Issue: Adoption of FY15 Budget and Setting Calendar Year 2014 Tax Rates

Summary:

Counting today, the Board of Supervisors has met nine times, which includes two joint meetings with the School Board, to discuss the FY15 County Budget. The original budget schedule set by the Board called for the approval of the County Budget on April 29, 2014. This date was set to meet the mandate contained in section 22.1-93 of the Code of Virginia that Counties approve an annual budget for educational purposes by May first of each year. Doing so allows the School Board to make decisions for the coming school year. The failure of the General Assembly to adopt a budget allowed the County to delay the adoption of the budget.

Even though the General Assembly has not passed a budget, the Schools are requesting the School Budget be adopted. The adoption informs the Schools of the amount of the local contribution. While the General Assembly has not passed a budget, there are only small differences between the Senate, House and Governor's budget numbers, especially for education.

The proposed FY15 County Budget includes the following highlights:

- This is the first year the County Budget reflects the revenues required to fund the County's portion of the operations necessary to operate the regional jail. This cost is estimated to be \$1,400,000 and is the primary reason for the proposed eight cent increase in the real estate tax rate.
- Level or decreased funding is proposed for the majority of remaining expenditures.
- The proposed budget includes \$8,346,800 of local funds for the Prince Edward County Public Schools. This represents level funding with the FY14 budget.
- \$1,212,000 is budgeted for the opening of a new cell at the Prince Edward County landfill in the Landfill Construction Fund.
- The Sheriff's department budget includes \$119,000 for the purchase of three vehicles and a communications system for the dispatch office.

There is no proposal to reduce local funding for our schools. The budget challenges the Schools are facing for FY15 are due to the reduction in Federal funding and increases in the VRS and health insurance rates. Federal funds are being reduced by almost \$500,000 while the increase in the VRS rate of 3.11% will cause an expenditure increase of more than \$400,000 and the health insurance premium increase will cost almost \$130,000.

County of Prince Edward Board of Supervisors Agenda Summary

The two attachments reflect decisions the Board of Supervisors has made during the last three budget work sessions that have been held. In addition, adjustments are proposed that would negate the use of any of the fund balance in the General Fund to balance the FY15 General Fund Budget. That task was accomplished by increasing the revenue estimates for several revenue line items. Attachment 1 reflects all the revenue adjustments made or recommended since I submitted the original FY15 Budget recommendation. Items marked with an asterisk reflect adjustments that were taken prior to balancing the budget without the use of the fund balance.

Attachment 2 displays all the adjustments made by either the receipt of new information (VRS and Group Life rates) or actions taken by the Board.

Revenues and expenditures are now in balance without the use of the fund balance.

You will notice on the last page of Attachment 2 there are two items that do not include accounting information. These are proposed expenditures for the County's membership in the Virginia Growth Alliance (\$23,386) and the match for a Rescue Squad Assistance Fund Grant to purchase repeaters (\$8,500). The Board has discussed these two items but has not taken any action to fund them. The budget has been balanced with the inclusion of these two expenditures. If the Board decides not to fund either of these items then the funds could be returned to the fund balance or the contingency line could be increased.

Additionally, the Board has discussed providing funding to the Virso Recreation Community but has taken no action.

Approval of FY 15 School Budget

SAMPLE MOTION:

I move that the FY 15 Prince Edward County School Budget be approved as follows:

<u>School Fund</u> – The total for the School Fund is **\$24,844,956**, of which **\$8,346,800** is local revenue as a transfer from the County General Fund.

<u>School Cafeteria Fund</u> – The total for the School Cafeteria Fund is **\$1,075,034**, of which \$0.00 is local revenue as a transfer from the County General Fund.

This provides for an overall FY 15Prince Edward County School Budget in the amount of \$25,919,990.



A Resolution to Approve the FY 15 Prince Edward County Budget

WHEREAS, it is the responsibility of the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors to approve and control the fiscal plan for the County of Prince Edward, Virginia for Fiscal Year 2015 (FY 15); and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the Board of Supervisors that departments and agencies shall adhere to the budgeted funds in accordance with departmental budgets presented by the County Administrator and amended by the Board of Supervisors;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, that the FY 15 Budget for Prince Edward County of \$52,769,051 is hereby approved and effective July 1, 2014.

Resolution Affirming Declaration of Local Emergency

Summary: I will update the Board on the action of the County regarding the private dam on Morris Creek Road at the May 6, 2014 Board meeting. Additionally, Section 44-146.21 of the *Code of Virginia* (citation below) requires that a Declaration of Local Emergency be confirmed by the governing body at its next regularly scheduled meeting or at a special meeting within fourteen days of the declaration, whichever occurs first.

 $\int 44-146.21$. Declaration of local emergency.

(a) A local emergency may be declared by the local director of emergency management with the consent of the governing body of the political subdivision. In the event the governing body cannot convene due to the disaster or other exigent circumstances, the director, or in his absence, the deputy director, or in the absence of both the director and deputy director, any member of the governing body may declare the existence of a local emergency, subject to confirmation by the governing body at its next regularly scheduled meeting or at a special meeting within fourteen days of the declaration, whichever occurs first. The governing body, when in its judgment all emergency actions have been taken, shall take appropriate action to end the declared emergency.

WHEREAS, at 4:30 p.m. on April 29, 2014, as a result of the rainfall storm event, W.W. DECLARATION OF LOCAL EMERGENCY County of Prince Edward, Virginia

The County Administrator/Director of Emergency Management of the County of Prince Edward, Virginia does hereby find:

- 1. That due to the rainfall storm event of April 29, 2014/April 30, 2014, Prince Edward County is facing dangerous public safety conditions; and
- 2. That due to this rainfall event a condition of extreme peril to life and property necessitates the proclamation of the existence of an emergency; and
- 3. Under the authority of Section 44.-146.21 of the *Code of Virginia*, the Director of Emergency Management has declared a Local Emergency;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY PROCLAIMED that an emergency now exists throughout the County of Prince Edward; and

IT IS FURTHER PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED that during the existence of said emergency, the powers, functions, and duties of the Emergency Management Organization of Prince Edward County shall be those prescribed by State Law and the Ordinances, Resolutions, and approved plans of Prince Edward County in order to mitigate the effects of said emergency.
