Financial Report

Summary:

This report serves as a quick update of the status of the Fiscal Year that just ended on June 30, 2017. There are still revenues that will be received and bills that have to be paid from the FY17 budget but I have enough knowledge to make a fairly good estimate of what can be expected when the fiscal year is finally closed.

Overall, we will have another successful year in the General Fund with revenue collection exceeding our budget and expenditures less than the budget. I estimate revenues will exceed the budget by at least \$400,000 while expenses will be \$200,000 less budget for a total positive variance of \$600,000. This estimate tracks closely to the Treasurer's monthly report that is showing an increase in the cash balance of about \$700,000 when comparing May 2017 with May of 2016.

Increased collections from Personal Property, Recordation Tax, Fines and Landfill bills are the primary reasons the revenues have exceeded our budget. Personal Property collections are approximately \$140,000 more than expected and reflect the increased numbers of vehicles in the County. The recordation tax is \$72,000 more than budgeted and reflects the increased number of property sales. The Sheriff's at-will program is fully staffed after a period with some vacancies and the result has been almost \$80,000 more in fines being collected than budgeted. Receipts from Landfill bills are about \$135,000 more than budgeted. This is the result of the new company County Waste assuming the routes formally controlled by CFS which had not been using our landfill.

Savings associated with the regional jail, juvenile detention, and the planning and economic development offices were the primary reasons for the expenditure savings.

I will present a more complete report at the September meeting after all of the revenue and expenditure items have been posted.
