Chairman William G. Fore, Jr. called the meeting to order. Supervisor James C. Moore asked for a moment of silence and then Reverend Thomas Tillerson offered the invocation.

In Re: Special Presentation

Chairman Fore said, "Ladies and gentlemen, this evening the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors has the opportunity to pay its respects to the life and legacy of a man who helped bestow upon our County, our Commonwealth and our nation one of the greatest gifts to future generations – that of the opportunity for equal education.

"Oliver White Hill, Sr., who passed on August 5, 2007 at the age of 100, was the lead counsel for Davis v. County School Board of Prince Edward County, which was one of the state cases consolidated into the Supreme Court case of Brown vs. Board of Education.

"In 1999, President Clinton said of Mr. Hill upon presenting him the Presidential Medal of Freedom:

'Throughout his long and rich life, he has challenged the laws of our land and the conscience of our country. He has stood up for everything that is necessary to make America truly one, indivisible and equal.'

"The courage and personal sacrifice made by individuals such as Oliver Hill, Sr. have changed forever our nation's future. And tonight, we are honored to have as our guest, Dr. Oliver W. Hill, Jr., who can speak first hand of his father's life and legacy."

Chairman Fore then read the Resolution of Respect, adopted at the September 11, 2007 Board of Supervisors meeting, as follows:

Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, Virginia A Resolution of Respect

Oliver White Hill, Sr. May 1, 1907 – August 5, 2007

WHEREAS, Oliver White Hill, Sr. was a native Virginian, born in Richmond in 1907; and

WHEREAS, Oliver White Hill, Sr. earned his undergraduate and law degrees from Howard University and practiced law in Virginia starting in 1934; and

WHEREAS, Oliver White Hill, Sr. became active in the national civil rights movement, using his law degree to serve as legal counsel in many of the Nation's most important civil rights cases establishing equal opportunity in education, employment, housing, transportation and the justice system; and

WHEREAS, Oliver W. Hill, Sr. represented the students of Robert Russa Moton High School in *Davis v. School Board of Prince Edward County, Virginia*, which became one of five cases consolidated in the 1954 landmark *Brown v. Board of Education* decision; and

WHEREAS, Oliver W. Hill, Sr. was an icon of the civil rights movement and a central figure in the history of Prince Edward County, Virginia;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Supervisors of the County of Prince Edward, Virginia, does join other Virginians in honoring the life and legacy of Oliver White Hill, Sr. for his efforts to promote racial equality, and ensure equal opportunities and justice for all.

Dr. Oliver Hill, Jr., said, upon receiving the Resolution, "I would like to thank the Board of Supervisors and like to thank the residents of Prince Edward County and Farmville. This is very special, and one reason it's special is that I've gone to a lot of these kinds of programs and received awards on

behalf of my father, and oftentimes there's a climate of pessimism that the legacy of Brown has not been fulfilled and that things have come to turn back. But when I come to Farmville, and when I see this audience and I see this Board of Supervisors, this is really a monument to my father, greater than any monument up on the Capital grounds here. And you all have much to be proud of as an icon to the whole country of what can happen when people work together. I want to thank you for this and I want to thank you for making the dream of Brown come true, to have a truly inclusive society here in Prince Edward County. On behalf of my father, I want to thank you again."

Chairman Fore then called a brief recess.

Supervisor McKay left the meeting during the recess.

In Re: Public Participation

Chairman Fore called the meeting back to order, and said no one had signed up to speak and asked if anyone in the audience had any comment. Being no one wishing to speak, the public participation portion was closed.

In Re: Treasurer's Report

Mrs. Mable Shanaberger said that at last month's meeting, she had touched upon the reason for the delay in the completion of written Treasurer's Reports, and said "a new auditing standard known as Statement on Auditing Standards 112 (SAS 112) was issued in May 2006 for all audits of periods on or after December 15, 2006. This standard required some changes in our accounting in order for Prince Edward County to be in compliance. These steps needed to be made prior to FY '07.

"In addition to these changes, the accounting books needed to remain open for 60 days after June 30, 2007. These changes have been made and FY '07 was closed on Thursday, October 4th. We are now working on the Treasurer's Report for July. In your November Board packet, you will have the end of the year reports by Fund for FY '07 as well as other reports.

"I can assure you that there is money in the bank to cover the County's routine expenditures."

Supervisor Simpson announced he and Mrs. Shanaberger were working on the County decal [program] for FY '09. He said the fee will remain, but the decals will not be issued for display on vehicles in 2009.

In Re: Introduction of the New Building and Grounds Supervisor

County Administrator Wade Bartlett introduced the new Building and Grounds Supervisor, Mr. Ron Van Eps. In introducing him to the Board, County Administrator W.W. Bartlett stated that Mr. Van Eps previously worked with the United States Department of the Interior, where he served as Trails Maintenance Supervisor for the National Park Service. Mr. Van Eps will supervise the County's buildings and grounds department which manages the maintenance and housekeeping of all county-owned facilities and grounds.

In Re: Highway Matters

Assistant County Administrator Sarah E. Puckett said Alan Leatherwood, Resident Highway Engineer, was unable to attend but gave updates on the various projects in the county. She said Miller Lake Road still lacks one signature; Hidden Lake Road also lacks one signature. She reported the Slaydon Forest Drive project began that day, and the stop light installation on Dominion Drive, which will be

partially funded by revenue sharing, is anticipated to be completed prior to Lowe's opening in mid-December.

Supervisor Jones said a few landowners on Smith Drive inquired if the alleyways behind their properties were State property, and if there was a way for the land to revert back to the landowner. County Attorney Jim Ennis said the plats would need to be reviewed. A brief discussion followed.

Supervisor Moore asked Mrs. Puckett to pass along thanks to Mr. Leatherwood for the completion of the bridge on Route 634.

In Re: Unveiling of Prince Edward County Web Site

Chairman Fore introduced Mrs. Magi Van Eps who presented the new County web site; she highlighted several pages of the web site at www.co.prince-edward.va.us.

Mr. Bartlett said the web site will be maintained in-house, and updates will occur in a timely manner. Chairman Fore thanked Supervisors Sally Gilfillan, James Moore and Pattie Cooper-Jones for their leadership on the IT Committee.

In Re: Request for Voluntary Boundary Adjustments

Chairman Fore stated two adjustments were presented: one from Woodland, Inc. (Holly Manor) for an adjustment on approximately one-acre of their property located within the County, and one from Blalock Real Estate Services for an adjustment of 67.2 acres located off Scott Drive.

Mr. Jonathan Pickett, Director of Planning and Community Development, said the Woodland group requested the full 13.2 acres instead of the original acre, as it would be easier for future options to have the entire property in the Town limits. He said developers from Chesterfield County are interested in the Birdsong property, consisting of 67.2 acres adjacent to Scott Drive. The developers are interested in building a single-family development, with half the home sites to be offered at market rate and half for elderly residents.

Supervisor Jones asked if a public hearing must be held by both the Town and the County. The Town would have to extend water and sewer if adjustments are made. Discussion of location, lot sizes, access roads, zoning, and water and sewer rates followed.

Mr. Ennis stated neither of the transmittal letters he reviewed indicated that the Town consented to

the request for the Boundary Line Adjustment, and they are required to indicate acceptance. He said

additionally, an agreement must be prepared from the Town of Farmville, as the Notice of Intent states that

the Boundary Adjustment Agreement is available for inspection by the public, which is part of the public

notice to holding a public hearing. A discussion on the process needed followed.

Chairman Fore asked for the proper procedure that must take place. Mr. Ennis said the first order

of business would be to get the consent of the Town in regards to either or both properties being taken into

the Town limits. Secondly, a preparation of the actual boundary adjustment agreement is necessary, which

must be on file pursuant to the terms of the public notice. Then the public hearing would be held. Once the

public hearing has occurred, the Board can then vote on the Boundary Adjustment Agreement, and after

that, a petition must be filed in the Circuit Court of Prince Edward County, and the Court has to approve

the Boundary Adjustment.

PROCEDURE FOR DISPOSITION OF SURPLUS REAL PROPERTY

Whenever the Board of Supervisors of Prince Edward County, Virginia deem it in the best interest of the citizens of said County to dispose of any surplus real property owned by said County, the following procedure shall be followed:

- 1. A public hearing shall be conducted prior to the disposition of said real property. In no event shall the public hearing be conducted no more than ninety days prior to the sale of the property. Notice of the public hearing shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation in said County not less than once a week for two successive weeks. Notice may also be posted on the County web page and posted on the notice board in the Prince Edward County Courthouse. The public hearing shall not be scheduled within seven days of the last date of publication.
- 2. After the required public hearing and upon the affirmative vote of a majority of the members of the Board of Supervisors, the property shall be declared surplus and shall be advertised for sale not less than once a week for four successive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation in the County and in either the *Richmond Times-Dispatch* or *Lynchburg News and Advance* once a week for two successive weeks. Sale shall be by public auction and shall not be conducted within seven days of the date of the last advertisement.
- 3. County shall obtain an appraisal of the value of said surplus property and shall accept no bid which is less than the appraised value. The appraisal shall be no older than one year.
- 4. Property transfers from the County to the Industrial Development Authority or other governmental entities or authorities and transfers by leasehold agreements are expressly exempt from this procedure.
- 5. Recognizing that there may be market conditions or other circumstances which are time sensitive that could adversely affect the value of any such property, the Board of Supervisors may deviate from all or any of this procedure upon the unanimous vote of the Board members in attendance.
- 6. To the extent that the terms of this procedure may conflict with the Code of Virginia, the Code of Virginia shall be controlling.

In Re: County Administrator's Report



At the October 25th, 2007 Virginia Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Commission meeting, the Commission members voted to deny Prince Edward County's Special Projects Grant application for \$396,000. Then November 1, 2007, a third Tobacco Allocation award was made to Prince Edward County in the amount of \$151,760, which includes \$42,000 that the County had earlier de-obligated in October, 2007 when a previous grant award had closed out. The \$151,760 is now eligible for Economic Development Grants due February 1, 2008. These funds would be used to do site improvements such as stump grubbing, removal of top soil, grading for pad sites, installation of water and sewer lines, installation of communication lines and to help pay for engineering costs associated with the development of three "Ready to go" industrial sites at the Prince Edward County Business Park. The preparation of these industrial sites is critical to the future industrial economic development growth of Prince Edward County. Without "Ready to go" sites Prince Edward County is at a decided disadvantage when trying to recruit new businesses or industries to the County.



Dear Mr. Bartlett:

The Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission was created during the 2006 Session of the General Assembly for the purpose of planning for and commemorating the 150th anniversary of Virginia's participation in the American Civil War, the duration of which will be 2011 through 2015.

Virginia leads the nation by being the first state to create a Sesquicentennial Commission and formally begin planning for the commemoration. As you know, the 150th anniversary of the Civil War holds tremendous educational, economic, and tourism opportunities for the Commonwealth. Not only was Virginia the central focus of the Civil War in the 1860's, but it is still at the center, in terms of what visitors can see and experience today:

- Virginia has, far and away, more Civil War sites than any other state, including over 400 that
 are linked by the Civil War Trails program. In addition to touring the battlefields, travelers
 can visit world-class museums, historic homes, cemeteries, Civil War libraries and research
 centers, and much more.
- 'Heritage tourism' is one of Virginia's biggest resources. Civil War scholars and enthusiasts flock to the Commonwealth from all over the United States. In fact, data from the Virginia Tourism Corporation shows that the Civil War traveler tends to stay longer and spend more money than the average visitor to Virginia.
- The story of Virginia's participation in the war is statewide - there is not a county, city, or town in the Commonwealth that was unaffected by the Civil War. There are hundreds of Civil War-related sites throughout the state that serve to better educate Virginians, and those who travel to Virginia, as to the pivotal role the Commonwealth held in the war. The strength of that geographic dispersal means that visitors do not have to travel to a specific place to experience the history no matter where they are in the state, there is nearby Civil War history to take in.

It would be helpful to the Commission's work if your locality would form a local sesquicentennial committee to begin planning for the four-year statewide commemoration period. Further, please consider designating a liaison to work with the Commission, who would communicate regularly on plans in development and events occurring within the locality. While the Commission is planning statewide

programs to commemorate the sesquicentennial, including traveling exhibitions, strong involvement at the local level is crucial. The Commission is working with statewide partners, including the Civil War Trails program, to promote local participation. Local history, after all, is the foundation on which all else is built.

To every extent possible, the local sesquicentennial committee should include representatives of:

- Office of the chief administrative official
- Governing body (i.e., City Council or Board of Supervisors)
- Tourism industry organizations
- Chamber of Commerce or economic development office
- Education community (e.g., Superintendent, teachers, PTA representatives, etc.)
- Local battlefields and National Park Service personnel
- Civil War museums and facilities
- Public and private nonprofit organizations and agencies engaged in commemorating historical events

Once the local committee designee is named, please forward the enclosed form to Cheryl Jackson, Commission Staff Coordinator. Staff will remain in close contact with the local liaison, providing technical assistance to the committee as needed. Please feel free to contact Ms. Jackson if you have any questions, at (804) 786-3591 or by email: cjackson@leg.state.va.us.

One final note as you begin planning. It is important to realize that this is a *commemoration*, not a celebration. There is no joy to be found in a war that caused the deaths of over 620,000 Americans, divided families, and tore apart a nation. Commemorative events and activities should be solemn remembrances that are meaningful to, and inclusive of, all Virginians. The Commission is firm in its resolve to portray a balanced story of Virginia's participation in the American Civil War that includes the African-American, Union, and Confederate perspectives.

On behalf of the Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission, I look forward to working with you and other localities throughout the Commonwealth as we begin planning for the 150th anniversary of the American Civil War. The beginning of the commemoration period is fast approaching and promises to provide an opportunity to better understand our past so that we can come together to embrace our future.

VIRGINIA ACTS OF ASSEMBLY -- 2006 SESSION

CHAPTER 465

An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Title 30 a chapter numbered 40, consisting of sections numbered 30-266 through 30-274, relating to the Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission and Fund; report.

Whereas, the Commonwealth of Virginia witnessed more American Civil War military engagements on its soil than any other state, hosts more historic sites related to the American Civil War than any other state, and is home to the Pamplin Historical Park and the National Museum of the Civil War Soldier, Tredegar National Civil War Center, and the Virginia Center for Civil War Studies at Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University, all of which are nationally recognized centers of expertise in the study of the American Civil War; now, therefore,

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Title 30 a chapter numbered 40, consisting of sections numbered 30-266 through 30-274, as follows:

CHAPTER 40.

VIRGINIA SESQUICENTENNIAL OF THE AMERICAN CIVIL WAR COMMISSION AND FUND. § 30-266. Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission established; purpose.

The Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission (the Commission) is established in the legislative branch of state government. The purpose of the Commission is to prepare for and commemorate the sesquicentennial of Virginia's participation in the American Civil War.

§ 30-267. Membership; terms.

The Commission shall have a total membership of 13 members that shall consist of 10 legislative members, two nonlegislative citizen members, and one ex officio member. Members shall be appointed as follows: six members of the House of Delegates, including the Speaker of the House of Delegates, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates in accordance with the principles of proportional representation contained in the Rules of the House of Delegates; four members of the Senate, including the President pro tempore of the Senate, to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules; and two nonlegislative citizen members at large, one to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of Delegates and one to be appointed by the Senate Committee on Rules. The President and Chief Executive Officer of the Virginia Historical Society or his designee shall serve ex officio with nonvoting privileges. Nonlegislative citizen members of the Commission shall be citizens of the Commonwealth. Unless otherwise approved in writing by the chairman of the Commission and the respective Clerk, nonlegislative citizen members shall only be reimbursed for travel originating and ending within the Commonwealth for the purpose of attending meetings.

Legislative members and the ex officio member of the Commission shall serve terms coincident with their terms of office. Nonlegislative citizen members shall serve a term of four years. Appointments to fill vacancies, other than by expiration of a term, shall be for the unexpired terms. Vacancies shall be

filled in the same manner as the original appointments. All members may be reappointed.

The Commission shall elect a chairman and vice-chairman from among its membership, who shall be members of the General Assembly. The Commission may name five of its members to constitute an executive committee, of whom one shall be the President and Chief Executive Officer of the Virginia Historical Society, which shall act for the Commission pursuant to its direction.

§ 30-268. Advisory council.

The Commission may appoint and establish an advisory council composed of nonlegislative citizens at large who have knowledge of American Civil War history and interest in its sesquicentennial celebration, to assist the Commission in its work. The Librarian of Virginia shall be a member of the advisory council.

§ 30-269. Quorum; meetings; voting on recommendations.

A majority of the members shall constitute a quorum. The meetings of the Commission shall be held

at the call of the chairman or whenever a majority of the members so request.

No recommendation of the Commission shall be adopted if a majority of the House members or a majority of the Senate members appointed to the Commission (i) vote against the recommendation and (ii) vote for the recommendation to fail notwithstanding the majority vote of the Commission.

§ 30-270. Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission Fund established.

There is hereby created in the state treasury a special nonreverting fund to be known as the Virginia Sesquicentennial of the American Civil War Commission Fund, hereafter referred to as the "Fund." The Fund shall be established on the books of the Comptroller and shall consist of gifts, grants, donations,

Summary:

Attached you will find a proposed amendment to the County's code. The proposed code Section clearly states the County Administrator works at the pleasure of the Board. It also lists various powers and duties of the County Administrator and the process to remove the County Administrator. Most of these powers and duties are contained in the state code or are part of other County policies both written and unwritten. By including this in the County Code it institutionalizes, at a very general level the position of the County Administrator and the expectations of the position.

Also attached is the beginning of a County Financial Policy or Manual. Eventually this Policy/Manual will be all inclusive to include Budget Development, amendments and execution, debt management, investment policies, capital improvements, reserve requirements and any other items the Board desires. At this time I am submitting for consideration by the Board the overall statement of the objectives of the County's financial policy and the sections dealing with the development, adoption, amendments and execution of the budget.

No action is requested on either of these items at this time. They are provided for your review and input. It is my intention to begin the approval process for each at the regularly scheduled Board meeting in December.

Prince Edward County Proposed County Code

Sec Appointment of County Administrator
The Board shall appoint a County Administrator who shall be the Chief Executive Officer and the administrative head of the County government responsible for the proper administration of the government as reflected by the legislative and policy directions of the Board and by General law. The County Administrator shall be chosen solely on the basis of his/her executive and administrative qualifications. He shall serve at the pleasure of the Board and shall enforce the laws of the County and where applicable, the Commonwealth and shall insure the faithful performance of all administrative duties required by the Board. The Board may enter into an agreement with the County Administrator defining terms of employment.
Sec Removal of the County Administrator
The Board of Supervisors may remove the County Administrator at any time by a majority vote of all its members. All members must be present during such vote.
Sec Compensation
The County Administrator shall receive such compensation as the Board of Supervisors shall fix from time to time by ordinance or resolution.
Sec Powers and Duties
GENERAL:
The County Administrator shall have all the responsibility and shall carry out all the duties prescribed by 15.2-1541 and 15.2-1541.1 of the Code of Virginia, as now and

The County Administrator shall devote his full time to the work and service of the County under the direction of the Board of Supervisors to whom he shall be accountable. He need not be a resident of the county at the time of his appointment but must become an actual resident of the County within a time prescribed by the Board.

hereafter may be amended and in addition such other duties and responsibilities as may

be established by the Board of Supervisors.

In the case of the absence or disability of the County Administrator, the Board shall designate the Assistant County Administrator to perform the duties of the office.

ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES:

The County Administrator shall be the Chief Administrative Officer of the county and shall, insofar as the Board requires, be responsible to the Board for the proper administration of all affairs of the County which the Board has authority to control. To that end, the County Administrator shall have the following powers and duties:

- 1. To execute and enforce all lawful ordinances, resolutions and orders of the Board and all laws of the Commonwealth required to be enforced through the Board of Supervisors or officers subject to the control of the Board of Supervisors.
- 2. To make reports to the Board in regard to matters of administration.
- 3. To appoint qualified officers and employees to head the administrative departments of the County and to dismiss, suspend and discipline, in accordance with duly adopted personnel regulations, all officers and employees in such departments, except as otherwise specifically provided by law or this Code. Department heads who are appointed by the County Administrator shall serve at the pleasure of the County Administrator.
- 4. To appoint all officers and employees of the County, except as he may authorize the head of an office, department and board responsible to him to appoint subordinates in such office, department or board.
- 5. To assign any employee of the County to any department be it permanent or temporary to ensure the most efficient use of personnel.
- 6. Prescribe such rules and regulations as he deems necessary or expedient for the conduct of administrative departments or agencies subject to his authority, and he shall have the power to revoke, suspend or amend any rule or regulation of any such department or agency, promulgated by any officer or employee subject to his control, so long as such rules or regulations are not promulgated by the Board of Supervisors.
- 7. To investigate and examine or inquire into the affairs or operation of any department, division, office or agency of the county.
- 8. Delegate any powers and duties conferred upon him by this Code to any other officer or employee who is subject to his supervision.

FINANCIAL DUTIES:

1. Advise the Board of the financial condition of the County. Submit to the Board as the Board may direct reports concerning the various financial aspects of the County.

- 2. Prepare and submit to the Board of Supervisors a proposed annual budget for the County for informative and fiscal planning purposes only.
- 3. Execute the budget as adopted by the Board of Supervisors.
- 4. Maintain a centralized system of accounting for the County. Maintain a record of all revenues and expenditures of the County in such system.
- 5. Submit to the Board and make available to the public a complete report on the finances of the County at the end of each fiscal year.

In addition to the foregoing enumerated powers and duties, the County Administrator shall have all other duties and responsibilities imposed upon or granted to him by other provisions of this Code or conferred upon him by the Board of Supervisors.

Sec Power to be construed as administrative in na	ture

It is the intent of the Board of Supervisors to grant to the County Administrator only those powers and duties which are administrative or ministerial in nature and not delegate any governmental authority imbued in the Board of Supervisors as the governing body of Prince Edward County, Virginia pursuant to Title 15.2 of the Code of Virginia. To that end, the above specifically enumerated powers are to be construed as administrative in nature.

FINANCE POLICY

I. Financial Policy Guidelines - Objectives

This fiscal policy is a statement of the guidelines and goals that will influence and guide the financial management practices of the County of Prince Edward. A fiscal policy that is adopted, adhered to and regularly reviewed is recognized as the cornerstone of sound financial management. Effective fiscal policy:

- Contributes to the County's ability to insulate itself from fiscal crisis
- Empowers short and long term financial credit ability by helping to achieve the highest credit and bond ratings possible
- Promote long-term financial stability by establishing clear and consistent guidelines
- Directs attention to the total financial picture of the County rather than single issue areas
- Promotes the linking of long-run financial planning with day to day operations
- Ensures the most efficient use of resources in providing services to our citizens
- Establishes adequate internal controls that minimize the risk of the misuse and misappropriation of funds and noncompliance with applicable laws, regulations, contracts, and grants, and
- Provides the Board of Supervisors and the citizens a framework for measuring the fiscal impact of government services against established fiscal parameters and guidelines.

Chapter 1 - Budget Development Policy

The County Administrator will serve as the Finance Director. As the Finance Director, he will be responsible for the preparation of the annual budget to include a five-year Capital Improvement Plan (CIP), execution of the final budget as approved by the Board of Supervisors, recommend changes to the budget and maintain a central accounting system.

To these ends the following financial policies are adopted:

- 1.0 On or before the regular scheduled Board meeting of April of each year, the County Administrator shall submit to the Board a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and an accompanying message.
- 1.01 Budget Message

The County Administrator's budget message shall explain the budget both in fiscal terms and in terms of projects to be accomplished. It shall describe the important features of the budget, indicate any significant changes from the prior year in financial policies, expenditures and revenues together with the reasons for such changes, summarize the County's debt position and include such other material as the County Administrator deems desirable

1.02 Budget Preparation

- A. The County Administrator will establish a budget schedule which will include important dates throughout the budget preparation process.
- B. All departments, excluding the School Board will submit their requested budget to the County Administrator by a date and a form he shall establish.
- C. Volunteer and Other Organizations
 - 1. All such organizations shall submit their requests for contributions to the County Administrator.
 - 2. The Social Services Board shall approve the departmental budget of their respective organizations prior to submission to the County Administrator.
- D. The School Board is requested to submit a proposed budget by not later than March 1 and a budget approved by the School Board shall be submitted by April 1.

1.03 Operating Budget

- A. The annual operating budget is the central financial planning document that embodies all operating revenue and expenditure decisions. It establishes the level of services to be provided by each department to the citizens of the county.
- B. The County Administrator shall incorporate the Board's priorities in the formulation of the preliminary budget proposal.
- C. The County Administrator shall attempt to balance recurring operating expenses to recurring operating revenues.
- D. The Board shall adopt a balanced budget annually.

1.04 Revenue Policies

The County Administrator will estimate annual revenues using a conservative, objective and analytical process.

The County will consider market rates and charges levied by other public and private organizations for similar services in establishing tax rates, fees and charges.

The County will review the cost of activities supported by user fees to determine the impact of inflation and other cost increases.

The County will identify and pursue grants that are consistent with the County's goals and strategic plan.

The County will follow an aggressive policy of collecting revenues.

1.05 Budget Adoption

A consolidated public hearing on the County budget, School budget, CIP, and tax rates, if applicable, shall be held no later than the regularly scheduled Board meeting of April to obtain citizen comments.

The consolidated public hearing notice shall appear at least seven days prior to the public hearing date.

The School budget shall approved by the Board of Supervisors no later than May 1, or within 30 days of the receipt of the estimates of state funds available to the school division from the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

Not less than one week following the public hearing, but prior to July 1, the Board shall adopt a balanced budget and five year Capital Improvements program.

The budget is legally enacted through passage of an appropriations resolution for all governmental and proprietary fund types that place restrictions on expenditures at the fund level for the County Administrator and category level for the School Board.

Although legal restrictions on expenditures are established at the fund level, effective administrative control over expenditures is maintained by the County Administrator through the establishment of more detailed line item budgets segregated by department.

1.06 Budget Amendments

The County Administrator is authorized to transfer monies within the funds established by the Board of Supervisors.

All transfers or amendments requiring Board of Supervisors approval that have been initiated from Social Services must have the approval of that board as applicable prior to presentation to the Board of Supervisors.

Approval of the Board of Supervisors must be obtained prior to the submission of any grant applications requiring the expenditure of county funds.

All revenue received by an agency under the control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or Social Services Board not included in the approved budget may not be expended by said agency without the consent of the Board of Supervisors being first obtained and those sums appropriated in the budget. Any grant approved by the Board for application shall not be expended until the grant is approved by the funding agency for drawdown and accepted into the budget by the Board of Supervisors.

1.07 Budget Execution

The County Administrator is responsible for the execution of the budget as approved by the Board of Supervisors.

If during the Fiscal Year it appears to the County Administrator that the funds available will be insufficient to meet the amounts appropriated, he shall report to the Board of Supervisors without delay, indicating the estimated amount of the deficit, any remedial action taken by him and his recommendations as to other actions to be taken. The Board of Supervisors shall then take such action as it deems necessary to prevent or minimize any deficit.

The County Administrator will report to the Board of Supervisors on a schedule established by the Board of Supervisors the financial condition of the county.

The County Administrator shall have the power to approve all warrants insofar as the warrants do not exceed the amounts appropriated by Fund by the Board of Supervisors. The warrant shall be converted to a negotiable check signed by both the County Administrator and Treasurer. The Treasurer will insure sufficient funds are available prior to affixing his signature to such check. The County Administrator will report to the Board of Supervisors at its monthly meeting the expenditures of monies by Fund for the previous month.

I am pleased to inform you that on October 15, 2007, Acting U.S. Secretary of Agriculture Charles F. Conner approved the Governor's request that your locality be designated a primary natural disaster area due to losses caused by drought that occurred during the 2007 crop year. A copy of the Secretarial Natural Disaster Determination is enclosed.

Acting Secretary Conner has advised Governor Kaine that the secretarial designation makes farm operators in both the primary and contiguous counties and independent cities eligible to be considered for low-interest emergency loans from the Farm Service Agency (FSA) of the United States Department of Agriculture, provided eligibility requirements are met. Thank you for your letters of August 22, 2007, August 29, 2007, September 12, 2007, and September 14, 2007, to former Secretary of Agriculture Mike Johanns; and your letter of September 27, 2007, requesting a Statewide disaster designation for all remaining undesignated Virginia counties and independent cities due to losses caused by drought and high temperatures that occurred during the 2007 crop year.

The Department of Agriculture (USDA) has reviewed the Damage and Loss Assessment Reports, along with the additional information submitted by the State Executive Director, Farm Service Agency (FSA). Based on this review, USDA has determined that there were sufficient production losses to warrant a Secretarial disaster designation. Therefore, I am designating 78 Virginia counties and 34 Virginia independent cities as primary natural disaster areas due to drought and high temperatures that occurred during the period January 1, 2007, and continuing. Those counties and independent cities are:

We were unable to confirm that sufficient production losses occurred in Arlington and York Counties and the independent city of Poquoson. None of those areas sustained qualifying crop losses due to the natural disaster. Therefore, I am unable to approve your request for the designation of Arlington and York Counties and the independent city of Poquoson as primary natural disaster areas.

However, Arlington and York Counties and the independent city of Poquoson will be eligible for FSA emergency assistance, since they are named along with 13 other counties and 2 other independent cities, as contiguous disaster areas, in accordance with section 321(a) of the Consolidated Farm and Rural Development Act. All other counties and independent cities in Virginia have already been designated or named by the Secretary of Agriculture, for this same disaster.

This designation makes farm operators in both primary and contiguous counties eligible to be considered for low-interest emergency loans from FSA, provided eligibility requirements are met. FSA will consider each application on its own merit by taking into account the extent of losses, security available, and repayment ability.

GOVERNOR KAINE ENCOURAGES VOLUNTARY WATER ONSERVATION AND CALLS ON LOCALITIES TO UPDATE DROUGHT CONTINGENCY PLANS

~Warns that drought conditions could become acute in the spring of 2008 if lack of rain continues ~

RICHMOND – Governor Timothy M. Kaine today urged localities to update water conservation and drought contingency ordinances and plans and begin preparations to implement those plans. The Governor also encouraged citizens and businesses to strictly follow all calls for water conservation issued by public waterworks or local governments.

In areas where local water conservation requirements have not been initiated, citizens and businesses should voluntarily conserve water to the greatest extent possible. This includes minimizing non-essential outdoor water uses such as irrigation and vehicle washing as well as reductions in indoor water uses.

"Assure that there are no water leaks in your home; limit showers to periods of less than 5 minutes; turn off the water when you brush your teeth; and only operate dishwashers and clothes washers with full loads," Governor Kaine said. "These nple actions when performed by millions of citizens throughout the Commonwealth can result in a significant reduction in the stresses placed on our water resources."

The entire Commonwealth is currently experiencing significant drought, which intensified in the six weeks preceding last week's welcomed wide-spread rainfall. While last week's rain addressed many short term drought impacts, the underlying long term precipitation deficit remains.

Fortunately, the Commonwealth is approaching the time of year when water demands will diminish greatly. With the end of the active growing season, the water needs of actively growing plants will be virtually eliminated and human demands for most non-essential outdoor water uses will cease. If, however, weather predictions of a dry winter materialize, Virginia is poised to experience significant drought with the onset of the growing season in the spring of 2008. The long range weather outlook calls for the potential for above normal temperatures and below normal rainfall through January 2008. While it is unlikely that serious water shortages will occur prior to the spring of 2008, it is essential to prepare for the potential for serious water supply impacts in the coming months.

All local governments should review existing local ordinances requiring mandatory non-essential water use restrictions at this time. Any locality that has not opted such ordinances should consider doing so now. All local ordinances should be consistent with the mandatory non-essential water use restrictions contained in the Virginia Drought Assessment and Response Plan. It is likely that these ordinances will be required in the spring of 2008.

"The best drought responses are those that take into account the individual nature of water supplies and the users of those resources, and these must be developed at the local water system level," said Governor Kaine. "We must use the window of opportunity that we have between now and the spring of 2008 to develop the best local response plans that we can. I applaud the efforts of the 55 water suppliers in the Commonwealth who have implemented existing water conservation plans to address the impact of the current drought on their systems."

The Governor is also directing all executive branch agencies and institutions to review existing drought water conservation and contingency plans or develop new plans and eliminate all non-essential water uses at this time. The elimination of non-essential water uses must be consistent with the requirements contained in the irginia Drought Assessment and Response Plan.

Today's actions are in addition to those the Governor has already taken to ress specific drought impacts on farmers and forest lands. As the result of Governor Kaine's request that the US Secretary of Agriculture declare the entire Commonwealth an agricultural drought disaster area, all Virginia localities are now eligible for federal disaster assistance to address agricultural drought impacts. On October 18, the Governor issued an executive order declaring a state of emergency in the Commonwealth that includes a ban on all outdoor burning. The most immediate danger related to the drought is the potential for a significant fall wildfire season.

"I ask that all citizens be vigilant in controlling potential sources of wildfires," said Governor Kaine. "This includes being mindful of parking vehicles in proximity to fuel sources such as dried grass as well as avoiding all outdoor burning. While the recent widespread rainfall has provided some temporary reduction in wildfire potential, this relief will rapidly dissipate without additional periodic rainfall. The current ban on all outdoor burning will remain in place until further notice."
