Chairman Wilck called the special meeting to order.

In Re: Work Session with Fire Chiefs

Chief L. W. Gilliam, Hampden-Sydney Volunteer Fire Department, stated his department is

requesting an additional \$20,000 for the Fire Department and \$10,000 for the EMS. He stated the

maintenance for vehicles was costly and the call volume is increasing; their department is second or third

due with almost all calls in the County.

Chief Trey Pyle, Meherrin Volunteer Fire Department, stated the department is requesting, for the

EMS portion, an additional \$5,000 operational cost along with a Vehicle Acquisition Fund to be started with

\$12,000 a year for six years. It was noted Meherrin VFD received a donation of \$17,500 from Container

First Services (CFS).

Supervisor Cooper-Jones entered the meeting at this time.

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Mr. Bartlett asked if Lunenburg County provided an additional funding for FY20. Chief Pyle said they did not.

Chairman Wilck expressed his concern that currently, the Board provides equal funding to all departments; if one [department] is given more, he is concerned that there will be complaints from the other departments.

Mr. Bartlett asked if the Fire Association has taken a stance on this request.

Chief Dallas Tinsley, Darlington Heights Volunteer Fire Department, stated the Association voted to not ask for additional funding, with the exception of Hampden-Sydney and Meherrin voted for additional funding for the rescue side of theirs. Chief Tinsley said the Darlington Heights department has always stuck to their budget, and sometimes they haven't been able to get things they wanted due to lack of funding. He said his department holds fund raisers to get the things that are not in the budget; he spoke about the budget for his department.

Chief Tinsley stated he understands the challenges Chief Gilliam faces with bigger turnover of personnel and the process of always having to train new staff. He said he is not opposed to EMS receiving more, and acknowledged there are no instructors to do the training free of charge. The cost of \$300-\$600 per person to train, plus materials, for EMS, and recertifications, is an expense other Volunteer Fire Departments do not have to figure in.

Chief Al Mason, Prospect Volunteer Fire Department, said he is satisfied with what the department receives. He said he is not aware of their budget. He said years ago, his department sat on \$6,000-\$8,000 and then the Committee was formed because costs were going up. He said maybe the amounts need to be revamped.

Chief Shane Richardson, Pamplin Volunteer Fire Department, said Pamplin also has an EMS department; they are currently having difficulty trying to sign a contract with a paid two-man EMS crew. He said it is costly, and calls are about equal between Appomattox and Prince Edward Counties.

Chief Dean Farmer, Farmville Volunteer Fire Department, thanked the Board for the support given and said this Board provides more funding than the surrounding localities provide to their departments, and the funding is adequate. He said his department has \$88 to last until July, but uses the funds wisely. He said the EMS agency costs have to be kept in mind and everything cannot be bought within a year. He said they

do fund raisers for things that are wanted or needed. Chief Farmer said their department needs turnout gear and EMS equipment, but will need to get it during the next budget cycle. He said Meherrin has much higher costs because they transport patients to the hospital, provide a special vehicle for transport and have many more costs associated with that. He said the other departments understand it costs more to provide that level of care and recommended more fund raisers.

Andy Ellington, President, Rice Volunteer Fire Department, thanked the Board for its support and said they are hurting for volunteers. He said they have a lot of expenses and would love to have a new tanker as theirs is a 1996 model. He said each year, there had been about \$10,000 surplus from County funds which were carry-over and insurance funds. He said it has been a tough year and now has \$3,000 to get to July; he said pumps, a four-wheel drive mechanism and a transmission all broke down this year. He suggested a committee be formed to start looking at next year's budget and a possible 2% increase. Mr. Ellington said his department tries to do three fund raisers each year. He said they have to look at the future, adding that if they cannot get volunteers, paid fire departments will be necessary in the county and taxes will have to be raised.

Chief Tinsley said that Hampden-Sydney is not being cut out of the funding, he said everyone is running close [to their budget]. He said his department does not have the call load or EMS as Hampden-Sydney does, but it may cause issues because everyone's budget is tight. He said it would be good to find out if the departments can be funded a little more.

Supervisor Gilliam said the main reason the Board gathered all the Fire Chiefs was to commend them on their service, and while the Board understands prices of everything have gone up, it has to be fair to all the departments. He said they are all for helping the EMS but the main thing the Board wants is to ensure that all is fair with all departments and to hear their thoughts, now and for next year. He said the Board cannot do it all at once.

Supervisor Jones asked if funds could be switched from the Fire to the EMS and leave the fire funding as it is. He said each department has its own unique situation.

Chief Gilliam thanked the Board for the funding for the Fire Department; he said the only reason they came [to request additional funding] for the EMS side is that they currently supplement the EMS with the funding for the Fire Department. He said they are a transport agency like Prince Edward Rescue. He

said the request is strictly to offset rising costs. He said it would not be fair to the citizens of Prince Edward County for them to continue to use the Fire Department funding for the EMS.

Mr. Bartlett asked if the other departments are supplementing the EMS from the Fire funding.

Assistant Chief Todd Pugh, Hampton-Sydney Volunteer Fire Department, said that they are also supplementing their EMS with Fire funds. He said his department carries disability and full insurance on their members, which equates to approximately \$20,000+ each year. He said if it were to be fair, each department would need to submit their budget, with justification. He said all departments are not equal and cannot operate with equal funding due to the nature of the County and the jurisdictions, the areas served. He said his department had over \$100,000 surplus but it has been used in the past few years. He said all apparatus is certified. He said they do fund raising.

Chief Gilliam said volunteerism is down and people want to know what they will get in return.

Discussion followed on workers compensation and insurance on volunteers, apparatus, AirPaks, fire trucks and ladder trucks.

Chief Tinsley said the normal truck is the pumper, which carries the fire hose, ladder and forceful entry tools. He said their main function is forcing entry and finding victims. The truck company is set up to do ventilation, to go to the roof, look for extension and to assist with search, but their compliance with tools is different from the engine. They provide water and engine help. He said the ladder truck has a place on every structure fire; the ladder must be certified every year.

Mr. Bartlett asked if the increased cost is from the training or is it due to more calls run, causing the increase in the operational costs. Chief Gilliam said they are both costly. He said there is a higher turnover rate; they had 21 new members last year, all of which need turnout gear and the Firefighter I classes.

Mr. Bartlett said membership consists of 10 or less Prince Edward County citizens and the rest are students.

Chief Gilliam said they had 28 total members; now, due to classes letting out for the summer, they are down to six members.

Mr. Bartlett said over the years, an organization gets a personality of their own, and it has become a "student department." He asked how they might be able to recruit more permanent citizen members and not as many students. Chief Gilliam said firefighters are always training; he said due to the location and the name of the department, citizens feel that it only covers the college grounds or that the college students will

take care of it. He added that much of the citizen population is older. Discussion followed on recruiting motivated volunteers that have the time to devote to the training hours, and said volunteerism is down, nationwide.

Chief Tinsley said the Board can do things to help get people involved. He said people now want to know what they will get from volunteering. He said some other areas provide \$8 per call worked, and some receive a percentage off their taxes. Discussion followed.

Supervisor Southall asked if Hampden-Sydney College provides any funding. Chief Gilliam said the College gave \$17,000 last year.

Supervisor Wilck said the Board members don't think about these things because they're not involved; he said a committee will be set up to discuss these issues for next year's budget. He thanked the Fire Chiefs for attending and providing their input.

Mr. Bartlett said the County may have recently received ATL funds; he said the ATL funds can only be used for certain things. Discussion followed.

Supervisor Jones asked if money could be given to the Meherrin and Hampden-Sydney EMS and mark it as EMS funding; Mr. Bartlett said he would have to research to be certain as they may need to be separate. Discussion followed on the members of the committee.

Chairman Wilck called the regular meeting to order. Supervisor Townsend offered the invocation

and led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Recognitions is an opportunity for the Board of Supervisors to recognize achievements in our

community, with a focus on the accomplishments of the students at the Prince Edward County Public Schools

and Fuqua School, and our employees and our citizen volunteers who serve the County of Prince Edward.

Mr. Bartlett reported that in recent weeks, Prince Edward Middle School (PECMS) students have

earned high achievements at school and district Science Fairs. At the school-level Science Fair, several

middle school students earned purple ribbons in recognition of their projects' perfect scores. These students

include fifth-graders Ava Tibbs, Quin'Neasha Woodford, and Brendan Vanderwilt; sixth-graders Avery

Ivers, Gabe Leonard, Nina Davis, Jake Magin, and Josh Ragland; and seventh-grader Elizabeth McElfresh.

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After their success at the school level, many Eagles moved on to the Appomattox District Science Fair on Saturday, April 6 at Appomattox High School. At this fair, students presented their work again for a larger audience. Winners of purple ribbons at this level include fifth-graders Austin Johnson and Stephanie Riccio, sixth-grader Riley Fulcher, and seventh-grader Elizabeth McElfresh. Through their hard work and dedication to academics, these students represented Prince Edward County Public Schools well to neighboring schools and we would like to recognize them for their work.

Mr. Bartlett then said Prince Edward County students recently attended the State Leadership Conference, which was held in Reston, Virginia on April 5-7 at the Hyatt Regency in Reston. Tiba Hamza placed first in Healthcare Administration. Sam Detrick and Ben Edward placed third in Marketing. Robert Mason Kinne participated in Public Speaking. Hamza, Detrick, and Edwards are eligible to attend the National Leadership Conference which will be held in San Antonio, Texas June 29-July 2. Tiba Hamza was inducted as State Vice President. She will attend Summer Leadership Training June 18-20 at the University of Richmond. Congratulations to these students.

Mr. Bartlett then said the Prince Edward County CNA students took a 70-question state board test and then were watched by a State Board tester as they performed five out of 22 Nursing skills picked randomly by the State tester. We had a 100% pass rate. These girls worked and studied very hard to achieve this result. We would like to recognize the following students: Faith Best, Makayla Burnette, Abriel Johnson, Makayla Morris, Destiny Rice, Jayla Watson, Cameshia Wright, and Quiana Wylie.

Magi Van Eps, Director of Tourism, stated the Tourism Department applied for a grant from the Virginia Tourism Corporation and Prince Edward County was one of only 39 marketing destination organizations to receive \$10,000. She said the title is based on the first state slogan, and is called 50 Years of Love; she said the campaign to promote Prince Edward County will be held three specific weekends. She said the first weekend will be held June 7-9 and the keynote event is Demo Days at Wilck's Lake. Then July 19-21, the event is Cycling through the Piedmont, and finally, September 27-29 will feature National Alpaca Farm Days, as BrightEyes Alpaca Retreat on Hard Times Road sees over 400 visitors each year. She said each weekend would allow the visitors to spend the weekend and contribute to the local economy. She said there will be a radio campaign, digital campaign and will cross promote where applicable. She said Sandy Ingersoll, Saylor's Creek State Park, suggested an art project for the students of Prince Edward County which would then be turned into postcards. Mrs. Van Eps said the postcards would be given to the visitors and used

along with a passport program to encourage people to go from business to business, and will be a tracking measure for how the visitation is on each of these three weekends. She said LCVA offered to be the recipient and judged the entries. Of the 88 total entries, nine were from Fuqua High School, 15 were from Fuqua Middle School, 47 were from Fuqua Elementary School and 17 were from Prince Edward County Elementary School. In Re: Public Participation

Vicky Page, Friends of the Farmville-Prince Edward Library, stated that over \$1,000 has been generated by book sales and membership renewals; these funds go into the General Fund. Ms. Page said the "Friends" provide furniture, kiosks, and children's programs from the fund raisers and said funds raised from the Gala is designated for children's programs. She then announced they held their annual Board meeting and new officers have been appointed; Robin Sedgewick will continue as Chair for next year.

Rick Ewing, Director, Central Virginia Regional Library, stated the Library will hold a free lunch program for children 18 years and under; he said Prince Edward County Schools are providing a free bag lunch during June and July, Monday through Thursday, from 12:00 noon until 1:00 p.m. He said there will also be programs available for the children.

Justine Young, Piedmont Senior Resources, stated she was unable to attend the meeting during the budget process due to military service. She said Piedmont Senior Resources was created by seven counties to access federal funds; for every \$100 provided, the counties receive \$1,000. In order to receive the federal funds, a 10% match is required. She said several counties are close to the 10% match but are concerned about what other counties have provided; she said the concern is regarding the share of services being

provided to each county. She said other counties have stated they may reduce their contributions if other counties don't increase their contributions. Prince Edward County receives 50% in wages, goods and other benefits; she said over \$605,000 directly is pumped into the economy in Prince Edward County. She requested an exemption on property taxes which will result in approximately \$7,400 which would move Prince Edward County to a somewhat-level match. She said their entire budget of \$1.9 million, all of which is Federal, State and private grants. Ms. Young stated they currently have 50 employees and now provide \$1.9 million all within five years. She said only 13 cents of every \$1.00 goes for administrative costs, the balance goes to services.

Mr. Bartlett questioned the match required. Ms. Young said the federal required match is based on population of the various counties. She then stated Prince Edward County receives the majority of the services and said as an example, the new transportation program provided 40 trips to citizens during this month alone, as follows: seven to Charlotte County, four to Cumberland County, two to Lunenburg County, nine to Nottoway County, and 18 to Prince Edward County. She said this program is not state or federally funded.

Susan Campbell, Prospect Depot Historical Society, asked the Board how the Prospect Depot project will be funded. She stated the project was delayed until the Trail was "put together" and was to be for public use. She asked the Board to assist them with continuing the project.

Bill Shear, FACES Board of Directors, gave a brief history and facts about FACES; he requested the Board consider a tax abatement on the property taxes, and to hold a special hearing. He said the organization is important to this community; there is a satellite distribution center in Abilene, food is delivered to elderly, and backpacks with food are provided to children for the weekends. Mr. Shear stated if FACES pays the property taxes, that comes out of the budget. Mr. Shear stated FACES distributed 1.5 million pounds of food per year to 1,500 people, saving them \$1.8 million. He said FACES is all-volunteer staffed, and asked the Board to consider their request.

Bob Chonko, FACES Treasurer, stated over the years, FACES has acquired trucks by donation. He said FACES has met the criteria for abatement and is exempt from state sales tax.

Supervisor Gilliam entered the meeting at this time.

Daniel Jordan, High Bridge Trail State Park Manager, reported the damage to the Trail that occurred during Hurricane Michael has been fixed and the Trail is back open.

Elsora Stiff, on behalf of Oliver Stiff, asked that the Board consider convening a public hearing on the Historical Society's request for the Prospect Depot project.

Supervisors Emert, Townsend and Southall thanked everyone for attending the meeting.

Supervisor Pride commended the work done by FACES; she said she volunteers at the Abilene Center.

Supervisor Gilliam apologized that he was late to the meeting due to responding to a fire call.

Supervisor Cooper-Jones thanked the citizens for reaching out to the Board members.

In Re: Highway Matters

Mrs. Sarah Elam Puckett, Assistant County Administrator, said VDOT has announced a new Resident Engineer for the Farmville Residency. Scott D. Frederick, P.E., joined VDOT in late April. He is a graduate of Virginia Tech, is a Professional Engineer and brings 12 years of experience with Georgia DOT to his new position.

Mrs. Puckett said Mr. Frederick plans to attend the June meeting of the Board for the Six-Year Plan Public Hearing. She said she and Mr. Bartlett met with Mr. Frederick on May 7; he is learning the district and looks forward to meeting the Board and getting to know Prince Edward County.

Mrs. Puckett stated Carrie Shepheard provided an update on the Smart Scale projects and Rural Rustic programs. She said the Rural Rustic project has started on Route 661, Nursery Road. Mowing on secondary routes began today at the intersection at Worsham Road and Green Bay Road. State forces will begin and mow from Route 15 eastward; contract forces will mow from Route 15 west to Pamplin and have 30 days to complete that.

Supervisor Townsend asked if trash is still being picked up on the primary roads. Mrs. Puckett said they are still working in the Prospect area on Route 460.

Supervisor Pride asked if trash pickup will be done on Abilene Road. Mrs. Puckett said VDOT only does pick-up on primary roads.

Chairman Wilck stated he and Mr. Bartlett will meet with Mr. Gerry Spates, Town of Farmville Manager, and VDOT to survey a site with Burt Dodson.

Mr. Bartlett said there have been challenges finding and retaining volunteers; he suggested the Board consider changing the one-year terms to two-year terms. He said these volunteer opportunities will be advertised.

In Re: Shentel – Cable Television Franchise Renewal

Shenandoah Cable Television, LLC, doing business as Shentel is requesting to renew the existing Franchise Agreement which was originally adopted in 1993. The Franchise Agreement was last renewed in June of 2010 by resolution, effective in December 2008.

Per Section 15-2-2108.21 of the *Code of Virginia* states such agreements shall have a term of 15 years. Section 15.2-2108.1.1.C of the *Code of Virginia* states "... no new or renewed cable franchise entered into on or after January 1, 2007 shall include a franchise fee as long as cable services are subject to the Virginia Communications Sales and Use Tax." Shentel is subject to this tax which is capped at 5% per Chapter 6.2 of Title 58.1 of the *Code of Virginia*.

Shentel pays this tax directly to the Commonwealth. The Commonwealth then remits to the County its portion as part of the Telecommunication Tax the County receives each month.

With deregulation, franchise agreements no longer provide exclusive monopolies to cable companies. As stated in the heading, this is a non-exclusive franchise, meaning any other provider could

enter the market if they so wished. No longer having the authority to negotiate the franchise fee, the primary purpose of the franchise agreement is to reach agreement on the use of public rights of way, and to require Shentel to indemnify the County for any work done in the rights of way.

Mr. Bartlett said there was no representative attending the meeting. He asked Supervisor Cooper-Jones if there has been any change since last meeting. She indicated that a representative had been by to pick up a box, but there was no further action taken on her issue and the problem has not been resolved.

Following discussion, Supervisor Jones made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Southall, to approve the Resolution extending the Franchise Agreement until December 13, 2033 and authorize the Board Chair or County Administrator to execute all necessary documents; the motion carried:

A Resolution of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, Virginia

APPROVING THE RENEWAL OF THE CABLE TELEVISION FRANCHISE

WHEREAS, Shenandoah Cable Television, LLC ("Franchisee") owns, operates and maintains a cable television system ("System") serving Prince Edward County, Virginia pursuant to a franchise agreement which expired on December 13, 2018 (the "Franchise") issued by Prince Edward County, Virginia (the "Franchise Authority"), and Franchisee is the duly authorized holder of the Franchise; and

WHEREAS, Franchisee and Franchise Authority have continued to follow and be bound by the Franchise; and

WHEREAS, Franchisee has requested the consent of the Franchise Authority for the renewal of the Franchise in accordance with the requirements of the Franchise and applicable law; and

WHEREAS, Franchisee has represented that it will comply with the terms and conditions of the Franchise; and

WHEREAS, the Franchise Authority believes that it is in the best interest of the community to approve the renewal of the Franchise granted to Franchisee.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE FRANCHISE AUTHORITY AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1: The Franchise Authority hereby approves and consents to the renewal for a term of ten years of the Franchise, all in accordance with the terms of the Franchise and applicable law and Franchisee shall comply with the terms and conditions of the Franchise.

SECTION 2: The Franchise Authority confirms that the renewal term of the Franchise shall be for a term of fifteen (15) years deemed to have commenced on December 14, 2018 and ending on December 13, 2033.

SECTION 3: The Franchise Authority agrees that the pledge of, or grant of a security interest in, the Franchise to any lender(s) of Shenandoah Cable Television, LLC or its affiliates, for the purpose of securing indebtedness, shall not require the consent of Franchise Authority and is hereby authorized.

SECTION 4: This Resolution shall have the force of a continuing agreement with Franchisee, and Franchising Authority shall not revoke, amend or otherwise alter this Resolution without the consent of Franchisee.

In Re: Prospect Depot Grant Project

The County has been informed due to the failure to meet project delivery guidelines, VDOT is reevaluating the project. The County has three options: 1) Ask for an extension, 2) Stop the project and ask for a waiver of repayment, or 3) Cancel the project and repay direct expenses of \$169,423.79. The County has been informed an extension will likely not be approved because, per federal regulations, insufficient funds are not a valid reason for a delay and that is the primary reason for the delay of this project. Also, for an extension to be approved, a valid confirmation is needed that funding would be available to cover any cost above the federal funding still available which is about \$330,00. The County has been informed additional funds cannot be requested for this project if the bids come in higher than the current allocations.

The current estimate by the Architect is \$610,000 but VDOT thinks the actual cost will be over \$1 million because the plans and bid documents must be amended. With the County only having approximately \$335,000 in funds available means the County would be responsible for costs that could be between \$275,000 to \$665,000 or more. Mr. Bartlett recommended the County notify VDOT of cancellation of the project and will repay direct expenses associated with the project which are \$169,423.79.

While this is a large amount, the consequence of moving forward would cost the County a much larger amount. The County has received several items from these expenditures. The County has a set of plans which can be used to go to bid in the future if funds become available. The County has a MOA that has been vetted and approved by DCR that would speed the approval of a future MOA. DCR has agreed to an easement for Dominion to allow the running of electrical lines to any future building. DCR has approved a Special Use Permit to allow access to the park property. Thus, after repayment the County does not walk away empty-handed.

Mr. Bartlett recommended the County enter into discussions with DCR and the Prospect Historical

Society to discuss possible paths forward. Without the involvement of Federal and possibly State funding,

numerous onerous requirements and regulations of the Federal Government and Virginia Department of

Historic Resources will no longer apply and will reduce the costs dramatically, making the project more cost

effective.

Mr. Bartlett said the project is still valuable and its completion will provide an asset to County

citizens, one that will assist in expanding the usage and tourism on the western portion of the High Bridge

Trail State Park and at the same time become a focal point of the Prospect Community by providing a unifying

structure that can be used to bind the Community together.

Mr. Bartlett presented a summary of the history of the project and a more detailed explanation of

the legislation driving this recommendation. Discussion followed.

Mr. Bartlett recommended the County inform VDOT that the Prospect Train Depot Project is

cancelled and the County will repay the direct expenses of \$169,413.79 and authorize the Board Chairman

or County Administrator to execute any documents necessary to that end.

Chairman Wilck invited Mr. Richard Stockton to speak on the Prospect Depot. Mr. Stockton said

he has put so much effort into this project over the past 19 years. He said there aren't many buildings built

in 1884 that are still standing.

Mr. Bartlett said there is not enough funding to complete the project and the plans are not complete;

the environmental study has not been done with a deadline of September. Mr. Bartlett said the project has

viability; it is a unifying structure on the western part of the Trail. The County should eliminate the

regulations from the federal and state government, which would drive the cost down considerably. Mr.

Bartlett said the County has designs and a MOU with DCR

Mr. Bartlett said Prince Edward County has applied for financing through the Virginia Resources

Authority's Summer 2019 Virginia Pooled Financing Program bond issue. McGuireWoods serves as bond

counsel to Virginia Resources Authority ("VRA"). McGuireWoods also has served as the County's bond

counsel for over 20 years and has an intimate knowledge and documentation of the County's financial status

and current debt structure. Mr. Bartlett recommended they continue to serve as bond counsel to Prince

Edward County. Because of the potential of conflict with VRA, McGuireWoods would not undertake the

representation of both VRA and Prince Edward County without consent of the County. Specifically, Arthur

Anderson would serve as the County's bond counsel. Mr. Anderson is a partner with the firm and has

extensive experience as a bond counsel and has represented many Virginia local governments and state

agencies in the issuance of bonds. The County provided this same consent in both 2011 and 2017 when the

County borrowed money through VRA.

Mr. Bartlett said that Mr. Anderson is requesting a limited consent only. In the unlikely event that

a material dispute or litigation develops between the County and either authority (including a material dispute

or litigation in which multiple parties are seeking money from the County), McGuireWoods will not represent

either (or any) party in that dispute without the express written consent of both (or all) parties.

Mr. Anderson is respectfully requesting that Prince Edward County consent to this arrangement and

to McGuireWoods continued representation of VRA on unrelated matters.

Mr. Bartlett stated the County Attorney has also reviewed this request and has no concerns.

Terri Atkins-Wilson, County Attorney, explained "material dispute" in relation to "limited consent."

FY 20 Budget Appropriations

Summary:

On April 30, 2019 the Board of Supervisors approved the FY20 Budget for Prince Edward County. The resolution adopted on that date listed a total budget of \$57,657,743 which included a School budget of \$25,955,279 and a School Cafeteria Budget of \$1,463,775.

While the Board approved the FY20 Budget funds can not be expended until the money is actually appropriated. Historically the Board waits until the June meeting to appropriate the budget for the new fiscal year. Attachment 1 is the Annual Resolution of Appropriation which empowers County officers to expend funds and manage cash assets in accordance with the policies contained in the resolution. Attachment 2 provides the specific amounts appropriated by cost centers.

You will notice the Budget resolution approved on April 30, 2019 is \$125,000 greater than the appropriations resolution. This is the result of the decrease in the school funding by \$125,000.

ANNUAL RESOLUTION OF APPROPRIATION OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2020

A resolution to appropriate designated funds and accounts from specified estimated revenues for FY 2020 for the operating budget and the Capital Improvements Program for the County of Prince Edward and to authorize and empower County officers to expend funds and manage cash assets; and to establish policies under which funds will be expended and managed.

The Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors does hereby resolve on this 11th day of June 2019 that, for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2019, and ending on June 30, 2020, the following sections are hereby adopted.

- Section 1. The cost centers shown on the attached letter labeled FY 2019-2020 Appropriations are hereby appropriated from the designated estimated revenues as approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 30, 2019 for FY 2019-2020.
- Section 2. Appropriations, in addition to those contained in this general Appropriations Resolution, may be made by the Board of Supervisors, only if deemed appropriate and there is available in the fund unencumbered or unappropriated sums sufficient to meet such appropriations.
- Section 3. All appropriations herein authorized shall be on the basis of cost centers for all departments and agencies and by Category.
- Section 4. The Social Services Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. By this resolution the Social Services Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within its respective funds in any amount.
- Section 5. The School Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. Appropriations for the School Board are by Category. By this resolution the School Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within a category.
- Section 6. The County Administrator is expressly authorized to approve transfers of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within the same Fund with the exception of Constitutional Officers for the efficient operation of government. Transfers into or out of a department of a Constitutional Officer requires prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 7. All outstanding encumbrances, both operating and capital, at June 30, 2019 shall be re-appropriated to the FY2020 fiscal year to the same cost center and account for which they are encumbered in the previous year.

- Section 8. At the close of the fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriations lapse for budget items other than those involving ongoing operational projects, or programs supported by grants or County funds, which must be preapproved by the County Administrator or his designee and submitted to the Board of Supervisors for final approval. Such funds must be applied to the purpose for which they were originally approved.
- Appropriations previously designated for capital projects will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until the completion of the project if funding is available from all planned sources, or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate ordinance, resolution or other action changes or eliminates the appropriation. Upon completion of a capital project, the County Administrator is hereby authorized to close out the project and return to the funding source any remaining balances. This section applies to all existing appropriations for capital projects at June 30, 2019 and appropriations as they are made in the FY 2020 Budget. The County Administrator is hereby authorized to approve construction change orders to contracts up to an increase of \$10,000.00 as long as funds are available from the funding sources and approve all change orders for reduction of contracts.
- Section 10. The approval of the Board of Supervisors of any grant of funds to the County shall constitute the appropriation of both the revenue to be received from the grant and the County's expenditure required by the terms of the grant, if any. The appropriation of grant funds will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until completion of the project or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate action, changes or eliminates the appropriation. The County Administrator may increase or reduce any grant appropriation to the level approved by the granting agency during the fiscal year. The County Administrator may approve necessary accounting transfers between departments and funds to enable the grant to be accounted for in the correct manner. Upon completion of a grant project, the County Administrator is authorized to close out the grant and return to the funding source any remaining balance. This section applies to appropriations for grants outstanding at June 30, 2019 and appropriations in the FY 2020 Budget.
- Section 11. The County Administrator may reduce revenue and expenditure appropriations related to programs funded all or in part by the Commonwealth of Virginia and/or the Federal Government to the level approved by the responsible state or federal agency.
- Section 12. The County Administrator is authorized to make transfers to the various funds for which there are transfers budgeted. The County Administrator shall transfer funds as deemed necessary up to amounts budgeted or in accordance with any existing bond resolutions that specify the matter in which transfers are to be made.
- Section 13. The Treasurer may advance monies to and from the various funds of the County to allow maximum cash flow efficiency. The advances must not violate County bond covenants or other legal restrictions that would prohibit an advance. The

Treasurer is authorized and directed to credit all interest received from the investment of all County funds to the General fund, with the exception of the School Construction Fund, Economic Development Fund, Recreation Fund, Forfeited Assets Fund, Landfill Fund, D.A.R.E. Fund, VDOT Revenue Sharing Fund (non-local money only) and the Piedmont Court Services Fund, wherein all interest earned will be credited to the respective funds.

- Section 14. All procurement activities with funds appropriated herein shall be made in accordance with the County purchasing policy and applicable state statutes.
- Section 15 It is the intent of this resolution that funds be expended for the purpose indicated in the budget; therefore, budgeted funds may not be transferred from operating expenditures to capital projects or from capital projects to operating expenses without the prior approval from the Board of Supervisors. Also, funds may not be transferred from one capital project to another without the prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 16. The County Administrator is authorized, pursuant to State statute, to issue orders and checks for payments where funds have been budgeted, appropriated, and where sufficient funds are available. A listing of vendor payments shall be presented to the Board of Supervisors for information not less frequently than monthly.
- Section 17 Subject to the qualifications in this resolution contained, all appropriations are declared to be maximum, conditional and proportionate appropriations the purpose being to make the appropriations payable in full in the amount named herein if necessary and then only in the event the aggregate revenues collected and available during the fiscal year for which the appropriations are made are sufficient to pay all the appropriations in full. Otherwise, the said appropriations shall be deemed to be payable in such proportions as the total sum of all realized revenue of the respective funds is to the total amount of revenue estimated to be available in the said fiscal year by the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 18. All revenues received by an agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board not included in its estimate of revenue for the financing of the fund budget as submitted to the Board of Supervisors may not be expended by said agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board without the consent of the Board of Supervisors being first obtained, and those sums appropriated to the budget. Any grant approved by the Board for application shall not be expended until the grant is approved by the funding agency for drawdown. Nor may any of these agencies or boards make expenditures which will exceed a specific item of an appropriation.
- Section 19. Allowances out of any of the appropriations made in this ordinance by any or all County departments, commissions, bureaus, or agencies under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors to any of their officers and employees for expense on account of the use of such officers and employees of their personal

automobiles in the discharge of their official duties shall be paid at the same rate as that established by the internal revenue service and shall be subject to change by the County Administrator from time to time to maintain like rates.

Section 20. All previous appropriation ordinances or resolutions to the extent that they are inconsistent with the provisions *of* this ordinance shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

Section 21. This ordinance shall become effective on July 1, 2019.



PUBLIC HEARING: Special Use Permit – Dominion Microwave Tower

Summary: The County has received a special use permit application from Dominion Energy Virginia to permit the Construction of an unmanned microwave tower to serve as part of the telecommunications network for Dominion Energy Virginia. The proposed tower will be located at 341 Merriman Shop Road on a parcel owned by Virginia Electric and Power Company, identified as Tax Map 043-A-37, Prince Edward County, VA. This is in an A1, Agricultural Conservation District.

The proposed tower will be 235' in height and will be lighted as required by the FAA with one top flashing beacon and flashing beacons at the towers midpoint. The tower will be located within the existing fenced Pamplin substation. Dominion Energy Virginia will provide the County co-locations opportunities without compensation for emergency services equipment. There is an existing tower located adjacent to the property and due to security reasons is not suitable for Dominion Energy to collocate on. The proposed tower will be for Dominion Energy's communication network to monitor, control and ensure the security and safety of the substation.

The Prince Edward County Board of Zoning Appeals conducted a Public Hearing on April 30, 2019 and granted a variance to allow the tower to exceed the limited 199' height limitation based on topography of the site. The Planning Commission conducted a Public Hearing on April 30, 2019 and no one spoke in opposition to the request. The Planning Commission recommended forwarding the matter to the Board of Supervisors for approval.

Impacts:

Staff does not have any concerns of negative impacts on the surrounding properties

associated with the request.







In Re: Special Use Permit – Dominion Virginia Energy, Tower

Mr. Fowler stated the County has received a special use permit application for the construction of an unmanned microwave tower to serve as part of the telecommunications network for Dominion Energy Virginia. The proposed tower will be located at 341 Merriman Shop Road on a parcel owned by Virginia

Electric and Power Company, identified as Tax Map 043-A-37, Prince Edward, Virginia. This is in an A1, Agricultural Conservation District.

The tower will be a 235' in height and will be lighted as required by the FAA with one top flashing beacon and flashing side beacons at the tower's midpoint. The tower will be located within the existing fenced Pamplin substation.

Dominion Virginia Energy will provide the County co-location opportunities without compensation for emergency services equipment. There is an existing tower located adjacent to the property and due to security reasons is not suitable for Dominion Energy to collocate on. The proposed tower will be for Dominion Energy's communication network to monitor, control and ensure the security and safety of the substation. The property is presently zoned A1, Agricultural Conservation, and this zoning classification permits towers with related unmanned equipment buildings by Special Use Permit.

The Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) conducted a Public Hearing on April 30, 2019 at 10:00 a.m. to receive citizen input prior to considering action for granting a variance from Section 3-100 (C)3 of the Prince Edward County Zoning Ordinance which restricts the height of towers to no greater than 199 feet in height.

Mr. Fowler stated staff does not have any concerns of negative impacts on the surrounding properties associated with the request. There was no opposition during the BZA Public Hearing. The BZA approved the variance.

John Mulligan, Dominion Energy Virginia representative, explained the microwave tower is used for the substations to communicate with one another. The height will be 230' plus a four-foot lightning rod, which brings it to 234'. It must have line-of-sight with the existing tower, which is the reasoning for the height. It will be outside of the substation in a separate enclosed fenced area; he presented the site plan. He stated there is another tower nearby but Dominion does not like to collocate on towers because they cannot control who has access to the tower and cannot afford the risk of someone interfering in the communications on the transmission grid. He said it would be exclusively Dominion Energy Virginia except for the County to collocate their emergency communication system, but no private entities.

Chairman Prengaman opened the public hearing.

There being no one wishing to speak, Chairman Prengaman closed the public hearing.

Commissioner Jones made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Hunt, to recommend approval for the Special Use Permit application from Dominion Energy Virginia to construct an unmanned microwave tower; the motion carried:





1. **Poplar Hill CDA – Board Position**: The Board of Supervisors appoints three members of the eight-member Poplar Hill Community Development Authority. Two have historically been citizens and one has been a member of the Board of Supervisors. Currently, Supervisor Gene Southall holds the Board position on the CDA. His term expires June 30, 2019.

Recommendation: The Board will wish to re-appoint Supervisor Gene Southall to the Poplar Hill CDA for a two-year term to expire June 30, 2021.

2. Virginia Growth Alliance – County Alternate: The County has two voting members on the Virginia Growth Alliance (VGA) Board, including Board of Supervisors member, Odessa Pride, Ed.D., and County Administrator, Wade Bartlett. County Administrator's Report: VRA Financing

Summary: The total cost of the three capital projects the County has authorized – (1) Renovating the former STEPS CENTRE, (2) Constructing a new building to house the County's Social Service operations, and (3) Renovations to the Courthouse complex - will exceed \$10 million. The County's fund balance while above average for Counties of similar size is not large enough to allow the County to pay cash for all of these costs. After hearing a presentation from the County's financial advisor on April 16, 2019 the Board of Supervisors authorized the submission of an application to the Virginia Resources Authority (VRA) to participate in the summer bond pool being developed by the VRA.

The VRA is an agency of the Commonwealth that borrows for the benefits of local governments and is planning a bond sale in early August. The County participated in such bond sales by VRA in 2011 and again in 2017 when the County refinanced portions of the 2011 bonds to lower the interest rates thus decreasing the County's debt service. The County used the Courthouse as collateral and entered into a lease and lease-back arrangement with VRA to secure the bonds

To continue to move forward with the proposed financing plan the Board will need to approve the attached resolution. This resolution sets both the maximum amount of any borrowing (\$10,125,000) and the maximum term (15 years). In addition, the resolution sets the maximum true interest cost at 4%. The Resolution again authorizes the use of the Courthouse as collateral and amending the leases to reflect the new borrowing.

We have until July 15, 2019 to adjust the amount of the loan and/or the term. I recommend the Board hold a special meeting dedicated to this topic with the objective of determining both the amount of funds to be borrowed and the term of the borrowing. This should occur no later than the July meeting scheduled for July 9, 2019.

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA APPROVING THE LEASE FINANCING OF VARIOUS CAPITAL PROJECTS FOR THE COUNTY AND AUTHORIZING THE LEASING OF CERTAIN COUNTY-OWNED PROPERTY, THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN AMENDED AND RESTATED PRIME LEASE AND A LOCAL ACQUISITION AND AMENDED AND RESTATED FINANCING LEASE, AND OTHER RELATED ACTIONS

WHEREAS, on November 16, 2011, the Virginia Resources Authority ("VRA") issued its Infrastructure and State Moral Obligation Revenue Bonds (Virginia Pooled Financing Program), Series 2011B, and loaned a portion of the proceeds thereof to the County of Prince Edward, Virginia (the "County") pursuant to a Local Lease Acquisition Agreement and Financing Lease dated as of October 15, 2011 between the County and VRA (the "2011B Financing Lease"), to assist the County in financing the 2011B Project (as defined in the 2011B Financing Lease);

WHEREAS, on August 17, 2017, VRA issued its Infrastructure and State Moral Obligation Revenue Bonds (Virginia Pooled Financing Program), Series 2017B, and loaned a portion of the proceeds thereof to the County pursuant to a Local Lease Acquisition Agreement and Amended and Restated Financing Lease dated as of June 23, 2017 between the County and VRA (the "2017B Financing Lease" and collectively, with the 2011B Financing Lease, the "Prior Financing Leases"), to assist the County in financing the 2017B Project (as defined in the 2017B Financing Lease);

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors (the "Board") of the County intends (i) to finance all or a portion of the costs (or to reimburse the County for payment of such costs) of various capital improvements, including the construction of a new social services facility and the renovation of the County's courthouse facilities (the "Projects") and (ii) to pay costs of issuance associated therewith;

WHEREAS, the Board has determined that it is in the best interest of the County to enter into a lease arrangement in order to obtain funds to finance the Projects;

WHEREAS, the Board is authorized, pursuant to Section 15.2-1800 of the Code of Virginia of 1950, as amended, to lease any improved or unimproved real estate held by the County;

WHEREAS, VRA intends to issue its Infrastructure and State Moral Obligation Revenue Bonds (Virginia Pooled Financing Program), Series 2019B (the "VRA Bonds"), and to provide a portion of the proceeds to the County to finance the Projects pursuant to the terms of a Local Lease Acquisition Agreement and Amended and Restated Financing Lease (the "Financing Lease"), between the County and VRA, which will amend and restate the Prior Financing Leases;

WHEREAS, the County will enter into an Amended and Restated Prime Lease (the "Prime Lease") with VRA whereby the County will lease certain real estate, which may include any or all of the real estate related to the County's courthouse, owned by the County as may be required by VRA (the "Real Estate") and the associated improvements and property located thereon (the "Improvements") to VRA;

WHEREAS, the County will enter into the Financing Lease with VRA pursuant to which VRA will lease the Real Estate and the Improvements back to the County and the County will make rental payments corresponding in amount and timing to the debt service on the portion of the VRA Bonds issued to finance the Projects (the "Rental Payments");

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Financing Lease the County will undertake and complete the Projects;

WHEREAS, the County intends to pay the Rental Payments out of appropriations from the County's General Fund;

WHEREAS, the Financing Lease shall indicate that approximately \$10,125,000 is the amount of proceeds requested (the "Proceeds Requested") from VRA;

WHEREAS, VRA has advised the County that the sale date of the VRA Bonds is tentatively scheduled for July 24, 2019, but may occur, subject to market conditions, at any time between July 15, 2019 and August 15, 2019 (the "VRA Sale Date"), and that VRA's objective is to pay the County an amount which, in VRA's judgment, reflects the market value of the Rental Payments under the Financing Lease (the "VRA Purchase Price Objective"), taking into consideration the Proceeds Requested and such factors as the purchase price to be received by VRA for VRA Bonds, the issuance costs of the VRA Bonds (consisting of the underwriters' discount and other costs incurred by VRA (collectively, the "VRA Costs")) and other market conditions relating to the sale of the VRA Bonds;

WHEREAS, such factors may result in the County receiving an amount other than the par amount of the aggregate principal components of the Rental Payments under the Financing Lease and consequently (i) the aggregate principal components of the Rental Payments under the Financing Lease may be greater than the Proceeds Requested in order to receive an amount of proceeds that is substantially equal to the Proceeds Requested, or (ii) if the maximum authorized aggregate principal components of the Rental Payments under the Financing Lease set forth in paragraph 4 of this Resolution does not exceed the Proceeds Requested by at least the amount of the VRA Costs and any original issue discount, the amount to be paid to the County, given the VRA Purchase Price Objective and market conditions, will be less than the Proceeds Requested; and

WHEREAS, the Prime Lease and the Financing Lease are referred to herein as the "Documents." Copies of the Documents are on file with the County Administrator.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA:

- 1. <u>Approval of Lease-Leaseback Arrangement</u>. The lease-leaseback arrangement with VRA to accomplish the financing of the Projects is hereby approved.
- **2.** Approval of Prime Lease. The leasing of the Real Estate and the Improvements by the County, as lessor, to VRA, as lessee, pursuant to the terms of the Prime Lease is hereby approved.
- **3.** Approval of the Financing Lease. The leasing of the Real Estate and the Improvements by VRA, as lessor, to the County, as lessee, pursuant to the terms of the Financing Lease is hereby approved.
- 4. Approval of the Terms of the Rental Payments. The Rental Payments set forth in the Financing Lease shall be composed of principal and interest components reflecting an original aggregate principal amount not to exceed \$10,125,000 and a true interest cost not to exceed 4.0% per annum (exclusive of "Supplemental Interest" as provided in the Financing Lease and taking into account any original issue discount or premium) and the final maturity shall be not later than December 31, 2034.

It is determined to be in the best interest of the County to accept the offer of VRA to enter into the Financing Lease with the County, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Resolution, which Financing Lease shall be executed by the Chairman of the Board (the "Chairman") and the County Administrator, or either of them. Given the VRA Purchase Price Objective and market conditions, it may become necessary to enter into the Financing Lease with aggregate principal components of the Rental Payments greater than the Proceeds Requested. If the limitation on the maximum aggregate principal components of Rental Payments on the Financing Lease set forth in this paragraph 4 restricts VRA's ability to generate the Proceeds Requested, taking into account the VRA Costs, the VRA Purchase Price Objective and market conditions, the County Administrator is authorized to accept a purchase price at an amount less than the Proceeds Requested. The actions of the County Administrator shall be conclusive, and no further action shall be necessary on the part of the Board of Supervisors.

The Financing Lease, in substantially the form presented to this meeting, is hereby approved, with such completions, omissions, insertions and changes not inconsistent with this Resolution as may be approved by the Chairman or the County Administrator. The Chairman and the County Administrator, either of whom may act are hereby authorized and directed to enter into the Financing Lease.

The actions of the Chairman and the County Administrator in accepting the final terms of the Rental Payments shall be conclusive, and no further action shall be necessary on the part of the Board.

- 5. Other Payments under Financing Lease. The County agrees to pay all amounts required by the Financing Lease, including any amounts required by Section 5.1(b) of the Financing Lease, including the "Supplemental Interest," as provided in such section.
- 6. <u>Execution and Recordation of Documents</u>. The Chairman and the County Administrator, either of whom may act, are authorized and directed to execute the Documents and deliver them to the other parties thereto. The Chairman and the County Administrator, either

of whom may act, are further authorized to cause the Prime Lease and the Financing Lease, to be recorded in the Clerk's Office of the Circuit Court of Prince Edward County.

- 7. Form of Documents. The Documents shall be in substantially the forms on file with the County Administrator, which are hereby approved with such completions, omissions, insertions and changes as may be approved by the Chairman and the County Administrator, either of whom may act, with the execution and delivery of the Documents by the Chairman and/or the County Administrator constituting conclusive evidence of the approval of any such completions, omissions, insertions, and changes.
- 8. <u>Essentiality of the Projects and Real Estate</u>. The Projects, the Real Estate and the Improvements are hereby declared to be essential to the efficient operation of the County, and the County anticipates that the Projects, the Real Estate and the Improvements will continue to be essential to the operation of the County during the term of the Financing Lease.
- 9. **Annual Budget.** While recognizing that it is not empowered to make any binding commitment to make Rental Payments and any other payments required under the Financing Lease beyond the current fiscal year, the Board hereby states its intent to make annual appropriations for future fiscal years in amounts sufficient to make all such payments and hereby recommends that future Boards do likewise during the term of the Financing Lease. The Board directs the County Administrator, or such other officer who may be charged with the responsibility for preparing the County's annual budget, to include in the budget request for each fiscal year during the term of the Financing Lease an amount sufficient to pay the Rental Payments and all other payments coming due under the Financing Lease during such fiscal year. If at any time during any fiscal year of the County throughout the term of the Financing Lease, the amount appropriated in the County's annual budget in any such fiscal year is insufficient to pay when due the Rental Payments and any other payments required under the Financing Lease, the Board directs the County Administrator, or such other officer who may be charged with the responsibility for preparing the County's annual budget, to submit to the Board at the next scheduled meeting, or as promptly as practicable but in any event within 45 days, a request for a supplemental appropriation sufficient to cover the deficit.
- 10. Rental Payments Subject to Appropriation. The County's obligation to make the Rental Payments and all other payments pursuant to the Financing Lease is hereby specifically stated to be subject to annual appropriation therefor by the Board, and nothing in this resolution or the Documents shall constitute a pledge of the full faith and credit or taxing power of the County or compel the Board to make any such appropriation.
- 11. <u>Disclosure Documents</u>. The County authorizes and consents to the inclusion of information with respect to the County to be contained in VRA's Preliminary Official Statement and VRA's Official Statement in final form, both to be prepared in connection with the sale of the VRA Bonds. If appropriate, such disclosure documents shall be distributed in such manner and at such times as VRA shall determine. The County Administrator is authorized and directed to take whatever actions are necessary and/or appropriate to aid VRA in ensuring compliance with Securities and Exchange Commission Rule 15c2-12.

- 12. Tax Documents. The County Administrator and the Chairman, either of whom may act, is authorized to execute a Nonarbitrage Certificate and Tax Compliance Agreement and/or any related document (the "Tax Documents") setting forth the expected use and investment of the proceeds of the VRA Bonds to be received pursuant to the Documents and containing such covenants as may be necessary in order for the County and/or VRA to comply with the provisions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (the "Tax Code"), with respect to the VRA Bonds and the Documents including the provisions of Section 148 of the Tax Code and applicable regulations relating to "arbitrage bonds." The County covenants that the proceeds of the VRA Bonds to be received pursuant to the Documents will be invested and expended as set forth in the Tax Documents, to be delivered simultaneously with the issuance and delivery of the Financing Lease and that the County shall comply with the other covenants and representations contained therein.
- 13. Other Actions. All other actions of the officers of the County in conformity with the purpose and intent of this Resolution are hereby approved and confirmed. Summary:

The Green Ridge Recycling and Disposal Facility is a subsidiary of County Waste and will be the landfill proposed to open in Cumberland County. Green Ridge was required by DEQ to contact every locality in Virginia and offer them the ability to reserve capacity in the proposed landfill. Attached is the letter the County received from Green Ridge explaining this offer, attachment (1). Also attached is a form that once completed would either serve as an acceptance to reserve capacity in the landfill or decline the offer to reserve capacity.

Signing the agreement would not lock the County into any obligation to actually use their landfill. I clarified this with Mr. Cifor, senior vice-president who will oversee design, construction and management of the site. As both the letter and the agreement to reserve capacity state – the County and Green Ridge must reach a mutually agreeable contract before moving forward.

The County has been well served by operating our own landfill for many years and there is no intention to change operations. It will take approximately 2-3 years before this proposed landfill is ready to accept waste over that period there could be unexpected items that arise (DEQ regulations, increased costs, decreased revenues, etc.) that could make it appealing to take advantage of this offer. It would be in the County's best interest to keep all options open. At the disposal rate we are seeing I would recommend the County request to reserve 52,271 cubic yards per year of capacity.

Summary:

Since 2003 when the General Assembly transferred the responsibility of designating nonprofit organizations as tax exempt from real or personal property taxes or both to the local governing body, it has been the policy of the Board of Supervisors not to approve any such requests.

A quick search using a service called GuideStar found a list of over 150 non-profit organizations in Prince Edward County. Staff believes this number is low because. Most of the non-profits focus their efforts on providing assistance in a narrow band of services. Some of these areas are (1) providing food, (2) education, (3) health care, (4) physical disabilities, (5) providing clothing, (6) care of animals, (7) support of the environment, (7) the arts, (8) veterans, (9) senior citizens, (10) domestic violence, (11) suicide prevention, (12) recreation, (13) housing and many more. All of these organizations provide a valuable service to the Community.

The policy of not approving any requests has served the Board well over the years. Picking and choosing which organizations should receive tax payers' dollars and which should not be the same as deciding which citizens in the County should receive funding from the tax payers and who should not, since each of the nonprofits serve a specific target audience that is rather narrow in scope.

In 2016 the Board approved a Funding Policy for Non-County Agencies. That policy determined that the provision of public safety was a core function of the government. The agencies providing such services could not be established without approval of the governing body and as such serve as extensions of the County Government and deserve to receive tax payer dollars. The policy then listed eight organizations that were either agencies of the state, or were created by action of the County and Town of Farmville. It was deemed these agencies should be treated as County departments.

The remainder of the agencies receiving funding were deemed not to be providing a core service or if they were, they were ancillary to the primary provider of such services.

That way the amount of tax payer dollars provided could be reviewed each year and adjusted based on new information. But if the Board wishes to create a longer-term policy, I recommend the Board develop a policy specifically listing the type of services provided that would qualify an organization to be considered for tax exemption.

With the large number of non-profits in the County, providing tax exemption to some organizations without a defined process would create confusion on which organizations should receive tax exemption and which should not.

PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS POLICY FOR FUNDING NON-COUNTY AGENCIES AND ORGANIZATIONS EFFECTIVE DATE: June 14, 2016

I. Purpose

The Board of Supervisors of Prince Edward County receives numerous funding requests from non-county agencies. The Board is aware many of these organizations provide valuable services to citizens of Prince Edward County. These organizations either enhance the lives of County citizens or support operations of County government. At the same time the Board is cognizant of its fiduciary responsibility to the tax payers of Prince Edward County. This policy is intended to guide the Board with its fiduciary duties and responsibilities and aid in the prudent and consistent evaluation of funding requests.

II. Definition

In the past, all organizations that were not under the direct control of the County were lumped into one category in the County budget often called "outside organizations." These organizations followed the same policy regarding requesting funds from the County during the County's budget development process. After careful deliberation the Board has determined these organizations are best divided in to three distinct categories.

First, is a Public Safety Category. This category includes firefighting and emergency medical service response. Providing Public Safety is a core function of government. These organizations cannot be established without the approval of the governing body (15.2-955). Additionally, the governing body has the authority to dissolve such fire/EMS agencies if for any reason it deems it advisable (27-10). These responsibilities and duties codified in the Code of Virginia document these services are a core function of government. In small/rural communities these services are often performed by volunteer organizations. These volunteer agencies provide these core functions at the least cost to the citizens. But because these are core functions and are vital to the well-being of the citizens, the Commonwealth has developed certain controls and criteria these agencies must meet if they are to exist.

In Prince Edward County Firefighting services are performed by the Volunteer Fire Departments while emergency medical service is provided by a combination of volunteer non-profit organizations and for-profit agencies. The volunteer organizations provide the majority of the service to Prince Edward citizens while the for-profit agencies serve primarily as a backup service. The Board does not believe the use of taxpayer dollars to support for-profit organizations providing emergency medical service is appropriate. Prince Edward County has authorized the creation of the volunteer fire/EMS agencies in

the County and as such has a special relationship to these organizations. These agencies will no longer be considered as outside organizations. Instead they will be treated the same as a County department during the budget process. They will still submit funding requests and those will be considered by the Board of Supervisors the same as other County departments.

The second category contains organizations that are either state agencies, political subdivisions of the state, agencies created by the County and the Town of Farmville. For many of these organizations the County appoints members to their governing boards or the agency provides services to the citizens the state has deemed a core function and the state and local governments have a long history of sharing costs. These agencies are listed in Attachment A. These agencies will also be treated as a County department during the budget process. They will still submit funding requests and those will be considered by the Board of Supervisors the same as other County departments.

The final category contains all other agencies which perform services for citizens but which are not deemed to be a core function of local government. Or, if providing a core service, is ancillary to the primary provider of such service. To assist the Board with their fiduciary duties and responsibilities and aid in the prudent and consistent evaluation of funding requests received from such organizations the Board has created the following policies and criteria which must be met before the Board will consider funding request and which will guide the decision process. The agencies currently receiving funds are listed in Attachment A.

- 1. The agency must be affiliated with the County by providing services directly to County residents.
- 2. Only organizations providing educational, health, safety or social services will receive funding consideration. Health includes agencies that provide food to citizens.
- 3. Only 501c(3) organizations or non-profits that provide financial statements will be considered.
- 4. No new organization can receive funding unless two-thirds of the Board of Supervisors approve. All members must be present for such a vote.
- 5. For FY17 and FY18 the total amount reserved for allocation to such agencies will be no more than \$150,000. The Board of Supervisors will establish a new spending limit for FY19 and beyond.
- 6. Once the budget is approved for any fiscal year, the Board will not consider any new or additional funding requested by any organization or Board member except in case of an emergency. Additional funding provided due to an emergency will not be provided unless approved by two-thirds of the Board of Supervisors. All members must be present for the vote.
- 7. All funds provided are subject to modification, reduction, or can be completely rescinded without prior notification. Such action will require approval of two-thirds of the Board of Supervisors. All members must be present for the vote.

These procedures will be used during the development of the annual budget and cannot be amended or abolished without the approval of two-thirds of the Board of Supervisors. All members must be present for the vote. The Board of Supervisors understands that one Board cannot bind a future Board. It is envisioned this policy will be ratified or amended during the organizational meeting of each new Board.

Memorandum

To: Board of Supervisors From: W.W. Bartlett May 21, 2019

The past several budget cycles have seen several outside organizations, which the County has traditionally funded, request an increase in that funding. This has put pressure on the Board's policy of limiting the amount of tax payers dollars provided to such organizations. All of these organizations provide a valuable service to their clients. In other words, they all are going good work. That is not the question. The issue is the use of tax payer dollars and the ability of the Board to maintain control over the County Budget.

In almost every case the organization cites a need for the additional funding because they have either expanded their program or have created new programs to meet a need that they have determined should be addressed. In most, if not every instance the expansion is addressing a legitimate need.

But the decision to expand means the organization has to raise additional funding to meet the amount of the "match" for the specific program. To meet the match requirements these organizations most often look to the local government as the source of the matching revenue. In almost every case the local government is not aware of the decision to expand services creating the need for additional funds. Some of these organizations have implied or packaged the requested increase as a funding mandate for the County. This is not an accurate assessment of the situation.

To expect the local governments to fund all of these program expansions when they have no or at most a limited say in the decision is not fair to either the Board of Supervisors or the County tax payer. To expect all or even one of these requests to be automatically funded means the Board of Supervisors will have lost control over the County's budget.

If any organization decides to expand programs it is not unreasonable, they be held responsible for raising the increased funding required and not automatically look to the local taxpayer. If the organization determines the only source of the additional funding is the local government, that organization should involve the local government prior to committing itself to the increased funding.

Before the resolution was adopted, the Senate of Virginia recognized and welcomed to the Capitol Director of Nutrition and Transportation Thomas Jordan Miles III, who was lobbying with the Virginia Association of Area Agencies on Aging and PSR.

The resolution highlights the work that PSR has performed in the seven-county area of Amelia, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway and Prince Edward counties for more than 40 years. Full text of the resolution is below.

SENATE JOINT RESOLUTION NO. 428

Offered February 15, 2019

Commending Piedmont Senior Resources Area Agency on Aging, Inc.

WHEREAS, for over 40 years, the Piedmont Senior Resources Area Agency on Aging, Inc., has played a vital role in helping local residents age with dignity by providing education, advocacy, and support; and

WHEREAS, the goal of Piedmont Senior Resources is to promote the maximum level of independence for persons 60 years of age and older, and to ensure that older residents of Buckingham, Cumberland, Amelia, Nottoway, Lunenburg, Charlotte, and Prince Edward counties live as an integral part of society, with access to programs and services that meet their needs and preferences; and

WHEREAS, to that end, Piedmont Senior Resources offers numerous programs, including a post-hospitalization program to decrease readmissions and a medical transportation program; major growth and expansion in recent years includes budget growth of over a half a million dollars and the No Wrong Door community expansion, with nutrition delivery growth up from 20,000 meals annually to 100,000 annually over the last four years; and

WHEREAS, key volunteers play a crucial role in supporting the Piedmont Senior Resources, namely Navona Hart of Real Living Cornerstone, Sidney Allen of Rochette's Florist, and Nash Osborn and Matt Hurley of The Fishin' Pig; other key volunteers include the volunteer advisory council; the board members; and students at Longwood University, Hampden-Sydney College, and Southside Virginia Community College; and

WHEREAS, Piedmont Senior Resources has been recognized with awards and grants by local, state, and national organizations including a Workplace Development Award, a No Wrong Door Award from the Department of Aging and Rehabilitation, and grants from Meals on Wheels of America, Subaru, the Centra Foundation, the Department of Rails and Transportation, Dominion Power, the Walter Payne Foundation, Norfolk and Southern Railroad, and Hampden-Sydney College; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED by the Senate, the House of Delegates concurring, That the General Assembly hereby commend the Piedmont Senior Resources Area Agency on Aging, Inc., for playing a vital role in helping local residents age with dignity by providing education, advocacy, and support for over 40 years; and, be it

RESOLVED FURTHER, That the Clerk of the Senate prepare a copy of this resolution for presentation to the Piedmont Senior Resources Area Agency on Aging, Inc., as an expression of the General Assembly's admiration for its efforts to foster independence and healthy aging, and improve the quality of life for older adults, their families, and their caregivers through comprehensive programs and services.

May 2019 Summary

On the Production Floor

- Westmoreland Berry Farm returned with this year's bumper crop of strawberries to make some
 jam. Susan said via email: "DELICIOUS strawberry preserves! ... I learned a lot and shared with
 my store employees that it is all done by hand." They are currently accumulating frozen
 blueberries and blackberries to return later in the season.
- Rupen Rao has officially launched three new sauce flavors with his most recent production. We
 created approximately 250 units each of Korma, Tikka Masala, and Tandoori Marinade. We are
 wishing him luck in getting into Whole Foods.
- Carolyn Lilley of Lilley Farms used up the last 2018's strawberries on some more jam as well as some spicy strawberry jam with habaneros in it. Flavored jams like this are becoming an increasingly popular way for farmer clients to add more variety to their offering.
- Two new clients came in for test batches this month: Tommy Terrell did his first trial of two
 vegetable-forward hot sauces. His "Purple SOSS" features beets and carrots and his "Green
 SOSS" features anaheims and dill. Marc-Anthony Richardson ran a test batch of his mango
 sauce, a sweet-savory sauce with a hint of spice.
- A group of VSU students visited the cannery and made some blueberry jam from fruit grown on VSU's Randolph Farm. The faculty also gifted VFW some extra blueberries and aronia berries to do some recipe trialing with.

In the Office

- Michelle has been doing a bit of recipe development and is currently working on a versatile fruit vinaigrette that would be a great non-jam option for our fruit farmers.
- Terri Irish of Washington State has been in touch with VFW in the past looking for advice on starting her own similar non-profit in her region. She is raising funds now for a visit to the cannery for more in-depth consultations and hands-on learning. We expect her visit in July or August.
- Allie and Michelle met with folks from Monticello at their Tufton Farm property. We discussed
 the future of value-added foods for Monticello and brainstormed new recipe ideas.
- Michelle talked with Julian Kroboth of Community Foodworks DC. Their mission is increasing
 healthy local food access for low income individuals. They are considering purchasing excess
 produce from farmers to make into products to distribute to the community they serve.
