

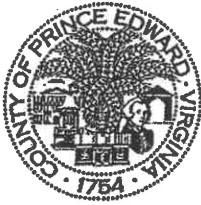

Summary:

The County received reimbursement from the state for the grant received and used to complete the mandated study to analyze modifications required for the SRR Dam to pass an appropriate amount of water in case of a maximum probable precipitation event without causing failure of the Dam. These funds have already been expended and are being returned to the General Fund balance.

At the Joint meeting of the Board of Supervisors and School Board on January 29, 2013 the Board of Supervisors approved the expenditure of \$35,000 to conduct a community survey. The budget amendment necessary to accomplish this task is listed below.

Summary:

Governor's Agriculture and Forestry Industries Development Fund (AFID)

The program and funds will reside within the VA Dept of Agriculture, with funding recommendations made by the Secretary of Agriculture and Forestry to the Governor. The Governor will make final award decisions.

Work Group: Application to this grant must be submitted by a locality. The locality must demonstrate participation from an agricultural work group or committee. There has been a committee of professionals serving in this capacity throughout the commercial cannery project. The Board is asked to formally recognize this work group for the purposes of the Food Enterprise Center project and this grant application. The work group must have the demonstrated support of the local government.

Local Match: The locality must provide a local match of \$1 for every \$1 requested. In kind donations, such as staff time or office space, are acceptable for up to 50% of the required match. Local match does not have to be in-hand at the time of application, but a commitment that it will be provided prior to project completion is required. The grant application budget is expected to be \$40,000. This requires a match of \$20,000 local funds to the \$20,000 requested grant award. Of the \$20,000 local match, \$10,000 can be in-kind, but \$10,000 must be a local cash match. Previously invested local funds may not be used as local match. Funds from the Tobacco Indemnification Commission may be used for up to half of the local cash match, but requires authorization from the TICC.

Commercial Cannery – Food Enterprise Center – Agriculture Enterprise Development Work Group

Working Group Focus: Establishing a Center for Production, Marketing, and Education of Value-Added Food Processing Serving Virginia Farm-Based Producers, the “Food Enterprise Center”

The following members of the Food Enterprise Center Work Group represent expertise in the relevant areas of the Food Enterprise Center concept and have been involved in the project since 2010. This group of individuals has participated in the expansion of the Prince Edward Cannery into a commercial food processing facility and the completion of the Feasibility Study examining the expansion of the Cannery as a Food Processing Center for Virginia farm based producers.

Summary:

This planning grant will continue to expand on the on-going efforts by Prince Edward County to establish a Value-Added Food Processing Facility. This project was initiated by a willingness to make improvements to the existing Prince Edward Cannery to serve commercial food business entrepreneurs. The initial improvements to the cannery were supported by an Agribusiness Grant from the Tobacco Commission.

The expansion of the cannery unveiled a clearly identified need in the agricultural community to have access to food processing establishments. There are no food processing facilities available to serve the smaller scale agricultural producers and the developing value-added food businesses. The cannery continues to support home users in combination with commercial users. It is not desirable to limit the access to the community facility to only commercially inspected users, therefore the commercial food business interests have identified a need for a commercial Food Processing Facility that is separate from the shared cannery facility. This commercial food processing facility would rocket the agricultural value-added food processing industry forward in this region.

The need for the commercial food processing facility is further supported by the August 20, 2012 report prepared for the Virginia Foundation for Agriculture, Innovation and Rural Sustainability (VA FAIRS) which investigated "Establishing the Prince Edward Community Cannery as a Center for Production, Marketing, and Education of Value-Added Food Processing Serving Virginia Farm-Based Producers." This report points to a well supported demand for the facility, but also describes obstacles inherent to the Prince Edward Community Cannery which would prevent the commercial grade quality necessary for larger volume commercial processing and production of food products from Virginia farms at that facility.

Prince Edward County recognizes that significant planning is necessary to move the project forward. The AFID Planning Grant funds are requested to fund predevelopment work for this project which will lead to the implementation of the local initiatives supporting the development of this agricultural sector project. The grant application outlines a project funding request of \$40,000 to obtain the services of a consultant to prepare the organizational and planning documents which will provide the logistical piece of the project, especially orchestrating the regional support and partnership commitments for this project. The deliverables of the project include the following:

- identifying the other localities that will commit to be regional partners;
- identifying the regional (private/ public) partners;
- structuring the facility operation and management plan, identifying incentives available through the first five years of operation to assist with operations costs (e.g. grants, funding sources);
- commercial lease arrangements and/or lease-to-own contract format;
- facility operations guidelines (e.g. Shared use agreements, Sanitation Standard Operating Procedures, user fees);
- Projections of impact on regional farm profitability.

The predevelopment planning project would be completed within two years of the grant award. This grant application provides demonstrated support from the agricultural community and the local government. There is an expected positive financial impact on the agriculture related industries as a direct result of the completion of the predevelopment planning and the implementation of the Food Enterprise Center project. The innovation of a Food Enterprise Center, which would provide the production and processing facility in combination with marketing and education assistance for value-added food businesses, is a model which could be applied in other communities.

Dear Mr. Bartlett:

The Virginia Department of Fire Programs has been notified of potential misuse of Aid to Locality funding disbursed to Prince Edward County for the FY-2013 Fiscal Year. This letter is to inform you that *Virginia Code* §38.2-401 has granted the Virginia Fire Service Board with the authority of Administration and Expenditure of entitlements allocated from the Fire Programs Fund. This allocation of Fire Program funds are to be used for “Fire Services” only, and may not be used to replace or supplant locally appropriated funds.

According to the meeting minutes for the County of Prince Edward Board of Supervisors (December 11, 2012), we have learned that Prince Edward County has approved a budget amendment to appropriate Fire Program funds to the Piedmont Regional Jail. As such, be reminded that you signed a Disbursement Agreement indicating that you would ensure the proper use of ATL funds. The Disbursement Agreement governs the distribution and use of the receiving locality’s (Prince Edward County) annual entitlement of Fire Program Funds as provided for in §38.2-401 of the *Code of Virginia* as amended. Additionally, according to the meeting minutes for the *Prince Edward Board of Supervisors (December 11, 2012)* “The additional amount for the Fire Programs was due to both Fiscal Years 2012 and 2013 revenues being received in Fiscal Year 2013” and an article reported in the *Farmville Herald (December 19, 2012)* “\$41,000 in fire programs (the state failed to send funds last year and the figures represent two years)”. The Virginia Department of Fire Programs acknowledges that two (2) years of funding were released to the County of Prince Edwards in fiscal year 2013, but not as a “failure” of the agency but due to Prince Edward County delay in reporting on funds received in Fiscal Year 2011 (Documents received July 17, 2012).

The Virginia Department of Fire Programs disbursed FY-2012 funds to Prince Edward County on September 20, 2012 in the amount of \$40,505. On October 22, 2012 VDFP received an Annual Report signed by you indicating all funds were expended in the following categorical areas.

- \$15,118.49 - Personal (Fire) Protective Equipment
- \$21,215.63 - (Fire) Vehicles including Apparatus
- \$4,170.88 - Fire Fighting Equipment and Supplies

Subsequently, on December 18, 2012 I received an email from Sheila B. Martin CSA Coordinator for Prince Edward County providing supporting documentation of the \$40,505 reported in the aforementioned categorical areas dated from July 2011 thru June 2012.

According to the County Board of Supervisors' meeting minutes, \$41,000 was budgeted from FY-2012 and FY-2013 ATL allocations. By our calculations, the County should have had a deficit in Fire Programs Fund cash as of 6/30/2012 since the County recorded expenses totaling \$40,505 but did not submit the required documentation to be eligible to receive the FY-2012 cash until 9/20/2012. Therefore, the FY-2012 ATL funds received in 9/2012 would have been in reimbursement of eligible expenses recorded by the County as of 6/30/2012.

The County also received 90% of its estimated FY-2013 ATL allocation in 9/2012, totaling \$36,455. According to the County Board of Supervisors' meeting minutes, you are on documented record as recommending that [presumably] the FY-2013 ATL funds be used to support the regional jail's deficit budget. Be advised that FY-2013 and all other years of ATL funds may not be used for any purpose other than fire services, and may not be used to supplant local budgets.

The Virginia Department of Fire Programs strongly encourages the County of Prince Edward to amend the approved Budget Amendment appropriating Fire Program Funds to the Piedmont Regional Jail. Misuse of Fire Programs funds may result in delay or forfeiture of future funding, and possible repayment of current or prior years' funding due to misuse.

Dear Mr. Bartlett:

It has been brought to my attention that at a December meeting of the Board of Supervisors, you presented and the Board of Supervisors approved a proposal to use Virginia Fire Services Board Aid to Localities monies in the amount of \$41,000 to fund a projected shortfall in Prince Edward County's Regional Jail obligations.

I understand the difficulties that Prince Edward County faces as it strives against the pressures of increasing demands and stagnant resources. As a partner with you, we are doing everything within the power of our office in the General Assembly to identify and combat unfunded mandates on localities as they arise. While it is not my policy to interfere in the decisions of local government, I do think it is helpful to inform you of the potential backlash of such a decision.

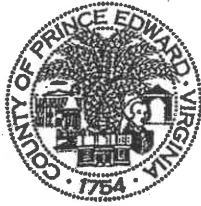
After reviewing the VFSB policy regarding the allowable uses of the Aid to Localities monies, that policy is very specific about the funds and how they may and may not be spent. Furthermore, the VFSB policy is also clear about the consequences of violating the terms of the agreement that you signed to receive those monies. Again it is not my policy to interfere, only to be helpful and to inform, and I sincerely hope this letter is received in that spirit. Immediate needs are pressing, but it would be most regretful if Prince Edward County lost future funds from the VFSB to augment the outstanding fire services that you provide to your citizens. Should future funding be impacted, I will do my best as an advocate of Prince Edward County; but my reading is that the General Assembly will be loath to thwart the longstanding policies of the Virginia Fire Services Board.
