS

- 1. Each of the eight School Board members shall be appointed by a majority vote of the full Board of Supervisors when the School Board members' terms expire. This vote of the Board of Supervisors shall be by the show of hands.
- 2. The School Board members' terms of office shall commence on July 1.
- 3. The criteria for the appointment of School Board members are as follow:
  - a. Each year, the Supervisor from each election district in which a School Board member's term expires shall appoint a three (3) or five (5) member Citizens Committee to review and select candidate(s) for appointment to the School Board.
  - b. The membership of the Citizens Committee shall be announced at the Board of Supervisors meeting in February and published in a newspaper of general circulation, and the voters of the electoral district encouraged to submit nominations to the Chairman of the Committee.
  - c. For the March Board meeting, the County Administrator shall schedule and publish notice of a public hearing at which citizens will have an opportunity to submit names of candidates to be considered for appointment to the School Board. The members of the appointed Citizens Committee shall attend.
  - d. After the public hearing, the Citizens Committee shall interview and seriously consider all persons who are nominated and express willingness to serve, if appointed.
  - e. At the April Board meeting, the Citizens Committee shall report to the full Board of Supervisors a list of candidates for consideration. If the incumbent is requesting reappointment and is the only citizen expressing an interest, the Citizens Committee shall only be required to submit one name, the incumbent's, for consideration. If the incumbent is not requesting reappointment or is ineligible for reappointment, the Citizens Committee shall submit one or more names for consideration. The Citizens Committee shall also provide the Board biographical information on each candidate.
  - f. At the May Board meeting, a public hearing shall be held on the candidate(s) submitted at the April meeting.
  - g. At the June meeting, the Board, by a majority vote, shall appoint one candidate to the School Board.
  - h. The Citizens Committee, in selecting the candidates, shall consider the following:
    - 1. Person <u>must</u> be an eligible voter and resident of the election district;
    - 2. Person should be a freeholder;
    - 3. Person <u>must</u> be willing to serve on the School Board;
    - 4. Person should have at least a high school education;
    - 5. Person should be oriented to public service;
    - 6. Person should be involved, concerned, and dedicated to public education;
    - 7. Person should be independent (base decisions on factual matters rather than as a representative of a group or faction);

STEPS will serve the Counties of Amelia, Buckingham, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway and Prince Edward. The program's main goal is to decrease poverty not by just providing money to those in need, but by also building the capacity of lowincome individuals so they can work their way out of poverty and stay out. **Summary:** At its February 10, 2015 meeting, the Board of Supervisors approved the preparation of an Enterprise Zone Boundary Amendment application to the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (VDHCD). Since then, the Economic Development Office has identified approximately 19 properties that would benefit from inclusion in the state's Enterprise Zone Grant Program.

At this time, 11 of the identified properties consisting of approximately 236.58 +/- acres have agreed to become part of Prince Edward County's Enterprise Zone Program. Responses to letters sent on April 24, 2015 to the 8 remaining property owners are still pending. Efforts to gain permission from the pending property owners for inclusion in the Zone Boundary Amendment will continue up until the date of the Enterprise Zone Public Hearing. The pending properties consist of approximately 17 +/- additional acres. All 19 properties being considered are in the Prospect District. The Town of Farmville has notified the Economic Development Office that they have no requests for boundary adjustments at this time.

Therefore, I respectfully request the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors authorize the advertisement of a Public Hearing to be held at its July 14, 2015 meeting for the submittal of an application to VDHCD to expand the Prince Edward County Enterprise Zone.

**Summary:** The Board of Supervisors has previously authorized the establishment of the Prince Edward County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). The purpose of the LEPC is to support emergency management planning for chemical hazards/hazardous materials and provide the public access to information about possible chemical hazards in the community. An LEPC can also function in an advisory capacity for all-hazards emergency management planning.

As was discussed at the March 26, 2015 meeting with Farmville Town Council, the creation of a Joint Farmville-Prince Edward LEPC is one opportunity for the County and Town to work together. The creation of a joint LEPC can facilitate improved coordination, communications, planning and response for the citizens of Farmville and Prince Edward County.

The membership of the LEPC is based on the requirements of the federal *Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act*, which requires: Elected state and local officials; Law enforcement, emergency medical, fire, civil defense, and public health professionals; Environment, transportation, and hospital officials; Facility representatives; Citizens, community groups and media. Most of these positional appointments have already been made. The County and Town will need to review their respective rosters to determine if additional appointments are needed.

# Jennifer Bowen receives 2015 Alumni Award for Excellence in Extension

BLACKSBURG, Va., May 1, 2015 – Jennifer Bowen of Farmville, Virginia, senior Extension agent in 4-H youth development and unit coordinator for Prince Edward County, Virginia, received Virginia Tech's 2015 Alumni Award for Excellence in Extension.

Sponsored by the Virginia Tech Alumni Association, the Alumni Award for Excellence in Extension is presented annually to two Virginia Cooperative Extension faculty members who have made outstanding contributions to the land-grant mission of the university. One award goes to an Extension specialist, and the other is given to an Extension agent. Each award winner receives \$2,000.

Bowen started her career as 4-H associate Extension agent for Prince Edward County in 2000. She was promoted to Extension agent, 4-H youth development, in 2005 and to senior agent in 2013.

Throughout her career with Virginia Cooperative Extension, Bowen has worked hard to develop and strengthen relationships with local schools, educators, parents, and children in Prince Edward County and to implement programs designed to meet local needs.

Under her leadership, 4-H programs have grown and become stronger. She is recognized as an outstanding educator and a leader among her peers, and the positive relationship she has maintained with local school systems has been instrumental in the growth of 4-H programs.

For example, one of her after-school programs, the Fun with Foods cooking class, has served nearly 200 youth. Parents said the program improved their children's abilities to read and follow directions and to measure correctly. Other after-school programs developed and led by Bowen have focused on natural resources education, science, engineering, technology, and plant and soil science.

In addition, Bowen manages between five and seven special interest clubs each year and works with 10 to 15 volunteer leaders who manage those clubs. She ensures they are aware of and following policies and procedures and that the youth are having positive educational and life-skill building experiences.

Throughout her career in Extension, Bowen has worked to make 4-H programs accessible to the underserved. For example, she has secured more than \$11,000 from the United Way for camp scholarships.

She also worked with volunteers and professionals to develop and implement Camp Loud and Clear, an overnight camping program for deaf and hard-of-hearing children.



Mr. Walker moved that the minutes be approved as presented. Motion carried.

#### Treasurer's Report

April Financial Statement: The Treasurer stated the April Financial Statement was in order.

Mr. Walker moved that the April Financial Statement be approved as presented. Motion carried.

#### **Report of Officers & Committees**

#### **Chairman's Report:**

**CRC FY 15-16 Budget Committee Meeting Report:** The Vice-Chairman stated the Budget Committee reviewed the draft budget earlier during the Budget Committee meeting.

Mr. Timmons stated the Budget Committee discussed earlier the need to seek quotes for a new copy machine as the current one is old and not functioning well. The Executive Director was asked to seek quotes for a new copy machine.

The Executive Director was asked to request in writing from Amelia County what amount they approved for CRC Membership Dues in the Amelia FY 15-16 Approved Budget. It was stated once this has been received in writing, the Council would send a letter to address the issue.

Mr. Walker moved that the CRC FY15-16 Budget be approved as presented. Motion carried.

**Appointment of CRC FY15-16 Nominating Committee:** This matter was tabled until the June meeting due to two members being absent.

**Report on Chief Administrative Officers (CAO) Meeting:** Ms. Hickman stated the Agenda for the April CAO meeting was included in the Council Members packet for review.

<u>Scoping the Future – Discussion of Innovative/Regional Ideas:</u> The Executive Director stated an attachment has been added for the monthly item at the request of the Council to list ideas that have been discussed previously.

#### Old Business

**Staff Update-FY15-16 CRC Budget Request:** Ms. Hickman stated the Budget Committee discussed earlier to include in the FY15-16 CRC Budget, \$17,000 for all CRC Member Investment Dues. Ms. Hickman stated several member counties have already passed their budget and the others will be passing their budgets in the coming weeks.

Adoption of CRC Charter As Amended: Ms. Hickman stated the CRC has received adopted

Resolutions from all five current member counties in good standing. This meets the CRC Charter guidelines for amending the charter, which requires 2/3 majority vote. Ms. Hickman stated the Amended Charter changes language in Article V to remove language that no member locality or institution shall pay annual dues in an amount greater than any other. The new language gives the Council the flexibility to set the member dues prior to the upcoming fiscal year.

Mr. Timmons moved and Mr. Walker seconded to Adopt the CRC Charter as amended effective May 7, 2015. Motion carried.

**Adoption of CRC Bylaws As Amended:** Ms. Hickman stated now that the CRC Charter has been amended the CRC Bylaws likewise need to be amended as well. The same change to remove language Article XVIII-Annual Dues and Assessments, 18.1 Annual Dues) that no member locality or institution shall pay annual dues in an amount greater than any other will be amended in the Bylaws.

Mr. Walker moved and Mr. Timmons seconded to Adopt the CRC Bylaws as amended effective May 7, 2015. Motion carried.

**CRC FY13-14 Annual Report Presentation Schedule:** Ms. Hickman stated the schedule for the CRC Annual Report Presentations was included in the Council Members packet for their information. Ms. Hickman stated staff visited the Towns of Keysville, Phenix, Blackstone and Kenbridge in the month of April to provide the Annual Report Presentation and will be visiting the Town of Victoria in May and the final presentation will be made to the Town of Dillwyn in June.

Council Member Comments: There were none.

#### New Business

#### President & Staff Reports

**Media Presentation – Robert Russa Moton Museum Project Status:** Mr. Gilliam gave a Media Presentation on the status of the Robert Russa Moton Museum Project. Mr. Gilliam stated the Permanent Exhibition includes 6 galleries that tell the civil rights in education story. The CRC's involvement was to administer the grants and assist with monitoring the job creation process. The Museum needs to create eight jobs with five of them being for low-and-moderate income (LMI) individuals. They currently have four and half LMI created jobs. Mr. Gilliam stated once the Pavilion is completed the Museum will be in the position to advertise for the final position.

Mr. Gilliam stated the Pavilion and Parking Lot Project was originally two separate applications but was bid as one project. The project includes the construction of the Pavilion (replica of Tar Paper Shack) to include: office space, storage, bathrooms, kitchen/prep, patio furniture, and landscaping. The Parking lot includes fourteen spaces and a bus pull-off. The bids were higher than the cost estimate and therefore, bathrooms, patio furniture and landscaping were excluded from the project. The bathrooms were roughed in but not completed. A mural will be painted on one side of the Pavilion by the Artist – Hamilton Glass.

The completion of these projects will make the Moton Museum a trailhead destination for tourist near and far.

Staff Report on CRC Regional Informational Meeting on UDA Designation: Ms. Foster stated the CRC Regional Informational Meeting on Designated Growth Areas/UDA's was held on Friday, April 17, 2015 in the lower level Mill Conference Room. Ms. Foster stated attendance was very good with representatives from all five member localities. Speakers included Rick Youngblood with VDOT and over the web remotely; Kelli Nash, Office of Intermodal Planning and Investment (OIPI) and David Jackson, Cambridge Systematics, Inc. (State On-Call Consultant). Ms. Foster stated the main reason for the CRC hosting this event was due to HB2 Project Prioritization. One of the stipulations in HB2 Legislation states that candidate projects shall be screened to determine whether they are consistent with either (or all) a Corridor of Statewide Significance, Regional Network or Improvements to Urban Development Areas (UDA's). Ms. Foster stated in Planning District 14, there is only one Corridor of Statewide Significance (U.S. 460), by the current definition of Regional Networks as networks within urbanized areas; the region has none and very few if any UDAs. Ms. Foster stated the State has recognized the few number of UDA's and has offered, through the OIPI office, assistance in establishing new ones or updating the localities current comprehensive plan to recognize growth areas to meet the current code. The CRC received several inquiries from localities on why they would need to establish a Urban Development Area because of the rural nature of the region. Because of the inquiries and the significance of HB2 Legislation tie-in, the Workshop was developed. Ms. Foster stated she felt the localities now have the information they need to address the issues surrounding HB2 and UDAs.

**Staff Report on Attendance at Lynchburg FY** 16**-21 VDOT SYIP Public Hearing:** Ms. Foster stated a copy of her comments made at the Lynchburg Public Hearing were included in the Council members' packet. Ms. Foster stated she focused on commenting on the HB2 Prioritization Process. Ms. Foster stated she brought attention to the fact that in order to be eligible to apply for State funding through the HB2 process a project must address at least one of the three travel markets: Corridors of Statewide Significance (COSS), Regional Networks and Urban Development Areas (UDA). Ms. Foster stated she pointed out that because of the rural nature of Planning District 14; the region only had one COSS – Route 460, no Regional Networks as defined by the HB2 Implementation Policy Guide and no defined UDAs. Ms. Foster stated she pointed out these definitions would hurt all rural areas and encouraged the CTB to refine the definitions to be inclusive of rural areas. Ms. Foster stated following the comment period she did receive acknowledgement from CTB Member, Shannon Valentine and the Secretary of Transportation, Aubrey Layne, Jr. thanking her for bringing this to their attention.

**Tentative VDOT FY2016 Transportation Alternative Program Awards:** Mr. Fortune stated the Commonwealth Transportation Board recently released the Tentative Awards for the FY2016 Transportation Alternative Program. Mr. Fortune stated the CRC assisted Amelia County and the Town of Dillwyn in applying for Transportation Alternative Funds in November of 2014. The Town of Dillwyn received a Tentative Allocation of \$244,481 (the amount requested) to complete Phase V and hopefully complete their Downtown Streetscape Improvements Project. Amelia County did not receive a Tentative Allocation but scored well in the process.

**CRC Submission of RFP Proposal for Amelia Comprehensive Plan:** Ms. Hickman stated the CRC submitted a Proposal in response to the February Request for Proposals from Amelia County to perform an Update to the Amelia County Comprehensive Plan. Ms. Hickman stated the Proposal was hand delivered on April 24, 2015 (deadline). Ms. Hickman provided a copy for the members to review at the meeting. Ms. Hickman stated the CRC is currently assisting Buckingham County with an update to their Comprehensive Plan and previously assisted them in 2008 for a complete re-write. The CRC has also assisted Cumberland County, Lunenburg County and Prince Edward County and several Towns in

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updating their Comprehensive Plans.

Ms. Hickman stated the CRC is available to assist its members with updates of their comprehensive plans. Ms. Hickman stated member localities can directly request assistance from the CRC without going through the RFP process. This option saves the locality time and money. Ms. Hickman stated she has not received a response from Amelia County yet on the RFP.

#### Council Member Comments: There were none.

**<u>Commonwealth Intergovernmental Review Process (CIRP)</u>:** Ms. Foster stated there were no local CIRPS.

**Other Business:** Ms. Hickman stated information on the Buy Fresh Buy Local (BFBL) was not received in time to include it in the Council members' packet (received May 7, 2015). Ms. Hawthorne stated in an email that she had hoped to report on things that have happened vs things they are still waiting on. Ms. Hawthorne stated they have applied to the SCC as a non-profit organization and are awaiting their application being approved. Ms. Hawthorne stated BFBL is still researching for a sponsor to handle the everyday contacting, etc. as described earlier to the CRC. They are also waiting on funds from the Tobacco Commission to close out the grant. The Food Guide has been sent for printing and hopefully will be ready in a couple of weeks for distribution. They are anticipating that the Old Dominion RC&D will officially close operations this month. Ms. Hawthorne requested that the CRC keep an open mind about helping the BFBL is possible in the future, but at this time they are not sure what that help will be. Ms. Hawthorne apologized that she could not be here to answer questions but would try to be at the June CRC meeting with more information and a specific request of the CRC.

Ms. Hickman stated a letter will need to be drafted to respond to the letter received from Lunenburg County. Ms. Hickman reminded Council Members the letter from Lunenburg was sent out to Council Members in a separate mailing due to not being received in time to be included in the Council Members Packet. The letter from Lunenburg County requested the CRC review and consider revision to the fee schedule for services to 501(c) 3 non-profit organizations within the member localities. The letter also posed two questions to the CRC; 1)If a non-member locality contracts CRC services, would the non-member charges be such that they would save money by becoming a member? and 2) how many times per fiscal year are non-member jurisdictions paying for services? Ms. Hickman referred to the cover letter she sent to CRC Members with the Lunenburg Letter that provide information on these questions.

Mr. Timmons moved and Mr. Walker seconded that Lunenburg County be sent a response that states in order to keep membership dues at a minimum the CRC charges everyone the same.

**<u>Council Member Comments:</u>** There were none.

**Adjournment:** The meeting adjourned at 12:45 p.m.
