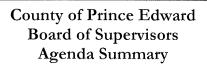

Issue:	Emergency Management Appointments

Summary: The *Code of Virginia* requires that emergency management positions be by appointment of the Board of Supervisors. As County Administrator, my contract designates me as Director of Emergency Management. I am asking the Board to appoint Sarah Puckett, Deputy Director of Emergency Management.

Additionally, the Virginia Department of Emergency Management has requested that each locality adopt an "authorizing resolution" for the Statewide Mutual Aid Program (SMA). SMA is used when a disaster strikes a locality and it requests assistance from other localities across Virginia. The resolution designates that the County Administrator and Assistant County Administrator are authorized to request, offer, provide assistance and incur cost on behalf of the County, in the event of an emergency/disaster. The resolution also designates Coordinating Officers who are authorized to provide information on resource capabilities on behalf of the County.

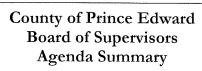

Summary: As we discussed during the County budget process, legislative action by the 2012 Virginia General Assembly requires Boards of Supervisors to make certain decisions by July 1, 2012 regarding employer and employee retirement contributions, as follows:

- 1. Resolution #1 <u>Employer Retirement Contribution Rate:</u> The first resolution establishes what employer contribution rate the County will pay for the biennium beginning July 1, 2012:
 - 12.25% the rate certified by VRS for the 2012-2014 biennium; or
 - 10.11% the alternate rate, which is the higher of the current rate certified by VRS or 70% of the VRS certified rate for 2012-2014.

Should the Board opt to use the 10.11% alternate rate, the County's contribution to our VRS account will be less than the amount recommended by the actuarial study. The result will be higher contribution rates in the future. Option for the lower rate would decrease the FY 13 VRS cost for the County by \$74,418.

 Resolution #2 - <u>Employee Contribution Rate</u>: Effective July 1, 2012, all Plan 1 employees (VRS members prior to July 1, 2010) and Plan 2 employees (new hires after July 1, 2010) of schools divisions and political subdivisions must begin paying a 5% member contribution. The Board has determined that it will implement the total 5% effective July 1, 2012 and that employees will receive a comparable offsetting salary increase effective July 1, 2012.

Employer Contribution Rates for Counties, Cities, Towns, School Divisions and Other Political Subdivisions (In accordance with the 2012 Appropriation Act Item 468(H))

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Prince Edward County 55173 does hereby acknowledge that its contribution rates effective July 1, 2012 shall be based on the higher of a) the contribution rate in effect for FY 2012, or b) seventy percent of the results of the June 30, 2011 actuarial valuation of assets and liabilities as approved by the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees for the 2012-14 biennium (the "Alternate Rate") provided that, at its option, the contribution rate may be based on the employer contribution rates certified by the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees pursuant to Virginia Code § 51.1-145(I) resulting from the June 30, 2011 actuarial value of assets and liabilities (the "Certified Rate"); and

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Prince Edward County 55173 does hereby certify to the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees that it elects to pay the following contribution rate effective July 1, 2012:

BE IT ALSO RESOLVED, that the Prince Edward County 55173 does hereby certify to the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees that it has reviewed and understands the information provided by the Virginia Retirement System outlining the potential future fiscal implications of any election made under the provisions of this resolution; and

NOW, THEREFORE, the officers of Prince Edward County 55173 are hereby authorized and directed in the name of the Prince Edward County to carry out the provisions of this resolution, and said officers of the Prince Edward County are authorized and directed to pay over to the Treasurer of Virginia from time to time such sums as are due to be paid by Prince Edward County for this purpose.

Member Contributions by Salary Reduction for Counties, Cities, Towns, and Other Political Subdivisions

(In accordance with Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497))

Resolution

WHEREAS, the Prince Edward County 55173 employees who are Virginia Retirement System members who commence or recommence employment on or after July 1, 2012 ("FY2013 Employees" for purposes of this resolution), shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis upon commencing or recommencing employment; and

WHEREAS, the Prince Edward County 55173 employees who are Virginia Retirement System members and in service on June 30, 2012, shall be required to contribute five percent of their creditable compensation by salary reduction pursuant to Internal Revenue Code § 414(h) on a pre-tax basis no later than July 1, 2016; and

WHEREAS, such employees in service on June 30, 2012, shall contribute a minimum of an additional one percent of their creditable compensation beginning on each July 1 of 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016, or until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and

WHEREAS, the Prince Edward County 55173 may elect to require such employees in service on June 30, 2012, to contribute more than an additional one percent each year, in whole percentages, until the employees' contributions equal five percent of creditable compensation; and

WHEREAS, the second enactment clause of Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497) requires an increase in total creditable compensation, effective July 1, 2012, to each such employee in service on June 30, 2012, to offset the cost of the member contributions, such increase in total creditable compensation to be equal to the difference between five percent of the employee's total creditable compensation and the percentage of the member contribution paid by such employee on January 1, 2012.

BE IT THEREFORE RESOLVED, that the Prince Edward County 55173 does hereby certify to the Virginia Retirement System Board of Trustees that it shall effect the implementation of the member contribution requirements of Chapter 822 of the 2012 Acts of Assembly (SB497) according to the following schedule for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2012 (i.e., FY2013):

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that such contributions, although designated as member contributions, are to be made by the Prince Edward County in lieu of member contributions; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that pick up member contributions shall be paid from the same source of funds as used in paying the wages to affected employees; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that member contributions made by the Prince Edward County under the pick up arrangement shall be treated for all purposes other than income taxation, including but not limited to VRS benefits, in the same manner and to the same extent as member contributions made prior to the pick up arrangement; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that nothing herein shall be construed so as to permit or extend an option to VRS members to receive the pick up contributions made by the Prince Edward County directly instead of having them paid to VRS; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that notwithstanding any contractual or other provisions, the wages of each member of VRS who is an employee of the Prince Edward County shall be reduced by the amount of member contributions picked up by the Prince Edward County on behalf of such employee pursuant to the foregoing resolutions.

NOW, THEREFORE, the officers of Prince Edward County 55173 are hereby authorized and directed in the name of the Prince Edward County to carry out the provisions of this resolution, and said officers of the Prince Edward County are authorized and directed to pay over to the Treasurer of Virginia from time to time such sums as are due to be paid by the Prince Edward County for this purpose.

Issue:	Consent Agenda - School Budget Procedures

Summary:

The Board of Supervisors had discussion during the Board meeting of April 26, 2012 concerning the procedures currently in place for appropriating funds to the Schools. There were two major points of discussion:

- A. Appropriating funds annually by Category, as is the current practice, vice appropriating funds in a lump sum. The school desires the funds to be appropriated in a lump sum vice by category. This would allow the School Board greater flexibility in the use of funds and allow a faster response whenever situations arise that would require a shift in funds between categories. Currently, for funds to be moved between categories the School Board would have to meet and approve such a request from the Superintendent and then request a meeting of the Board of Supervisors to request approval of the same action.
- B. Allow the School Board to retain any unspent funds in the School Fund. Current practice is for the General Fund to only provide the exact amount required to balance the School Fund after taking into account the state and federal revenues received and comparing them to the actual expenses, subject to the maximum amount of local funds approved and appropriated by the Board of Supervisors. This request would require the Board of Supervisors to appropriate the entire amount of local funds when the all budget items are appropriated, normally during the June Board of Supervisors meeting. While all funds would be appropriated, due to cash flow purposes the funds would not be moved from the General Fund to the Schools fund except on a monthly or quarterly as the Board desires.

At the end of the fiscal year any funds not expended from the School Fund would be retained in the School Fund. This would allow the School Board flexibility in building the school budget for the next year. If the Board of Supervisors approves this request I recommend the Board of Supervisors require the School Board to make a specific request for the use of any funds from the fund balance which would require the Board of Supervisors to vote of the request. I would also recommend such funds only be used for one-time costs such as capital items (equipment or projects costing \$5,000 or greater) until such time as the fund balance accumulates to an amount sufficient enough to allow funding operational expenses during times of economic downturns.
