- Following each Board member's comment period, the remaining two (2) minutes shall be set aside for appropriate response, and shall be divided equally between those members of the Board wishing to respond, and as directed by the Chairman.

RESCINDING DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY County of Prince Edward, Virginia

WHEREAS, the County Administrator/Director of Emergency Management of the County of Prince Edward, Virginia does hereby find:

The severe Winter Storm that of January 22, 2016 through January 24, 2016, that produced significant periods of sustained heavy snowfall, sleet and gusty winds, with total accumulations in the County of 8 to 10+ inches, caused dangerous public safety conditions and peril to life and property, and necessitated the Declaration of Local Emergency, effective 5:00 p.m. Thursday, January 21, 2016, in the County of Prince Edward, Virginia, has now abated;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED, that an emergency no longer exists in the County of Prince Edward, Virginia, and the Declaration of Local Emergency is rescinded, effective immediately.

In Re: Memorandum of Understanding, Vehicle Fire Training Prop

Mrs. Puckett stated the Town of Farmville is pursuing the development of a regional fire trining center for area Volunteer Fire Departments. At present, the Farmville Burn Building is under construction and the Town is pursuing a \$50,000 grant through the Virginia Department of Fire Programs for the purchase of a mobile Vehicle Fire Training Prop and a flat-bed trailer on which to haul it. The grant funds will cover the purchase cost of both the prop and the trailer.

One of the eligibility requirements for the grant application is the Town, as the lead locality applicant, must document the existence of a multi-jurisdictional regional training partnership.

A Memorandum of Understanding has been drafted by the Town regarding the use of the Vehicle Fire Training Prop by the volunteer fire departments in Prince Edward County. She pointed out that the Town reserves the right to request financial support from the participating localities but funding is not a prerequisite for the County's volunteer fire departments to use the burn building or the training prop.

Supervisor Gray questioned the longevity of the vehicle prop; Mrs. Puckett stated it is specially fabricated for fire training prop. Mr. Bartlett added it should last at least ten years; it is a shell with no seats or anything to pollute the air.

Supervisor Pride asked if training will be done at different times for the localities. Mrs. Puckett stated there will most likely be training at different times and explained the ways training has taken place in the past. She added the use of the prop will be handled through the Farmville Fire Department.

Memorandum of Understanding
Multi-jurisdictional Regional Fire Training Partnership
For Use of a Vehicle Fire Training Prop
Between
The Town of Farmville, Farmville Volunteer Fire Department
And
Prince Edward County

Purpose:

The Town of Farmville and the Farmville Fire Department recognizes the value of a regional partnership in fire service related training as well as Virginia Department of Fire Programs Certification Training. The purpose of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to provide an outline for the use of a vehicle fire training prop used by multiple jurisdictions to enhance fire training in the Division 3 Area.

Scope:

This MOU provides that the Town of Farmville will maintain the fire training prop and provide the participating fire departments with access to the training prop as needed, unless otherwise in use. The participating fire department shall be responsible for the replacement of fuel for the training prop. Also the liability shall be assumed by the participating fire department utilizing the training prop. While the lead fire department participants (Town of Farmville, Charlotte, Cumberland and Prince Edward Counties) shall be the primary users, the prop will be made available upon request and at the discretion of the Town of Farmville. Agencies shall operate under the same guidelines as provided and a qualified operator shall be onsite to oversee the training operation.

Term:

The period of the MOU shall be based on the fiscal year, beginning on July 1st of the current year and end on June 30th of the following year. The MOU shall be evaluated each year and any changes shall be

incorporated into the next year's MOU. The agreement shall exist for the serviceable life of the prop.

Monetary Terms:

This MOU further outlines that each use of the training prop shall be documented and the amount of propane used shall be replenished after each use to ensure a state of readiness. The Town of Farmville reserves the right to request, but shall not require, funding from the participating localities should operating

and maintenance expenditures become excessive.

Mr. Bartlett then stated the Finance Committee discussed the direction for the County Administrator to follow regarding outside agencies and a few state agencies. The Finance Committee directed Mr. Bartlett to develop a spreadsheet containing all of the outside agencies that the County has funded in the past. Mr. Bartlett provided a spreadsheet showing the 10-year funding history of such organizations. He added if funding is mandated, those organizations were was not added in this worksheet. The Finance Committee directed these agencies to be set at \$0. The only exemptions are the Fire and EMS agencies.

Supervisor Timmons stated that the Finance Committee did not recommend these agencies be funded at \$0. This process would force discussion and agreement on each agency. He reminded the Board that currently, Prince Edward County is at \$1.2 million over budget this year, plus another \$200,000 for the roof.

Mr. Bartlett reviewed the budget update:

Overall, I estimate revenues will exceed the budget by almost \$169,000 which is about seventenths of one percent. The greatest positive variance involves General Property Taxes which I forecast will exceed the budget by about \$174,500. The greatest negative variance belongs to Court Fines and Forfeitures with an expected shortfall of approximately \$65,300. This shortfall was created by staffing turnover in the Sheriff's office, a situation that is now resolved. The sheriff expects the revenue collections from this source will increase, but I assumed the collections would continue at the current rate. If collections return to FY15 levels an additional \$30-\$40k will be collected.

Another significant shortfall can be found in the vehicle licenses revenue line. It is expected that revenue source will be \$40,540 under the budget. This is being caused by a delay in the payment to the Town of \$68,903 for the FY15 amounts collected from Town residents. This amount would normally have been charged to FY15 and reduced the revenues in FY15; instead it was charged to the current FY. Because of the timing issue revenues in FY15 were \$541,664 versus a budget of \$460,000 or a positive variance of \$81,664. Over the two year period this revenue source exceeded the budgeted amounts by \$41,124.

On the Expenditure side of the equation I am estimating we will under expend the budget by \$201,637. The majority of the under expenditure will occur in Jail Costs (\$83,500), Building Official (\$41,600) and Planning Department (\$55,000). The savings in the last two departments is because of a position being vacant in each department. I expect this amount is conservative and would not be surprised to see even greater savings once I am further along in the budget process.

When adding the positive variances of the revenues and expenditures we should expect the draw on the fund balance to decrease by \$371,000. But this estimate is based on collection as of December 31, 2015. Thus the increase in the budget for the roofing contract of \$205,500 is not included in these calculations.

As you will recall the FY16 budget was approved with a transfer from the fund balance of slightly over \$1 million. Our challenge this FY will be to close that shortfall by either (1) decreasing spending; (2) increasing revenues; or (3) a combination of both.

We have received some good news. The County's VRS rate will fall by 28% from a rate of 11.4% to 8.91%. Based on current salaries that decrease will save the County approximately \$90,000 in FY17. On the other hand the County's Group Life Insurance rate will increase from 1.19% to 1.31%. This will increase our costs by about \$4,400. Overall the County should expect a net decrease in those two items of about \$85,000.

In the current year we have \$100,000 in a capital line item. Hopefully, this line item can be reduced if not eliminated, thereby saving those funds. We have been advised the Victim Witness grant will increase approximately \$7,000. There will be no need to increase expenditures in that program, thus allowing those funds to fall to the bottom line. The Sheriff will request to purchase two cars in FY17. The FY16 budget contained \$108,000 which allowed him to buy three cars. Thus, we should see a decrease of about \$38,000 of which he will ask for \$30,000 to buy a new repeater and place it on the Tower on Leigh Mountain. This will result in a net savings of \$8,000. At this time we know of two retirements which have the potential to reduce expenses several thousand dollars; the final amount to be determined after the positions are filled but I would estimate the savings will be at least \$15,000.

Adding these various anticipated savings results in an amount of \$130,000. If we include the \$85,000 in savings from the reduced VRS rate brings the total to \$215,000. Based on the FY16 review of real estate and personal property collection and adding normal growth in those two areas I anticipate revenue estimates will increase. But because the Commissioner of Revenue has just begun the assessment process for the year I have no empirical data to make an estimate with any level of confidence at this time.

Mr. Bartlett then asked the Board for direction in the development of the budget. He suggested the Board think about the presentation and give recommendations at the monthly meeting. The Board concurred.

Chairman Simpson called the meeting to order.

Dr. K. David Smith, Superintendent, stated information regarding the Governor's budget which was presented in January [2016] is available; the Senate and House budgets are still not available. He reviewed information in comparison to the Governor's budget only. Dr. Smith said there has been discussion that the funds allocated can be spent on a few instructional aides targeted to intervention. At this time, it appears that there will be no local match requirement.

Cindy Wahrman, Division Director of Finance, began by reviewing the Governor's proposed budget, comparing the FY15-16 budget to FY16-17 proposed budget. She said the composite index for the current year is 0.3274; next year, the composite index will be 0.3377, which indicates the State determined the local ability to pay is being increased. This decreases the amount of funding from the State. Mrs. Wahrman then reviewed the ADM and Standards of Quality (SOQ) funding. She continued discussing the programs funded by the lottery. Mrs. Wahrman stated the increase in State funding based on the Governor's proposed ADM of 1,990 is \$374,868.

Mrs. Wahrman reviewed Preliminary Funding Increases, Reductions, Expenditure increases, and stated the Net Preliminary Revenue Shortfall is \$1,749,839. She then discussed the class size ratios in the elementary and middle schools. Mrs. Wahrman reviewed the Total Budget and Local Funding Comparison (\$24,337,426 and \$8,317,182, respectively); she reviewed the changes that have taken place over the past five years, and stated the Food Service Department is self-supporting and based on the budget, a 1% salary increase has been requested. The Food Service Director stated that the budget can be maintained with the

1% salary increase. The food department is required to have an average of three months funding at the end

of the year to begin the next year because it takes several months for the Federal reimbursement funds to

come in.

Mrs. Wahrman stated the Weldon-Cooper Center provided a report for Prince Edward County

Schools for the projections on ADM for this year and next year. She said the School Board approved the

budget base on an ADM of 1,990.00 for the 2016-2017 year.

Mrs. Wahrman then reviewed the Tentative Capital Improvement Plan. She stated any of the

Chairman Simpson called the meeting to order. Supervisor Gray offered the invocation and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

In Re: Public Participation

Bemeché Hicks, Lockett District, reported several road issues at High Rock Road and Haskins Lane. He stated there are large potholes along the road and it appears to be sinking. Mr. Hicks then stated that along Route 460, nothing has been done to provide a ditch line; water runs into his back yard and ponds on approximately one-quarter of his property. He requested a ditch line be dug along Route 460 to alleviate this problem.

Kenneth Jackson, Lockett District, presented a letter to the Board regarding a proposed business and stated the Virginia Ordinance allows discussion in public session; he said certain topics can be divulged such as potential revenue and projected jobs generated in the area. He then stated the Board needs to focus on several items, such as the election of School Board members, adding or removing a Supervisor

to make the membership an odd number, and asked the Board to watch spending because co-signing a \$2.5 million loan doesn't look good.

Supervisor Timmons asked which note Mr. Jackson referred to. Mr. Jackson said it was for the YMCA; Supervisor Timmons stated the Board did not co-sign for that requested loan.

Cornell Walker, Prospect District, reported a traffic hazard on Pin Oak Road at the intersection of Hendricks Road and Sulphur Springs Road. He said at the December [2015] meeting, it was discussed there was \$25,000 which could have been used for safety items. He added that after Supervisor Gray's Town Hall Meeting, it was suggested that two mirrors be installed so drivers can see what is approaching on Pin Oak Road. He questioned the discussion of allowing the Town of Farmville to have that funding for safety items.

Several Supervisors indicated the Town did not receive the funds.

Mr. Walker stated previously it was requested that the hill be cut down; he asked the Board to consider the installation of two mirrors to allow drivers to see both directions.

Jennifer Bowen, 4-H Extension Agent, introduced nine members of the 4-H InnoVAtive Leadership Academy.

Ellen Wood, Hampden District, requested that the Board fully fund the schools and fund the search for the new Superintendent of Schools. She stated the Board does have a major impact on the schools and its hiring of a new superintendent by its financial control.

Theresa Clark, Longwood University, Social Work Program Department Chair, introduced the students from Longwood University from the Development of Social Policy class, attending to see the government in action.

In Re: Board of Supervisors Comments

Supervisor Gray welcomed all to the meeting and thanked them for their participation.

Supervisor Pride welcomed all and stated all have a say in the government. She thanked the Board members for making her feel welcome and thanked Mr. Bartlett and Mrs. Puckett for their guidance.

Supervisor Timmons welcomed all in attendance adding it was encouraging to see all the young people involved in 4-H and the Longwood University students.

Chairman Simpson welcomed all in attendance.

Supervisor Townsend welcomed the citizens in attendance and said he hopes to see all again next month.

Supervisor Wilck reminded the Board members of the Leadership Day at the Prince Edward County Elementary school Wednesday morning.

Supervisor Cooper-Jones welcomed all and thanked Dr. Clark and Ms. Bowen for taking the time to bring their youth groups and asked all to come again.

Scot Shippee, Resident Engineer, VDOT, advised the Board maintenance on pot holes and other safety issues is being done currently; he stated gravel is being added to unpaved roads when possible. He added brush cutting, cleaning ditches and adding pipes will be done in the coming months, as soon as possible.

In Re: County Administrator's Report - Tobacco Commission Grant Application

Mr. Bartlett stated the Tobacco Commission has recently announced a second Southside Economic Development Grant round for communities that still have funds in their local allocations. Currently, Prince Edward County has \$145,405 available. These funds, if awarded, could be used towards

the design and construction of a new Industrial Access Road at the Prince Edward Industrial Park.

The County has already received a total of \$377,475 (\$328,395 and \$49,080) from the

Commission toward the projected cost of the Access Road, which is \$1,058,650.

The scope of work for the road project is to construct a 1,500 foot road acceptable for transfer to

the VDOT road system once complete. This will include road clearing, road grading, erosion and sediment

control, ditch line protection, storm water management, culvert pipe, headwall/wing-walls, asphalt paving,

and 900 feet of 12-inch waterline. In addition, dirt will need to be moved from the adjoining Lot #11 to

equalize the grade of the road, thus eliminating a steep drop in the topography. A bonus to utilizing the dirt

from Lot #11 is that the lot will be nearly ready as a "ready-to-go" pad site.

Supervisor Timmons questioned if the funding could be used for any other project. Mr. Bartlett stated that it must be used for Economic Development.



CRITERIA FOR SELECTION OF SCHOOL BOARD MEMBERS

- 1. Each of the eight School Board members shall be appointed by a majority vote of the full Board of Supervisors when the School Board members' terms expire. This vote of the Board of Supervisors shall be by the show of hands.
- 2. The School Board members' terms of office shall commence on July 1.
- 3. The criteria for the appointment of School Board members are as follow:
 - a. Each year, the Supervisor from each election district in which a School Board member's term expires shall appoint a three (3) or five (5) member Citizens Committee to review and select candidate(s) for appointment to the School Board.
 - b. The membership of the Citizens Committee shall be announced at the Board of Supervisors meeting in February and published in a newspaper of general circulation, and the voters of the electoral district encouraged to submit nominations to the Chairman of the Committee.
 - c. For the March Board meeting, the County Administrator shall schedule and publish notice of a public hearing at which citizens will have an opportunity to submit names of candidates to be considered for appointment to the School Board. The members of the appointed Citizens Committee shall attend.
 - d. After the public hearing, the Citizens Committee shall interview and seriously consider all persons who are nominated and express willingness to serve, if appointed.
 - e. At the April Board meeting, the Citizens Committee shall report to the full Board of Supervisors a list of candidates for consideration. If the incumbent is requesting reappointment and is the only citizen expressing an interest, the Citizens Committee shall only be required to submit one name, the incumbent's, for consideration. If the incumbent is not requesting reappointment or is ineligible for reappointment, the Citizens Committee shall submit one or more names for consideration. The Citizens Committee shall also provide the Board biographical information on each candidate.
 - f. At the May Board meeting, a public hearing shall be held on the candidate(s) submitted at the April meeting.
 - g. At the June meeting, the Board, by a majority vote, shall appoint one candidate to the School Board.
 - h. The Citizens Committee, in selecting the candidates, shall consider the following:
 - 1. Person <u>must</u> be an eligible voter and resident of the election district;
 - 2. Person should be a freeholder;
 - 3. Person <u>must</u> be willing to serve on the School Board;
 - 4. Person should have at least a high school education;
 - 5. Person should be oriented to public service;
 - 6. Person should be involved, concerned, and dedicated to public education:
 - 7. Person should be independent (base decisions on factual matters rather than as a representative of a group or faction);
 - 8. Person should be able to perform the duties and obligations of School Board members;
 - 9. Person should be of integrity in all matters;
 - Person should be above prejudice with regard to race, creed, sex, religion, age, and national origin.

Issue: Fire Department Capital Expenditure Financing Fund

Summary: In 2011, the Board of Supervisors approved the creation of the Fire Department Capital Expenditure Financing Fund (Attachment 1). In summary, the County will make available up to a total of \$600,000 in low interest financing to the members of the Prince Edward Area Firefighters Association (to include Prince Edward Volunteer Rescue Squad) for the purchase of trucks and apparatus.

Section 15.2-954 of the *Code of Virginia* authorizes any locality to make loans to any nonprofit organization furnishing firefighting or rescue services (Attachment 2).

At present, the Darlington Heights Volunteer Fire Department has the only outstanding loan. They borrowed \$110,000 and will make their final payment of \$25,826 on August 1 of this year.

Attachment 3 is a copy of the master agreement. This agreement, signed by all of the VFD and the Rescue Squad contains the procedures by which the Fire Association will request funds to be provided and for which organization, mthe County will create a promissory note, and provides that in the event of a default each member of the Association guarantees repayment of the loan.

At its February 25, 2016 meeting, the Prince Edward Area Firefighters Association approved a request from the Prospect Volunteer Fire Department for \$188,000 of funding to finance a fire truck. See the attached letter from Fire Association President Ralph Crawley. The County received the request from the Fire Association on February 26, 2016, (Attachment 4).

Attachment 5 is a copy of the existing Promissory Note with Darlington Heights VFD. This note was developed by the County Attorney and will be used as a template to develop the Note with Prospect VFD.

McKay and Supervisor Wilck, met with the Fire Association on July 6, 2011 to discuss the draft Capital

Expenditure/Finance Agreement. The draft agreement met the majority of the requirements discussed by

the Board of Supervisors; the Committee added three requirements and made it clear that this funding is a

one-time event and will not be an annual donation.

Discussion followed regarding Prince Edward Volunteer Rescue Squad becoming a member of the

Fire Association, and regarding the anticipated specifics of the process in which the funding would be used.

Supervisor Simpson made a motion to allocate \$100,000 to be used by the Prince Edward

Prince Edward County Firefighters Association Capital Expenditure/Finance Agreement

Purpose: To provide low interest finance to the Prince Edward County Firefighters Association Department Members, for the upgrading and purchase of apparatus. (Apparatus: Pumpers, Tankers, and Specialty Vehicles approved by Association.)

Funds: Funding will be provided to this project from Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors at an annual interest rate of 1.5% annually. This rate will remain in effect annually and reviewed each year at the counties regular June meeting. Any changes required to the rate will take effect July of that calendar year.

Amount: The County will provide funding, up to \$600,000, for capital purchases approved by the association membership. At no time shall the total of a loan/ or loans from any member department exceed the fund amount minus \$50,000. It is the intent of the association to maintain a reserve of \$50,000 for use by Department Members in cases of emergency.

Terms: 5 years/60 months for all purchases

Payments: Monthly, Annually, Semi-Annually, or Quarterly

Interest: Prince Edward Rate 1.5% + Association Rate 1.5% annually = Current Rate 3.0%

Additional Requirements:

- 1. Prince Edward County will hold title to vehicle purchased
- 2. Prince Edward County agrees that the 1.5% interest charges, for the Association, will be rolled back into the fund (\$500,000) to increase the amount of available capital for additional purchases.

Administration:

- 1. Members must request money at a regular monthly business meeting of Prince Edward Firefighters Association.
- 2. Requested monies will be approved by the chiefs within the association or their designee at a special called meeting by the President of the association, provided the Treasurer has confirmed that funds are available for the project.
- 3. The President of the Association will make the request for the money from Prince Edward County Board or their designated committee.

- 4. Members agree to pay off all loan activities within the 5 year/60 month cycle, or seek additional funding on their own to pay off such loan, if they are unable to complete their obligation within the terms provided by the Association.
- 5. Members can pay off the loan early with no additional fees or interest charges, other than interest due during the time of the loan.
- 6. Prince Edward County will provide an amortization schedule, and payment amount for each purchase.
- 7. If payments are not made, the Board of Supervisors at their own discretion could:
 - a. Defer payment
 - b. Hold back the annual contribution
 - c. Take possession of the truck
- 8. Funding is also to be made available to rescue squads.

AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made this $/2^{ik}$ day of Ju/y, 2011, by and the COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA, (hereinafter referred to as "County"); the PRINCE EDWARD AREA FIREFIGHTERS ASSOCIATION, INC., a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Association"); the PRINCE EDWARD VOLUNTEER RESCUE SQUAD, INC., a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as the "Squad"); the HAMPDEN-SYDNEY VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT, INC., a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Hampden-Sydney"); the PROSPECT VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT, INC., a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Prospect"); the RICE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT, INC., a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Rice"), the DARLINGTON HEIGHTS VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT, INC., a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Darlington Heights"); the PAMPLIN VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT & EMS, INC., a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Pamplin"); and the **MEHERRIN** VOLUNTEER FIRE & RESCUE, INC., ENGINE CO. NO. 5, a Virginia Corporation, (hereinafter referred to as "Meherrin").

WHEREAS, County has expressed a desire to provide a fund of \$600,000.00, from which it will make low interest loans to the parties hereto for the purpose of purchasing needed equipment and other capital expenditures in order to continue to provide for the safety of

the citizens of Prince Edward County; and

WHEREAS, Squad, Hampden-Sydney, Prospect, Rice, Pamplin, Darlington Heights and Meherrin have formed the Association for the mutual benefit of the parties hereto in order to determine the amount of any loan from the fund as well as the priority of the equipment needs of the various departments; and

WHEREAS, the parties hereto wish to establish the guidelines and procedures which will be used in order to secure a loan from said fund;

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and the mutual covenants contained herein, the parties do hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Upon the execution of this agreement by all of the parties hereto, County will appropriate the sum of \$600,000.00 to be used as a loan fund for the parties hereto for the purchase of equipment.
- 2. The Association shall male all decisions concerning the priorities and the amounts of any loans from the fund to any of the parties hereto.
- 3. Upon receipt of a written notice from the Association which advises County of the party to whom money is to be lent from the fund and the amount of the loan request, County will cause a promissory note to be prepared for execution by the borrowing party. Said promissory note shall be in the amount stated in the notice from Association and shall bear simple interest at the rate of three per cent (3%) per annum and shall be payable in equal monthly installments of principle and interest to County over a term not to exceed sixty (60) months. Each member of the Association which executes this document does hereby guarantee the repayment of said loan and shall be liable for 14.285 per cent(14.285%) of the outstanding balance of principle and interest due in the event of a default by the maker of the note. In the event that a default shall occur, each

signatory department shall have thirty days from the date of receipt of written notice of default to remit to County the full amount of their share of the principle and interest due. In the event that said payment is not received within the said thirty day period, County may withhold said payment amount from any funds that have been or will be appropriated by County to the said member.

- 4. All written notices required by the terms of this agreement shall be sent to County c/o County Administrator, 111 South Street, Farmville, Virginia 23901 and to the other parties hereto at the registered address of the other parties hereto as reflected in the records of the State Corporation Commission and shall be by certified mail with return receipt requested.
- 5. In the event that the maker of the note shall make all payments due thereon annually in a timely fashion and there are no other events of default which occur during the term of the note, County will pay to the Association an amount equal to fifty per cent (50%) of the interest received by County during the preceding twelve months.
- 6. Each maker of a note under this agreement shall name County as a co-insured on any property and casualty insurance policy and any liability insurance policy placed on said equipment and shall provide County with evidence of said insurance and a copy of any endorsement thereto which names County as a co-insured. Failure to provide evidence of insurance shall constitute an event of default and County shall have the right to purchase insurance on said equipment and add the expense thereof to the balance due on said note and receive interest thereon.
- 7. The parties to this agreement represent that they have the authority to enter into this agreement as evidenced by the resolutions attached hereto and made a part hereof by reference.

PROMISSORY NOTE

\$120,000.00

Farmville, Virginia February 20, 2012

For Value Received, the undersigned, Darlington Heights Volunteer Fire Department, Inc., a Virginia Corporation, promise(s) to pay to the County of Prince Edward, Virginia, or order, the principal sum of \$120,000.00, with interest from date at rate of 3% per annum on the unpaid balance until paid. The said principal and interest shall be payable at the Office of the County Administrator, 111 South Stree, Farmville, Virginia, or at such other place as the holder may designate in writing, in five (5) annual installments on the 1st day of August of each year. The first installment shall be due on the 1st day of August 2012 and shall be in the amount of \$25,650.00. The next three annual installment payments of principal and interest shall be in the amount of \$25,826.60 commencing on the 1st day of August, 2013. The fifth (5th) or last installment shall fall due on August 1, 2016, on which date the entire unpaid principal of the Note, together with all accrued interest thereon, shall be immediately due and payable.

If default be made in any payment as above provided the unpaid balance of this Note with all accrued interest thereon may, at the option of the holder, be declared due and payable at once. Failure to exercise this option shall not constitute a waiver of the right to exercise the same in the event of any subsequent default.

Each and every maker and endorser of this note severally waives presentment, demand, protest and notice of dishonor, as well as the benefit of any exemption under the homestead laws, and agrees to remain bound for the payment hereof notwithstanding any agreement or agreements for the extension of the due date of any of said installments, in whole or in part, made by the holder before, on, or after maturity thereof, even though without their or any of their consent, or without notice to them or any of them, but reserve the right of anticipation, and agrees to pay a twenty per cent attorney's fee if placed in the hands of an attorney for collection.

County Administrator's Report

Summary:

- 1. At its December 8, 2015 meeting, the Board of Supervisors unamiously approved the transfer of the County's residual allocation of VDOT Revenue Sharing Funds to the Town of Farmville contingent on approval by VDOT. The Board authorized the County Administrator to sign any required documents. Such a transfer of funds is outside the normal operations of VDOT and they had to research if such a transfer was allowed and if so, what process to follow. VDOT has determined they will allow the transfer of the funds, but require that the Board adopt the attached resolution.
- 2. During its February 4, 2016 meeting, the Board of Supervisors was provided a preview of the FY17 Budget. This preview discussed some of the challenges that will be faced and provided a synopsis of various items that were already known and that will impact the FY17 Budget.

Additionally, Board members discussed the possibility of directing the County Administrator to present a budget to the Board that would have zero funding for most of the entity's that are considered "Outside Agencies." These are nonprofit or other governmental entities that provide various services to our citizens. Several members of the Board indicated they would like to think about the issue before making a decision and asked that the matter be tabled and discussed later. This is the last Board meeting until March 22, 2016, when I present the County Administrator's budget.

If no direction is provided, I will present my recommendation and the Board can then make the final decision on the amount of funding each organization will receive. This is the process that has been used during my tenure as the County Administrator. The attachment displays the organizations that fit this description and shows a ten-year funding history.

Mr. Walker moved that the minutes be approved as presented. Motion carried.

Treasurer's Report

December and January Financial Statements: The Treasurer requested approval for the December and January Financial Statements be tabled until the March meeting.

Report of Officers & Committees

<u>Chairman's Report:</u> The Chairman did not have a report.

Appointment of CRC Vice-Chairman: Ms. Hickman stated the past Vice-Chairman was Ms. Cassandra Stish. Ms. Stish no longer serves on the Buckingham Board of Supervisors and is no longer a CRC Representative. Therefore, the CRC will need to appoint a new Vice-Chairman.

Ms. Hickman stated the CRC Bylaws states the Vice-Chairman shall perform the duties and have the powers of the Chairman during the absence or disability of the Chairman, and he or she shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as the Council shall designate from time to time.

Mr. Walker moved and Mr. Dunnavant seconded to nominate Mr. Gleason as the CRC Vice-Chairman. Motion carried.

There was discussion on what would be the appropriate time for the Boards of Supervisors to hold the Dialogue meetings with the CRC Representatives and Staff.

Scoping the Future – Discussion of Innovative/Regional Ideas: Ms. Hickman stated this attachment is provided each month for the discussion of Innovative and/or Regional Ideas. Ms Hickman noted the listing also provides room for CRC Representatives to jot down ideas that can be added to the listing and discussed during the monthly Council meeting.

Mr. Timmons stated Prince Edward County is having problems with the County having "dead zone" areas where fire & rescue cannot be reached by radio communications. Mr. Timmons stated the County has commissioned a study on the problem to locate the dead zone areas and the equipment necessary to eradicate the problem. Other representatives stated their counties are having similar problems. It was stated that this problem does not stop at county boundary lines and this issue may be something that can be addressed at a regional level as a cost saving measure.

There was discussion on the matter.

Staff were asked to discuss this issue with the County Administrators at the Chief Administrators Officers meeting.

Old Business

Staff Reports:

FY 2014-2015 CRC Annual Report Brochure: Ms. Hickman stated the CRC Representatives were sent a FY 2014-2015 CRC Annual Report in the Council packet for their information.

Update on Meetings with Eligible Non-Members: Ms. Hickman stated at the December CRC meeting it was requested that she take the lead in meeting with all eligible Planning District 14 non-members to request that they appoint a non-voting representative to attend the CRC monthly meetings to participate in discussions. Ms. Hickman stated in January she met with representatives from Nottoway, Cumberland, Farmville, and Blackstone to provide them with a CRC Annual Report Brochure, discuss the request and to confirm she would be making a presentation before the Board of Supervisors/Town Councils. Ms. Hickman stated she also met with representatives from Hampden-Sydney College in January.

Ms. Hickman stated she made a presentation at the January Nottoway County Board of Supervisors meeting. Mr. Gilliam also attended the meeting. The Board considered the request but decided to table the matter until February. Ms. Hickman stated she plans to also attend the February meeting.

Ms. Hickman stated she will be making presentations during the February meetings of the Cumberland Board of Supervisors and the Blackstone Town Council. Ms. Hickman stated she also will be making a presentation to the Farmville Town Council at their March meeting. Ms. Hickman stated she is currently working on setting up a meeting with both SVCC and Longwood University to discuss the request.

Update on Economic Development Administration (EDA), Economic Development District

(EDD) Status: Ms. Hickman stated in December the CRC took action to poll CRC Representatives in January after new CRC representatives were appointed to the CRC to determine their backgrounds in order to provide this information to the Economic Development Administration (EDA) to determine if the current Council makeup would meet the needs of board representation for an Economic Development District (EDD) designation status. If not, to determine from EDA what types of representation would need to be added. Ms. Hickman stated the last new representative was appointed on January 20th. Therefore, she would be polling all Representatives in the near future to find out their backgrounds.

Ms. Hickman stated EDA previously had required that 35% of the governing board had to have a diverse representation, broader than strictly elected officials. Under this scenario, the CRC's current Council structure, without change, would not meet this quideline. However, the most recent Code of Federal Regulations relating to an EDA designated EDD, the percentage requirement is no longer in place. Ms. Hickman stated however, even if the CRC meets the requirements, it is not guaranteed if it applies that it will receive designation as an EDD. Ms. Hickman also stated before the CRC could become an EDD it will need to have an EDA approved Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy (CEDS). Ms. Hickman stated included in the council packet was a summary of requirements for completing a CEDS. Ms. Hickman stated the benefit of an EDD designation for the region would include annual funding for the CRC to carry out the EDA approved CEDS which currently is \$70,000 with a dollar for dollar match requirement. In addition, member localities would have access to EDA funding programs for projects that they currently are ineligible to apply for because there is no designated EDD for this region. Ms. Hickman went over a map included in the Council packet displaying there are currently 10 EDD's in Virginia all following Planning District boundaries. There are also 5 EDA approved CEDS regions, also following Planning District regions, that are awaiting EDA designation of their EDD. There are 6 regions that do not have an approved CEDS or EDD region.

There was discussion on the matter in ways to bring the Council representation in compliance if needed.

Mr. Timmons moved and Mr. Walker seconded for the Executive Director to poll CRC representatives on their backgrounds to see if the CRC will qualify for EDD designation, as defined by Federal Regulation Title 13 Chapter III, Part 304.2(c)(2). If so, then move forward in completing a Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy. If not, then doing whatever is necessary to add representation to meet this requirement including as an example, adding at-large members to the council, then proceeding with the completion of the CEDS in a six month timeframe. Motion carried.

Update on CRC Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Update: Mr. Fortune stated the Commonwealth Regional Council is currently working on an update of the Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan for Planning District 14 including all of the counties, except for Cumberland which chose not to participate. The Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan will identify ways to mitigate the effects of hazards, mainly natural hazards. By participating in an approved Plan, localities become eligible to apply for FEMA funding.

A kick-off meeting originally was scheduled for January 26th but due to inclement weather conditions, it was rescheduled to February 16, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. The meeting will be held in The Mill Conference Room which is located in the basement of the CRC office building.

Kenbridge Volunteer Fire Department 2015 Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG) Application Submission: Ms. Foster reported the CRC assisted the Kenbridge Volunteer Fire

Department in applying for FEMA, Assistance to Firefighters Grant Assistance Funds to purchase a Vehicle Exhaust Removal System for the Fire Department Facility. The total budget for the project is \$57,475. The Federal Request for funds is \$54,739, with the Applicant providing a 5% match of \$2,736. The Application was submitted January 14, 2016. This is a national grant program; therefore fire departments are competing nationwide for these funds. Grant awards should begin in the spring. Grant awards are usually posted weekly until all funds are expended.

There was discussion on the AFG program.

CRC/Virginia Growth Alliance (VGA) Stronger Economies Together (SET) Expansion Project **Regional Meeting Held:** Ms. Hickman stated a regional meeting was held on January 18th at Longwood University on the CRC/VGA SET Expansion Project. At this meeting, the Virginia Tech Office of Economic Development shared regional data from the digital survey/phone survey that was conducted throughout the VGA and CRC region. Ms. Hickman stated the CRC's role in this process was to help engage CRC member localities new to the VGA region which include Amelia, Buckingham and Prince Edward. They which were not part of the original SET Project when the VGA Regional Economic Development Strategic Plan was developed. Ms. Hickman stated the CRC also assisted in helping draw connections between Town economic activity and county and regional efforts. Ms. Hickman handed out a copy of the survey results provided at the meeting for council members' information. Ms. Hickman noted the VGA region included several additional localities not included in the CRC region. Ms. Hickman stated the meeting was very well attended. Ms. Hickman stated another regional meeting is scheduled for the evening of February 18th also at Longwood University to allow for those unable to attend a day meeting. Ms. Hickman stated information on both meetings was shared with all CRC member localities including the respective towns. Administrative staff were asked to provide this information to the Boards of Supervisors and Town Council Members.

Council Member Comments: There were none.

New Business

Staff Reports

Governor's 2016-2018 Biennial Budget & PDC Funding: Ms. Hickman stated the attachment provided in the council packet provides an overview of the Governor's proposed FY 2106-2018 Biennium Budget Proposal as analyzed by Mr. Jim Regimbal of Fiscal Analytics for the Virginia's Association of Counties (VACO). Ms. Hickman stated of particular interest for the region is the GO Virginia Initiative. While falling under the Department of Housing and Community Development in the proposed budget, GO Virginia is being covered under a separate line item for funding. Under the proposed legislation, planning district commissions/regional councils will play a role. Also, additional funding opportunities will be available for localities and regional initiatives.

Ms. Hickman also noted planning district commissions/regional councils state funding which also falls under the Department of Housing and Community Development in the budget, are currently proposed at the same amount as last year with no decrease in funding.

FY 16-17 CRC Budget Requests-Membership: Ms. Hickman stated she has inquired to counties for FY 16-17 Budget Request materials. Ms. Hickman stated as of this date, she had heard back from the following counties: Buckingham – request package due February 12th; Charlotte – budget request

due by March 1^{st} , and Prince Edward – request package due by February 26^{th} . Ms. Hickman stated she had not heard back from Amelia or Lunenburg.

Ms. Hickman noted the Council voted in December to keep the CRC Annual Dues at \$15,700 which is the same amount originally set back in 2005.

New CRC Representative Appointments & CRC Representative/Alternate Manual: Ms. Hickman stated as part of the orientation for new CRC Representatives and Alternates, she had created a Manual that will help the new appointees be well informed about their role and informed about how the organization operates. Ms. Hickman stated the Manuals were mailed to the two newly appointed representatives and one alternate. Upon reflection, she decided to provide current members with the manuals as well. Ms. Hickman handed out Manuals to current representatives present. Ms. Hickman stated this will be living document that can be added to, to be kept up-to-date on CRC policies, issues and financial matters.

Grant Award – Charlotte County Volunteer Rescue Squad, Rescue Squad Assistance Fund (RSAF) Application Funded: Ms. Foster stated the CRC assisted the Charlotte County Volunteer Rescue Squad in applying for funds to purchase 3 Patient Lift Systems and 6 Monitor/Defibrillators. The Squad was awarded \$35,617.07 to purchase the 3 Patient Lift Systems. Unfortunately, they were not awarded funds to purchase the Monitor/Defibrillators. Since this award, the Rescue Squad has decided it is more of a priority to receive the Monitors than the Patient Lift Systems. They have been in contact with the State Department of Health that oversees this program and have determined they can request a Modification to their award. However, it is not guaranteed it will be granted. The Rescue Squad has decided to pursue a Modification to request that the award instead be used to purchase the Monitors. The CRC has been asked to assist in this Modification which we are currently working on at this time. I will keep you informed as to how this turns out.

The new RSAF Cycle for Applications began February 1 and closes on March 15, 2016. We would like to request a blanket approval for request, if the CRC receives them, to assist Rescue Squads in applying for this assistance. This will be on a first come, first serve basis as staff are available. Notification went out today to Rescue Squads/Fire Departments.

Mr. Timmons moved and Mr. Wingold seconded to allow the CRC to assist Rescue Squads or Fire Departments if requested to apply for RSAF Grant funds by the March 15, 2015 deadline. Motion carried.

HB2 Funding Recommendations & Project Scores: Ms. Foster stated the Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) met on January 19th and were presented by staff the HB2 funding recommendations and HB2 project scores. Ms. Foster stated VDOT received 321 HB2 applications with 287 of them deemed eligible to advance in the evaluation process. A summary report of the CRC's member locality projects scores and ranking was provided in the council members' packet. Ms. Foster stated she had listened to the CTB meeting via online video and stated this item on the agenda included a two hour discussion. Ms. Foster stated there seemed to be genuine surprise at how well the rural localities did in the scoring process. Ms. Foster noted Prince Edward Counties project at the intersection of US 460 and VA 307 ranked 4th in the State of Virginia out of 287 projects. Ms. Foster stated this was impressive for rural localities and the region. Ms. Foster stated there was some concern by CTB members over the recommendation of how statewide priority funds would be utilized. Under the current recommendation projects competing at the district level were scored and prioritized

and recommended for funding based on the scores spending down the funds available for each district. However, because the requested cost for projects did not equally match funding available in each district, monies were usually left over in each district. The recommendation utilized the state priority funding pot of funds to "pick up" the next highest scored project in each district until all funds were exhausted. It was felt that this utilized all of the funding available in a more economical manner. However, because the next highest scored project in each district varied considerably in cost, the State monies utilized in each district varied considerably from each other. CTB members varied in opinions on different ways this could have been addressed. The CTB still have the final say and will continue to discuss this matter over the next 5 months before adoption in June. If the CTB should decide to vary from the scoring process they will have to provide a basis for this in a public meeting. Public Hearings will held in the Spring to receive input on the recommendations. Ms. Hickman noted that the Lunenburg County HB2 Project competed in the Richmond District and did not score well. However, Ms. Foster stated she had inquired on the scoring of this project because it was submitted under the safety category and data was provided regarding the safety issues, yet Lunenburg's application received no points under the safety issue. Ms. Foster stated she has not heard back from VDOT on this matter at this time. Ms. Foster also stated the new CTB member for the Richmond District asked a lot of questions during the meeting and may be of assistance for Lunenburg.

Ms. Foster stated she has invited Ms. Shannon Valentine, CTB Member for the Lynchburg District, to participate in a Ride-Along Tour of the project sites for the seven submitted HB2 projects in the CRC member region and also to tour the project site of the submitted Transportation Alternative Project for the Town of Charlotte Court House.

Virginia Initiative for Growth and Opportunity (GO Virginia): Ms. Hickman stated the GO Virginia Initiative is includes two pending legislative bills in the General Assembly in both the House and Senate. Ms. Hickman stated background information on this Initiative was included in the Council members' packet. Ms. Hickman passed out current copies of each bill for members present.

Ms. Hickman stated there are two bills in each legislature, one bill deals with the funding pot and the other with state incentives. The House has assigned both bills to the Agriculture, Commerce, Technology and Natural Resources Sub-Committee. This Sub-Committee met on February $3^{\rm rd}$ and recommended reporting both bills with amendments. The Appropriations Committee reported both appropriations with a substitute. The Senate Finance Committee will consider both bills on either February $9^{\rm th}$ or $10^{\rm th}$.

The biggest area of disagreement among legislators over the bills centers on the composition of the state-level Growth and Opportunity Board. The House version of the bill proposes a Board of 23 members, while the Senate Bill calls for 13 members. At issue is the size of the Board as well as the allotment of appointees to the Board by the House, Senate and Governor.

Ms. Hickman stated there is an also an attachment in the Council packet from the GO Virginia Coalition requesting the CRC consider signing an endorsement of the Initiative. Ms. Hickman stated the VAPDC has been working to ensure that PDC'/RC's are recognized as an important player in this legislation and if approved, it has been requested that each PDC/RC endorse GO Virginia by becoming a member of the GO Virginia Coalition. Ms. Hickman pointed out quite a few PDCs/RCs have already endorsed the GO Virginia Coalition. Ms. Hickman stated this was originally planned to be acted on at the January CRC meeting, which was canceled.

There was discussion on the matter.

Mr. Walker stated it is his understanding that the funding for this Initiative in the Governor's proposed budget is tied to the revenues from the Medicaid Expansion Proposal. This proposal is currently not going anywhere in the General Assembly.

2016 VACO County Government Day & 2016 VAPDC Winter Conference: Ms. Hickman stated on February 11th, VAPDC will join VACO to host the Annual County Government Day in Richmond, Virginia. The VAPDC Winter Conference also begins on February 11th and continues on February 12th. The VADPC participants will be meeting on various topics including a presentation on the current status of the GO Virginia and also a series of speakers from the Federal Reserve Bank. Ms. Hickman stated VAPDC just sent out a revised agenda that now includes Mr. Bob Gittler with EDA making a presentation as well. Ms. Hickman stated she will be discussing with him the CRC's endeavor to become designated as an EDD.

Ms. Hickman stated Ms. Foster and herself will be attending these meetings as well as an Annual Programming Meeting with VDOT on February 10^{th} .

2016 Virginia Community Development Block Grant (VCDBG) Program: Mr. Fortune stated enclosed in the Council members packet was information on the 2016 VCDBG Program. Mr. Fortune noted the deadline for competitive grants is March 23, 2016 by 5:00 p.m. Mr. Fortune stated there is also an Open Submission Program that allows for applying for funding beginning January 1st through September 30th or until all of the funding is committed. There are different program areas for both funding programs. Mr. Fortune stated any locality considering applying for a competitive grant should be well into the planning process at this point. Mr. Fortune stated the attachment also lists various projects member localities have implemented in the last 25 years with funding received through the VCDG Program. Mr. Fortune also noted the Town of Dillwyn is currently in the planning stage of a potential housing rehab project and have opted to not apply for VCDBG funds this year but possibly next year.

Virginia Business Appreciation Month – May 2016: Mr. Gilliam stated the attachment provided is a reminder that Virginia Business Appreciation Month is the Month of May. The CRC as well localities and the public are asked to join the Governor, the Virginia Secretary of Commerce and Trade to recognize the accomplishments of our existing businesses. More information on this recognition should be forthcoming.

CRC GIS Services: Ms. Foster stated the staff provides Geographic Information Services (GIS) to member localities on various projects that are requested. Ms. Foster stated the staff like to provide an update on this service every so often so it is not forgotten as a service. Ms. Foster stated recently Lunenburg County requested that a map of the County be created that would show the election districts with roads depicted that could be formatted in a PDF version to be put on the County's website. Ms. Foster stated she also included on the map two sub-sections that showed close-ups of both towns located in Lunenburg County. Ms. Foster passed around a copy of the completed map for members present to view. Ms. Foster stated she is also working with the Town of Kenbridge on their Zoning Map that the CRC recently produced. The Town is now updating some of their zoning. Ms. Foster stated another request the CRC received was from Charlotte County to assist the County's School System in preparing a map for a grant application that would depict the addresses of school children in the County receiving reduced lunches. Unfortunately, the CRC was not able to assist in this

endeavor due to confidentiality rules. The CRC had the GIS Software to complete the task in the CRC office and the County had the address file data. However, the County could not allow the address files to leave the County office due to strict confidentiality rules. Therefore, the CRC did not have the data to complete the task. Ms. Foster stated it is her understanding from the School Superintendent they were able to produce the Map by other means. Ms. Foster stated hopefully the CRC can work with them on other projects in the future.

Council members present were interested in receiving a map similar to the Lunenburg Map for their counties. Ms. Foster did note the counties received a Redistricting Map which outlined the election districts when the CRC assisted the localities with the Redistricting process back in 2011. Ms. Foster stated she would work on getting all of the member counties a map showing election districts and roads in a PDF format.

Council Member Comments: There were none.

<u>Commonwealth Intergovernmental Review Process (CIRP)</u>: Ms. Foster stated the following CIRP's were recommended for a Level One, No comment:

- -Environmental Review Report Town of Phenix Water System Upgrade
- -Environmental Review Report Town of Keysville Water System Upgrade
- -John Kerr Reservoir Revision to Existing Water Control Plan
- -Reissuance of VDPDES Permit No. VA0084433, Drakes Branch Waste Water Treatment Plant
- -Special Evaluation Assistance for Rural Communities & Households Program (SEARCH)/Predevelopment Planning Grant Buckingham County Sprouses Corner Sewer Evaluation

Mr. Walker moved and Mr. Timmons seconded to give the listed CIRP's a Level One, No Comment. Motion carried.

Other Business:

Virginia Community Development Block Grant (VCDBG) Program Regional Priorities for the **CRC Region:** Mr. Fortune stated the Virginia Department of Housing and Community Development (DHCD) each year request the Planning District Commissions/Regional Councils to set Regional Priorities for the VCDBG competitive grant program. This usually involves the CRC contacting all of the localities in Planning District 14 (member and non-member) to ask for their input on ranking the Priorities as well as ask what Projects than plan to submit for funding. There are nine different project types that are ranked into three priority groups, with the top priority ranked receiving 50 points, middle ranking receiving 30 points and the bottom priority 15 points. Mr. Fortune stated staff felt this process may need to be revisited due to recent CRC policies regarding providing services to non-members. Mr. Fortune stated the CRC has contacted DHCD to see if there would be any ramifications to the CRC if it did not include non-members in the process of ranking the VCDBG Regional Priorities. Mr. Fortune stated the CRC wanted to make sure we would not be putting State Planning Funding in jeopardy because of the duties of PDCs/RCs through the Regional Cooperation Act. Mr. Fortune stated we have not heard back from DHCD at this point. Mr. Fortune stated the CRC's VCDBG Regional Priorities are due to DHCD by March 18, 2016. This would mean the CRC would need to take action on the proposed CRC VCDBG Regional Priorities at the upcoming March 4th CRC meeting. Mr. Fortune stated the CRC has not sent any information out yet to localities due to waiting for guidance from DHCD first,

Mr. Fortune stated as an option, the CRC could go ahead and contact all localities, as in the past. If a non-member locality lists a project that will be submitted for the grant competition, that category would be ranked in the lowest category because they are a non-member.

In addition, Mr. Fortune stated if DHCD responds that there are no ramifications to the CRC for excluding non-members would the Council like for the staff to draft a policy to be acted on at the March 4^{th} CRC meeting.

There was discussion on the matter.

It was the consensus of the members present, if there is no fallout from DHCD to exclude non-members in the ranking of CRC VCDBG Regional Priorities, staff send the request to all localities, but exclude non-member projects from the top priority. It was also requested that a formal policy be put together for the March 4th CRC meeting for consideration.

Council Member Comments: There were none.

Adjournment: The meeting adjourned at 1:48 p.m.
