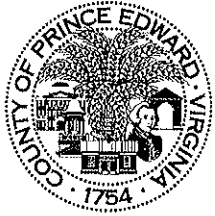

In Re: Highway Matters

Mr. Mark McKissick reported Route 613, Miller Lake Road, is under contract. He said the cost will be approximately \$600,000, and the project is to begin May 19, 2008. He estimated the construction would take 90 days to complete.

Mr. Moore said the plant mix for patching on Route 460 in the Rice area is not holding well. Mr. McKissick said they are using slurry mix which may give another year, and that it's just "a lot of bandaids." He said the schedule for the Route 15 has not changed; the project has gone to a design build, and it will not interfere with the work to be done on Route 643, which will begin after work is complete on Route 15. Mr. McKissick said work on Hampden-Sydney Road is due to begin in 2012; the funds are allocated and the design will be completed for such time as the funds are available.

Mr. Ward asked if the Hostetters signed the necessary papers; Mr. McKissick said they were waiting for both he and Mr. Gilliam to agree on the fence.

Mr. Ward asked if Mr. Bill Bailey put in for grant funding for curb work and water issues in the Prospect area. Mr. McKissick said he did not know.

Mr. McKay asked about the status of the Slaydon Forest Road project. Mr. McKissick said stone was ordered and they are awaiting a contractor from Louisa to spread it with a bulldozer. He said they hope to have it spread in two weeks, and that they are short-staffed. He added the maintenance budget was allocated a certain amount of money, and it was divided among the residencies to spend. He said they are working overtime putting down stone and asphalt.

Mr. Ward asked about having gravel spread on Isham Road. Mr. McKissick said he was unsure of any plans for that project, but would look into it. Mr. McKissick reminded the Board that the Six Year Plan would need to be approved at the June 2008 meeting.

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**ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND PROTECT THE
SANDY RIVER RESERVOIR
AND ADJACENT COUNTY-OWNED PROPERTIES
IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 15.1-13 OF THE
CODE OF VIRGINIA 1950, AS AMENDED**

Sec. 82-31.

- (a) The following activities are hereby declared to be unlawful in that part of Lockett Magisterial District of Prince Edward County known as Sandy River Reservoir and on any County-owned property surrounding the reservoir:
- (1) Presence of persons, boats, or other personal property at anytime in areas marked "No Trespassing," without the express written permission of the county administrator.
 - (2) Parking on any County-owned property surrounding the reservoir other than in the Sandy River Reservoir Public Use Area located off Route 640, at the end of Route 792, or in any other area specifically designated by the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors as a Public Parking Area.
 - (3) Littering or dumping of any type, kind or description.
 - (4) Hunting or trapping of any type, kind or description without an express written permit issued by the County of Prince Edward.
 - (5) Conducting fishing tournaments in which prizes are awarded without an express written permit issued by the County of Prince Edward and Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.
 - (6) Diving, snorkeling or swimming of any type, kind or description.
 - (7) Operation in or on the reservoir of any unlicensed watercraft or any type of watercraft propelled by an engine in excess of ten (10) horsepower.

- (8) Operation in or on the reservoir of a windsurfer, sailboard or any wind-propelled vessel, other than a sailboat, length of which shall not exceed sixteen (16) feet.
- (9) Operation in or on the reservoir of any jet ski.
- (10) Sale of any and all commodities or services anywhere in either the reservoir or the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir, as well as the posting of any kind of advertisement of any description, unless sanctioned by the County of Prince Edward.
- (11) Discharging any firearm, including but not limited to any weapon which propels a projectile by pneumatic means, unless sanctioned by the County of Prince Edward.
- (12) Possession of any type of alcoholic beverage while on the premises.
- (13) Presence on the reservoir or the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir by any person under the age of twelve (12) years, unless such person is accompanied by an individual who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
- (14) Camping and lighting or maintaining any kind of fire, unless such activity has been sanctioned or is sponsored by the County.
- (15) Use of any of the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir by any person riding any type of motorized or non-motorized vehicle, bicycle or horse and use of any part of the reservoir or such County-owned property for ice skating or sledding, unless any such use has been expressly sanctioned by the County.
- (16) The use of any of the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir, other than those areas specifically designated by the County as such, for boat access to and from the reservoir including, but not limited to construction of piers, docks and access roads.

Individuals owning property adjacent to the county buffer who have a county-approved and permitted boat access ramp shall continue to be responsible for the soil erosion and sedimentation measures and for the safe maintenance and upkeep of the ramp. The permit is not transferable to any future owners of the property. Permittee must carry liability insurance and show annual proof thereof.
- (17) Cutting, removing or altering any trees, brush or other vegetation now growing or hereafter established in the reservoir or on the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir and removing, altering or otherwise disturbing the reservoir or any County-owned land surrounding the reservoir.
- (18) Withdrawal of water for any purpose, with the exception that adjacent property owners with express written permission from Prince Edward County may withdraw reasonable amounts of water for irrigation and domestic purposes until such time as water therein is used for public water supply.
- (19) Stocking of any fish or other aquatic species in the reservoir or animal on the County-owned property, without written permission of Prince Edward County and the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.

(20) The siting of “sewerage systems” and “treatment works”, as defined by the State Board of Health Sewage Handling and Disposal Regulations, within five hundred (500) feet of the normal pool elevation of the reservoir.

(21) Discharging a firearm, as defined in paragraph 11 of this section, on any county-owned land, on or within 300 feet of a public parking area.

Mr. James Ennis said that in February 2008, the Board discussed two boundary requests to adjust boundaries with the Town of Farmville. One of those was a 13.95 acre parcel which at that time was represented as being the Woodlands, and a 67 + acre parcel from Mr. Blaylock. He said subsequent to the approval of the plat that was presented, it was determined that the plat was in error; the 13.95 acre parcel included a small parcel owned by Mt. Trella Properties, LLC, which had not requested a boundary adjustment. Mr. Ennis said that he is now in receipt of an adjustment letter from Mt. Trella property, requesting that property to be part of the adjustment taken into the Town of Farmville. He said a public hearing can now be scheduled on the boundary adjustments. Mr. Ennis said he is in receipt of the Boundary Adjustment agreement which would need to be amended to reflect the inclusion of the Mt. Trella parcel, as would the petition to Circuit Court for the ultimate boundary adjustment.

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In Re: County Administrator's Report

Mr. Bartlett said the Institute for Outdoor Drama from the University of North Carolina in Chapel Hill, NC is conducting an Outdoor Drama Feasibility Study and Identification of potential sites and is requesting the Board to submit any potential sites for consideration. He added the Commonwealth Regional Council is going to pay for the study by the Institute. He asked that Board members present their suggestions of sites to be evaluated to him or Mrs. Puckett.

Mr. Bartlett gave a report on the update of the Water & Wastewater projects. He said he recently received a response from the Town of Farmville. On February 21, at the last meeting of the joint committees of the Town and County concerning the Sandy River Reservoir, the County presented a Memorandum of Understanding, which did not bind either party in any direct contracts concerning water or sewer. It was also determined at that meeting that the two localities go forward with studying an agreement or a contract concerning the Town's offer to sell water and sewer services to the County. He said the Town and County engineers reviewed agreements from other jurisdictions and brought a draft on March 24th to the Town and County. On April 18, a letter was sent to the Town of Farmville requesting a status report and requested a meeting; on May 13, a reply was sent to the County Attorney stating the Town declined taking action on Prince Edward County's Memorandum of Understanding and the draft water and sewer contract forwarded by email on March 24th, pending a subcommittee meeting as discussed on February 21st. He said while the Town declined to take action on the Memorandum of Understanding, the Town has agreed to meet with the County regarding the draft contract. He said the County would attempt to set up meetings with the Town regarding the contract to move forward and work together.

Mr. Bartlett said as the County moves forward with the County utility system, it is now necessary to determine management and operating structure of the system. He recommended scheduling a work session on June 10 at 4:00 p.m.; requested authorization for a public hearing to be advertised for June 18 at 7:00 p.m. regarding the establishment of an authority for the management and operational control of the County utility system; and requested the Board direct the Planning Commission to amend the Comprehensive Plan, specifically Chapter 5, titled Wastewater and Water, and the amendment would contain language describing actions Prince Edward County desires to adopt in regard to Utility Infrastructure Development throughout the county. He added the work session will focus on the various forms of management control, but recommended the Authority. He said the creation of an Authority would not negate the option of reaching an agreement with the Town concerning these issues, as the Authority would act on the County's behalf. He added there is no requirement for the Town to join with the Authority unless the Town so desires.

Mr. Ward suggested inviting state regulatory personnel and people that have responsibility with water and sewage so that their expertise could be shared with the Board. Mr. Bartlett said the regulatory personnel would be more concerned with quality of the water and the processes by which the water is treated than the management of the Authority. Mr. Ward said their input on the establishment of the water and sewer treatment plant would be helpful. Mr. Bartlett said the creation of the management is more the administrative management versus the treatment; they have to approve the type of plant built and the treatment to be done, and is part of the design and the study. He said the DEQ and the Health Department will be invited.

Mr. McKay asked why a delay in the time between the meeting and the public hearing; Mr. Bartlett said the County must wait at least 30 days from advertisement of the public hearing and holding the public hearing on the creation of an authority.

Prince Edward. He said at the April Board meeting, the candidates presented were Harriett Fentress, District 301, and Russell Dove, District 501. The floor was opened for public comment.

There being no one wishing to speak, the public hearing was closed.

Chairman Fore stated the Board will appoint School Board members at the June Board meeting.

In Re: Public Hearing – Transfer of Industrial Park Parcels to IDA

Chairman Fore announced that this was the date and time scheduled for a public hearing on the transfer of Industrial Park parcels to the IDA, notice of which was advertised in the April 25, 2008 and May 2, 2008 editions of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward. Chairman Fore asked Mrs. Sharon L. Carney to give opening remarks.

Mrs. Carney said the Board of Supervisors gave formal approval in April of 2007 to harvest approximately 44 acres of timber at the Prince Edward Business Park with the ultimate intention of developing part of the raw land into approximately three industrial sites. The timbering is complete.

Mrs. Carney said on March 28, 2008, the Industrial Development Authority (IDA) awarded an engineering contract for \$57,794 to Hurt & Proffitt from Lynchburg to begin the necessary engineering for the development of three “ready-to-go” industrial sites. She added that on April 29, 2008, the Virginia Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Commission awarded Prince Edward County \$193,510 for the development of three “ready-to-go” industrial sites, consisting of approximately 25 acres +/-, at a projected cost of \$762,000.

Mrs. Carney said in order to achieve the best project construction and engineering oversight, the IDA requested the transfer of the 37 acres (more or less) to the IDA. She said this procedure has been followed for past development at the Business Park, and allows the Board of Supervisors to maintain control of development and the sale of property.

Mrs. Carney reported that while researching deed titles for VDOT right-of-way along US 15 South, it was discovered that approximately 1.67 acres, bounding the north side of the Lowe’s Home Center property, was inadvertently omitted when transferring the land ownership from Prince Edward County to the IDA; a “Deed of Correction” is needed to rectify the oversight. The 1.67 acre lot would be an independent lot

Chairman Fore opened the floor for public comment.

There being no one wishing to speak, the public hearing was closed.

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the Board of Supervisors authorized the transfer of 37 acres +/- to the Industrial Development Authority, and authorized the Chairman and the County Administrator to execute the documents necessary to convey the parcels to the IDA.

In Re: Noise Ordinance Committee Report

Chairman Fore said there was no action taken following the public hearing during the April 2008 Board meeting, and several citizens addressed the Board. He said the Committee met on May 5, 2008 with the County Attorney, County Administrator, Sheriff and Chief Deputy. The owners of Fevers, Mr. and Mrs. William Harding, were also present.

Chairman Fore said the Committee discussed the citizen complaints received at the public hearing. The County Attorney discussed with the committee why sound measuring devices (decibel meters) are not necessary in the enforcement of the ordinance. The Sheriff and Chief Deputy suggested the noise complaints are not due to Fever's but due to the noise from the vehicles of their patrons as they are entering and exiting the Fevers establishment.

Chairman Fore said the recommendation of the committee is to ask each Board member to consider visiting the Poplar Forest Apartments during the hours that Fevers is in operation (9:00 p.m. – 2:00 a.m. on Saturday; 8:00 p.m. – 1:00 a.m. on Sunday) prior to bringing the Noise Ordinance back to the full Board.

Mrs. Gilfillan said there needs to be a resolution for the citizens' complaints the Board received during the public hearing, and the issue should be resolved quickly. She asked that the Board members visit the site within the month for discussion at the next Board meeting.

Mr. Moore asked if the County owns a noise measurement device; Chief Deputy Wesley Reed said the County does not. Mr. Moore said an individual is not going to be able to measure the noise, and would be a matter of opinion. Mr. Ennis said the proposed noise ordinance states, with respect to the vehicles, that if the stereo is turned up so loudly that someone outside the vehicle can hear it, the vehicle operator is in violation. He added emergency vehicles are exempt. Mr. Moore said the County needs to obtain a noise measurement device, as he felt an opinion would not hold up in court if that became necessary.

Mr. Ennis said the proposed ordinance does not include decibels, but classifies certain types of noises as being per se reasonably loud if they occur between certain hours in the night and morning. He said certain exemptions were built in, such as church bells and emergency vehicles, and certain authorized activities. He said the noise could be limited from a property or street line, and the ordinance predicates one warning. He added the ordinance is not to eliminate all noise, but to eliminate unreasonably loud noise between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m., such as construction, and the like.

Further discussion followed regarding the need for decibel meters.

Mrs. Gilfillan suggested the Board leave the wording in the ordinance as is, and ask the Sheriff and the Deputy to investigate for at least two Fridays and Saturdays and go through different areas in Poplar Forest, and come back to the Board with a report. She added that if Mr. Moore would find it better, then borrow one of the meters from the Town and use it – not to enforce or write tickets – but as an indication of the noise levels at the different areas.

Mr. Ward said he would hate for the Board to become regulators, and asked if there was a nuisance law in place. Mr. Ennis said there is a statewide nuisance statute. Mr. Ward said he felt it was a police problem, and that where he lives, he can sometimes hear a party two miles away.

Chief Reed said that he would be glad to take the Board members to Fevers or Poplar Forest; he said there have been complaints in the past from people at Poplar Forest, and he personally went out to investigate and the complaint was unfounded.

Chairman Fore said the County is dependent upon the Sheriff's Department to be the enforcing arm of the Board's policy, but the Board must make the policies. He said it would be best to have personal knowledge, and asked the Board members, the Noise Ordinance Committee and the Deputies to visit the

Poplar Forest Apartments during Fevers' operating hours, and then relate their findings to the Board. Mrs. Gilfillan requested the Sheriff to investigate for at least two Fridays and Saturdays and go through different areas in Poplar Forest, and come back to the Board with a report.

In Re: Library Committee Report

Chairman Fore said the Library Committee met on May 1, 2008 with the Town Committee and representatives of the Library to discuss the final cost estimates of approximately \$7.3 million. He said the Town and County committee members agreed that the construction split is 1/3 Town and 2/3 County, but no final agreement has been reached with the Town on ownership, maintenance, and other issues. He said the Board needs to determine how the County will pay for the library.

Mr. Bartlett said the Architect issued an Invitation for Bids to obtain a better estimate of the costs, which should be presented within 30-60 days. At that time, options can be removed to reduce the cost if desired. He said once the final cost is obtained, state and federal grants may be sought. He added the Commonwealth Regional Council (CRC) will be asked to assist.

In Re: Light of Reconciliation

Mrs. Wiley said that on Monday, July 21, 2008, the Governor will unveil and dedicate the Civil Rights Memorial on the Virginia State Capital Grounds, in honor of Barbara Johns and the R. R. Moton High School students for their contribution in the Civil Rights movement here in Prince Edward County, where the schools were closed in 1959 and not reopened until 1964. She requested that the Board consider establishing a Light of Reconciliation atop the Prince Edward County Courthouse to serve as a tribute to all students who helped bring about change in the struggle for civil rights in education. She said the light could be installed to illuminate the cupola. She added that it would be fitting and proper for the citizens of Prince Edward County to begin a healing process to right some of the wrongs brought to this county because of the school closing. She added she would like an annual ceremony to be held each year, beginning July 21, 2008. Mrs. Wiley thanked Ken Woodley for the idea, and asked him to give remarks.

Mr. Ken Woodley said:

I think ideas like this are truly gifts from God, and I think the wonderful thing is – the great thing is when people get together and open the gift together and share it with one another.

I'm a member of the Civil Rights Memorial Committee as a regional representative, and Lacy Ward, Jr. is a member of that Executive Committee. There was a meeting in Richmond last week where the plans for a two-day celebration of the unveiling of the Civil Rights Memorial were confirmed: Sunday, in Richmond on July 20th, and then the actual unveiling by the Governor on the morning of the 21st. The Memorial – the statue itself – is virtually a memorial to the people from Prince Edward County. I've seen the renderings, and Barbara Johns, [and] John Stokes are vigorously identifiable individuals, and the late Rev. L. Francis Griffin.

On that day, in the Capital Grounds of Virginia, between the Capital and the Governor's mansion, that monument to these Prince Edward residents and their contribution to American history will be unveiled.

It seemed like Prince Edward [County] responding – doing something here simultaneously, and what better way to do it than to shine a light, because it was those young people who helped America see the light, and they shone a light themselves on that day in 1951 that went to the heart and soul of this country and to our birth certificate that all people are created equal - a light atop this courthouse where so many decisions were made in the 1950s, and where the students visited the school superintendent on that day in 1951, but where other decisions have been made through the years, bringing people together.

This Light of Reconciliation would be a memorial – an honor – a tribute to those Prince Edward residents who are being given the supreme honor of a statue in Richmond on the Capital Grounds. But it would be our hope, too, that as people come here – whether they work here or visit here – as they incline their heads to look at this light, that they would also incline their hearts and minds to continue the work of reconciliation that needs to continue in this community and this state, and this nation. And what better way for Prince Edward [County] to continue to show the nation – to help America see the light and to shine a light that needs to be shone. Illuminating the cupola, and doing it perhaps in a dusk ceremony, it's possible we can get a former Governor here as part of that, would be a fitting way to honor but also to rededicate ourselves daily to shining the light toward one another.

Mr. Woodley thanked Mrs. Wiley for bringing this before the Board.

Mrs. Gilfillan suggested having a yearly ceremony; the first is to be in concert with the unveiling in Richmond, but thereafter hold the ceremony on the day Mr. Woodley mentioned in 1951 or on the first date schools reopened in 1964 so the date has meaning for what actually happened. She said the Board could sponsor the event each year and have a series of dialogs.

Further discussion of the future ceremonies followed.

The Light of Reconciliation

Illuminated in the courthouse bell tower on July 21, 2008 by the Board of Supervisors of Prince Edward County in honor of Barbara Johns and the students of Robert Russa Moton High School and all the children of our county for their historic role in ending public school segregation in the United States and in sorrow for closing schools. When we raise our eyes to see this light, may we also incline our hearts and minds to shine our own light of reconciliation toward all people.

In Re: Work Session on the Route 15 Corridor Plan

Dr. W. W. Porterfield, Chairman of the Planning Commission, called the Planning Commission to order. He said the meeting was to explore ideas about the commercial corridors within Prince Edward County.

Mr. Bartlett, County Administrator, said, "The overlay district is created for the purpose of providing special criteria to accomplish an intended purpose. The overlay district is in addition to and overlaps or overlays all other zoning districts, thus any parcel of land in the overlay district, but also in one the established zoning districts. An entrance corridor overlay district is intended to implement Prince Edward County's Comprehensive Plan's goal of protecting the County's natural, scenic, historic and natural resources. To do so, we should protect and promote the unique characteristics of our natural and built environments leading to our more densely populated areas, our main commercial zones and our historic areas. Setting design standards for a corridor ensures compatibility of development, promotes general welfare of the community by creating attractive environments, increasing commerce, improving property values, and increasing public awareness of our natural, scenic, historic and cultural resources. One of the main items to be decided is where the district will and will not apply; specifically we must decide both the length and the width of the corridor. A corridor development plan can include, but is not necessarily limited to the following:

- reducing impacts from development on existing land forms and resources
- promoting development design compatibility with nearby historic architectural and cultural resources
- improving pedestrian and vehicular connections within each parcel

- reducing the prominence of parking lots on the corridors
- increasing site plantings
- establishing reciprocity between building and site design
- fully integrating utilities into building and site structures
- regulating the size, intensity and placement of signs and lighting
- assuring provisions for stormwater management are well integrated into site design
- reducing access points to the main corridor itself

Mr. Bartlett continued, “In addition to the above, we must determine if we will allow exemptions to the regulations. Examples of such exemptions are existing single family dwellings, interior alterations to buildings that will not affect the exterior, and agricultural and forestal buildings where no site plan is required.” He said this is the initial meeting, and needs input from the Board and the Planning Commission on what the staff should work on.

Jonathan Pickett, Director of Planning and Community Development, said the Comprehensive Plan and special policy area when dealing with corridor development, and identifies Route 15, Route 460, and Route 360 as the corridors. The County wants to keep those areas aesthetically pleasing as well as provide for the type of development along a particular section of road where traffic or too many accidents take place. He said there are three goals, one of which is to visualize what the corridors should look like in ten to twenty years. He said the corridor that is most likely for growth is Route 15, South. He said the second goal is how to implement it; for example, would one corridor development plan be written to cover all three corridors, and implementing Route 15 first, or just concentrate on Route 15 and let each corridor stand on its own. He said the third thing was to get specifics the Board and Planning Commission feel are the important types of things that need studied, such as landscaping, signage, lighting, utilities, access points, etc.

Mr. Pickett said commercial development is increasing; some is controlled by proffers, but it would be better to have a plan or guidelines in place.

Dr. Porterfield said Hampden-Sydney College is very interested in seeing the plan made and having design standards; Mr. Bartlett added The Manor is also very interested.

Discussion followed on access points from Route 15. Mrs. Daves-Johnson showed examples of access strips. Dr. Porterfield stressed the need for designing the size of the overlay district.

Mrs. Daves-Johnson said input was needed on the appearance of the corridor. General discussion followed on landscaping, medians, matched or balanced architecture, underground or overhead utility lines, a biking or walking path, turn-lanes, and the costs for the various scenarios.

Mr. Thomas M. Pairet entered the meeting at this time.

Mr. Coleman stressed that the regulations should not increase the cost of the properties to the point that they would be too costly for developers. Dr. Porterfield said it would be easy to include specifications for the design standards.

Mrs. Daves-Johnson then said the implementation approach could be handled in two ways: by land use, which would provide general guidelines and additional specific guidelines or design standards; or look at one section of the roadway and complete a plan for types of development in that section only. Mr. McKay suggested completing work on the plan for Route 15 first, as they may learn of necessary changes. Dr. Porterfield said a plan for Route 15 is time-sensitive and should be done quickly. After some further discussion, the consensus was to establish the content of a General Plan for all areas, with the Route 15 Corridor as Phase I, and a sign ordinance.

The Board of Supervisors and Planning Commission took a brief dinner break.

Chairman Fore left the meeting during the dinner break.

Following the dinner break, Mrs. Daves-Johnson reviewed considerations of the Plan and design. She said the procedure and application process of the overlay district could follow one of two options – set a firm width of property within the overlay district or set the district according to parcel boundaries. Discussion followed on setting a general ordinance for the overlay and set Sub-Districts allowing for more specific criteria or decide “piece meal” the overlay districts on a corridor by corridor basis.

A brief discussion followed on extending the construction of the four lane road to Worsham [Road] instead of stopping at Kingsville.

Mrs. Daves-Johnson said the next thing to be considered was the plan approval process for projects within the overlay district.

Mrs. Daves-Johnson said another consideration is the permitted uses. At the corridor level, land-use planning can provide localized recommendations for individual parcels based on site-specific strengths and weaknesses. The land use element will help determine the quality and quantity of development that should occur based on existing and future infrastructure capacities. After a brief discussion, a consensus was reached that the developer would need to request rezoning for the parcel with applicable design standards.

Discussion followed on Conditional or Special Use Permits, conventional zoning measures, building materials, environmental concepts and Natural Area preservation followed. Mr. Wilck said too many regulations may discourage some developers. Dr. Porterfield said the use of environmental concepts should be encouraged, and the ordinance should include language that the County needs to look at how developers intend to treat the natural areas.

Mrs. Daves-Johnson said the following items should also be considered: access management; site and architectural design and building materials; landscaping; lighting; signage; and linkages to scenic byways, trails, and public transit.

Mr. Pickett said the Planning Commission will hold two public hearings in June; and requested input from the Board members. He said the Planning Commission can work on a draft during June and July.

Dr. Porterfield asked if maps could be made with the differing depths of proposed corridors from the town limits to Worsham Road; Mr. Pickett said yes. Dr. Porterfield said that could be put in place with specific design standards to follow. Mrs. Daves-Johnson added that establishing linkages could be a way to get grants for the project.

Dr. Porterfield said the Planning Commission would pick up the language of this meeting, write a draft defining the overlay district, and a public hearing may be necessary. He said it may take up to six months to complete. A suggestion was made to contact the landowners in the immediate area to request their input. Dr. Porterfield then adjourned the Planning Commission meeting.

Summary: The attachment contains the recommended budget appropriation resolution. The appropriations allocate all funds needed to provide the approved pay raise of 3% effective July 1, 2008.

In addition the resolution establishes certain management guidelines that authorize and empower Constitutional Officers and County officers to expend and manage cash assets entrusted to them. The resolution also establishes certain policies under which funds will be expended and managed.

The resolution institutionalizes certain ongoing management practices and authorizes new management practices. These new are meant increase efficiencies by streamlining certain administrative functions. But at the same time allowing the Board of Supervisors to maintain adequate control over the assets of the County.

The resolution specifically requires the Board to approve any future adjustments to appropriations, approves appropriations by cost centers or by Category for the Schools, grants certain authority to the Social Services and School Boards and delineates procedures for the acceptance and expenditure of grants.

The Resolution authorizes the County Administrator to approve transfers of monies within the same fund with the exception of Constitutional Officers which requires Board approval. The resolution authorizes the reappropriation of funds encumbered but not expended, but requires the appropriation of all unencumbered funds to lapse. The resolution requires appropriations designated for specific capital projects to only be expended on those capital projects.

The resolution authorizes the County Administrator to issue checks where funds have been appropriated and present to the Board at least monthly a listing of such payments occurrence. This provides payment to 3rd party claimants without regard to fault.

**ORDINANCE TO REGULATE AND PROTECT THE SANDY
RIVER RESERVOIR AND ADJACENT COUNTY-OWNED PROPERTIES
IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 15.1-13 OF THE
CODE OF VIRGINIA 1950, AS AMENDED**

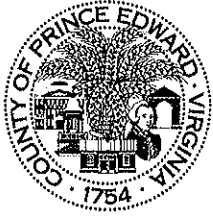
Sec. 82-31.

- (a) The following activities are hereby declared to be unlawful in that part of Lockett Magisterial District of Prince Edward County known as Sandy River Reservoir and on any County-owned property surrounding the reservoir:
- (1) Presence of persons, boats, or other personal property at anytime in areas marked "No Trespassing," without the express written permission of the county administrator.
 - (2) Parking on any County-owned property surrounding the reservoir other than in the Sandy River Reservoir Public Use Area located off Route 640, at the end of Route 792, or in any other area specifically designated by the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors as a Public Parking Area.
 - (3) Littering or dumping of any type, kind or description.
 - (4) Hunting or trapping of any type, kind or description without an express written permit issued by the County of Prince Edward.
 - (5) Conducting fishing tournaments in which prizes are awarded without an express written permit issued by the County of Prince Edward and Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.
 - (6) Diving, snorkeling or swimming of any type, kind or description.
 - (7) Operation in or on the reservoir of any unlicensed watercraft or any type of watercraft propelled by an engine in excess of ten (10) horsepower.
 - (8) Operation in or on the reservoir of a windsurfer, sailboard or any wind-propelled vessel, other than a sailboat, length of which shall not exceed sixteen (16) feet.
 - (9) Operation in or on the reservoir of any jet ski.
 - (10) Sale of any and all commodities or services anywhere in either the reservoir or the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir, as well as the posting of any kind of advertisement of any description, unless sanctioned by the County of Prince Edward.
 - (11) Discharging any firearm, including but not limited to any weapon which propels a projectile by pneumatic means, unless sanctioned by the County of Prince Edward.
 - (12) Possession of any type of alcoholic beverage while on the premises.
 - (13) Presence on the reservoir or the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir by any person under the age of twelve (12) years, unless such person is accompanied by an individual who is at least twenty-one (21) years of age.

- (14) Camping and lighting or maintaining any kind of fire, unless such activity has been sanctioned or is sponsored by the County.
- (15) Use of any of the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir by any person riding any type of motorized or non-motorized vehicle, bicycle or horse and use of any part of the reservoir or such County-owned property for ice skating or sledding, unless any such use has been expressly sanctioned by the County.
- (16) The use of any of the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir, other than those areas specifically designated by the County as such, for boat access to and from the reservoir including, but not limited to construction of piers, docks and access roads.

Individuals owning property adjacent to the county buffer who have a county-approved and permitted boat access ramp shall continue to be responsible for the soil erosion and sedimentation measures and for the safe maintenance and upkeep of the ramp. The permit is not transferable to any future owners of the property. Permittee must carry liability insurance and show annual proof thereof.

- (17) Cutting, removing or altering any trees, brush or other vegetation now growing or hereafter established in the reservoir or on the County-owned property surrounding the reservoir and removing, altering or otherwise disturbing the reservoir or any County-owned land surrounding the reservoir.
 - (18) Withdrawal of water for any purpose, with the exception that adjacent property owners with express written permission from Prince Edward County may withdraw reasonable amounts of water for irrigation and domestic purposes until such time as water therein is used for public water supply.
 - (19) Stocking of any fish or other aquatic species in the reservoir or animal on the County-owned property, without written permission of Prince Edward County and the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries.
 - (20) The siting of “sewerage systems” and “treatment works”, as defined by the State Board of Health Sewage Handling and Disposal Regulations, within five hundred (500) feet of the normal pool elevation of the reservoir.
 - (21) **Discharging a firearm, as defined in paragraph 11 of this section, on any county-owned land, on or within 300 feet of a public parking area.**
- (b) Any person who shall knowingly commit any of the acts declared unlawful in (a) above, shall, on conviction of a first offense of a violation of this section, be guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor as same as defined in Section 18.2-11 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended. (Ord. of 7-9-96; Ord. of 11-12-98, Ord. of 9-14-99, Ord. of 10-10-00).

Ordinances were tightened to keep neighborhoods looking nice and some inducements were used in this area as well.

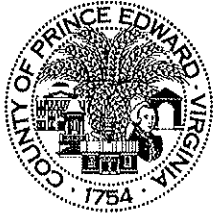

VIRGINIA'S TRANSPORTATION SOLUTION

Whereas, an efficient transportation network is crucial to sustainable economic growth in the Commonwealth, a cleaner environment and enhanced public safety and quality of life; and

Whereas, the Commonwealth faces a documented transportation funding shortfall including a recurring and inflating road maintenance funding shortfall resulting in the Commonwealth Transportation Board eliminating and reducing programmed project spending totaling \$1.1 billion in the new six-year transportation program; and

Whereas, the Virginia Department of Transportation is transferring almost \$400 million in Fiscal Year 2008 from road construction funds to support road maintenance activities; and

Whereas, the eliminated and stalled project monies include primary, urban, and secondary construction funding reductions to regions and localities of up to 44 percent for Fiscal Year 2009; and

Whereas, funding for new highway and bridge construction is diminished as the annual road maintenance shortfall continues to escalate and the estimate to repair the Commonwealth's 1,700 deficient bridges totals more than \$3 billion; and

Whereas, the lack of funding for new highway and bridge construction is adversely impacting the ability of Prince Edward County and the entire Commonwealth to successfully compete with other states for new economic development projects; and

Whereas, transferring state general funds to transportation neither adequately supports documented and recurring transportation infrastructure investment needs, nor serves to protect the Commonwealth's additional core services including public education, health care, mental health and retardation, and public safety; and

Whereas, Virginia has the nation's seventh lowest motor vehicle sales tax rate and the Commonwealth last enacted dedicated, new, significant and recurring annual statewide revenues for transportation in 1986, including the last increase in Virginia's modestly low gas tax rate of 17.5 cents per gallon; and

Whereas, since 2006 the Commonwealth has enacted significant reforms to improve the coordination between transportation and local land-use planning;

Now, therefore, be it resolved, that the County of Prince Edward hereby calls on the Governor of Virginia and the Virginia General Assembly during the forthcoming transportation special session to enact a significant transportation funding package to include dedicated, new, significant and recurring annual revenues to address the Commonwealth's documented transportation infrastructure needs;

And, be it further resolved, that the Governor of Virginia and the Virginia General Assembly are urged to enact dedicated, new, significant and recurring annual revenues to eliminate the road maintenance shortfall; increase funding directed to interstate and primary highways, urban and secondary roads, and transit projects; guard against the transfer of general funds to transportation; and address the unique transportation needs of specific regions of the Commonwealth including initially Hampton Roads and Northern Virginia.

SECTION 46-31 ENUMERATION OF LOUD AND DISTURBING NOISES

It shall be unlawful for any person to create, cause to be created or allow on property under the person's control or ownership any unreasonably loud or disturbing noise in the county. Noise of such character, intensity or duration as to be detrimental to the life or health of any person or as to unreasonably disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of any person, is hereby prohibited. For purposes of this article, a tenant shall be deemed to be in control of the property contained within his or her tenancy.

The following acts shall be deemed to be loud and disturbing noise in violation of this article, but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive:

HORN OR SIGNALING DEVICES: The sounding of any horn or signal device on any automobile, motorcycle, bus or other vehicle except as a reasonable warning; the creation by means of any such signal device of any unreasonable loud or harsh sound; and the sounding of such device for any unreasonable period of time.

TELEVISIONS, RADIOS, COMPACT DISC PLAYERS, OR MUSICAL INSTRUMENTS: The playing of any television, radio, record, tape or compact disc player, MP3 player, digital audio player or other electrical device or any musical instrument in such a manner or with such a volume,

- (a) to permit sound to be heard across a residential real property boundary or through partitions common to two dwellings within a building;
- (b) to be plainly audible at a distance of fifty (50) feet the building in which it is located;
- (c) the sound is plainly audible at a distance of fifty (50) feet from its source.

ANIMALS: The keeping of any animal or bird which by causing frequent or long continued noise shall disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of any person in the vicinity to such an extent as shall constitute a nuisance.

VEHICLES: The use of any automobile, motorcycle or vehicle so out of repair, so loaded or in such manner as to create loud, grating, grinding, rattling or other noises. Repairing, rebuilding, or modifying any motor vehicle or other mechanical device in the outdoors between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day. Operation of sound amplifying equipment in a motor vehicle at a volume sufficient to be plainly audible at a distance of fifty (50) feet from the vehicle.

EXHAUSTS: The discharge into the open air of the exhaust of any steam engine, stationary internal combustion engine, or motor vehicle engine except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud and explosive noises therefrom.

LOADING, UNLOADING AND OPENING BOXES: The creation of loud and excessive noise in connection with loading or unloading any vehicle or the opening and destruction of bales, boxes, crates and containers.

LOADING, UNLOADING TRUCKS: The loading or unloading of trucks in the outdoors within one hundred (100) yards of a residence between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day.

CONSTRUCTION: The erection, including excavation, demolition, alteration, or repairs of any building or improvement that creates noise that can be heard at adjoining property lines from sunset until 6:00 a.m. the following day except in the case of an emergency.

SECTION 46-32 PENALTY FOR VIOLATION

A violation of any provision of this chapter shall constitute a Class 3 misdemeanor. Each separate act on part of the person violating this article shall be deemed a separate offense, and each day a violation is permitted to continue unabated shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 46-33 COMPLAINT REQUIRED

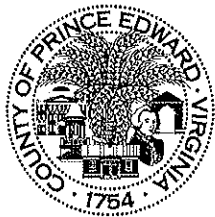
No summons or warrant charging a violation of this article shall be issued except upon the sworn complaint of two (2) persons, each a resident of a separate household, and each alleging facts within his or her own personal knowledge, or upon complaint by a law enforcement or animal control officer.

SECTION 46-34 EXEMPTIONS

Nothing in this chapter shall apply to law enforcement, ambulances, or other emergency vehicles and personnel, aircraft or any noise or sound created thereby or to any noise or sound created by any person to sound a warning or call attention to a bona fide emergency.

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to the following:

1. Music, bells or chimes that are part of a bona fide religious service, observation or other such religious event.
2. Bona Fide agricultural activity.
3. Sound generated from a school or county sponsored athletic or recreational event.
4. Locomotives and other railroad equipment.
5. Lawful discharge of firearms.
6. Military activities of the Commonwealth or of the United States of America.
7. Activities sanctioned by a college or university which take place within the confines of the main campus of such college or university.
8. Dances or concerts conducted for the benefit of any benevolent, charitable or educational organization.

Summary: After review of the current budget, I recommend the following:

1. Increase the revenue line for personal property tax by \$400,000. We have collected \$2,918,853 while the budget is \$2,520,000.
2. Of that amount, \$200,000 will be used to increase the CSA programs and \$200,000 will be transferred to the Landfill Construction Fund. In addition to the \$200,000 transfer from the General Fund; \$400,000 will be transferred from the Landfill Construction Fund Balance both to be used to increase the Landfill Construction expense line by \$600,000. The construction of the new cell proceeded much faster than anticipated. While the amount to be expended is the same, most will be expended this fiscal year vice next fiscal year.
3. Due to the retirement of another employee, the budget of the Retirement Benefits Fund needs to be increased by \$11,339. It is recommended this be transferred from the General Fund.

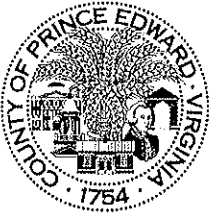

At the May Board meeting you said that a public hearing was required by law. In your June 2 email to me, you mention both sides of the question. Is it still your opinion that Prince Edward was required by law to have the public hearing prior to transferring land to the IDA?

On 5/22/2008, staff from the Virginia Department of Conservation and Recreation's (DCR) Richmond Regional Office conducted a Corrective Action Agreement (CAA) review of Prince Edward County's erosion and sediment control (ESC) program. The purpose of the review was to verify completion of all measures noted in the CAA dated 11/15/2007.

The staff review found that Prince Edward County does not appear to have acceptably completed all of the items listed in the CAA, and staff will make a recommendation to the Virginia Soil and Water Conservation Board that Prince Edward County's ESC program be found inconsistent with the requirements of the Erosion and Sediment Control Law and Regulations. Enclosed is a copy of the Corrective Action Agreement Review Report that summarizes the findings made by staff during the review.


The Piedmont Soil & Water Conservation District (PSWCD) owns and maintains the easements for 14 flood control structures in Prince Edward County, which were installed by the USDA- Soil Conservation Service to assist with flood control and sediment storage. The lakes were not funded for recreational purposes. Nine of these structures are located in the Buffalo Creek watershed and are 30-40 years of age. As part of the District's operation & maintenance agreements with Department of Conservation & Recreation, Dam Safety Division, and USDA - Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS), the water control gate is required to be opened and closed annually. Primarily due to budget restrictions, this maintenance has not been completed in the past. In light of the age of these structures (30-40 years) and the concern for public safety, the PSWCD is in the process of testing these gate mechanisms.

In February 2008 we opened the gate mechanism on Buffalo #3, Little Creek Lake, lowered the water level and inspected the gate. The gate and operating mechanism passed a NRCS engineer inspection with only minor maintenance needed. In May 2008, the PSWCD proceeded to open the Buffalo #2, Stockton Lake gate and encountered a problem with the operating mechanism, which did not allow us to close the gate, thus lowering the water level. In order for the NRCS engineer to fully inspect the gate and make recommendations for correction, the lake needed to be drained. Unfortunately with a spike in high temperatures on the weekend of May 31, fish in the lake expired. The Virginia Departments of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and Game and Inland Fisheries (DGIF) were called to assist in the evaluation of the situation.

Currently we are awaiting a formal NRCS engineering report and are in the process of procuring the repairs and parts needed to make the gate operable within standards of the operation and maintenance agreements. The PSWCD's number one concern is public safety and making sure these flood control structures are properly maintained. We are aware of the surrounding lake landowner's enjoyment and recreational benefits they receive from these resources. We regret any hardship or problems that may have resulted in the draining of Stockton Lake. We are very appreciative of Prince Edward County staff for their support and of the financial support Prince Edward County has given PSWCD in the maintenance of these structures.
