As you will recall, in November/December 2007, the Board awarded annual contracts for engineering services to Draper Aden Associates, Resource International and Wiley & Wilson. The term of the current contracts has expired. The Virginia Public Procurement Act allows the County to award two additional renewals to these contracts under this procurement.

An annual contract is at no cost to the County, unless the engineering firm is used for a specific project. When the County has a project, we negotiate the price and scope of work with the engineering firms we have under contract. If we cannot reach an agreement, the County retains the option to advertise for services from other engineering firms. The limit per project for engineering fees is \$100,000.

Board approval of entering into annual contracts from January 1, 2009 to December 31, 2010 with Draper Aden Associates, Resource International and Wiley & Wilson is requested.

Borrowing Entity: Town of Farmville, Virginia (the "Town")

Purchaser: RBC Bank (the "Bank")

Purpose: To provide funding for a new library (the "Project"). The library is a

joint project between the Town of Farmville and the County of Prince Edward (the "County"). As specified in the Interlocal Agreement, the Town will be responsible for 1/3 of the total Project cost, while the

County will be responsible for 2/3 of the total Project cost.

Anticipated Funding: On or before February 13, 2009
Amount: Not to exceed \$4,200,000.00

Term: Fifteen (15) years

Interest Rate: 3.68%

Payments: Annual principal payments beginning either February 1, 2010 or

February 1, 2011, and semi-annual interest payments beginning August

1, 2009.

Prepayment Terms: Any prepayment of the loan within the first seven (7) years will be

subject to a fee of 1% of the outstanding balance. The loan may be

prepaid at any time thereafter without penalty.

Security Interest: The Bond is a General Obligation of the Town and shall constitute a

pledge of the full faith and credit of the Town. Principal and interest on the Bond are payable from an ad valorem tax, unlimited as to the amount or rate, upon all property within the Town subject to taxation

for General Obligation purposes.

Funding: At closing, the proceeds of the Bond will be placed in an Escrow Account.

Escrow Fund: RBC Bank will set up and administer the Escrow Fund under an Escrow

Deposit Agreement and invest it in a RBC Public Funds Account for the Borrowing Entity's benefit until needed to make payments to vendors for the Project. the interest rate payable hereunder shall increase to the rate which will provide to the Bank the effective yield which it would have received had there not been a Change in Deductibility. A "Change in Deductibility" means any determination by the Internal Revenue service or any court of competent jurisdiction that the obligation of the Town hereunder is not a "qualified tax-exempt obligation" within the meaning of Section 265(b) (3) of the Internal Revenue Code as a result or as a consequence of (i) an action, or failure to act, by the Town or (ii) a breach of any representation or warranty made by the Town to the Bank relating to the status of this Contract as a qualified tax-exempt

obligation.

Covenants of the Town: Covenants shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

A. Payments: The Town will make timely payment of all principal and interest on the Bond on or before each due date by wire transfer to the Bank.

B. Financial Statements: Not later than 180 days following the end of each Fiscal Year,

beginning with the 2009 Fiscal Year, the Town and the County will provide the Bank a copy of the Comprehensive Annual Financial

Report for such Fiscal Year.

C. Annual Budget and Other The Town and the County will prepare the annual budget in accordance Information: with Virginia law, and will provide to the Bank (i) a copy of their final

annual budgets within 30 days of adoption thereof by the Council and (ii) such other public information as the Bank may reasonably request.

The Town and the County will take all actions necessary to maintain

their tax-exempt status.

D. Tax Compliance:

Conditions Precedent: The obligation of the Bank to provide the financing is subject to the satisfaction of each of the following conditions precedent on or before

the Disbursement Date:

A. Opinion of Town Attorney: The Bank shall have received a written opinion of the Town's Attorney as to (1) the corporate existence of the Town; (2) the due adoption of the Resolution; (3) the due authorization, execution, validity, and

enforceability of the Bond and the related financing documents

including the Interlocal Agreement between the Town and the County; (4) the absence of litigation against the Town relating to its existence or powers, or the proceedings for the authorization and issuance of the Bond, in form and substance satisfactory to the Bank; and (5) such other matters as the Bank may reasonably request, in form and substance satisfactory of the Bank. Failure by the Town to make any payment of principal of or interest on

the Bond when due.

B.

The application for the appointment of a receiver for any party or the filing of a petition under any provisions of the Bankruptcy Code or Act by or against any party or any assignment for the benefit of creditors by or against any party.

If the terms are mutually satisfactory, they will be incorporated into the financing documentation that will be executed by the Town and the Bank.

January 12, 2009 Proposal Expiration: The Bank must be notified by 5:00 p.m. that our bid will be recommended to the governing body for approval. 

Issue: Replace Part Time Position at Visitor Center

Summary:

Diane Speas Faison is a Prince Edward County part-time employee. Her position is one of two positions that work weekends and holidays at Virginia's Heartland Regional Visitor Center & Transportation Heritage Museum. On January 5, 2009, Ms. Faison submitted her resignation as she is relocating to Winston-Salem North Carolina where her children and grandchildren currently reside. Ms. Faison has worked in this position since October 2007. February 16th, 2009 will be her last day.

In April 2005, Virginia's Heartland Regional Visitor Center & Transportation Heritage Museum opened its doors to the public. In October 2007, this facility became a Certified State Visitor Center. With only 57 Certified Visitor Centers in Virginia it takes dedication from the local community to make a State Certified Visitor Center succeed. To comply, Prince Edward County had to meet four key criteria:

- Allocate designated parking for the Visitor Center, including at least one handicapped space.
- Be open to the public at least 5 days a week Friday, Saturday and Sunday are required days.
- Provide adequate bathroom facilities.
- Provide brochure space to represent the 56 other Certified Visitor Centers at no charge.

Some of the benefits of being a Certified Visitor Center include:

- Each of the 12 State owned Welcome Centers is required to reserve a brochure slot at no charge to Certified Visitor Centers. Without certification, these brochure slots would cost \$1,088 per year.
- Each of the 57 Certified Visitor Center is required to present and promote every other Certified Visitor Center in Virginia at no charge. Without certification, the cost would be \$6048 per year.
- 25% to 40% discounts on Virginia Tourism Corporation (VTC) Co-op advertising in national venues covering Travel, Heritage/Culture, Outdoor/Recreation, and others. Some examples:
 - Southern Living
 - o AAA/World
 - American Legacy
- On-going educational and networking opportunities through VTC:
 - Marketing training
 - Grant writing workshops
 - Customer Service Training workshops
 - Networking with other Visitor Center staff

Since October 2007, Virginia's Heartland Regional Visitor Center & Transportation Heritage Museum has successfully met the four key points. Because of the increased exposure via Virginia Tourism Corporation, Welcome Centers, Certified Visitor Centers, the Prince Edward County website, and word of mouth, there has been a 17.5% increase in visitors this year over last as shown in the table below:

These numbers are tracked on a calendar year basis reflecting 9 out of 10 visitors who actually sign the Guest Book.

In 2006, the state of Virginia shipped over 500,000 individual issues of the Virginia is For Lovers Travel Guide. They printed and shipped another 250,000 Travel Guides to Visitor Centers and Welcome Centers during that year. Additionally, over 300,000 Travel Guides were downloaded from the VTC website. In 2007, Prince Edward County advertised in the Virginia is for Lovers Travel Guide for the first time. As a result of that ad, Virginia's Heartland Regional Visitor Center mailed over 2,000 requests for information about Prince Edward County, while continuing to be the local resource for information to groups coming to Prince Edward County, as shown in the table below:

These numbers are tracked on a calendar year basis.

While the Visitor Center staff is available 7 days a week to meet and greet visitors to our area ensuring all are welcome, they are also responsible for mass mailings for the Office of Economic Development as in the 500 envelope Enterprise Zone mailing scheduled this month or a County event like the Light of Reconciliation. Not only will they process the invitations, they call all reminder lists, help with setup and teardown, and ensure the Visitor Center is always clean and neat. Additionally, the staff maintains the inventory of over 100 different brochures: ordering replacement brochures and stocking the displays.

The ability to be open 7 days a week allows the existing staff to function during the standard business week, while allowing part time County staff to operate the Visitor Center during times when visitors are looking for a one stop facility with information regarding things to do and places to go in our area.

Recommendation: Respectfully request the Personnel Committee to allow this position to be advertised and filled as this is not a new position, but a replacement position. With the changing economy, it is not clear whether we will be able to continue to use the Older Worker Programs we currently utilize to assist with existing staffing levels at the Visitor Center.
