FY 17 County Budget Amendments

Summary: During the various budget work sessions, the Board has discussed several amendments to the advertised budget. Those items are listed below and includes the action that I have discerned the majority of the Board wishes to take. The amendments listed below, if all are approved, will not change the amount of the advertised budget, \$51,388,500. The changes do not increase the total budget, they merely reduce the amount that would be returned to the reserve of the General Fund by \$14,762. These amendments to the advertised budget are:

- 1. Reduce the Longwood Small Business Development Center from \$15,000 to \$6,750
- 2. Increase the Library from \$192,156 to \$204,663
- 3. Increase Meals on Wheels from \$4,000 to \$5,000
- 4. Increase Piedmont Senior Resources from \$1,600 to \$2,000
- 5. Increase the Hampden-Sydney First responders from \$0 to \$5,000
- 6. Increase Crossroads Community Services from \$48,000 to \$60,000
- 7. Reduce the Farmville Chamber of Commerce from \$4,000 to \$250
- 8. Increase FACES from \$3,400 to \$4,275
- 9. Reduce SVCC by \$5,000
- 10. Reduce the transfer to the General Fund Balance by \$14,762 to reflect the amendments above

The increases for Piedmont Senior Resources and Crossroads were not specifically discussed by the Board of Supervisors but are in keeping with criteria espoused by the Board. Piedmont Senior Resources primary function is to provide meals for the elderly. The Board indicated a strong desire to eliminate the reductions to programs that provided meals/food to those in need and specifically mentioned FACES and Meals on Wheels. Piedmont Senior Resources meets that criteria.

The Board discussed funding to Crossroads and directed staff to determine the impact to the Citizens and determine if the local funds were used as a match for any grants. Crossroads uses the funds provided by the localities to meet the required 10% match for the state grant. The advertised budget included a reduction of \$12,000 to Crossroads. Such a reduction would result in a total reduction of services of \$120,000 for the citizens of the County. Attachment (1) is an email from the Executive Director of Crossroads lies which would be reduced if the Counties funding was reduced. Because of the impact on services I am recommending funding for Crossroads be returned to its FY16 amount of \$60,000.

<u>School Fund</u> – The total for the School Fund is **\$24,570,003**, of which **\$8,000,000** is local revenue as a transfer from the County General Fund.

<u>School Cafeteria Fund</u> – The total for the School Cafeteria Fund is **\$1,088,427** of which \$0.00 is local revenue as a transfer from the County General Fund.

This provides for an overall FY 17 Prince Edward County School Budget in the amount of \$25,658,430.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has conducted a total of six meetings/work sessions on the FY 17 County Budget; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors has received citizen input on the proposed budget and proposed tax rates at a duly advertised Public Hearing held April 19, 2016; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Board of Supervisors that departments and agencies shall adhere to the budgeted funds in accordance with departmental budgets presented by the County Administrator and amended by the Board of Supervisors;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, that the FY 17 Budget for Prince Edward County of \$51,388,500 is hereby approved and effective July 1, 2016.

2016 Calendar Year Tax Ordinance

Summary:

Attached is the Ordinance to impose the tax levies for calendar year 2016. The proposed ordinance will increase the Real Estate tax rate by two cents from \$.49 to \$.51. The \$.51 rate returns the rate to an equalized value before the 2014 reassessment. At the proposed rate, the majority of land owners will have a 2016 tax bill that is less than the amount of their 2014 tax bill.

The Ordinance also imposes a special tax levy of \$1.00 for land contained in the Poplar Hill CDA.

An Ordinance to Impose Tax Levies For Calendar Year 2016

Whereas, the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors establishes the levies for the County of Prince Edward, Virginia; and

Whereas, for calendar year 2016, beginning January 1, 2016 and ending December 31, 2016, the Board of Supervisors has duly advertised and on April 19, 2016 held a public hearing on the subject tax levies;

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward that the following tax levies be, and hereby are, imposed for the calendar year 2016:
