

TRAFFIC ENGINEERING ISSUES

- 1. A Traffic Engineering study was conducted on Route 696, from Route 632 to Route 614, a distance of 2.95 miles to determine if the speed limit could be reduced. While, we can not currently support any changes to the statutory 55/45 MPH Speed Limit, a CURVE (W1-2L) Sign with a 30 MPH Advisory Speed Plate will be installed.
- 2. We have conducted a Traffic Engineering review along Route 655, from Route 460 to Route 626, a distance of 0.23 miles. It was found that the road qualifies for a 25 MPH Speed Zone in accordance to Section 46.2-874 of the Code of Virginia, and it will be posted as such. We have received the Board's Resolution for the requested WATCI FOR CHILDREN signs and we are currently deciding on the location for installation.
- 3. We have reviewed Route 1002, in the Hampden Sydney area to determine the feasibility of reducing the statutory speed limit. It was determined that this route qualifies for a 25 MPH Speed Zone in accordance to Section 46.2-874 of the Code of Virginia, and these signs will be installed.

OTHER INQUIRIES

1. Norfolk-Southern bridges on Routes 622 and 623.


VDOT has received a request to investigate delays in bridge repair projects that have generated the need for school bus detours, due to the reduced postings. In April and May of this year, our Structure and Bridge engineers reduced the ratings on the bridges due to excessive corrosion. The bridges are owned by Norfolk-Southern, who will perforn repairs. While VDOT does not control the schedule for these projects, once they are completed, we will re-inspect the bridges to determine whether the load ratings and weight limits can be increased. These bridges have been scheduled for replacement in the Six Year Plan. Once they have been replaced, they will remain in the state system of Maintenance.



Introducing Planning and Investment Management in the Lynchburg District

VDOT's recent Blueprint reorganization included the creation of the "Planning and Investment Management" section, which operates under the direction of the District's Planning and Investment Manager (PIM). The purpose of this new organization is to organizationally combine Land Development/Land Use, Planning and Programming as well as to provide "liaisons" to local governments. To facilitate these activities, two new "Director" positions have been created in the Lynchburg District: the Transportation and Land Use Director and the Programming Investment Management Director.

The following generalized organizational chart shows the relationship between the PIM and the Directors for Transportation and Land Use and Programming Investment Management.



Planning and Investment Manager (Acting): Robert Guercia

It is the responsibility of the PIM to oversee the linkage between Planning, Land Use, and Programming for the Lynchburg District. The PIM Manager serves as the district financial planner and resource for transportation project funding for preliminary engineering, construction, and maintenance programs. The Manager will oversee activities with the Central Office, local governments, and MPO's to enhance ongoing communication and coordination of transportation priorities with available funding. The Manager also provides oversight in the development of the Six Year Plan (SYP) and support inplementation of strategic objectives related to the SYP. The Manager will work with VDOT staff to evaluate and redirect resources and seek additional financing sources as needed.

Transportation & Land Use Director: Jorg Huckabee-Mayfield (434) 856-8179

This Director has oversight of all site plan reviews, the issuance of permits, and the inspection of land development activities. In order to serve our communities more effectively, Land Use engineering, Permits and planning staff is located at the Lynchburg District Office and field offices in Chatham and Dillwyn.

The Transportation and Land Use Director is the local liaison for the following counties:

Buckingham Cumberland Prince Edward Charlotte Halifax

In addition to the general local liaison function, this Director coordinates the review and response to Traffic Engineering requests received from local governments, elected officials and citizens in the listed counties for speed limit or other signs, traffic signals, traffic calming, through truck restrictions, and other activities that are performed by VDOT. Planning functions also fall within the Transportation and Land Use directorate, as do the review and processing of certain types of street additions such as rural additions and urban street additions.

Programming Investment Management Director: Randy Hamilton (434) 856-8215

One of the basic functions of the PIM Organizational structure is to enhance and consolidate the programming functions of the District, implementing a consolidated and consistent approach to managing VDOT's various revenue streams and plans such as the Six Year Improvement, Urban and the Secondary Six Year Plans. The Programming Investment Management Director is responsible for ensuring that this occurs. All Secondary and Urban Six Year Plan functions (including special funded programs) will be performed under the oversight of the Programming Investment Management Director.

The Director and Staff will also work with the localities to process requests by localities to administer projects.

The Programming Investment Management Director is the local liaison for the following counties:

Pittsylvania Amherst Nelson Appomattox Campbell

In addition to the general local liaison function, this Director coordinates the review and response to Traffic Engineering requests received from local governments, elected officials or citizens in the listed counties for speed limit or other signs, traffic signals, traffic calming, through truck restrictions, and other activities that are performed by VDOT. This Director will also coordinate the various special funded projects such as Revenue Sharing, Enhancement, Access, and others.

In some areas, Transportation and Land Use and Programming Investment Management will work hand-in-hand to deliver services to the localities. For example, the Transportation and Land Use Director and Staff will work directly with local governments to evaluate candidate projects and develop initial scope and cost estimates for inclusion into the Six Year Plan. The Programming Investment Management Director and staff will then work with the localities and Transportation and Land Use Director to establish the locality's priorities and will work to secure appropriate funding for each project.

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide a project update of key items that have occurred since our Board workshop presentation on September 14th. We are also including revised cost information for two of the eastern water main routes that will potentially be serving the Towns of Crewe and Burkeville.

<u>VDH Review Comments of PER</u> – we have received comments from the Virginia Department of Health for the Preliminary Engineering Report that was submitted on July 19, 2010 as summarized below:

- The comments were generally minor in nature and were as expected based on our communication with VDH. We are currently working on a response and anticipate approval of the PER this fall.
- VDH encourages reservoir aeration for improved water quality. The Crowder/DAA team
 has recommended that this be deferred until the plant has been in operation for a few years
 and a track record can be established. The County's independent review consultant Wiley
 and Wilson agreed with this recommendation. We are confident that we can negotiate a
 mutually acceptable technical solution.
- Pilot testing will be required to demonstrate the proposed treatment plant can meet water
 quality standards. This will have to occur during the late summer and fall when raw water
 quality is lowest. A "pilot test" is when a small scale version of the treatment plant is
 constructed and operated for a period normally ranging from 2-16 weeks. This can be
 accomplished as part of the Comprehensive Agreement.
- VDH strongly encourages Prince Edward County to adopt the proposed Reservoir Protection Overlay District to protect water quality.

<u>VDOT Meeting to Discuss Project Alignments</u> – representatives of the Crowder/DAA design team met with VDOT representatives on September 30, 2010 and below are some items that resulted from the meeting:

- These comments apply to Route 628, Route 630, Route 605, and Route 460.
- The water mains can be installed in the road right of way. VDOT will need to review specific location of waterlines relative to the pavement before approving location. They will also need to see preliminary plans to determine if secondary roads can be open cut or whether a bored crossing is required.
- Although water mains can be installed in the right of way, VDOT will require that they be
 located as far from the pavement as possible unless special conditions do not allow this.
 This will significantly increase the number of temporary construction easements and also
 increase the number of trees to be removed that provide screening between houses and the
 road.
- Since the proposed water main to Burkeville is considered a transmission main and not a distribution main, VDOT would prefer that connections to the main be minimized or for "feeder" lines to be installed at key locations during construction to avoid periodic work in the right of way. This may increase the cost for the Route 460 option.

Meeting with Town of Crewe – representatives of DAA and the County met with the Town Manager and an assistant on October 6, 2010. The purpose of the meeting was to present a draft financial analysis if the Town purchases water from the Heartland Authority. Below are some items resulting from the meeting:

- The operating expenses and revenue assumptions that were made will be reviewed by the Town and provided to DAA for revisions to the financial analysis.
- The Town Manager requested a presentation to Town Council, tentatively scheduled for Monday, November 8, 2010. The purpose of the presentation will be to provide preliminary cost estimates and the results of the financial modeling.
- Similar meetings will be scheduled with Hampden-Sydney College and Burkeville.

Meeting with DCR – representatives of the Crowder/DAA design team and Sarah Puckett met with the Department of Conservation and Recreation regarding the water main installation along the High Bridge trail. Below are some items that resulted from the meeting:

- DCR will allow the water main to be placed within the trail, provided that the trail is returned to its original condition.
- DCR will allow portions of the trail to be closed during construction. They would prefer installation of water main during winter months. This will maximize crew production rates, which will reduce construction cost.
- The DCR is very interested in providing a trail connector to Burkeville. Presently, the trail ends approximately 1 mile before the Town limits. Anything the water project can do to assist with trail options will be appreciated by DCR.
- DCR has indicated that they will participate in a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)
 with the County regarding installation and operation of the water main. The County will
 take the lead on providing a draft MOU for review by DCR.




Revisions to Eastern Water Main Options - per comments received at the Board of Supervisors workshop on September 14th, we have performed a more detailed analysis for two of the options that can serve Crewe and Burkeville. The two options are shown on the attached map and are summarized below:


- Option 1A (Route 460 Option) this option includes running the water main along Route 460 from Rice to Crewe. From Rice, the option has been changed to run along Route 600, Route 605, and then through private property prior to entering the water treatment plant site. The cost has been reduced from Route 605 to the water plant since the previous estimate provided at the September 14th workshop. With the revised alignment, the overall length of this option is now 65,085 linear feet. The total cost estimate is \$5,127,960. For comparison purposes, the total cost estimate for Option 1 presented previously was \$5,927,331.
- Option 4A (High Bridge Trail Option) this option includes combining the High Bridge trail option with Route 600, Route 605 and then through private property prior to entering the water treatment plant site. Per Board comments, extensions to the Rice fire station, and 2 connection points along the trail to Route 460 have been added to this option. With these extensions, the overall length of this option is now 68,920 linear feet. The total cost estimate is \$4,841,572. If the extensions are removed from the project, the total cost estimate is \$4,513,122 (extension to Rice fire station \$137,239, extension #5 \$47,457, extension #8 \$128,628, misc. \$15,126). For comparison purposes, the total cost estimate for Option 4 presented previously was \$4,981,695.


It is important to note that Option 1A will require a considerable amount of easements adjacent to the VDOT right of way, which will increase total project cost significantly and will also increase the project schedule. Another reason that Option 1A may increase is due to the need for "feeder" lines to be installed at key locations along Route 460. For these reasons and since Option 4A is still considerably less expensive than Option 1A, we believe it is prudent to continue to evaluate Option 4A in order to confirm assumptions, reduce risk, and hopefully reduce the construction pricing for our final estimate.

Motor Vehicle License Tax Collection Agreement with Town

To alleviate the need for vehicle decals, the Town of Farmville has rescinded its Motor Vehicle License Tax. By this action the County's tax will now be applied to all town residents. To enable the Town to continue to receive this revenue stream, the County will need to agree to enter into a revenue reimbursement agreement, whereby the County assesses, collects and reimburses the Town for 65% of the actual taxes collected from town residents. The County will retain the remaining 35%.

MOTOR VEHICLE LICENSE TAX AGREEMENT BETWEEN COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA AND TOWN OF FARMVILLE, VIRGINIA

THIS AGREEMENT is made this 12th day of October, 2010, by and between the COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA, hereinafter referred to as "the County", party of the first part, and the TOWN OF FARMVILLE, VIRGINIA, hereinafter referred to as the "Town", party of the second part.

WHEREAS, the Town Council desires to relieve the citizens of the Town from the burden of placing the decals on their vehicles to prove payment of the subject Tax; and

WHEREAS, the Town desires to continue collecting revenues from this revenue source; and

WHEREAS, the subject tax can be printed on the personal property tax tickets, and

WHEREAS, the Town does not currently have a personal property tax and thus does not mail personal property tax tickets to its residents; and

WHEREAS, the Town Council has eliminated the Town Motor Vehicle License Tax and such elimination has caused the County's Motor Vehicle License Tax Ordinance to be enforceable within the Town; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors desires to assist the Town and its residents in this matter.

WHEREAS, upon a review of the Town and County Motor Vehicle License Tax rates it was determined the Town's rates were 75% of the County's rate; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors agrees to reimburse the Town a portion of the taxes collected from Town taxpayers; and

WHEREAS, in consideration of the work performed by employees working in the County Courthouse in support of Town operations and the assistance they provide Town residents, the Town Council desires to pay an administrative fee in the amount of 10% of the taxes collected; and

WHEREAS, the Town and County wish to enter into an agreement to relieve Town citizens of the burden of placing decals on their vehicles and at the same time allow the Town to collect revenues from this tax:

NOW THEREFORE, THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH: that for and in consideration of the promises and the mutual covenants and undertakings of the parties to this agreement, the parties mutually agree with each other as follows:

Sec 1. Upon execution of this agreement by the Town and the County, the County will assess and collect the County Motor Vehicle License Tax on all Town residents.

- Sec 2. The county will remit to the Town 65% of the actual amount of the tax collected from town residents. This amount represents the amount the Town would normally collect after deducting the 10% administrative fee.
- Sec 3. The County shall remit payment to the Town on a quarterly basis.
- Sec 4. This agreement will remain in full force and effect and shall automatically renew annually unless notice of the intent to terminate is received not later than July 1 of each year. Said written notice to the County shall be sent to the County Administrator's office at 111 South Street, Farmville, VA and to Town at Town Manager's office at 116 N. Main Street, Farmville, VA.

Health Insurance

Summary:

Over the years I have heard various comments concerning the County's benefit package most have been positive with the exception of the cost to add dependents to the health insurance plan.

To validate what I have heard I sent a survey to all employees currently receiving any county benefits.

I received 55 responses. Sixty-seven percent of the respondents either stated the current family premium is too high or responded with a Not Applicable (N/A) for that question. Several that responded (N/A) commented the cost was too high which was the reason their dependents were not covered. Additionally 60% responded that their ability to pay the dependent premium was either very bad or poor.

The remainder of the benefit package was rated as either excellent or good by the vast majority of the respondents.

While the local choice program is very good it is a set program that allows no deviations to solve the problem mentioned above. I am not advocating moving to another insurance provider. Anthem offers many other health insurance plans, one of which may be able to solve the issue mentioned above.

Recommendation:

Authorize the County Administrator to engage outside assistance in researching alternative plans.
