

Articles of Incorporation

And

Constitution

Preamble:

We declare and establish this Constitution and Articles of Incorporation to secure the principles of our organization and govern the body in an orderly manner. This document preserves the liberties of each individual member of this organization and the freedom of action of this body in relation to other organizations.

Name:

The name of this organization shall be known as RAISE (Respect for All Individuals in Society Everywhere) and its Primary subcommittee SAGE (Searching And Grieving Everywhere)

Objectives:

RAISE will work with other organization to promote and ensure equality and civil justice for all citizens of Central Virginia.

SAGE the primary subcommittee will be dedicated to helping families, and law enforcement agencies; with resources and guidance for Missing Persons in Central Virginia

RAISE/SAGE is a volunteer not for profit organization. 15% of funds will be allocated for fund raising endeavors, and 85% of funds will go towards organizations principle purpose

ByLaws

General:

this is a sovereign and democratic organization. The membership retains unto itself the right of self-government in all phases.

The membership reserves the right to determine who shall be members of this organization, and conditions of said membership

Article I

A Candidacy:

Anyone who fills out proper membership form, and submit request for membership to the board, and is approved by a majority membership vote, may become a member of this organization. Members accept the principles and policies of this organization once submitting said request.

B New Member

Orientation:

New members will be given both written doctrine and verbal explanation of organization's policies, principles, and expectations, upon acceptance into organization.

Article II

Voting Rights

Of Membership:

All active members in good standing who have attended at least two organizational meetings per quarter shall be allotted one vote; on presented decisions, or proposals to the organization.

Article III

Termination

of Membership:

Membership maybe terminated by 2/3 vote of majority of organization membership. Member being removed must be informed of action and charges for said removal at least 15 days in advance of said vote, and must be given chance to rebut charges of dismissal. (if causes or actions of said members brings negative results to this organization or its committees.)

ArticleIV

Governing

of Organization: Organization shall be governed by Roberts Rules of Order (revised) and

shall be governed by affixed officer slate, to be voted in by majority of membership at annual reconstitution meeting of membership, to be held the fourth week of December of every other year. All officers are volunteers and not paid employees. Officers obtaining title of Chair, Vice-Chair, and

Financial Secretary shall be the Directors of Record for this Organization.

President: To preside over meetings, work in conjunction with Secretary to set meeting

agenda; and act as spokesperson for organization.

<u>Vice-President:</u> To act in the absence of Chair or on behalf of organization when directed

Secretary: To keep Organizations records, correspondence, to maintain records in an

organized manner.

Treasure: To be in charge of Organizations accounts payables and receivables, to work

in conjunction with Financial Secretary to write checks, keep financial

records organized and available for viewing.

Financial Secretary: To work in conjunction with Treasure to maintain financial records of

Organization, oversee accounts receivable and payable; to maintain

organized and detail records and make them available upon request. To give

monthly reports to organization regarding said finances.

Article IV B:

Conflict of Interest: No member of Executive Board, Board of Directors, or Subcommittee

Chair, Vice-Chair or Executive Committee, shall enter into an agreements for goods, or services, with any entity which may be in direct conflict; either by physical, personal, or professional nature.

Any conflict which may arise must be brought forth by said

individuals.

ArticleV

Meetings:

Meetings shall be held once a month at Sojourners United Church of Christ on or by the third week of the month. All members shall be informed of meeting 5 days in advance of said meeting.

Special or emergency meetings may be called when 2/3s majority of members have been contacted and given affirmation to hold said meeting. Members must be informed of reason(s) for said meeting.

Meeting of governing board may be called by Chair or two standing Officers.

Quarterly Meetings will be held at the end of every third month.

Article VI

Fiscal Year:

Organizations fiscal year will be from January 1st to December 31st

Article VII

Policies and Procedures:

It is the policy of this organization to help preserve the civil and constitutional rights of all members in society; to help those individuals regardless of race, creed, religion, social-economic background, or sexual orientation

No member of this organization shall speak or represent said organization without the consent of membership and leadership of this organization

Members of this organization will work using all available avenues to help in the search for missing, disappeared, or unsolved victims and their families.

Procedures may be added or deleted upon recommendation of bylaw review committee, and 2/3 vote of active members in good standing; in Organization's Quarterly Meeting.

Summary: The County has received a renewal with the Local Choice Program for the provision of health insurance for county employees for the 2012-2013 fiscal year. The County will experience a 16.1% increase in rates. The County can only select two plans to offer the employees. The attached tables display the cost of the various plans for the current fiscal year and the new rates effective July 1, 2013. In addition a comparison of the benefits of each plan is provided

Summary: The FY14 budget closely mirrors the FY13 budget. The list below outlines the primary changes between the two budgets. The first 5 items are discretionary and the final 3 are mandatory.

- 1. Recommendation to offer the Key Advantage 500 plan instead of the Key Advantage Expanded Health Insurance plan from Local Choice. To offer the Key Advantage Expanded plan would increase expenses by \$133,200. To offer the Key Advantage 250 plan would increase expenses by \$69,264.
- 2. Reduction of \$24,403 in the contribution to the Farmville Volunteer Fire Department. This was recommended to take into account the Fire Program Funds the Department receives from the Town of Farmville.
- 3. Decrease in funding to the Library by \$25,597 from the FY 13 budget or \$40,918 when compared to the Library's request of \$207,507. The decrease was recommended to align the County's contribution with funding provided by the Town of Farmville. Farmville is providing the same amount in FY13 as they did in FY10. Additionally, the Library stated in their application that FY10 was used as their base year and they asked for an additional \$12,507, this amount would be \$152,059 + 12,507 = \$164,566. I recommended the amount provided to the Library in FY11 or \$166,559.
- 4. Various expenditure reductions totaling more than \$330,000
- 5. Expense of \$200,000 to purchase a garbage truck.
- 6. Expense of \$200,000 for the reassessment.
- 7. Expense of \$1,150,000 to close a landfill cell.
- 8. Expense of \$700,000 for the regional jail.

Also, attached is statistical data regarding the Volunteer Fire Departments and funding history for the Library.

The Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward will hold a public hearing on MONDAY, APRIL 22, 2013 at 7:00 p.m. in the Board of Supervisors Room, Prince Edward County Courthouse, 111 South Street, 3rd Floor, Farmville, Virginia, at which time any citizen of Prince Edward County shall have the right to attend and state his/her views on the proposed County Budget, School Budget and tax levies ordinance. The details of the proposed budget ordinance may be examined Monday through Friday, from 8:30 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. in the Prince Edward County Administrator's Office, 111 South Street, 3rd Floor, Farmville, Virginia. 434-392-8837. Information is also available on the County's web site: www.co.prince-edward.va.us.

The following synopsis of the proposed consolidated FY 14 County and School Budget is prepared and published for information and fiscal planning purposes only. The inclusion in the proposed budget of any item(s) does not constitute an obligation or commitment on the part of the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors to appropriate any funds for that purpose. To determine the amount of tax owed, divide the property's assessed value by 100 then multiply by the appropriate tax rate. Prince Edward County determines the assessed valuation for Machinery & Tools, Merchant's Capital, and all Business Tangible Personal Property tax classifications by taking a percentage of the original cost of the property as shown in the chart below. Real estate is assessed at fair market value. Tangible Personal Property owned by individuals such as vehicles, trailers, motorcycles, etc. are assessed using the National Automobile Dealers Association (NADA) Guide Loan Value.
