Approximately four years ago, Greensville County became involved in a new economic development initiative to create a mega site. The County was invited to join this initiative by the Virginia Economic Development Partnership (VEDP), McCallum Sweeney Consulting (MSC) and CSX.

The Commonwealth of Virginia and CSX were interested in creating a marketable mega site that would be competitive to mega sites already established in other states such as Georgia, Alabama, Mississippi and Tennessee. The primary industrial clients, at that time, were original equipment manufacturers in the automobile industry. Toyota, Volkswagen and FIAT were all evaluating sites to locate assembly plants.

Greensville County and the City of Emporia accepted the invitation and began the process of land acquisition and planning for improvements of water facilities, sewer facilities, electrical transmission lines, natural gas lines, road and railroad improvements. Substantial work was undertaken regarding environmental issues such as obtaining the approval of the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality, U.S. Army Corp of Engineers and the Virginia Department of Historic Resources for the mega site. All of the information was provided to McCallum Sweeney and Greensville County was the only jurisdiction in the Commonwealth of Virginia to obtain certification by McCallum Sweeney. It is still the only certified mega site in Virginia and North Carolina and one of only 9 available mega sites in the United States, as 6 of the MSC certified mega-sites have already been sold with an average investment exceeding \$1 billion and average job creation exceeding 1,100.

The Greensville County mega site received serious consideration from both Toyota and Volkswagen even though we were not successful in having either one of those two industries make the decision to locate here. Ironically both Toyota and Volkswagen landed at one of the MSC certified mega-sites identified above.

The County still has a very competitive site for a global industrial client looking for a substantial amount of acreage (at least 1500 acres), interstate visibility, convenient access to a railroad and significant water and sewer capability.

The Commonwealth of Virginia is now renewing its efforts to assist in the <u>development of mega sites</u>, making \$5.0 million through VEDP available for mega site feasibility studies and <u>development</u>. The Virginia Tobacco Commission is also preparing a grant program to develop mega sites in the Tobacco Region. Greensville County and the City of Emporia will be applicants and continue their chase of a major industry in Southside Virginia.

Prince Edward County is within a 50 mile radius of the Mid-Atlantic Advance Manufacturing Center ("MAMaC"). It is our belief that Prince Edward County would benefit significantly from an economy-transforming industry/employment center locating at MAMaC.

We plan to submit an application for grant funding to the Partnership and the Tobacco Commission order to obtain grant funds to assist us in developing MAMaC. In order for our application to be successful, we are kindly requesting your support given the potential positive impact to your community. On behalf of the Greensville County Board of Supervisors, we are formally requesting that the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors adopt the following resolution or one similar to it if you are in support of this community transforming project. I would be glad to meet with you or your Board of Supervisors regarding this request.





Southside Regional Map





WHEREAS, McCallum Sweeney certified the MAMaC site on January 28, 2008 and MAMaC remains as the only mega site certified by McCallum Sweeney in the Commonwealth of Virginia as of this date;

WHEREAS, the development of a mega site in Southside Virginia will have a transformational impact on the economic conditions of Prince Edward County through the creation of new jobs, higher wages and increased business activity within the region;

WHEREAS, new marketing opportunities will be created for industrial sites within Prince Edward County and the region for new businesses and industries wanting to locate near the mega site, increasing investment and job creation in the region;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors recognizes the transformational benefits of the development of MAMaC to the citizens of the Prince Edward County and Southside Virginia;

Issue: FY10 FINANCIAL OVERVIEW

Summary:

The FY10 budget for the General Fund, as amended, projected the use of \$1,477,192 from the Fund Balance. I am pleased to report I estimate we will only require the use of approximately \$837,304. Of this amount \$414,555 or almost 50% will be reimbursed in FY11 from various grants where the expenditures occurred in FY10. Thus, on a cash basis when the grants are closed the fund balance will only decrease by \$422,749. The primary reason was due to the under expenditure of funds by most of the departments.

Both the Piedmont Regional Jail and the Juvenile Detention Center worked hard to hold down costs and generate revenue. The result was a savings of approximately \$150,000 divided almost evenly between the two. The budget for General Properties was under-expended by \$108,000. Utility savings accounted for \$30,000 of the amount but much of the remaining \$78,000 was due to the hard work of all maintenance personnel led by Ron VanEps. When an employee retired last August the position was not filled and all employees took up the slack saving \$32,000. Work normally contracted out was completed in-house contributing to most of the remaining savings. Additionally I estimate we will underexpend CSA by \$200,000 thanks to the work of the FAPT and CPMT.

Local revenues were also a bright spot. I estimate we will collect approximately 274,931 more in local revenues than budgeted. The primary reason was the collection of \$366,071 more in Personal Property taxes than budgeted. We also collected more in Merchants Capital (\$30,135), Penalties & Interest (\$37,683), Vehicle Licenses (\$49,278) and a few items to a lesser degree. But we failed to meet our budget in Real Estate Tax (\$119,385) due to lower collection rates, Local Sales Tax (\$71,781) due to the economy, and Interest Earnings (\$99,209) due to the very low interest rates.

Major reductions occurred in state funding. Revenues for the Constitutional Offices were \$178,000 less than the budget due to the cuts made by the Governor to balance the state budget. Revenues from several state grants when totaled together were almost \$600,000 less than budgeted. These include Tobacco Commission Grants, VDOT and VITA Grants. Expenditures in these grant projects will extend into the new fiscal year and all the funds will be received in FY11. Thus, this is only a short-term issue.

The remainder of the fund results are depicted on the attachment. Overall the fund balance will decrease by \$636,511 but still be \$9,530,847 for all funds, more than adequate to meet our cashflow requirements and provide for any emergencies. As mentioned above, \$414,555 will be replaced in FY11. The decrease was planned by the Board and represents the desire to maintain funding for education and services to our citizens while keeping taxes low. The use of the fund balance in such trying times is appropriate and the purpose for maintaining a fund balance.

McGuire Says Current Economy Creating More Demand for Longwood SBDC Services

Sheri McGuire, Executive Director of the Longwood Small Business Development Center (SBDC) told the Commonwealth Regional Council's (CRC) Chief Administrative Officers Advisory Committee on February 23, 2010 that the current economy has resulted in more clients seeking help from her office.

McGuire said that, of the increased number of clients, the trend has been toward existing businesses seeking help. Additionally, she said Longwood SBDC's monthly workshops have been filling up quickly over recent months. McGuire said that, if demand warrants, her staff is willing to go into outlying areas and conduct these workshops.

Services provided by Longwood SBDC include helping new businesses develop a business plan, helping (new and existing) businesses seek and obtain financial assistance, and reviewing business strategies for existing businesses. Monthly workshops offered by Longwood SBDC include business workshops and seminars, basic bookkeeping classes, and payroll workshops. In addition, Longwood SBDC offers online training and can research business valuations for potential sales.

Longwood SBDC has five offices in Southside Virginia: Farmville (where McGuire is based), Danville, Martinsville, Petersburg, and South Boston. The Farmville Office serves the localities in Planning District 14 – the Counties of Amelia, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway, and Prince Edward.

Crowder Updates Committee on WIB Programs

Southern Virginia Workforce

Debra Crowder, Executive Director of the South Central (Virginia) Workforce Investment Board (WIB), gave a presentation to the Commonwealth Regional Council's (CRC) Chief Administrative Officers Advisory Committee on March 23, 2010 about the programs her agency offers.

The South Central WIB is one of 15 such boards statewide. The South Central WIB serves Area 8, which consists of 10 counties – the counties in Planning District 13 (Brunswick, Halifax, and Mecklenburg) and Planning District 14 (Amelia, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway, and Prince Edward). They serve low-income and low-skilled adults, people who have been laid off, and youth (both in and out of school). Among the services provided by the South Central WIB are: Incumbent Worker Training, where the WIB pays up to 50% of the cost to train an employee; On-the-job training (the WIB pays up to 50% of a worker's salary while they're in training); basic and advanced skills training; and youth programs. The WIB has a contract with Southside Virginia Community College to operate the youth programs.

The Area 8 WIB receives \$1.2 million in federal funding annually to fund their programs. They also received federal stimulus funding in 2009 to operate their youth employment program.

Recycling Update



Sharon Harrup, Chief Executive Officer of STEPS, Inc., and Stephen Coe, Environmental Specialist in the Office of Solid Waste at the Department of Environmental Quality, gave a presentation on recycling to the CRC's Chief Administrative Officers Advisory Committee on May 25, 2010. Harrup presented data on items recycled at the STEPS Farmville Recycling Center in Farmville. The Center accepts cardboard, office paper, newspaper, plastic bottles and jugs (except for motor oil and anti-freeze containers), aluminum cans, and electronic items that have a cord. For all of 2009, STEPS recycled:

- 272 tons of cardboard
- 111 tons of newspaper
- 47 tons of plastic
- Two (2) tons of aluminum cans

Cardboard collected from this facility is shipped to Big Island, Virginia, where it is used to make liner boards and medium for cardboard. Office paper is sent to a paper mill in Rincon, Georgia, for use in Brawny paper towels and Charmin bathroom tissue. Newspaper is delivered to Dublin, Georgia, where it is re-pulped and made into news print rolls for use by the newspaper industry. Aluminum cans are sent to Alabama, where they are shredded and melted into thin sheets. Those sheets are then sent to the Anheuser Busch plant in Williamsburg, where they are again made into aluminum cans. Plastics are shipped to various locations within the United States for uses that include toys, piping, plastic lumber, pens, fencing, floor tiles, picnic tables, laundry detergent, bottles, doghouses, and fiberfill (for winter coats, sleeping bags, life jackets, and other uses).

STEPS, Inc. is a private, non-profit organization that provides job training and development for individuals with disabilities and TANF recipients which lead to an employment, either within one of its facilities or in an unsubsidized community job. STEPS has two locations, Farmville and Victoria. STEPS serves the Counties of Amelia, Appomattox, Brunswick, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Mecklenburg, Nottoway and Prince Edward. CRC Grant Writing Update

Prince Edward County Receives EECBG Grant

The Commonwealth Regional Council (CRC) would like to congratulate Prince Edward County on its successful application to the Virginia Department of Mines, Minerals, and Energy (VDMME) for funding to undertake energy efficiency improvements at the STEPS job training and manufacturing facility in Farmville to facilitate job creation and retention.

Prince Edward County was awarded \$708,002 for the installation of a new HVAC system at the facility. The VDMME funded this project under the Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant (EECBG) Program, which is using federal stimulus funds through the U.S. Department of Energy to fund energy-related projects at the local government level. CRC staff, working with VDMME and acting upon a request from Prince Edward County, prepared the application on the County's behalf and submitted it to VDMME in late 2009. In March 2010, the County learned that this project would be funded under the EECBG Program.

Nearly 150 applications were submitted statewide, seeking a total of approximately \$51 million in EECBG funding. Prince Edward County is one of 39 applicants that received funding (more than \$13 million was awarded for projects across the State).

Victoria DCR Trail Grant Application Funded

The CRC would like to congratulate the Town of Victoria, which learned in June that its grant application to the Department of Conservation and Recreation (DCR) for funding to construct a recreational trail was approved. The trail would run from the Victoria Railroad Park to Twin Cemetery Road, just outside the Town Limits. It would be a multi-use trail, and would connect to the Victoria Railroad Park and (when completed) the Tobacco Heritage Trail.

CRC staff, acting on a request from the Town, assisted with the two-phase application. The first phase was due in July 2009, and consisted of a general project description and supporting documentation. DCR, upon reviewing this application and visiting the project area, advanced the project to the next stage and notified the Town to proceed with the second phase of the application. That phase, which consisted of a more detailed project description and required environmental reviews, plus supporting documentation, was submitted in February 2010.

Victoria Awarded Safe Routes to School Grant

The CRC would like to congratulate the Town of Victoria, which learned in April that it was awarded \$107,158 in Safe Routes to School (SRTS) grant funding from VDOT for infrastructure improvements around Victoria Elementary School. CRC staff, acting on a request from the Town, prepared SRTS grant applications on behalf of the Town and submitted them to VDOT in December 2009. In March 2010, VDOT contacted the Town and asked for a revised grant submission, which the CRC helped to prepare and submit.

The grant will fund activities including new sidewalks, crosswalks, and flashing signage. These improvements are identified in the Lunenburg County School Travel Plan, which was prepared by the CRC in 2009 using a SRTS planning grant.

VDOT Enhancement Awards Announced

The Virginia Commonwealth Transportation Board (CTB) announced Transportation Enhancement Grant awards in June. A total of 131 eligible project proposals were submitted statewide, for an aggregate of just under \$53 million in funding. The CTB awarded a total of just under \$21.97 million for 71 projects. Among localities that were assisted by CRC staff, the Town of Victoria Streetscape Improvements Project (an existing project), was awarded \$204,000. The CRC would like to congratulate the Town of Victoria for its successful grant application.

The deadline for the next round of applications (must be received or postmarked) is December 1, 2010. VDOT has advised that they will only accept applications for existing projects in the upcoming grant cycle.

Tobacco Commission Grant Applications Due

The Virginia Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Commission has announced the following grant deadlines for the second half of 2010:

- Southside Economic Development August 16: Each County within the Commission's Southside Region is allocated funding which could be used for different types of projects geared toward economic development. They include: Building and utility infrastructure creation or improvements; Programs and facilities to provide workforce training; Support of traditional economies, and new opportunities for economic diversification (such as new industry and employment clusters) and entrepreneurial development; Enhancements to regional tourism infrastructure that demonstrate ability to attract measurable visitor revenues; and Broadband deployment and other technology projects.
- Education August 16: This program funds basic education proposals, proposals which
 promote or assist with GED and higher education degree fulfillment, and workforce training
 programs and facilities. Additionally, programs specifically targeting training (for example,
 teachers, nurses or other careers related to current or prospective employers) when such
 employment opportunities exist in a community or region could be considered for funding.
- Agribusiness November 1: These grant fund programs including transitioning farmers into alternative agricultural enterprises, improved production techniques, increasing net farm income, expanding market opportunities, value-added products, and pilot and demonstration programs.

Reminder - VDH Planning Grants Due August 27

Planning grant applications are due to the Virginia Department of Health (VDH) by August 27, 2010. Applications must be received or postmarked by this date. VDH planning grants are open to public and private owners of community waterworks, and can be for up to \$30,000 per project for small, financially stressed community waterworks serving less than 3,300 persons. These grants can fund activities such as preliminary engineering studies, designs and plans and specifications, source water quality and quantity studies, drilling test wells to determine source feasibility, and other similar technical assistance.

CRC Project Update

Update of Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan Underway

The CRC has begun an update of the Regional Hazard Mitigation Plan for Planning District 14. The original Plan was completed in 2005, and the update is required by the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000. A kick-off meeting was held in April, and a workshop is planned for August to go over the results of the updated data collection and risk assessment. Nationally, natural hazards (including hurricanes, wind, and flooding) result in millions of dollars in damage each year. This Plan identifies ways to help localities protect people and property from the effects of natural disasters. As part of the Plan update process, Amelia County's Hazard Mitigation Plan will be incorporated into the Regional Plan (previously, Amelia County was covered under its own Plan). The Regional Plan update is expected to be completed in late 2010 or early 2011.

Current Phase of Dillwyn Enhancement Project Under Construction

The current phase of the Town of Dillwyn Enhancement Project is now under construction. The Commonwealth Regional Council (CRC) is assisting the Town in implementation of the project, which is being funded by a VDOT Enhancement Grant (awarded to the Town in 2006). Activities for this phase include new sidewalks on U.S. 15 from the Main/Oak Street Intersection to Conner Street, a crosswalk at Main and Hancock, period lighting, and trees. The Town has contracted with Farmville Excavation for this project, which is expected to be completed by late summer/early fall.

CRC Assisting Town of Phenix with Municipal Well Project

The Town of Phenix is moving forward with construction on its municipal well project. The CRC is assisting with implementation of the project, which is being funded by a SERCAP grant plus local funding. The project involves the completion of a new municipal well, which was drilled recently, and connecting the well to the Town's water system. The new well will improve the quantity and quality of the Town's water, and reduce the amount of testing required by the Virginia Department of Health (the water is currently subject to additional testing due to the presence of contaminants in the system). Construction is expected to be complete by the end of the year.

CRC Assisting Moton Museum With Facility Improvements

The CRC is assisting the Moton Museum with implementation of a project to install a bus pull-off and related sidewalk system for the historic landmark. The Museum has received approval from VDOT to use \$9,122 in Enhancement Grant funds that were left over from a previous Enhancement Project. All activities are expected to be completed by September, and will provide improved access for the museum – which is a trailhead on the Civil Rights in Education Heritage Trail. The former school for African-Americans was the site of a student strike in 1951 to protest poor school conditions. That strike started a series of events that eventually led to the U.S. Supreme Court's landmark 1954 Brown v. Board of Education ruling.

CRC Updating Regional Bicycle Plan

In the Spring of 2010, the CRC Transportation Committee undertook an update of the 2000 Regional Bicycle Plan. The document is proposed to be adopted in August 2010. For the purpose of this plan, the entire Planning District was evaluated — Amelia, Buckingham, Charlotte, Cumberland, Lunenburg, Nottoway and Prince Edward Counties. The purpose of this plan is to provide information and guidance on the development of bicycle facilities and accommodations to enhance and encourage safe bicycle travel within the District. In updating this plan, the CRC Transportation Committee and CRC staff kept in mind that the plan needed to be realistic and include attainable goals. A Public Input meeting will be held on August 5, 2010 at 6:45 p.m. at the CRC office. A copy of the DRAFT Plan is on the CRC website: http://www.virginiasheartland.org/about-proj trans.html.
