Issue: Request for Refund from Delinquent Tax Land Sale

Summary: Attached for your consideration is a letter from Treasurer Donna Nunnally explaining the circumstances by which a 4.00-acre parcel land was sold at the tax sale on October 26, 2010 and the parcel did not exist. The purchaser has requested a refund in the amount of \$3,500.

The Code of Virginia provides that the Board of Supervisors may issue a refund in an amount up to \$2,500. Any amount over that requires a court order from the Circuit Court Judge.

Additionally, the Board will wish to take action to request the Commissioner of the Revenue to remove this parcel from the land records.

Recommendation:

- 1. The Board will wish to authorize the refund, and request that Judge White enter an order directing the Treasurer to issue a refund in the amount of \$3,500 to Mr. Carl Crigger;
- 2. Authorize the Treasurer to remove the property from the delinquent tax records; and
- 3. Authorize the Commissioner of the Revenue to remove this parcel from the land records of Prince Edward County.

§ 58.1-3971. Property improperly placed on delinquent land books.

A. The attorney shall periodically report to the governing body employing him every parcel of real estate which he ascertains to be improperly placed on the delinquent land books and the governing body, upon satisfying itself of the correctness of the report, or correcting it to conform to the facts, shall certify the information to the treasurer who shall mark his delinquent land book accordingly. The attorney shall make the same report to the commissioner of the revenue and request that the commissioner of the revenue correct the assessment of such property pursuant to § 58.1-3981, and the attorney shall, to the extent necessary if the correction is not or cannot be made pursuant to § 58.1-3981, move the court to enter an order correcting such assessment accordingly.

B. If any parcel which is improperly placed on the delinquent land books is sold under the provisions of this article, the purchaser shall be entitled to a refund of the entire amount he paid for such parcel. The governing body shall reimburse the court or the appropriate party for costs and fees allowed out of such payment.

Dear Mr. Fore:

Through the USDA Small Watershed Program, the Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) and the Piedmont Soil & Water Conservation District (PSWCD), assisted with the installation of Buffalo Creek Dam No. 2, Stockton Lake, in 1962. We are pleased that the dam has provided 50 years of useful life and service to the Prince Edward County Watershed community. The original investment of taxpayer's resources yielded a far greater return than originally foreseen. It is estimated that \$49,300 in annual benefits such as reduction in flood damages, increase in property values, wildlife habitat and recreational benefits have been provided to Prince Edward County, and these benefits will continue. The PSWCD and NRCS have operated and maintained this dam for 50 years to comply with all current federal and state regulations, thus insuring a safe structure.

Now that the operation and maintenance agreement has expired for the Stockton Lake Dam, the federal interest is complete and the local sponsors, PSWCD and Prince Edward County, are free to operate and maintain the dam unencumbered by NRCS requirements. However, both sponsors still have operation and maintenance responsibilities in order to remain in compliance with the applicable laws, regulations and ordinances that will continue to provide multiple benefits for many years into the future. Also by following the operation and maintenance responsibilities, sponsors will be eligible to participate in the Dam Rehabilitation Program in future years if needed. NRCS will continue to provide technical assistance, dependent upon funding and staff resources, upon request.

The PSWCD would like to thank Prince Edward County for their support as a local sponsor in this watershed dam project over the past 50 years. The PSWCD recently provided to Prince Edward County a copy of the downstream flood inundation study for Stockton Lake Dam. We strongly encourage the Board of Supervisors, along with the Planning Commission and county staff, to consider the results of these studies before allowing any construction of buildings or structures within the breach zone. Thereby minimizing the potential loss of life if the dam should fail and assuring that future property damages are kept to a minimum. Downstream construction could cause a change of hazard classification, which would result in additional costs to maintain in the future.
