CHARTER AGREEMENT

of the

COMMONWEALTH REGIONAL COUNCIL

Acting by their governing bodies pursuant to the provisions of the Regional Cooperation Act, Title 15.2, Chapter 42, of the Code of Virginia, as amended, the localities embracing at least 45 percent of the population within planning district 14, along with certain institutions of higher education within planning district 14, hereby organize a planning district commission for the purposes and under the name hereinafter designated.

Article I – Name

1.1. The name of the planning district shall be the Commonwealth Planning District, and the name of the planning district commission shall be the Commonwealth Regional Council (hereinafter referred to as "the Council").

Article II - Purposes and Powers

- 2.1. It is the purpose of the Council to perform the planning and other functions provided by the Regional Cooperation Act, Title 15.2, Chapter 42, of the Code of Virginia, as amended, including, but not limited to, encouraging and facilitating local government cooperation and state-local cooperation in addressing, on a regional basis, problems of greater than local significance, and promoting the orderly and efficient development of the physical, social and economic elements of the district by planning, and encouraging and assisting localities to plan, for the future. The Council shall not have a legal obligation to perform the functions necessary to implement the plans and policies established by it or to furnish governmental services to the district.
- 2.2. The Council shall have the powers provided by the Regional Cooperation Act, Title 15.2, Chapter 42, of the Code of Virginia, as amended, to perform the planning and other functions provided in paragraph 2.1, and all other powers incidental thereto.

Article III - Principal Office

3.1. The principal office of the Council shall be located in the Town of Farmville, Virginia.

Article IV - Members

- 4.1. The affairs of the Council shall be managed by the Council members. The initial number of members of the Council shall be ten (10).
 - 4.2. The composition of the membership of the Council shall be as follows:
- (a) Each locality that is a party to the charter agreement shall appoint, in writing, one member and one alternate member. Both the member and alternate member appointed by each locality shall be elected officials of the governing body of the locality, and their terms of office shall be coincident with their elected term of office or such shorter term as their appointing governing body shall determine.
- (b) Longwood University, Hampden-Sydney College, and Southside Virginia Community College, each of which is a higher education institution, shall each appoint, in writing, one member and one alternate member. The member and alternate member appointed by each institution of higher education shall be the President of the institution or a cabinet level representative, and his or her term of office shall be determined by the appointing institution and coincident with his or her appointment with the institution.

Article V – Dues

5.1. The Council shall determine at or before the first meeting of each calendar year the annual dues to be paid by the member localities and institutions. In no event, except as otherwise provided herein, shall any locality or institution be required to pay annual dues in an amount greater than any other member locality or institution. Annual dues shall be paid on or before August 31 of each year.

- 5.2. Any member locality that transferred, or caused to be transferred, its pro rata shares of the assets of the former Piedmont Planning District Commission to the Council shall commence paying annual dues in July of 2006. The member institutions of higher education shall commence paying annual dues in July of 2005.
- 5.3. If any member locality or institution fails to timely pay its annual dues in full, after written notice from the Secretary of the Council, then that locality's appointed member to the Council shall not be permitted to vote on any matters before the Council unless and until the dues payment is made in full. However, its nonpayment of dues notwithstanding, a locality's member to the Council shall not be excluded from Council meetings and discussions.
- 5.4. Any locality or institution of higher education that is admitted to the Council pursuant to paragraph 9.1 shall pay a one-time assessment immediately upon its admission to the Council in an amount equal to its pro rata share of the fair market value of the Council's assets as of the date of admission. If the Council and the locality or institution are not able to promptly agree on the fair market value of the assets, the same shall be determined by an appraisal prepared by a qualified appraiser selected and compensated by the Council.
- 5.5. An additional assessment may be made upon a member locality or institution for additional services that are provided in response to a request by such member locality or institution and that are not included in the Work Program adopted by the Council. Such assessment shall be agreed upon by and between the Council and the requesting member locality or institution.

Article VI - Officers

- 6.1. The officers of the Council shall be a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. All officers of the Council shall be members of the Council, and they shall be elected by a majority vote of the members.
- 6.2. The term of office for each officer shall be one year, or until his or her successor is elected, whichever shall first occur.

- 6.3. The officers of the Council, with the exception of the Treasurer, shall serve no more than two (2) one year consecutive terms. The Treasurer may serve more than two (2) one year consecutive terms.
- 6.4. The Council shall appoint an Executive Director. The Executive Director shall be an employee of the Council and shall serve at the pleasure of the Council under a written employment agreement.
- 6.5. The Executive Director, as authorized by the Council, shall hire staff necessary and appropriate to fulfill the purpose and exercise the powers of the Council.

<u>Article VII – Voting Rights</u>

- 7.1. Each member of the Council shall have one equal, non-weighted vote on all matters before the Council.
- 7.2. To exercise a vote on a matter before the Council, a member must be in attendance at the meeting during which the vote is called, and shall otherwise vote in the fashion prescribed in the Council's Bylaws.

Article VIII - Amendments

- 8.1. This Charter Agreement may be amended, supplemented, or superseded only after concurring resolutions have been adopted by the governing bodies of two-thirds of the member localities and institutions.
- 8.2. All proposed amendments to this Charter Agreement shall be submitted to the Council, in writing, for review and comment to the member localities and institutions.

Article IX - Addition or Withdrawal of Localities or Institutions of Higher Education

- 9.1. Any locality or institution of higher education located within planning district 14 that is not a party to this Charter Agreement may petition the Council for membership, and shall be admitted as a member locality or institution upon (1) a majority vote of acceptance by the Council members, (2) execution of the Charter Agreement by the locality or institution of higher education, and (3) payment of the initial assessment as provided in paragraph 5.4.
- 9.2. Any member locality or institution of higher education may withdraw from the Council by submitting to the Council, in writing, at least 90 days before the end of the Council's current fiscal year, a notice of intent to withdraw. Such withdrawal shall not become effective until the end of the current fiscal year.

<u>Article X – Dissolution</u>

10.1. The Council may be dissolved at any time, but only after concurring resolutions for dissolution have been adopted by the governing bodies of a majority of the member localities. Upon the dissolution or termination of the Council, it shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of its liabilities, distribute its assets to its member localities, pro rata, based upon the formula used to determine annual dues to the Council.

Article XI - Effective Date of Organization

11.1. The effective date of the organization of the Council shall be July 1, 2005.

BYLAWS

of the

COMMONWEALTH REGIONAL COUNCIL

Article I – Definitions

- 1.1. "Agreement" and "Charter Agreement" means the written agreement, dated July 1, 2005, entered into by certain localities embracing at least 45 percent of the population of planning district 14 and certain institutions of higher education within planning district 14, and as subsequently amended.
 - 1.2. "Council" means the Commonwealth Regional Council.
- 1.3. "Council members" and "members" means those individuals appointed by the member localities and higher education institutions to serve as members of the Commonwealth Regional Council.
- 1.4. "Elected representative" means an individual elected by the citizens of a member locality to serve on that locality's governing body.
- 1.5. "Freedom of Information Act" means Title 2.2, Chapter 37, of the Code of Virginia, as amended.
- 1.6. "Higher Education Institution" and "Institution of Higher Education" means a nonprofit educational institution whose primary purpose is to provide collegiate or graduate education
- 1.7. "Member locality" means any locality, which is a member in good standing of the Commonwealth Regional Council, whether by being a party to the original Charter Agreement or by becoming a member subsequent to the date of the original Charter Agreement.
- 1.8. "Regional Cooperation Act" means Title 15.2, Chapter 42, of the Code of Virginia, as amended.

Article II - Purpose and Powers

- 2.1. Purpose. It is the purpose of the Council to perform the planning and other functions provided by the Regional Cooperation Act, including, but not limited to, encouraging and facilitating local government cooperation and state-local cooperation in addressing, on a regional basis, problems of greater than local significance, and promoting the orderly and efficient development of the physical, social and economic elements of the district by planning, and encouraging and assisting localities to plan, for the future. The Council shall not have a legal obligation to perform the functions necessary to implement the plans and policies established by it or to furnish governmental services to the district.
- 2.2. <u>Powers</u>. The Council shall have the powers provided by the Regional Cooperation Act to perform the planning and other functions provided in paragraph 2.1, and all other powers incidental thereto.
- 2.3. <u>Disposition of Earnings and Assets</u>. No part of the net earnings or any of the assets of the Council shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to, any of its members, officers or other private persons, other than to its member localities as is consistent with the Regional Cooperation Act, the Charter Agreement, and these Bylaws. However, the Council may pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes of a planning district commission as set forth within the Regional Cooperation Act, the Charter Agreement, and these Bylaws.

Article III - Members

- 3.1. <u>Members</u>. The affairs of the Council shall be managed by the Council members. The initial number of members of the Council shall be ten (10).
- 3.2. <u>Composition of Membership</u>. The composition of the membership of the Council shall be as follows:
- (a) Each member locality shall appoint, in writing, one member and one alternate member. Both the member and the alternate member appointed by each locality shall be elected officials of the appointing governing body, and their terms of office shall be coincident with their elected terms of office or such shorter term as their appointing governing body shall determine.

(b) Longwood University, Hampden-Sydney College, and Southside Virginia Community College, each of which is a higher education institution, shall each appoint, in writing, one member and one alternate member. The member and alternate member appointed by each institution of higher education shall be the Chairman of the institution and/or cabinet level representatives, and their terms of office shall be determined by the appointing institution and coincident with their appointment with the institution.

Article IV - Officers

- 4.1. Officers. The officers of the Council shall be a Chairman, Vice Chairman, Secretary, and Treasurer. All officers of the Council shall be members of the Council, and they shall be elected by a majority vote of the members before or at the first regular meeting of the Council each fiscal year. Candidates for office may be nominated by the Nominating Committee and/or by individual members of the Council.
- 4.2. <u>Terms of Office</u>. The term of office for each officer shall be one year, or until his or her successor is elected, whichever shall first occur. The officers of the Council, with the exception of the Treasurer, shall serve no more than two (2) one year consecutive terms. The Treasurer may serve more than two (2) one year consecutive terms.
- 4.3. <u>Powers of Chairman</u>. The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Council and at all meetings of the Executive Committee, and he or she shall have the same vote as any other member. The Chairman shall be responsible for the implementation of the policies established and actions taken by the Council. The Chairman shall seek nominations from the Council members for all committee assignments, but, except as otherwise provided herein, may appoint members to committees as needed. The Chairman shall act as the spokesman of the Council, and he or she shall perform all the duties commonly incident to his or her office and shall perform such other duties as the Council shall designate from time to time.
- 4.4. <u>Powers of Vice Chairman</u>. The Vice Chairman shall, except as especially limited by vote of the Council, perform the duties and have the powers of the Chairman during the absence or disability of the Chairman, and he or she shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as the Council shall designate from time to time.
- 4.5. <u>Powers of Secretary</u>. The Secretary shall issue notices of all meetings and keep and issue accurate minutes of all meetings of the Council and Committees. He or she shall have custody of the seal of the Council and have custody of the records and reports of the Council and

Committees. He or she shall attest the corporate seal affixed to documents. He or she shall have care and custody of the valuable papers and documents of the Council. He or she shall keep accurate books of account of the Council and together with all its property in his or her possession shall be subject at all times to the inspection and control of the Council. He or she shall perform all the duties commonly incident to his or her office and shall perform such other duties and have such other powers as the Council shall determine from time to time. The Secretary may, with the permission of the Council, delegate certain of his or her duties and responsibilities to the Council's staff.

- 4.6. <u>Powers of Treasurer</u>. The Treasurer shall have the care and custody of all monies, funds and securities of the Council. The Treasurer shall have the authority to sign all receipts and vouchers for payments made to the Council and shall keep full and accurate accounts of all monies received by and paid by him or her on account of the Council which shall directly reflect all the financial transactions and conditions of the Council, and he or she shall generally perform all acts incident to his or her position of Treasurer and shall have such further powers and duties as shall be from time to time conferred upon him or her by the Council. The Treasurer may, with the permission of the Council, delegate certain of his or her duties and responsibilities to the Council's staff.
- 4.7. <u>Vacancies</u>. If the office of any officer becomes vacant by reason of death, resignation, removal, disqualification, or otherwise, the members, by a majority vote, shall choose a successor or successors who shall hold office for the unexpired term.

Article V - Employees

- 5.1. <u>Executive Director</u>. The Council shall appoint an Executive Director. The Executive Director shall be an employee of the Council and shall serve at the pleasure of the Council under the terms and conditions of a written employment agreement.
- 5.2. <u>Staff.</u> The Executive Director, as authorized by the Council, shall hire staff necessary and appropriate to fulfill the purpose and exercise the powers of the Council.

Article VI - Meetings

6.1. <u>Regular Meetings</u>. The regular meetings of the Council shall be held at the principle office of the Council on the first Thursday of each month, if not a legal holiday, but if a legal holiday, then on the following Thursday

- 6.2. <u>Special Meeting</u>. Special meetings of the Council may be held at any time at the principal office of the Council, or other appropriate location, whenever called by the Chairman, Vice Chairman, the Secretary, or a majority of the Council members, notice thereof being given to each member by the Secretary, or at any time without formal notice provided all the members are present.
- 6.3. <u>Telephonic and Videoconference</u>. Members of the Council, or of any committee designated by the Council, may, to the extent that it is compliant with, and not in violation of, Virginia's Freedom of Information Act, participate in meetings thereof by means of conference telephone, videoconference, or similar communications equipment by means of which all persons participating in the meeting can hear each other, and participation in a meeting pursuant to this bylaw shall constitute presence in person at such meeting.
- 6.4. Notice to Members. Notice to members of special meetings stating the time, place and purposes thereof shall be given by mailing the same to each member at his or her residence or business address, or e-mailing the notice to the member to his or her e-mail of record, at least five (5) days before the meeting or by delivering the same to him or her personally at his or her residence or business address at least five (5) days before the meeting. Such special meetings shall be held at such time and place as the notice thereof or the waiver thereof shall specify. Regular meetings may be held without notice to the members of the date, time, place, or purpose of the meeting.
- 6.5. <u>Freedom of Information Act</u>. The Council shall comply with the notice requirements, as well as all other requirements, of the Freedom of Information Act in the conduct of its meetings and in all of its other activities and business.
- 6.6. Quorum. A majority of the Council members as constituted for the time being shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business, but a less number may adjourn any meeting from time to time and the meeting may be held as adjourned without further notice. When a quorum is present at any meeting, a majority of the members thereat shall decide any questions brought before such meeting except as otherwise provided by law, the Charter Agreement or by these Bylaws.
- 6.6. Order of Business. The order of business at any regular meeting or special meeting of the Council shall be as follows:
 - (1) Reading and disposal of any unapproved minutes.

- (2) Reports of officers and committees.
- (3) Unfinished business.
- (4) New business.
- (5) Adjournment.

Article VII - Committees

- 7.1. Executive Committee. The Council, by resolution adopted by a majority of the Council members, may designate two or more officers to constitute an Executive Committee. The Chairman of the Council shall serve as a member and as the chairman of any and all executive committees. The Executive Committee so constituted shall have and may exercise the powers and authority of the Council, except the right to approve an amendment of the Bylaws. Such Committees shall always be subject to the final authority of the Council.
- 7.2. <u>Nominating Committee</u>. The Council shall appoint a Nominating Committee each year in sufficient time for the committee to submit nominations and for the Council to hold a timely election of officers. The Nominating Committee shall consist of at least three Council members.
- 7.3. <u>Budget Committee</u>. The Council shall appoint a Budget Committee each year in sufficient time for the committee to submit a proposed budget to the Council and for the Council to consider and adopt a budget. The Budget Committee shall consist of at least three Council members.
- 7.4. Advisory Committees. The Council and/or its member localities institutions shall, each year, appoint an Advisory Committee of Chief Administrative Officers, an Advisory Committee on Civil Rights, an Advisory Committee on Marketing, and such other advisory committees it shall deem appropriate. Each advisory committee shall develop its own mission statement and shall adopt its own rules and procedures, provided that such mission statement and rules and procedures are consistent with the Charter Agreement, these Bylaws, and all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations. The composition of such advisory committees is as follows:
- (a) <u>Advisory Committee of Chief Administrative Officers</u>. The Advisory Committee of Chief Administrative Officers shall be composed of the current county administrators and/or

town managers of the member localities, and the current chief administrative officers of the higher education institutions.

- (b) Advisory Committee on Civil Rights. Each member locality and institution shall, on an annual basis, appoint one (1) representative to serve on the Advisory Committee on Civil Rights.
- (c) Advisory Committee on Marketing. Each member locality and institution shall, on an annual basis, appoint one (1) person from its office of economic development (or its equivalent) to serve on the Advisory Committee on Marketing. In addition, the Council shall, on an annual basis, appoint such community business leaders to the Advisory Committee on Marketing as it shall deem appropriate.
- 7.5. <u>Freedom of Information Act</u>. All Committees of the Council shall comply with the notice requirements, as well as all other requirements, of the Freedom of Information Act in the conduct of its meetings and in all of its other activities and business.

Article VIII - Resignation and Removal

- 8.1. <u>Resignation</u>. Any officer or agent of the Council may resign at any time by giving written notice to the Council or to the Chairman or to the Secretary of the Council. Any such resignation shall take effect at the time specified therein, or if the time be not specified, then upon receipt thereof; and, unless otherwise specified therein, the acceptance of such resignation shall not be necessary to make it effective.
- 8.2. <u>Vacation</u>. In the event a member locality or institution is unrepresented at three (3) consecutive meetings of the Council or four (4) total meetings of the Council in any given fiscal year, then that locality or institution shall be deemed to have vacated its position on the Council. Upon such a vacation, the locality or institution shall be required to reappoint, in writing, a member and alternate member.
- 8.3. <u>Removal</u>. The Council, by vote of not less than a majority of the Council members, may remove from office any officer or agent elected or appointed by them.

Article IX -Transactions with Council Members

9.1. Transactions with Council Members. No purchase, sale, contract or other transaction between the Council and any individual, partnership, firm corporation, or other business entity shall be void or voidable, or otherwise affected by the fact that one or more of the members of this Council are pecuniarily or otherwise interested in the transaction or are partners, members, managers, officers, shareholders, or otherwise interested in any such partnership, firm, corporation, or other business entity, if the interest of such members is disclosed to or known by a majority of the disinterested members and the transaction is (a) approved by a majority of the disinterested members then in office, with any interested member being eligible to be counted as a part of the quorum, or (b) fair and reasonable to this Council at the time it is entered into. Nothing herein contained shall be construed to create any liability which would not otherwise exist under applicable law, or prevent the ratification or approval of transactions with the Council in any manner permitted by law. Any person who becomes a member of the Council is relieved from any liability that might otherwise exist from any contract or transaction with the Council in which he or she may be in any wise interested if such contract is approved as hereinbefore provided.

Article X - Indemnification

10.1. Indemnification. The Council shall indemnify any member, officer or employee of the Council, or former member, officer or employee of the Council, against damages and expenses actually and reasonably incurred by him or her in connection with or arising out of any action, suit or proceeding in which he or she may be involved by reason of his or her being or having been such member, officer or employee, except in relation to matters as to which he or she shall be adjudged in such action, suit or proceeding to be liable for gross negligence or willful misconduct in the performance of duty to the Council. The Council may also reimburse any member, officer or employee for the reasonable costs of settlement of any such action, suit or proceeding (other than amounts paid to the Council itself), if it shall be found by a majority of disinterested Council members (or by independent counsel if a majority of the members were involved in the matter) that it was to the interest of the Council that such settlement be made and that such member, officer or employee was not guilty of gross negligence or willful misconduct in the performance of his or her duty. Such rights of indemnification and reimbursement shall not be deemed exclusive of any other rights to which such member, officer or employee may be entitled under any bylaw, agreement or otherwise. Every reference herein to a member, officer or employee shall include his or her personal representative.

Article XI - Seal

11.1. Council Seal. The Council is not required to obtain a seal. However, should the Secretary of the Council determine that a seal is desirable, the seal of the Council shall consist of two concentric circles between which shall be the words "Commonwealth Regional Council" and in the center of which shall be inscribed the words and figures "Council Seal, 2005, Commonwealth of Virginia".

Article XII - Fiscal Year

12.1. <u>Fiscal Year</u>. The fiscal year of the Council shall be the twelve months period beginning the 1st day of July each year until the 30th day of June the following year.

Article XIII - Waiver of Notice

- 13.1. <u>Formal Waiver</u>. Whenever any notice whatever is required to be given to members by these Bylaws, or the Charter Agreement of the Council, or any of the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia, a waiver of notice thereof, in writing, signed by the person or persons entitled to said notice, whether before or after the time stated therein, shall be deemed equivalent thereto.
- 13.2. Waiver by Attendance. A member who attends a meeting shall be deemed to have had timely and proper notice of the meeting, unless the member attends for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened.

Article XIV - Amendments

14.1. Amendment to Bylaws. These Bylaws may be amended, altered or repealed by a vote of two-thirds of the members at any regular meeting and at any special meeting provided as to the latter that in the notice of said meeting or in the waiver of notice the nature of the proposed amendment shall be stated. At any meeting, either regular or special, at which all of the members are personally present, these Bylaws may be amended, altered or repealed without any notice whatsoever.

Article XV - Contracts, Checks, Deposits and Funds

- 15.1. <u>Contracts</u>. The Council may authorize any officer or officers, agent or agents of the Council, in addition to the officers so authorized by these Bylaws, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Council, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances.
- 15.2. <u>Checks, Drafts, Etc.</u>. All checks, drafts or orders for the payment of money, notes or other evidences of indebtedness issued in the name of the Council shall be signed by such officer or officers, agent or agents, of the Council, and in such manner as shall from time to time be determined by resolution of the Council. In the absence of such determination by the Council, such instrument shall be signed by the Executive Director and countersigned by the Treasurer, or if the Treasurer is not available, then by the Chairman.
- 15.3. <u>Deposits</u>. All funds of the Council shall be deposited from time to time to the credit of the Council in such banks, trust companies, or other depositories as the Council may select.
- 15.4. Gifts. The Council may accept on behalf of the Council any contribution, gift, bequest or devise for the general purposes or for any special purpose of the Council.

<u>Article XVI – Cooperation and Consultation With Other Agencies</u>

16.1. Cooperation and Consultation. The Council may cooperate with other planning district commissions, councils of governments, or the legislative and administrative bodies and officials of other districts or localities within or outside a district, so as to coordinate the planning, development and services of the Commonwealth Regional District with the plans and services of other districts and localities and the Commonwealth. The Council may appoint committees and adopt rules to effect such cooperation. The Council shall also cooperate with the Department of Housing and Community Development and use advice and information furnished by such Department and by other state and federal officials, departments and agencies.

Article XVII - Annual Budget and Report

17.1. <u>Annual Budget</u>. On or before June 30 of each year, the Council shall adopt a budget for the upcoming fiscal year. The budget shall, at a minimum, identify the source and amounts of funds, and the estimated expenses and liabilities. If, for any reason, a budget is not

adopted before June 30, the Executive Committee shall be authorized to continue funding the Council until a budget is adopted.

17.2. <u>Annual Report</u>. The Council shall submit an annual report by September 1 of each year to its member local governments and the Department of Housing and Community Development in accordance with a format prescribed by the Department. The annual report shall contain, at a minimum, a description of the activities conducted by the Council during the preceding fiscal year, including how the Council met the provisions of the Regional Cooperation Act, and information showing the sources and amounts of funding provided to the Council.

<u>Article XVIII – Annual Dues and Assessments</u>

- 18.1. <u>Annual Dues</u>. The Council shall determine at or before the first meeting of each fiscal calendar year the annual dues to be paid by the member localities and institutions. In no event, except as otherwise provided in the Charter Agreement or these Bylaws, shall any locality or institution be required to pay annual dues in an amount greater than any other member locality or institution.
- 18.2. <u>Commencement of Annual Dues</u>. Any member locality that transferred, or caused to be transferred, its pro rata shares of the assets of the former Piedmont Planning District Commission to the Council shall commence paying annual dues in July of 2006. The member institutions of higher education shall commence paying annual dues in July of 2005.
- 18.3. Nonpayment. If any member locality or institution fails to timely pay its dues in full, after written notice from the Secretary, then that localities appointed member to the Council shall not be permitted to vote on any matters before the Council until the locality pays its dues in full. However, the that appointed member to the Council shall not be excluded from Council meetings and discussions.
- 18.4. Assessment for New Member Localities or Institutions. Any locality or institution of higher education that is admitted to the Council pursuant to paragraph 9.1 of the Charter Agreement shall pay a one-time assessment immediately upon its admission to the Council in an amount equal to its pro rata share of the fair market value of the Council's assets as of the date of admission. If the Council and the locality or institution are not able to promptly agree on the fair market value of the assets, the same shall be determined by an appraisal prepared by a qualified appraiser selected and compensated by the Council.

18.5. <u>Assessments</u>. An additional assessment may be made upon a member locality or institution for additional services that are provided in response to a request by such member locality or institution and that are not included in the Work Program adopted by the Council. Such assessment shall be agreed upon by and between the Council and the requesting member locality or institution.

Article XIX - Dissolution

19.1. <u>Dissolution</u>. The Council may be dissolved at any time, but only after concurring resolutions for dissolution have been adopted by the governing bodies of a majority of the member localities. Upon the dissolution or termination of the Council, it shall, after paying or making provisions for the payment of its liabilities, distribute its assets to its member localities, pro rata, based upon the formula used to determine dues to the Council.

Article XX - Parliamentary Procedure

20.1. <u>Parliamentary Procedure</u>. In all matters of parliamentary procedure not specifically covered by these Bylaws, the Charter Agreement, and/or the Regional Cooperation Act, Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, Procedures in Small Boards, shall govern.

Dear Governor Kaine:

On September 1, 2009, the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward wrote to you requesting your assistance with insuring the timely completion of High Bridge Trail State Park. Our letter shared with you the success of the exemplary partnership between the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation and the Virginia Department of Transportation. We shared with you that it has taken only two VDOT employees to construct the first twenty-two miles from High Bridge to Pamplin, which has saved DCR (and the taxpayers of Virginia) a significant amount of money.

We had asked of you to please direct VDOT to execute a final agreement with VDCR which would enable VDOT's employees to construct the remaining eleven miles of the trail. Clearly, VDOT has proven that its employees involvement in this project is efficient and cost-effective, and therefore in the best interest of the citizens of Virginia.

You have also received similar letters from the Counties of Appomattox, Cumberland and Nottoway and the Town of Farmville. A copy of each is attached.

On October 13, 2009, you responded to the Appomattox County Board of Supervisors. Your letter stated, "By copy of this letter, I am requesting that the two agencies move forward with this agreement as quickly as possible so that the grading of the rail bed and its conversion to a trail is completed as soon as possible."

On October 27, 2009 VDOT Commissioner David Ekern, P.E., wrote to DCR Director Joe Maroon and stated, "If DCR would like VDOT to procure this work and act as DCR's agent in procuring and administering a contract to complete the work I would be happy to consider such an agreement."

The final attachment is a copy of an e-mail dated November 13, 2009 from a DCR employee stating that it is VDOT's intention "to contract out all the work. In other words there wouldn't be any VDOT forces involved in it other than procuring and administering contracts."

We can find no reasonable explanation as to why VDOT is seemingly unwilling to complete this important outdoor recreational and economic development project for the Commonwealth.

The two VDOT employees who constructed the first twenty-two miles of trail are assigned to work in the Dillwyn Residency, which serves Prince Edward County. When they were needed for road maintenance projects, they were pulled from the trail. Given our limited transportation budget, this arrangement has maximized our limited resources and accomplished a great deal for our citizens.

Let us be clear, the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors unanimously supports having VDOT employees who maintain the roads in Prince Edward County be temporarily assigned to complete the construction of High Bridge Trail.

The County of Prince Edward stands united with the Counties of Appomattox, Cumberland and Nottoway and the Towns of Burkeville, Farmville and Pamplin in our request that you direct VDOT to immediately mobilize its employees and equipment to complete High Bridge Trail State Park.

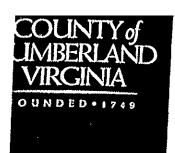

In September the Governor issued his FY10 Budget reduction Plan to address a \$1.35 billion shortfall in revenues for the current fiscal year. I have been in contact with the Schools and they have indicated they can take actions necessary to adjust their budget to absorb the \$243,000 in revenue reductions they have to take.

The majority of the revenue reductions in the General Fund involve the Constitutional Offices and the Registrar/Electoral Board. Some state departments are still determining how they will absorb their reductions. Thus, there could be additional revenue reductions but these will be minor. The total reduction in those areas mentioned is \$126,093 and is allocated as such - Treasurer = \$6,141; Commissioner of Revenue = \$5,232; Clerk of Circuit Court = 23,356; Commonwealth's Attorney = \$25,638; Sheriff = \$60,671; and Registrar/Electoral Board = \$5,055.

Our major revenue sources are the real estate and personal property tax. After discussion with Mrs. Booth concerning the assessed values on the tax bills, I am confident our budgeted amounts in those categories are conservative and our collections will exceed our budgeted amounts. Our next largest revenue source is the Local Sales Tax. This tax has decreased due to the economy but it appears collections should equal our budget.

Currently, I am holding one position vacant and plan to do so into the foreseeable future. This will save approximately \$33,000 if left open for the remainder of the Fiscal Year. The Commonwealth Attorney had a locally funded position vacant for approximately 3 months which produced a saving of approximately \$7,000.

After deducting the \$40,000 in savings from the state budget reductions leaves an unfunded reduction of \$86,093.

The auditors recently completed their field work and while there will be minor adjustments before the final audit is ready for release the estimate of the combined fund balance for all funds is approximately \$9.5 million at the end of June 2009.

Recommendation: I recommend the Board take no action to adjust the budget at this time. But authorize the County Administrator to advise the Constitutional Officers and Department Heads of the reductions and request they make every effort to under expend their approved budget. This item will be revisited in January.
