- Each Board member shall be allotted an opportunity to speak for a maximum of one (1) minute; unless additional time is yielded by another member of the Board. In the event a Board member or member(s) shall be absent, unallocated time shall not be allocated to Board members in attendance.
- Following each Board member's comment period, the remaining two (2) minutes shall be set aside for appropriate response, and shall be divided equally between those members of the Board wishing to respond, and as directed by the Chairman.

Planning Commission Chairman Townsend called the Planning Commission meeting to order as a continuation of a recessed meeting; he stated there was a quorum present.

In Re: Joint Public Hearing - Special Use Permit, Ellington Energy Services, Inc.

Chairman Simpson announced that this was the date and time scheduled for a joint public hearing on a request of Ellington Energy Services, Inc., for a Special Use Permit application to install one lighted free-standing sign with LED digital reader in a C-1, General Commercial District, further described as Tax Map Parcel #022-A-70A1; this site is located at 3810 West Third Street, Farmville, Virginia and is known as Pump & Pantry. Notice of this hearing was advertised according to law in the Wednesday, May 27, 2015 and Wednesday, June 3, 2015 editions of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

Mr. Robert Fowler, Planning Director, stated the County received a Special Use Permit Application to permit the installation of one internally lighted free-standing sign with LED digital display, located at 3810 West Third Street, Farmville, on Tax Map Parcel 022-A-70A1. The free-standing sign will be approximately 40 square feet in area and 22 feet in height, and will replace the existing free-standing sign if approved.

Mr. Fowler stated the property is currently being used as a convenience store which is an allowed use in the C1, General Commercial District. Section 3-104.11 of the Prince Edward County Zoning Ordinance permits internally lighted signs by Special Use Permit.

Mr. Fowler stated there were no objections from the neighbors.

Supervisor Gray questioned the hours the sign will be lit; Mr. Fowler stated it will be lit 24 hours a day, and will not have a scrolling message.

Board of Supervisors Chairman Simpson opened the public hearing.

There being no one further wishing to speak, Chairman Simpson closed the public hearing.

Planning Commission Chairman asked the Commissioners for any questions or comments. There being none, Commissioner Mason made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Prengaman, to accept for recommendation to the Board of Supervisors the Special Use Permit application from Ellington Energy Services, Inc., to install one lighted free-standing sign with LED digital reader located at 3810 West Third Street, Farmville, Virginia and known as Pump & Pantry; the motion carried unanimously:

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, that the FY 16 Budget for Prince Edward County of \$51,577,461 is hereby approved and effective July 1, 2015.

ANNUAL RESOLUTION OF APPROPRIATION OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2016

A resolution to appropriate designated funds and accounts from specified estimated revenues for FY 2016 for the operating budget and the Capital Improvements Program for the County of Prince Edward and to authorize and empower County officers to expend funds and manage cash assets; and to establish policies under which funds will be expended and managed.

The Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors does hereby resolve on this 9th day of June 2015 that, for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2015, and ending on June 30, 2016, the following sections are hereby adopted.

- Section 1. The cost centers shown on the attached letter labeled FY 2015-2016 Appropriations are hereby appropriated from the designated estimated revenues as approved by the Board of Supervisors on June 9, 2015 for FY 2015-2016.
- Section 2. Appropriations, in addition to those contained in this general Appropriations Resolution, may be made by the Board of Supervisors, only if deemed appropriate and there is available in the fund unencumbered or unappropriated sums sufficient to meet such appropriations.
- Section 3. All appropriations herein authorized shall be on the basis of cost centers for all departments and agencies and by Category.
- Section 4. The Social Services Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. By this resolution the Social Services Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within its respective funds in any amount.
- Section 5. The School Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. Appropriations for the School Board are by Category. By this resolution the School Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within or between a category.
- Section 6. The County Administrator is expressly authorized to approve transfers of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within the same Fund with the exception of Constitutional Officers for the efficient operation of government. Transfers into or out of a department of a Constitutional Officer requires prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 7. All outstanding encumbrances, both operating and capital, at June 30, 2015 shall be reappropriated to the FY2016 fiscal year to the same cost center and account for which they are encumbered in the previous year.

- Section 8. At the close of the fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriations lapse for budget items other than those involving ongoing operational projects, or programs supported by grants or County funds, which must be preapproved by the County Administrator or his designee and submitted to the Board of Supervisors for final approval. Such funds must be applied to the purpose for which they were originally approved.
- Section 9. Appropriations previously designated for capital projects will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until the completion of the project if funding is available from all planned sources, or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate ordinance, resolution or other action changes or eliminates the appropriation. Upon completion of a capital project, the County Administrator is hereby authorized to close out the project and return to the funding source any remaining balances. This section applies to all existing appropriations for capital projects at June 30, 2015 and appropriations as they are made in the FY 2016 Budget. The County Administrator is hereby authorized to approve construction change orders to contracts up to an increase of \$10,000.00 as long as funds are available from the funding sources and approve all change orders for reduction of contracts.
- Section 10. The approval of the Board of Supervisors of any grant of funds to the County shall constitute the appropriation of both the revenue to be received from the grant and the County's expenditure required by the terms of the grant, if any. The appropriation of grant funds will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until completion of the project or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate action, changes or eliminates the appropriation. The County Administrator may increase or reduce any grant appropriation to the level approved by the granting agency during the fiscal year. The County Administrator may approve necessary accounting transfers between departments and funds to enable the grant to be accounted for in the correct manner. Upon completion of a grant project, the County Administrator is authorized to close out the grant and return to the funding source any remaining balance. This section applies to appropriations for grants outstanding at June 30, 2015 and appropriations in the FY 2016 Budget.
- Section 11. The County Administrator may reduce revenue and expenditure appropriations related to programs funded all or in part by the Commonwealth of Virginia and/or the Federal Government to the level approved by the responsible state or federal agency.
- Section 12. The County Administrator is authorized to make transfers to the various funds for which there are transfers budgeted. The County Administrator shall transfer funds as deemed necessary up to amounts budgeted or in accordance with any existing bond resolutions that specify the matter in which transfers are to be made.
- Section 13. The Treasurer may advance monies to and from the various funds of the County to allow maximum cash flow efficiency. The advances must not violate County bond covenants or other legal restrictions that would prohibit an advance. The Treasurer is authorized and directed to credit all interest received from the investment of all County funds to the General fund, with the exception of the School Construction Fund, Economic Development Fund, Recreation Fund, Forfeited Assets Fund, Landfill Fund, D.A.R.E.

Fund, VDOT Revenue Sharing Fund (non-local money only) and the Piedmont Court Services Fund, wherein all interest earned will be credited to the respective funds.

- Section 14. All procurement activities with funds appropriated herein shall be made in accordance with the County purchasing policy and applicable state statutes.
- Section 15 It is the intent of this resolution that funds be expended for the purpose indicated in the budget; therefore, budgeted funds may not be transferred from operating expenditures to capital projects or from capital projects to operating expenses without the prior approval from the Board of Supervisors. Also, funds may not be transferred from one capital project to another without the prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 16. The County Administrator is authorized, pursuant to State statute, to issue orders and checks for payments where funds have been budgeted, appropriated, and where sufficient funds are available. A listing of vendor payments shall be presented to the Board of Supervisors for information not less frequently than monthly.
- Section 17 Subject to the qualifications in this resolution contained, all appropriations are declared to be maximum, conditional and proportionate appropriations the purpose being to make the appropriations payable in full in the amount named herein if necessary and then only in the event the aggregate revenues collected and available during the fiscal year for which the appropriations are made are sufficient to pay all the appropriations in full. Otherwise, the said appropriations shall be deemed to be payable in such proportions as the total sum of all realized revenue of the respective funds is to the total amount of revenue estimated to be available in the said fiscal year by the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 18. All revenues received by an agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board not included in its estimate of revenue for the financing of the fund budget as submitted to the Board of Supervisors may not be expended by said agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board without the consent of the Board of Supervisors being first obtained, and those sums appropriated to the budget. Any grant approved by the Board for application shall not be expended until the grant is approved by the funding agency for drawdown. Nor may any of these agencies or boards make expenditures which will exceed a specific item of an appropriation.
- Section 19. Allowances out of any of the appropriations made in this resolution by any or all County departments, commissions, bureaus, or agencies under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors to any of their officers and employees for expense on account of the use of such officers and employees of their personal automobiles in the discharge of their official duties shall be paid at the same rate as that established by the internal revenue service and shall be subject to change by the County Administrator from time to time to maintain like rates.

- Section 20. All previous appropriation ordinances or resolutions to the extent that they are inconsistent with the provisions *of* this resolution shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
- Section 21. This resolution shall become effective on July 1, 2015.

In Re: Appointment - STEPS Tripartite Board

Mr. Bartlett stated the Virginia Department of Social Services (VDSS) has selected STEPS, Inc. to serve as the Community Action Agency (CAA) for our region. STEPS will serve the Counties of Amelia, Buckingham, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway and Prince Edward. The program's main goal is to decrease poverty not by just providing money to those in need, but by also building the capacity of low-income individuals so they can work their way out of poverty and stay out. By federal law, the composition of the Tripartite Board must represent three constituencies: 1) Low Income Individuals and Families; 2) Elected Officials or "Their Representative:; and 3) Major Groups and Interests in the Community Served (e.g. business, industry, labor, religious, law enforcement, education or other major groups in the community). Mr. Bartlett said STEPS is asking the Board of Supervisors to appoint a member of the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors to the new Tripartite Board of Directors which will oversee the operation of the CAA. The Board may also appoint an alternate, who does not have to be a member of the Board of Supervisors. In Re: Enterprise Zone Boundary Adjustment

Mrs. Sharon Lee Carney, Director of Economic Development, stated that at its February 10, 2015 meeting, the Board of Supervisors approved the preparation of an Enterprise Zone Boundary Amendment application to the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (VDHCD). Since then, the Economic Development Office has identified approximately 19 properties that would benefit from inclusion in the state's Enterprise Zone Grant Program.

Mrs. Carney said that at this time, 11 of the identified properties consisting of approximately 236.58 +/- acres have agreed to become part of Prince Edward County's Enterprise Zone Program. Responses to letters sent on April 24, 2015 to the eight remaining property owners are still pending. Efforts to gain permission from the pending property owners for inclusion in the Zone Boundary Amendment will continue up until the date of the Enterprise Zone Public Hearing. The pending properties consist of approximately 17 +/- additional acres. All 19 properties being considered are in the Prospect District. The Town of Farmville has notified the Economic Development Office that they have no requests for boundary adjustments at this time. Mrs. Carney reported that an additional seven parcels were requested to be added that day.

Mrs. Carney requested the Board of Supervisors authorize the advertisement of a public hearing to be held at its July 14, 2015 meeting for the submittal of an application to VDHCD to expand the Prince Edward County Enterprise Zone. In Re: Joint Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC)

Mrs. Sarah Elam Puckett, Assistant County Administrator, stated the Board of Supervisors has previously authorized the establishment of the Prince Edward County Local Emergency Planning Committee (LEPC). The purpose of the LEPC is to support emergency management planning for chemical hazards/hazardous materials and provide the public access to information about possible chemical hazards in the community. An LEPC can also function in an advisory capacity for all-hazards emergency management planning.

As was discussed at the March 25, 2015 meeting with Farmville Town Council, the creation of a Joint Farmville-Prince Edward LEPC is one opportunity for the County and Town to work together. The creation of a joint LEPC can facilitate improved coordination, communications, planning and response for the citizens of Farmville and Prince Edward County.

Mrs. Puckett stated the membership of the LEPC is based on the requirements of the federal Emergency Planning and Community Right to Know Act, which requires: Elected state and local officials; Law enforcement, emergency medical, fire, civil defense, and public health professionals; Environment, transportation, and hospital officials; Facility representatives; Citizens, community groups and media. Most of these positional appointments have already been made. The County and Town will need to review their respective rosters to determine if additional appointments are needed. She stated the First Responders already work together; this will bring the local governments together. Supervisor Timmons made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Townsend, to authorize the creation of a joint LEPC with the Town of Farmville and the dissolution of the Prince Edward County LEPC after the creation of the joint LEPC; the motion carried:

- Promote the importance of public readiness through community seminars; and
- Develop a formal hazardous weather plan, which includes training severe weather spotters and holding emergency exercises.

Mrs. Puckett said the Storm Ready Community Program encourages communities to take a proactive approach to improving local hazardous weather operations, which will help the County better prepare for and mitigate the effects of extreme weather related events. She stated there is no cost to the County for the program with the exception of staff time.

Summary:

a. <u>Sheriff's Office At-Will Overtime Program</u>: At the January 13, 2015 meeting the Board approved a six month extension of the "At-Will" traffic enforcement program. For the second half of FY15 this program has cost a total of \$20,571 to include FICA costs. This program was instituted at the start of FY14 thus the FY13 revenues serve as the base year for revenue collection. During FY13 collections averaged \$8,265 per month or \$49,590 for six months. Collections for the second half of FY15 have been \$86,647. This is an increase of \$37,057 when compared to the base year and exceeds expenses by \$16,486.

On a financial basis the program funds itself. This program provides benefits other than financial and traffic enforcement. It frees deputies from routine traffic duties to concentrate on other law enforcement duties – crime prevention, solving crimes and increasing visibility and availability of law enforcement personnel throughout the County. It is a no cost program that effectively increases the number of deputies on shift. The Sheriff will be at the meeting to discuss this program.

Recommendations: The Board will wish to decide if it will continue to authorize this program. No budget action is required.

b. <u>Request from Prince Edward County School Board</u>: Attached is a letter from the School Board requesting a donation to support a naming dedication ceremony for three school locations.

The Finance Committee met June 15, 2015 to discuss the request from the Town of Farmville for assistance in funding the annual 4th of July Fireworks event known as "Fireworks After Dark" held at the Farmville Airport. The Committee is comprised of Supervisor Cooper-Jones – Chair, and Supervisors Jones, Simpson and Timmons.

The Town provided the Committee a summary of the cost of the event and an advertisement describing the various entertainment activities, attachment (1) and (2). The total cost for the event is \$19,450. No estimate of revenues from Donations was provided but at the June 9, 2015 meeting of the Board of Supervisors, it was stated that donations were raised from local people and businesses. The Committee noted that \$9,200 remained in the FY15 contingency line. The Committee unanimously approved a recommendation to the full board that \$4,600 be provided to the Town from the Contingency line from the FY15 budget to help support the 2015 Fireworks After Dark event. Additionally, the Committee recommends the remainder of the FY15 Contingency fund (\$4,600) be re-appropriated into FY16. If that is approved it will be accomplished when the remainder of the re-appropriations are submitted to the Board of Supervisors.

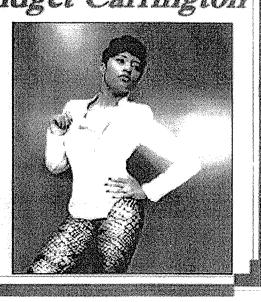

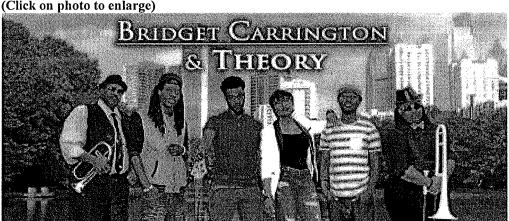

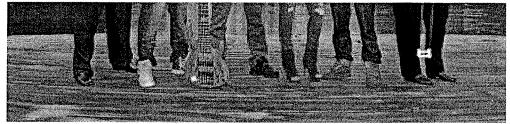

Summary:

The PERT Committee met June 23, 2015 at the Farmville Area Bus to discuss possible amendments to the routes of the Prince Edward Rural Transit (PERT) bus service. The PERT has an Orange Line that serves the Meherrin-Green Bay areas and a Green Line that serves the Tuggle-Prospect-Pamplin areas. The Committee is comprised of Supervisor Townsend – Chair, and Supervisors Gray and Timmons. Also present at the meeting were: Wade Bartlett, County Administrator; Gerry Spates, Town Manager: Julie Adams, Farmville Area Bus Manager; and Sarah Elam Puckett, Assistant County Administrator.

The Committee makes the following recommendations:

- 1. No changes are recommended to the Green Line.
- Amend the Orange Line to expand ridership along Leigh Mountain Road and Meherrin Road. A proposed revised schedule, as developed by the staff of the Farmville Area Bus, is attached for the Board's consideration. The only cost to the County will be approximately \$350 for the printing of new Orange Line bus schedules.

Note: To give the Farmville Area Bus time to develop new schedules and maps and to distribute that information to the regular ridership, Julie Adams recommends that the changes to Orange Line be implemented effective September 1, 2015.

Approval of Minutes of May 7, 2015 Meeting

Mr. Walker moved that the minutes be approved as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

April Financial Statement: The Treasurer stated the May Financial Statement was in order.

Mr. Timmons moved that the May Financial Statement be approved as presented. Motion carried.

Report of Officers & Committees

Chairman's Report:

Report of CRC FY15-16 Nominating Committee: The Chairman stated according to the CRC Bylaws, only the current Treasurer can continue to serve in office. A new slate of officers for Chairman, Vice-Chairman and Secretary are needed to begin serving July 1, 2015. Mr. Walker moved to nominate Mr. Wingold for Chairman, himself for Secretary, Ms. Stish for Vice-Chairman and Mr. Timmons for Treasurer. Motion carried.

Appointment of Charter/Bylaws Overall Review Committee: The Chairman stated over several past meetings there has been discussion of reviewing the CRC's Charter and Bylaws to address additional aspects, bring some matters up-to-date and do a general review. The Chairman stated in order to not take up considerable Council meeting time she suggested appointing a Charter/Bylaws Overall Review Committee to begin the review. Mr. Timmons volunteered to serve on the Committee. Mr. Walker suggested that Mr. Timmons, the Chairman and two CRC Staff Members serve as the committee. The Executive Director could determine the additional staff member other than herself. The Chairman suggested the Committee meet a half-hour prior to the monthly CRC Meetings. Mr. Timmons asked that his notes on the Charter be scanned and provided to all the Committee members.

Report on Chief Administrative Officers (CAO) Meeting: The Chairman stated the May CAO meeting was canceled.

Amelia FY15-16 Membership Investment Dues: The Chairman stated attached in the Council packet is a summary of the a letter from Amelia County confirming that the County approved a contribution of \$15,700 to the CRC for the Amelia County fiscal year 2016 budget. The amount requested was \$17,000. This matter was discussed during the May Budget Committee meeting. A draft letter was provided for review as required by the CRC Bylaws. The letter notifies Amelia that members not paying full payment of membership dues will not be considered a member in good standing until full payment is received (by August 31, 2105). Mr. Walker suggested language be added to letter to make Amelia aware that the increase in membership fees will be used for staff salary increases, which have not been increased in the past seven years.

Mr. Bennett stated unfortunately he was not involved in the Amelia Budget meetings due to health issues. Mr. Bennett stated he would be glad to go back and discuss the matter further with Amelia County to try and get the full amount of \$17,000 in the Amelia Budget.

Mr. Walker moved to amend the draft letter to include discussed language regarding raises and to also have the Chairman as well as the Secretary sign the letter and send it to Amelia County. Motion

Lunenburg Request on Service Fees/Questions: The Chairman stated Lunenburg County had previously sent a letter to the CRC with questions regarding the CRC fee policy for services to 501c3 organizations and membership benefits versus non-members. The Chairman stated she had worked with Ms. Hickman to provide a Draft Response Letter for Lunenburg County for the CRC members to review. Copies of Draft letter were distributed for review.

Ms. Hawthorne reported the CRC's current membership fee of \$17,000 is currently in the proposed FY15-16 Lunenburg County Budget.

There was discussion on the matter.

Mr. Walker moved that the letter be sent as presented. Motion carried.

Scoping the Future – Discussion of Innovative/Regional Ideas: The Chairman stated the added attachment in the Council packet that provides previous Innovative/Regional Ideas is every helpful. The Chairman encouraged members to review the list and discuss the ideas with colleagues and the county administrators.

Old Business

Staff Update-FY15-16 **CRC Budget Request:** Ms. Hickman stated as previously discussed, Lunenburg County is set to adopt their FY15-16 Budget on June 11, 2015. The CRC's membership fees of \$17,000 are included in the proposed budget.

CRC FY13-14 Annual Report Presentation Schedule: Ms. Hickman stated the final Annual Report Presentation will be made to the Dillwyn Town Council on June 9, 2015.

Old Dominion RC&D Request, Heart of VA Buy Fresh Buy Local (BFBL) Chapter (tabled previously): Ms. Hawthorne, representing BFBL, stated the BFBL has begun the process of receiving a EIN and 501C3 status. BFBL has also opened a bank account with RC&D transferring all applicable funds for their activities to this account. BFBL has partnered with Centra Hospital to produce 20,000 of the BFBL Brochures at a lesser cost than the previous 7,500 printed. Centra will be distributing 10,000-12,000 of the brochures for BFBL. BFBL's next meeting will be in July and therefore she should be able to come back in August with a specific request from BFBL for services from the CRC. Ms. Hawthorne stated BFBL understands that the services provided by the CRC would be provided through a fee structure.

Staff Report – Copier Quotes: Ms. Foster stated the current copy machine is 11 years old and has become very unreliable with service staff visiting the office weekly. Ms. Foster stated on several occasions the staff have had to use an outside source to print documents needed.

Ms. Foster stated enclosed in the Council Members packets are quotes on a new copy machine. The two vendors that provided quotes are Southern Copier Sales & Service out of Mechanicsville, Virginia and Key Office Supply, Inc. of Farmville, Virginia. The low quote of \$5,983 was made by Key Office Supply, Inc. Ms. Foster recommended that the machine be purchased through the low quote provided by Key Office Supply Inc.

Mr. Timmons moved that the low quote provided by Key Office Supply be accepted and a new copy machine be purchased through Key Office Supply Inc. Motion carried.

Council Member Comments: There were none.

New Business

President & Staff Reports

Town of Dillwyn Request-Technical Assistance for Dillwyn Comprehensive Plan Update: Mr. Fortune stated the Town of Dillwyn previously adopted a new Comprehensive Plan in 2009. Dillwyn requested options for updating this plan from the CRC. The CRC provided costs for two options; 1-Develop a new Town of Dillwyn Comprehensive Plan for a cost in the range of \$19,000-\$22,000 and option 2-Develop an Amendment (Revisions) to existing Town of Dillwyn Comprehensive Plan at a cost in the range of \$14,000-\$18,000. The Town of Dillwyn has responded and chosen option 2. A copy of the contract between the CRC and the Town of Dillwyn is included in the Council Members' packet for execution.

Mr. Walker moved that the CRC execute the agreement between the CRC and the Town of Dillwyn for the CRC to provide technical assistance for the update of the Town of Dillwyn Comprehensive Plan. Motion carried.

Town of Phenix Request – Agreement for New Round of Income Surveys for USDA Grant: Mr. Fortune stated as background to the new request, that the CRC had previously assisted the Town of Phenix in creating a income survey instrument, and receiving approval from the Lynchburg USDA office to proceed with surveys. The CRC completed the survey field work and compiled the income survey data for a USDA Application being submitted by a Consulting firm. However, after the Consultant submitted the compiled results to USDA, the State Office informed the Consultant and Town that they should been contacted to give approval and a specific format should have been used instead. In light of this new situation, the Town was able to get approval from Southeast RCAP to use remaining funds on a planning grant to complete the new income survey. Therefore, a copy of the new agreement for the CRC to complete a 2nd set of income surveys in the Town is included in the Council members' packet for approval.

Ms. Hawthorne moved to approve the Agreement for the CRC to provide administrative and technical assistance to the Town of Phenix to complete a second set of Income Surveys to assist with a USDA funding application. Motion carried.

Staff Report on VTrans2040 Multimodal Transportation Plan Regional Forum: Ms. Foster reported she had attended a VTrans2040 Multimodal Transportation Plan Regional Forum for stakeholders in the region held in Lynchburg, VA on May 28, 2015. VDOT's on-call consultant was facilitating the workshop to collect critical input from each region for the Transportation Needs Assessment. Ms. Foster stated she continued to share the transportation concerns of a rural region. Mr. Walker stated he appreciated the staff attending events on behalf of the region to share the rural perspective. Mr. Walker stated many localities are not able to attend all of the various forums and this was a valued service to the region that many overlook.

2014 Assistance to Firefighters Grant Program Funding Announcements Have Begun: Ms. Foster stated FEMA has begun announcements of award for the 2014 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Program. The CRC assisted five Fire Departments in applying for AFG assistance this past December, including Amelia, Prospect, Phenix, Hampden-Sydney and Kenbridge. Announcements will continue until all funds have been expended. Ms. Foster stated announcements are made weekly on the AFG website and will like continue through the fall.

CRC Hosting Regional VDOT Transportation Alternative Program Workshop: Ms. Foster stated the CRC will be hosting one of the regional workshops across the state for the VDOT Transportation Alternative Program. Ms. Foster stated it will be held on Wednesday, July 22, 2015 in The Mill Room. Localities have already been informed of the upcoming workshop. Applications will be due November 1, 2015.

Governor's Announcement – New Executive Director for Virginia Tobacco Commission: Ms. Hickman stated the Governor has announced the appointment of Mr. Evan Feinman to be the new Executive Director of the newly named Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission.

Ms. Hawthorne also noted in a change in the Tobacco Commission's Economic Development Grant Program that now requires a dollar for dollar match. She stated there was an error in the announcement when it stated there currently is not a match required for this program.

Council Member Comments: There were none.

Other Business:

Ms. Foster stated the CRC received in the mail this morning the CRC's Rural Transportation Planning Assistance Program FY-16 Letter of Authorization. Ms. Foster stated the CRC would need authorization for the Executive Director to execute the documents in order to proceed.

Mr. Bennett moved to authorize the Executive Director to execute the FY-16 Letter of Authorization for the CRC Rural Transportation Planning Assistance Program. Motion carried.

Ms. Hickman stated the USDA Rural Development has awarded the Virginia Cooperative Extension funding to support an expansion of the Stronger Economies Together (SET) program first launched in 2010. Several PDCs (including the CRC) along with Virginia's Growth Alliance which is the marketing organization that covers part of the CRC region, have been invited to become part of the 2015 SET Expansion Project. Since both Virginia Growth Alliance and CRC have some common coverage areas, discussions have started to develop a partnership to maximize the impact of this opportunity. Ms. Hickman stated the specifics are still being ironed out. There is no match requirement for the available funding. The Project would entail technical assistance for a workshop to carry out the mission fully provided by the Virginia Tech Office of Economic Development. Va Tech will not only deliver the content but will also guide participants in facilitated conversations. Ms. Hickman stated she would bring more information back when it is available.

<u>Council Member Comments:</u> There were none.
