Appropriations - Prince Edward County Schools, Food Service Budget

Summary:

The Prince Edward County School Board respectfully requests an appropriation of funds in the amount of \$58,056. These funds were obtained from the Equipment Assistance Grant for School Nutrition Program. The grant does not require a local match.

The Equipment Assistance Grant will allow the replacement of two cold food containers at the Elementary cafeteria; one cold refrigerator counter at the High School cafeteria, and two hot food tables and two cold food tables at the Middle School cafeteria.

The School Board respectfully request the funds be appropriated to the Food Service 2016-2017 Budget, which will increase that budget to \$1,146,483.
