ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

Sec. 10-1. Adoption of state comprehensive animal laws.

The provisions of Code of Virginia of 1950, § 3.1-796.66 et seq., are adopted and made a part of this chapter as fully as though set forth in this section.

Sec. 10-2. Definitions.

For the purpose of this chapter the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings unless otherwise defined within this chapter. Words and phrases not defined herein, which are defined in section 3.1-796.66 of the Code of Virginia shall have the meanings ascribed to them by that section:

ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER means a person appointed as the animal control officer or a deputy animal control officer pursuant to Virginia law to enforce the Virginia Comprehensive Animal Laws, this Chapter, and all laws for the protection of domestic animals.

COMPANION ANIMAL means any domestic dog, domestic cat, non-human primate, guinea pig, hamster, rabbit not raised for human food or fiber, or other animal not prohibited, kept for pleasure rather than utility

LIVESTOCK includes all domestic or domesticated: bovine animals; equine animals; ovine animals; porcine animals; cervidae animals; capradae animals; animals of the genus Lama; ratites; fish or shellfish in aquaculture facilities as defined by state law; enclosed domesticated rabbits or hares raised for human food or fiber; or any other individual animal specifically raised for food or fiber, except companion animals.

WILD OR EXOTIC ANIMAL means any raccoon, skunk, wolf, squirrel, fox, leopard, panther, tiger, lion, lynx or any other warm-blooded animal, poisonous snake or tarantula which can normally be found in the wild state or any other member of crocodilian, including but not limited to alligators, crocodiles, caimans and gavials. Ferrets, nonpoisonous snakes, rabbits and laboratory rats which have been bred in captivity and which never have known the wild shall be excluded from this definition.

DIVISION 1. CONTAINMENT OF LIVESTOCK

Sec. 10-10. Purposes; legislative authority.

- (a) The purpose of this division is to provide for the containment of livestock in the county and to prescribe the penalties for its violation.
- (b) This division is adopted under the provisions of Code of Virginia, § 55-310, et. seq.

Sec. 10-11. Lawful fence.

- (a) The boundary line of each lot or tract of land or any stream in the county shall be a lawful fence as to any livestock domesticated by man.
- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person who is the owner or manager of any livestock domesticated by man to permit any such livestock, as to which the boundaries of lots or tracts of land have been constituted a legal fence, to run at large beyond the limits of his own lands within the county; and such animal shall be deemed to be running at large while roaming or running off the property, whether owned or rented, of its owner or manager, and not under their owner's or manager's immediate control.

(c) Any such owner or manager, after having been notified by an officer of the law that such animal is running at large, permits such animal to continue to run at large, shall be deemed to have violated this section and shall be guilty of a Class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-03.1, 18.2-03.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

DIVISION 2. MISCELLANEOUS ANIMAL REGULATIONS

Sec. 10-20. Disposal of companion animals.

- (a) The owner of any companion animal which has died from disease or other cause shall forthwith cremate or bury or sanitarily dispose of the companion animal.
- (b) If after notice any owner fails to comply with this section, the animal control officer or other officer cremate or bury or sanitarily dispose of the companion animal; and may recover on behalf of the county from the owner the cost of this service.

Sec. 10-21. Killing of coyotes permitted; bounty established; procedures for claims.

- (a) The killing coyotes within the boundaries of the county is hereby authorized for bounties upon the following conditions: A bounty of \$50.00 shall be paid by the county, from available funds, for each coyote killed within the boundaries of the county.
- (b) All payments shall be contingent upon the furnishing of such identifying information as requested by the county's designated agent (county animal control). The board of supervisors shall be the approving authority for payment of all claims presented.
- (c) Available funds not to exceed \$2,500.00. The total amount of bounties to be paid under this division shall not exceed the sum of \$2,500.00 per calendar year, except by additional appropriation by the board.
- (d) Unlawful acts; penalties. It shall be unlawful for any person to present a false claim or to receive any money on a false claim under this division, which act shall constituted a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-03.1, 18.2-03.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

ARTICLE II. ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS

Sec. 10-30. Position created.

The animal control officer shall discharge the duties provided for in Code of Virginia § 3.1-796.66, et seq., and such other duties as are provided in this chapter. The animal control officer shall be paid from the dog operating fund such compensation as the board of supervisors by resolution may determine, such compensation to be paid monthly.

Sec. 10-31. Dog operating fund.

The dog operating fund shall consist of the funds received from dog license taxes and fines imposed for the violation of the provisions of this chapter.

Fees for services provided by the animal control officer, or for reclaiming animals, not otherwise specified within this Chapter shall be set by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.

ARTICLE III. DOGS

DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Sec. 10-40. Disposal of dead dogs.

The owner of any dog which has died from disease or other cause shall forthwith cremate or bury and dispose of the dog. If after notice any owner fails to do so, the animal control officer or other officer shall bury or cremate the dog; and he may recover on behalf of the county from the owner the cost of his service.

Sec. 10-41. Unlawful acts.

The following shall be deemed unlawful acts the violation of which shall be a Class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-03.1, 18.2-03.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section:

- (1) Diseased dogs. For the owner of any dog with a contagious or infectious disease to permit such dog to stray from his premises if such disease is known to the owner.
- (2) Female dog in season. For the owner of any female dog to permit such dog to stray from his premises while such dog is known to such owner to be in season.
- (3) Removing collar and tag. For any person except the owner or custodian to remove a legally acquired license tag from a dog without the permission of the owner or custodian.
- (4) Concealing a dog. For any person to conceal or harbor any dog for which the license tax has not been paid or to conceal a vicious or dangerous to prevent the same from being destroyed.

DIVISION 2. LICENSE TAX

Sec. 10-50. Unlicensed dogs prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to own a dog four months or older unless such dog is licensed as required by the provisions of the Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.85, and this division.

Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor and, upon their first offense of this section and shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of

Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-03.1, 18.2-03.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

Sec. 10-51. How to obtain license.

Dogs shall be licensed as provided by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.86, by reference, which section is adopted and made a part of this chapter by reference as fully as though set forth at length in this section.

Sec. 10-52. Amount of license tax.

(a) Pursuant to the authority of Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.87, any person licensing a dog in the county shall pay an annual license tax on the ownership of the dog according to the following schedule:

Male dog. . . \$10.00
Unsexed (castrated) male dog . . . \$5.00
Female dog . . . \$10.00
Unsexed (spayed) female dog . . . \$5.00

(b) No license tax shall be levied on a guide dog for a blind person, service dog or dogs under four months of age.

Sec. 10-53. Kennel license tax.

The tax for a licensed kennel shall be according to the following schedule:

5--20 dogs . . . \$35.00 Over--20 dogs . . . \$50.00

Sec. 10-54. When license tax payable.

The license tax imposed by this division shall be payable to the treasurer of the county, as required by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.88, which section is adopted and made a part of this chapter as fully as though set forth at length in this section.

Sec. 10-55. Effect of dog not wearing collar as evidence.

Any dog not wearing a collar bearing a license tag of the proper calendar year shall prima facie be deemed to be unlicensed and a stray; and in any proceedings under this division, the burden of proof of the fact that such dog has been licensed or is otherwise not required to bear a tag at the time shall be on the owner of the dog.

Sec. 10-56. What dog license shall consist of.

The county dog license shall consist of a license receipt and a metal tag. The tag shall be stamped or otherwise permanently marked to show the jurisdiction issuing the license, the sex of the dog and the calendar year for which issued, and shall bear a serial number.

Sec. 10-57. Duplicate license tags.

Duplicate license tags shall be obtained by the owner of a dog as provided by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.91, which section is adopted by reference and

made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

Sec. 10-58. Displaying receipts; dogs to wear tags.

Dog license receipts shall be displayed and dog license tags shall be worn as required by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.92.

Sec. 10-59. Payment of license tax subsequent to summons.

Payment of the license tax subsequent to a summons to appear before the general district court or other court for failure to do so within the time required shall not operate to relieve such owner of the penalties provided.

DIVISION 3. RABIES CONTROL

Sec. 10-60. Vaccination required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to own a dog or domesticated cat, age four months or older unless such dog or cat has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises. No license tags shall be issued for any dog unless there is presented to the treasurer at the time application for license is made evidence satisfactory to the treasurer, showing that such dog has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises, and that such inoculation or vaccination remains valid for the time application for license is made. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-03.1, 18.2-03.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

Sec. 10-61. Rabies clinic authorized.

The board of supervisors finding that the number of resident veterinarians is inadequate to meet the need, the county health department shall provide a rabies clinic at least once per year.

Sec. 10-62. Dogs or cats not vaccinated.

Any dog or cat found in the county not vaccinated and identified as described in this subdivision shall be impounded by the animal control officer, and such dogs shall be held for a period of five days. The dog or cat may be returned to its owner upon proof of ownership, vaccination of the dog or cat, and payment of the cost of impounding the dog or cat at usual rates, and payment of any fines assessed under the provisions of this division. At the expiration of the five-day period, any dog or cat not so claimed by its owner may disposed of by giving it into the possession of any person willing to pay the cost of impounding, vaccination and license. If not so disposed of, the dog or cat shall be euthanized in an humane manner by the impounding officer or other designated official.

Sec. 10-63. Quarantine authorized.

When the board of supervisors finds that there is sufficient reason to believe that a rabid animal is at large, the board shall have the power to pass an emergency ordinance requiring all owners of all dogs in the county to keep the dogs confined on their premises, and may further adopt such ordinances, regulations or other measures as it may deem reasonably necessary to prevent the spread within the county of the disease of rabies.

DIVISION 4. RUNNING AT LARGE

Sec. 10-70. Prohibited.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any dog, belonging to him or under his control, to run at large in the county at any time from March 1 to August 31. For the purpose of this division, a dog shall be deemed to be running at large while roaming or running or self-hunting off the property of its owner or custodian and not under the owner's or custodians' immediate control. Any person, after having been notified by any animal control officer or other officer of the law that the dog is running at large, who is the owner or custodian of the dog thereafter found running at large shall be deemed to have violated the provisions of this section.
- (b) This section shall not apply to any person or persons while engaging in the following activities:
- (1) Lawful hunting with a dog or dogs;
- (2) Law enforcement or search and rescue activity;
- (3) A supervised formal obedience training class or show;
- (4) Formally sanctioned field trials; or
- (5) Bona fide hunting or field trial dog training.
- (c) A violation of this section shall constitute a Class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-03.1, 18.2-03.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section; however, if the dog is a dangerous or vicious dog, a violation of this section shall constitute a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-03.1, 18.2-03.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.
- (d) Should the animal control officer or any law enforcement officer have reason to believe that any dog found running at large is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person, such officer may order the confinement of such animal by delivering a confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal and any person who thereafter permits such animal to run at large or remain unconfined, unrestricted or not penned up shall be deemed to have violated this section. Should the animal not be confined within six hours after the delivery of the confinement order or should the animal control officer or other officer, after due diligence, be unable to deliver the confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal, the animal control officer or any other law

enforcement officer shall impound any such vicious or destructive dog pursuant to the provision of section 6-197. Upon the issuance of the confinement order, or the impoundment of such animal to appear in the general district court of the county where the matter shall be heard on criminal warrants and the animal shall remain confined until the final disposition of the court proceeding; However, for the purposes of this section the owner or custodian of such dog shall be conclusively presumed to have known the dog to be vicious or destructive if at any time prior to the running at large of such animal the owner or custodian has received from any person a complaint that the animal is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person.

Sec. 10-71. Unlicensed dogs prohibited.

The running at large of dogs not duly licensed and displaying tags pursuant to the provisions of this article is prohibited.

DIVISION 5. IMPOUNDMENT

Sec. 10-80. County dog pound.

The animal control officer shall cause to be maintained a pound or enclosure as required by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.96.

Sec. 10-81. Confinement and disposition of dogs.

It shall be the duty of the animal control officer to confine and dispose of dogs pursuant to provisions of Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.66 et seq.

Sec. 10-82. Fees for confinement.

The legal owner of any dog seized and confined by the animal control officer shall pay to the animal control officer a charge for the confinement of the dog, the amount of such charge to be in accordance with the fees established by the board of supervisors. All fees received by the animal control officer shall be paid over to the county treasurer.

Sec. 10-83. Unlicensed dogs.

- (a) It shall be the duty of the animal control officer, or any other officer, to capture and impound any companion animal found running at large on which the license tax has not been paid. A reasonable effort will be made to find the owner. After five days, if the owner is not found, the animal shall be declared abandoned. If the owner is known, the animal will be held an additional five days. The provisions of Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.96 shall apply where applicable to the disposition of the dog. Any person, animal control officer or other officer euthanizing a dog under this chapter shall cremate, bury or sanitarily dispose of the dog. Prior to the disposition by euthanasia or otherwise, all of the provisions of Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.66 et seq., shall have been complied with.
- (b) If the animal control officer or other officer exercises his option to deliver such dog to any person in his jurisdiction who will pay the required license tax and cost on such dog, the person accepting delivery of such dog shall, within five days after such delivery, furnish to the animal control officer evidence of the

inoculation and licensing of such dog as required by this article; and the failure to provide such evidence shall be a violation of this article and shall constitute a separate offense.

DIVISION 6. DAMAGE BY DOGS

Sec. 10-90. Disposition of funds.

The treasurer shall keep all money collected by him for dog licenses in a separate account as part of the general fund; and such funds shall be used for the purposes designated by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.101, which section is adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

Sec. 10-91. Compensation for livestock and poultry killed or injured by dogs.

- (a) Any person who has any livestock or poultry killed or injured by any dog not his own in the county shall be entitled to receive as compensation the fair market value of such livestock or poultry not to exceed \$400.00 per animal or \$10.00 per fowl, provided that:
- (1) Within 72 hours of discovery of the death or injury, the claimant gives notice of the incident to the animal control officer.
- (2) Within 60 days of the discovery of the death or injury, the claimant shall furnish such evidence of the quantity and value of the dead or injured livestock or poultry and the reasons the claimant believes that death or injury was caused by a dog to the board of supervisors.
- (3) The claimant first has exhausted his legal remedies against the owner, if known, of the dog doing the damage for which compensation under this section is sought. Exhaustion shall mean a judgment against the owner of the dog upon which execution has returned unsatisfied.
- (b) Upon a determination by the board that a claim meets the criteria set forth in this section for compensation, the board shall approve the same and forward the approval to the treasurer. Upon payment under this section, the board shall be surrogated to the extent of compensation paid to the right of action to the owner of the livestock or poultry against the owner of the dog and may enforce such compensation in an appropriate action at law.

Sec. 10-92 Seizure of dogs suspected of killing or injuring livestock or poultry.

If any person, including the animal control officer, has reason to believe that any dog is killing livestock or poultry, he shall apply to a magistrate of the county, who shall issue a warrant requiring the owner or custodian, if known, to appear before the judge of the general district court at the time and place named therein, at which time evidence shall be heard. If it shall be determined by the court that such dog is a livestock or poultry killer, the dog shall be ordered (i) euthanized immediately by the animal control officer or other officer designated by the judge of the general district court or (ii) removed to another state which

does not border on the commonwealth. Any dog ordered removed which is later found in the commonwealth shall be ordered by a court to be euthanized immediately.

DIVISION 6. DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS DOGS

Sec. 10-100. Control of dangerous or vicious dogs; penalties.

(a) As used in this section:

"Dangerous dog" means a carfine or canine crossbreed that has bitten, attacked, or inflicted injury on a person or companion animal that is a dog or cat, or killed a companion animal that is a dog or cat. However, when a dog attacks or bites a companion animal that is a dog or cat, the attacking or biting dog shall not be deemed dangerous (i) if no serious physical injury as determined by a licensed veterinarian has occurred to the dog or cat as a result of the attack or bite, (ii) if both animals are owned by the same person, (iii) if such attack occurs on the property of the attacking or biting dog's owner or custodian, or (iv) for other good cause as determined by the court. No dog shall be found to be a dangerous dog as a result of biting, attacking, or inflicting injury on a dog or cat while engaged with an owner or custodian as part of lawful hunting or participating in an organized, lawful dog handling event.

"Vicious dog" means a canine or canine crossbreed that has (i) killed a person; (ii) inflicted serious injury to a person, including multiple bites, serious disfigurement, serious impairment of health, or serious impairment of a bodily function; or (iii) continued to exhibit the behavior that resulted in a previous finding by a court or, on or before July 1, 2006, by an animal control officer as authorized by local ordinance, that it is a dangerous dog, provided that its owner has been given notice of that finding.

(b) Any law-enforcement officer or animal control officer who has reason to believe that a canine or canine crossbreed within his jurisdiction is a dangerous dog or vicious dog shall apply to a magistrate of the jurisdiction for the issuance of a summons requiring the owner or custodian, if known, to appear before a general district court at a specified time. The summons shall advise the owner of the nature of the proceeding and the matters at issue. If a lawenforcement officer successfully makes an application for the issuance of a summons, he shall contact the local animal control officer and inform him of the location of the dog and the relevant facts pertaining to his belief that the dog is dangerous or vicious. The animal control officer shall confine the animal until such time as evidence shall be heard and a verdict rendered. If the animal control officer determines that the owner or custodian can confine the animal in a manner that protects the public safety, he may permit the owner or custodian to confine the animal until such time as evidence shall be heard and a verdict rendered. The court, through its contempt powers, may compel the owner, custodian or harborer of the animal to produce the animal. If, after hearing the evidence, the court finds that the animal is a dangerous dog, the court shall order the animal's owner to comply with the provisions of this section. If, after hearing the evidence, the court finds that the animal is a vicious dog, the court shall order the animal euthanized in accordance with the provisions of § 3.1-796.119 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended. The procedure for appeal and trial shall be the same as provided by law for misdemeanors. Trial by jury shall be as provided in Article 4 (§ 19.2-260 et seq.) of Chapter 15 of Title 19.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended. The Commonwealth shall be required to prove its case beyond a reasonable doubt.

- (c) No canine or canine crossbreed shall be found to be a dangerous dog or vicious dog solely because it is a particular breed, nor is the ownership of a particular breed of canine or canine crossbreed prohibited. No animal shall be found to be a dangerous dog or vicious dog if the threat, injury or damage was sustained by a person who was (i) committing, at the time, a crime upon the premises occupied by the animal's owner or custodian, (ii) committing, at the time, a willful trespass upon the premises occupied by the animal's owner or custodian, or (iii) provoking, tormenting, or physically abusing the animal, or can be shown to have repeatedly provoked, tormented, abused, or assaulted the animal at other times. No police dog that was engaged in the performance of its duties as such at the time of the acts complained of shall be found to be a dangerous dog or a vicious dog. No animal that, at the time of the acts complained of, was responding to pain or injury, or was protecting itself, its kennel, its offspring, a person, or its owner's or custodian's property, shall be found to be a dangerous dog or a vicious dog.
- (d) If the owner of an animal found to be a dangerous dog is a minor, the custodial parent or legal guardian shall be responsible for complying with all requirements of this section.
- (e) The owner of any animal found to be a dangerous dog shall, within 10 days of such finding, obtain a dangerous dog registration certificate from the local animal control officer or treasurer for a fee of \$50, in addition to other fees that may be authorized by law. The local animal control officer or treasurer shall also provide the owner with a uniformly designed tag that identifies the animal as a dangerous dog. The owner shall affix the tag to the animal's collar and ensure that the animal wears the collar and tag at all times. All certificates obtained pursuant to this subsection shall be renewed annually for the same fee and in the same manner as the initial certificate was obtained. The animal control officer shall provide a copy of the dangerous dog registration certificate and verification of compliance to the State Veterinarian.
- (f) All dangerous dog registration certificates or renewals thereof required to be obtained under this section shall only be issued to persons 18 years of age or older who present satisfactory evidence (i) of the animal's current rabies vaccination, if applicable, (ii) that the animal has been neutered or spayed, and (iii) that the animal is and will be confined in a proper enclosure or is and will be confined in the owner's residence or is and will be muzzled and confined in the owner's fenced-in yard until the proper enclosure is constructed. In addition, owners who apply for certificates or renewals thereof under this section shall not

be issued a certificate or renewal thereof unless they present satisfactory evidence that (i) their residence is and will continue to be posted with clearly visible signs warning both minors and adults of the presence of a dangerous dog on the property and (ii) the animal has been permanently identified by means of a tattoo on the inside thigh or by electronic implantation. All certificates or renewals thereof required to be obtained under this section shall only be issued to persons who present satisfactory evidence that the owner has liability insurance coverage, to the value of at least \$100,000, which covers animal bites. The owner may obtain and maintain a bond in surety, in lieu of liability insurance, to the value of at least \$100,000.

- (g) While on the property of its owner, an animal found to be a dangerous dog shall be confined indoors or in a securely enclosed and locked structure of sufficient height and design to prevent its escape or direct contact with or entry by minors, adults, or other animals. The structure shall be designed to provide the animal with shelter from the elements of nature. When off its owner's property, an animal found to be a dangerous dog shall be kept on a leash and muzzled in such a manner as not to cause injury to the animal or interfere with the animal's vision or respiration, but so as to prevent it from biting a person or another animal.
- (h) The owner of any dog found to be dangerous shall register the animal with the Commonwealth of Virginia Dangerous Dog Registry, as established under § 3.1-796.93:3 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, within 45 days of such a finding by a court of competent jurisdiction.

The owner shall also cause the local animal control officer to be promptly notified of (i) the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all owners; (ii) all of the means necessary to locate the owner and the dog at any time; (iii) any complaints or incidents of attack by the dog upon any person or cat or dog; (iv) any claims made or lawsuits brought as a result of any attack; (v) tattoo or chip identification information or both; (vi) proof of insurance or surety bond; and (vii) the death of the dog.

- (i) After an animal has been found to be a dangerous dog, the animal's owner shall immediately, upon learning of same, cause the local animal control authority to be notified if the animal (i) is loose or unconfined; or (ii) bites a person or attacks another animal; or (iii) is sold, given away, or dies. Any owner of a dangerous dog who relocates to a new address shall, within 10 days of relocating, provide written notice to the appropriate local animal control authority for the old address from which the animal has moved and the new address to which the animal has been moved.
- (j) Any owner or custodian of a canine or canine crossbreed or other animal is guilty of a:
- 1. Class 2 misdemeanor if the canine or canine crossbreed previously declared a dangerous dog pursuant to this section, when such declaration arose out of a separate and distinct incident, attacks and injures or kills a cat or dog that is a companion animal belonging to another person;

- 2. Class 1 misdemeanor if the canine or canine crossbreed previously declared a dangerous dog pursuant to this section, when such declaration arose out of a separate and distinct incident, bites a human being or attacks a human being causing bodily injury; or
- 3. Class 6 felony if any owner or custodian whose willful act or omission in the care, control, or containment of a canine, canine crossbreed, or other animal is so gross, wanton, and culpable as to show a reckless disregard for human life, and is the proximate cause of such dog or other animal attacking and causing serious bodily injury to any person.

The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any animal that, at the time of the acts complained of, was responding to pain or injury, or was protecting itself, its kennel, its offspring, a person, or its owner's or custodian's property, or when the animal is a police dog that is engaged in the performance of its duties at the time of the attack.

- (k) The owner of any animal that has been found to be a dangerous dog who willfully fails to comply with the requirements of this section is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- (I) All fees collected pursuant to this section, less the costs incurred by the animal control authority in producing and distributing the certificates and tags required by this section, shall be paid into a special dedicated fund in the treasury of the locality for the purpose of paying the expenses of any training course required under § 3.1-796.104:1 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.

ARTICLE VI. WILD OR EXOTIC ANIMALS

Sec. 10-110. Display or exhibition.

No person shall keep or permit to be kept on his premises any wild or exotic animal for display or for exhibition purposes, whether gratuitously or for a fee. This section shall not be construed to apply to zoological parks, performing animal exhibitions, circuses or veterinary clinics which are properly licensed by the federal government or Commonwealth of Virginia. In no case, however, shall such wild or exotic animals be exhibited or displayed in such a manner that persons other than their handlers can pet, fondle or otherwise come in direct physical contact with such animals.

Sec. 10-111. Keeping as a pet.

No person shall keep or permit to be kept any wild or exotic animal as a pet.

Sec. 10-112. Notice required at place of sale.

Any person who offers for sale a wild or exotic animal, as defined by

section 4-1 of this chapter, shall post-conspicuously at the place of sale or display the following notice:

"No person may lawfully keep or permit to be kept in Prince Edward County any live monkey (nonhuman primate), raccoon, skunk, wolf, squirrel, fox, leopard, panther, tiger, lion, lynx or any other warm-blooded animal, poisonous snake or tarantula, crocodile or alligator, which can normally be found in the wild state or any other member of the crocodilian, including but not limited to alligators, crocodiles, caimans and gavials."

Sec. 10-113. Penalty.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this article shall be deemed guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor. Each day a violation of this article shall continue constitutes a separate offense.

Sec. 10-114. Enforcement.

The provisions of this article shall be enforced by the animal control officer or other officer as provided in § 3.1-796.104 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.

Sec. 10-115. Effective date.

- (a) Any person who keeps a wild or exotic animal in contravention of this article may dispose of the animal by removal of the animal from the county, by giving or selling the animal to a zoological park, or by releasing the animal to the animal control officer. The animal control officer is authorized to release the animal to the wild, to a zoological park, or to a responsible adult, or euthanize the animal, if the circumstances warrant.
- (b) This article shall be effective immediately; provided, that any person currently keeping any wild or exotic animals in the county shall dispose of same within five (5) years of the date of adoption of this article; and provided further, that such wild animals shall be registered with the animal control officer within sixty (60) days from the date of adoption of this article.

ARTICLE V. HYBRID CANINE.

Section 10-120 Definitions.

As used in this article:

1. "Hybrid canine" means any animal which at any time has been or is permitted, licensed registered, or otherwise described or represented as a hybrid canine, wolf or coyote by its owner to a licensed veterinarian, law enforcement officer, animal control officer, humane investigator, official of the Department of Health, or representative of the State Veterinarian.

- 2. "Adequate confinement" means that, while on the property of its owner and not under the direct supervision and control of the owner or custodian, a hybrid canine shall be confined in a humane manner in a securely enclosed and locked structure of sufficient height and design to (i) prevent the animal's escape; or if the hybrid canine is determined to be a dangerous dog pursuant to § 3.1-796.93:1, the structure shall prevent direct contact with any person or animal not authorized by the owner to be in direct contact with the hybrid canine, and (ii) provide a minimum of 100 square feet of floor space for each adult animal. Tethering of a hybrid canine not under the direct supervision and control of the owner or custodian shall not be considered adequate confinement.
- 3. "Responsible ownership" means the ownership and humane care of a hybrid canine in such a manner as to comply with all laws and ordinances regarding hybrid canines and prevent endangerment by the animal to public health and safety.
- 4. "Owner" means any person who (a) has a right or property in an animal, (b) keeps or harbors an animal, (c) has an animal in his care, or (d) acts as a custodian of an animal.

Section 10-121. Hybrid canine ordinance; penalty.

- 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner or custodian to allow any hybrid canine to run at large in the country during the period of January 1 through December 31 inclusive of any year. For the purpose of this section, a hybrid canine shall be deemed to be running at large while outside of any pen or enclosure as provided in subsection 2 of this section, however, any owner or custodian of a hybrid canine may be allowed to remove a hybrid canine from any pen or enclosure for purposes of transportation to another pen or enclosure or for the purpose of obtaining medical attention. In no event shall any hybrid canine be allowed to be set free on any property within the county whether or not the hybrid canine is under its owner's or custodian's immediate control.
- 2. It shall be unlawful to own or possess a hybrid canine unless such hybrid canine is kept and maintained in a pen or enclosure as follows:
- (a) The pen or enclosure shall contain at least 200 square feet of space per adult hybrid canine.
- (b) Any fencing used in the construction of the pen or enclosure shall be at least eight (8) feet in height with an additional overhang of fencing or barbed wire angling a minimum of three (3) feet into the pen or enclosure. Such wire enclosure shall be of such strength as to prevent the escape of any hybrid canine enclosed therein.
- (c) To prevent digging out along the fence, concrete footers at least one (1) foot wide and six (6) inches deep shall be installed along the perimeter of the pen or enclosure or a wire footing of 12-gauge wire buried six (6) inches in the ground with at least three feet of wire on the inside of the pen or enclosure, bending the remaining one (1) foot of wire up in a 90° angle and connect every

six (6) inches to the bottom outside of the pen or enclosure.

- (d) The pen or enclosure shall provide shelter which affords complete protection from all elements of nature.
- (e) A violation of this ordinance shall be a Class 3 misdemeanor for the first violation and a Class 1 misdemeanor for any second or subsequent offense. Upon a conviction of a second violation of this ordinance, the owner shall surrender the hybrid canine to the animal control officer for euthanasia in accordance with § 3.1-796.119 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.

DUI EXPENSES REIMBURSEMENT ORDINANCE

- A. A person convicted of violating any of the following provisions shall be liable FOR RESTITUTION AT THE TIME OF SENTENCING OR in a separate civil action TO THE COUNTY OR TO ANY RESPONDING VOLUNTEER FIRE OR RESCUE SQUAD, OR BOTH, for reasonable expenses incurred by the County FOR RESPONDING LAW ENFORCEMENT, FIRE FIGHTING, RESCUE AND EMERGENCY SERVICES, including by the sheriff's office of such locality, or by any volunteer fire or rescue squad, or by any combination of the foregoing, when providing an appropriate emergency response to any accident or incident related to such violation:
 - 1. The provisions of § 18.2-51.4, 18.2-266, 18.2-266.1, 29.1-738, 29.1-738.02, or a similar ordinance, when such operation of a motor vehicle, engine, train or watercraft while so impaired is the proximate cause of the accident or incident;
 - 2. The provisions of Article 7 (§ 46.2-852 et seq.) of Chapter 8 of Title 46.2 relating to reckless driving, when such reckless driving is the proximate cause of the accident or incident;
 - 3. The provisions of Article 1 (§ 46.2-300 et seq.) of Chapter 3 of Title 46.2 relating to driving without a license or driving with a suspended or revoked license; and
 - 4. The provisions of § 46.2-894 relating to improperly leaving the scene of an accident.
- B. Personal liability under this ordinance for reasonable expenses of an appropriate emergency response shall not exceed \$1,000 in the aggregate for a particular accident or incident occurring in the County. In determining the "reasonable expenses," the County may bill a flat fee of \$250 or a minute-by-minute accounting of the actual costs incurred. As used in this ordinance, "appropriate emergency response" includes all costs of providing law-enforcement, fire-fighting, rescue, and emergency medical services. The court may order as restitution the reasonable expenses incurred by the County for RESPONDING LAW-ENFORCEMENT, fire-fighting, rescue and emergency medical services. The provisions of this ordinance shall not preempt or limit any remedy available to the Commonwealth, to the County or to any volunteer rescue squad to recover the reasonable expenses of an emergency response to an accident or incident not involving impaired driving, operation of a vehicle or other conduct as set forth herein.

Proposed Changes Are In Italics

In reviewing the county ordinance which allows for the Courts to impose restitution for expenses incurred by the County for responses to certain motor vehicle accidents, it has been determined that the General Assembly amended the enabling statute, §15.2-1716. The proposed changes will bring the County ordinance into compliance with the Code of Virginia and make it easier for the Court to impose the restitution requirement by allowing the Court to do so as part of the criminal sentencing event.

Special Projects Tobacco Commission Grant

Summary:

In June 2007 Prince Edward County submitted an "Economic Development Grant" grant application to the Tobacco Indemnification and Community Revitalization Commission for \$151, 760. This grant application was denied at the July 26th meeting, but Commission staff has since recommended the County reapply for a "Special Projects Grant," which is due by August 15, 2007. In accordance with the Tobacco Commission staff recommendation, I respectfully request the Board of Supervisors authorize the submittal of a "Special Projects" Tobacco Grant application for the August 15th, 2007 grant. The amount of the grant requested and County funds required will depend on the scope of work desired by the BOS. Three options are presented for your review.

Option I - Total cost is \$370,000. Request \$200,000 from the Commission with the remaining \$170,000 funded by PEC from the proceeds of the sale of land. The Commission's funds will be used to complete the engineering and site development plan necessary for the entire park consisting of 4 to 6 sites. The PEC funding of \$170,000 will fund the preparation of Lot #10 at the corner of Dominion Drive, next to Paris Ceramics, USA. This lot consists of approximately 8.48 acres with easy access and the highest potential industry interest.

Option II - Total cost is \$762,000. Request \$396,000 from the Commission with the remaining \$366,000 funded by PEC. This option will allow the completion of all items listed in Option I plus the preparation of Lots #7A and 12 consisting of approximately 20 acres fronting Commerce Street or Route 628 across from the Southside Virginia Family YMCA plot. These two sites have easy access and will be the next most desirable industrial sites at the park.

Option III - Total cost is \$1,858,000. Request \$944,000 from the Commission with the remaining \$914,000 funded by PEC. This option allows the completion of all items in Options I and II plus the construction of a 1/4 mile road, a cul-de-sac and development of the remainder of the Park. The road would give access to the remaining land in the Park of approximately 50 acres which could potentially contain 3 or 4 sites.. Once complete this will account for the total build out of the Prince Edward Business Park and should prepare the County for economic development opportunities for several years to come.

Wherever possible other funding sources and grants will be sought to assist with the cost of the park development.



Sharon Carney distributed a contact sheet and asked that everyone fill in their contact information and to list anyone not present who should receive copies of the meeting notes.

Sharon Carney then distributed a copy of the agenda for the called meeting, whereby Howard Simpson called the meeting to order at 1:45pm in the County's Third Floor conference room.

Peggy Epperson was then asked to give a report about the status of the development.

- Peggy gave out some statistical information including <u>Facts About the Library</u>.
- Peggy discussed the <u>First Draft Building Program</u> dated June 19, 2007 presented by the The Design Collaborative. The Program had been distributed to the committee members for review prior to the meeting.
- After much discussion it was determined that Peggy needed to set up a meeting
 with the project architect to go over some questions, to determine the project
 schedule and the estimated project cost. (Meeting TBD)
- It was also suggested by Wade Barlett and agreed upon by the committee, that a "value engineering" study should be conducted by another architectural firm to assure the best engineering of the project possible for the money. (Second opinion)

Eric Tannell, acting a County Legal Council from the Commonwealth Attorney's Office, brought forward a draft proposal Agreement between the Town of Farmville and Prince Edward County regarding the Farmville-Prince Edward Library. After much discussion the following points were agreed upon. Eric was then asked to redraft the agreement to reflect the agreed upon changes:

The cost of the Farmville-Prince Edward Library would be split 2/3 for the County and 1/3 for the Town. Total cost of project yet to be determined.

The building will be jointly owned between the Town of Farmville and Prince

Edward County respective of their contributions.

The fair market value of the land currently owned by the Town of Farmville at Wilck's Lake, will be credited towards the Town's portion of their pro-rata share. The fair market value of the land will be determined after the proposed site is surveyed and then appraised.

• In the event the library building and grounds should be sold at a later date, the proceeds will be split with 1/3 to the Town of Farmville and 2/3 to Prince Edward

County.

• The Town Manager will be responsible for the management of the architectural and construction contracts and the Town Manager shall be the primary point of contact for project construction and management.

- Once final approval of the building plans have been secured from the County and Town, any construction change order of \$1,000 or more must be approved by both County and Town with total accrued change orders not to exceed 5% of the cost of the proposed library.
- Permanent Financing for the construction of the library shall be administered by the Town of Farmville, subject to approval of the County.
- The library building will be leased to the Farmville-Prince Edward Library Board for \$1.00 a year.
- The Library Committee shall meet monthly to evaluate the progress of construction and shall provide a copy of the minutes of said meetings to the Town and the County.
- The existing Library facility will be sold with the proceeds going towards furniture, fixtures and equipment for the new library.
- The Library Board will be responsible for the daily operation of the library including all utilities, janitorial services and regular daily maintenance.
- Any costs incurred towards building and grounds or assistance with special projects by the Town of Farmville or Prince Edward County will be split by the Town and County as per their pro-rata portion.
- Building and grounds or special project s costs will be reconciled as part of the Library's annual appropriations from the Town and the County.
- The Community Library staff will be managed by the Board of Trustees for the Community Library. The Town shall act as fiscal agent for the payment of library personnel.

It was also agreed that the following documents need to be prepared and executed:

- Lease Agreement between the Town of Farmville and Prince Edward County to rent the new building to the Library Board (Eric Tannelle)
- Memorandum of Understanding between the Town of Farmville and Prince Edward County regarding the cost sharing of the building with the Town of Farmville paying 1/3 and the County of Prince Edward paying 2/3 as described above. (Eric Tannelle)

• Financing Agreement between the Town of Farmville and Prince Edward County regarding the financing of the Library project. (TBD)

The Library Committee will meet again when there is more development progress with the architect (Peggy Eppersen) and/or agreements are ready for review (Eric Tannell).

The meeting was adjourned at 2:55pm.





We understand that VCBR is a maximum security residential treatment facility dedicated to the treatment of civilly committed, sexually violent predators. We are also advised that when residents at VCBR's current facility in Dinwiddie County require hospital care, they are transported to the Medical College of Virginia in Richmond or to other secure facilities. You have requested that Southside accept these residents as patients once the facility is relocated to Nottoway County.

After thoroughly reviewing your request and considering the effect that it would have on the operation of Southside, the Hospital has determined that, except in the case of an emergency, Southside will not be available to treat VCBR patients. It is our position that the VCBR patients should instead receive all medical treatment at state hospitals or other facilities with secure areas for treatment of dangerous individuals.

For any treatment at Southside we would require that all VCBR patients be kept in metal restraints, except where removal of such restraints is necessary for treatment of an emergency medical condition and that the VCBR patients be accompanied at all times by one or more armed law enforcement officers from the Virginia State Police or another law enforcement agency acceptable to Southside. We would further note that the Southside Medical Staff is not large enough to provide around-the-clock emergency coverage in many specialties and subspecialties. Consequently, patients with emergency conditions may often require stabilization and transfer to another facility with such specialty capabilities. Given this reality, we believe it will be in the

patient's interest and more efficient for your organization for you to utilize a facility like the Medical College of Virginia hospitals for emergency care when the patient's condition permits transport to such a hospital.

Unlike larger hospitals, Southside does not have a full-time security staff or a secure treatment area, and given the nature and background of the VCBR residents, the presence of the VCBR patients at Southside and the additional burden of providing security and treating such individuals would disrupt the Hospital's operations. Further, the presence of the individuals would also be seen as detrimental to the safety and welfare of visitors to the Hospital and to Southside's patients and staff.

We are also aware of the Virginia statutory provision that "persons committed [to VCBR] shall be segregated by sight and sound at all times from prisoners in the custody of a correctional facility." Because inmates from nearby prison facilities are present on occasion at Southside for treatment, we could not guarantee that patients from VCBR who are brought to Southside for emergency treatment will not see or hear such inmates.

Dear Mr. Bartlett:

This is in reply to a request received from your office last year for the Department of Game and Inland Fisheries to explore the potential of establishing boating access to the Appomattox River in association with the recently acquired Featherfin Wildlife Management Area. Featherfin WMA borders about 10 miles of the Appomattox River in Appomattox, Buckingham and Prince Edward Counties. Your Board of Supervisors had asked that we specifically consider access points at State Route 612 (Appomattox County) and State Route 609 in Prince Edward County.

I subsequently notified your office that we were initiating development of a management plan for Featherfin WMA which would include consideration for potential river access opportunities. As part of that process we requested that our Capital Programs-Boating Access Section conduct an assessment to determine suitability of these sites for potential access development. That assessment was completed last August and concluded that none of the proposed sites qualify for funding consideration nor are they suitable for boating access. A formal assessment process is used to evaluate and score potential sites using a set of several criteria, and limited stream flow is one of the weakest features of the river at those locations.

I delayed a formal response regarding your request until we completed development of a management plan for Featherfin WMA, which has now been completed in draft form. We wanted to more closely evaluate habitat and other features of the management area before making a final decision about access and other management issues. Based on that process of inventory and planning, in addition to the formal boating access assessment noted earlier, we have concluded that we will not be able to pursue development of boating facilities at Featherfin Wildlife Management Area. However, we believe the area offers very good opportunities for the public to enjoy the river via a variety of walking trails, plus direct access in the vicinity of State Route 609.

Prince Edward County Public Information Session - County Zoning Ordinance July 17, 2007

The Public Information Session was attended by Board of Supervisors Chairman William G. Fore, Jr., Vice-Chairman Howard F. Simpson, Sally W. Gilfillan, Robert M. Jones, Lacy B. Ward, Director of Planning and Community Development Jonathan Pickett, and Planner Alecia Daves-Johnson. Jonathan Pickett opened the Public Information Session at 7:00 p.m. in the Prince Edward County Board Room. Mr. Pickett reviewed the steps taken to date in the development of the ordinance through the Public Hearing held by the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors on March 27, 2007. He explained that the comments received were considered and that the copy of the ordinance presented at this Information Session reflected those comments.

Mr. Pickett then reviewed the June 25, 2007 document titled "Summary of Draft 5 Zoning Changes" which resulted from the Board of Supervisors' Work Session on June 25, 2007. There were ten areas of change as follows:

- 1. Lot Size in the A-1 District-lot size reduced, density remained unchanged.
- 2. Farm Stands all development guidelines deleted.
- 3. Accessory Apartments deleted family member occupancy requirement and allowed separate utility hookup.
- 4. Home Occupations allowed non-household members to be employed, allowed retail and wholesale sales, and deleted regulations concerning fine arts, tutoring, and daycare. Allowed advertising signs at place of business, up to six square feet dimensionally. Permitted external storage as long as it is out of view of neighboring properties and roadways, adjusted delivery service restriction, and changed definition to clarify that only on-site activities are regulated.
- 5. Fences regulations deleted.
- 6. Non-conforming Uses and Structures deleted sections prohibiting replacement or expansions of such uses and structures.
- 7. Outdoor Gatherings exempted church revivals from this definition.
- 8. Accessory Structures deleted setback requirements.
- 9. Bed and Breakfast Allowed meal service without limitation to overnight guests, deleted requirement for owner-occupancy of facility, allowed outside entrances to guest rooms.
- 10. Two-Family Dwellings added as a by-right use in the A-1 and A-2 Districts.

Mr. Pickett then opened the floor for questions and comments. Mrs. Sally Gilfillan read a letter submitted by Betty and Kyle Sumner, constituents in her district, expressing concern about the adjacent commercial 'n

district and future build-out impacts to neighborhood traffic. Seven citizens spoke and Mr. Pickett responded. Topics of concern included the following: sub-division possibilities for a 7 acre parcel in the A1 District, commercial district near Crestview Neighborhood, clarification of commercial zoning concern, non-conforming use limited to inactivity for less than two years, explanation of the term "grandfathered", notification requirements for a public hearing, and the Realtors Association expressed their opposition to the ordinance in general but was thankful for the changes made.

The Public Information Session concluded at 8 p.m.

MINUTES OF THE MEETING OF THE POPLAR HILL COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY, PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, VIRGINIA

A regular monthly meeting of the Poplar Hill Community Development Authority, Prince Edward County, Virginia (the "Authority") was held on July 11, 2007 at 11:00 am in the Offices of Poplar Hill Golf Club, Main Street, Farmville, Virginia.

Present at the Board Meeting were Board Members Hunter Watson, Bobby Showalter, Ken Copeland, Robert Atkinson, Joe Eppes and Paul Hicks. Harlan Horton, Arthur Jeffords, and John Prengaman also attended.

Vice-chairman, Bobby Showalter called the meeting to order and conducted the meeting until 11:15 at which Norm Krueger was present and conducted the meeting.

On motion of Hunter Watson with a second by Joe Eppes, the Board unanimously approved the Minutes of the May 9, 2007 meeting and on motion of Bobby Showalter with a second by Paul Hicks the Board unanimously approved the minutes of the June 13, 2007 meeting.

Mr. Prengaman, assisted by Mr. Jeffords, gave the Manager's Report. Mr. Prengaman gave a status report on play at the golf course and the revenue that was generated by the play. He noted that play at the course had increased and revenue was up as a result. He indicated that he felt that increased marketing had improved play at the course with the majority of play still coming from the Richmond area. He then reviewed the monthly profit and loss statement.

Mr. Prengaman advised the Board the golf course is using about 500,000 gallons of water a day for irrigation. He further indicated that he was securing outings for the fall, with the most prominent being the Chamber of Commerce outing in September and the Southside HSC alumni outing in October. He also advised that the Golf Course is current with all of its payables to vendors and creditors.

Mr. Horton then advised the Board that Lighthouse Golf Group, LLC was no longer an operating entity and that Lighthouse Golf Virginia, LLC had assumed all of the obligations of Lighthouse Golf Group with respect to golf course management. Arthur Jeffords is remains the primary operator of the new entity. The Board was advised that it would need to amend its contract with Lighthouse Golf Group, LLC to reflect the new operating entity. On motion of Ken Copeland with a second by Robert Atkinson the Board unanimously approved entering into a contractual relationship with Lighthouse Golf Virginia, LLC on the same terms as contained in the contract with Lighthouse Golf Group, LLC and the Chairman was authorized to execute a new contract or any assignment of the existing contract to the new entity.

The Board was advised that at present there Authority has approved approximately \$920,000 in requisitions from the Trustee that remain unfunded but that as revenue is placed in the revenue account, those requisitions would be funded. The Board was advised that under

those circumstances it was not necessary to approve any additional requisitions at this time. The development entities which have purchased the residential real estate within the CDA district are paying the golf club expenses and those payments do not pass through the hands of the Trustee.

The Chairman advised the board that the CDA accountant Kevin Sheehan had accepted a position with Herberton Structured Finance and would begin curtailing his private practice and the CDA would, therefore need to hire a new accountant. The Chairman directed the Budget Committee to begin interviewing accounting firms.

The Chairman noticed Bob Fowler for the purpose of discussing the lease of the Golf Course by Poplar Hill Holdings, LLC. Mr. Fowler advised that his company would need some additional time within which to activate the lease. He further advised that until the activation, the residential development groups surrounding the course would continue to fund operating expense shortfalls. On motion of Norm Krueger with a second by Ken Copeland, the Board unanimously approved extending the lease activation date to August 31, 2007.

The Chairman then advised that the lease of the golf course and ultimate sale to a private company under a debt assumption arrangement would involve not only approval by the COPS holders under the primary golf course financing but also the holders the subordinated CABs and that the CDA would need to retain counsel to achieve that objective. He had received an engagement letter from Sands Anderson who had previously represented the CDA at the closing the CABs and sought authorization from the Board to retain them again for this purpose. On motion of Hunter Watson with a second by Joe Eppes, the Board unanimously voted to retain Sands Anderson under the terms of the engagement letter prepared by them to facilitate and document the subordinated debt assumption by the private purchaser.

There being nothing further to come before the Board, on motion duly made and seconded the meeting was adjourned.

melia landowners wary of reservoir project wson's Creek proposal calls for buying land and restricting area's zoning

PAINEVILLE Unlike the once-popular television series, the drama at this Dawson's Creek has nothing to do with teen anguish.

On Thursday night, representatives of the Appomattox River Water Authority outlined its proposal to create a reservoir at the western end of Amelia County, adjacent to Prince Edward County, on Dawson's Creek. About 50 Amelia residents gathered at Paineville Volunteer Fire Station to hear the proposal.

The authority -- which includes the cities of Colonial Heights and Petersburg and the counties of Chesterfield, Dinwiddie and Prince George -- created the Lake Chesdin Reservoir in the late 1960s and is now proposing a pumped-storage water reservoir that would supplement the lake during periods of drought and low flow.

That's where Amelia County comes in.

I for some residents who would have portions of their property purchased for the project and their land use restricted under a zoning request, the anguish begins.

While the project has been discussed for years, locals -- including members of the county's Board of Supervisors -- only got their first glimpse of the 24-page proposed agreement when copies were distributed during last week's meeting.

"To this minute [I've had] nothing written in my hands" about the proposal, Supervisor Jim Bennett said.

That lack of information has some landowners leery of the project.

"It's hard to be in favor of something when you don't know what you are going to get," said Elizabeth Henshaw of Chesterfield County, who with several relatives owns 200 acres in Amelia.

Officials with the authority said they would purchase the property; handle the construction; and build, operate and maintain the facility. If the authority is unable to get the necessary permits for the project, the deal will be voided.

The authority is asking Amelia County to host the facility, support the project with residents and state and federal agencies, and protect the reservoir through zoning -- including maintaining the existing requirement of 10-acre lot sizes in the area. In exchange, the authority will pay the county \$10 million for the right to build the reservoir and let the county have water.

authority also is promising to pay the landowners fair-market value for their land and work with the residents sely to address their concerns, as well as proposing a \$1 million incentive fund to be divided between the landowners if they quickly agree to the project.

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"I think the authority is [made up of] reasonable people," Richard D. Hartman, the authority's soon-to-retire ecutive director, assured last week's audience. "I don't think the authority would want to hurt people."

County and authority officials also reminded residents that the agreement presented during the meeting is a draft, and that residents will have an opportunity to voice their opinions. A public hearing is likely to be scheduled for later this year.

"There is nothing that can't be changed in the document," Hartman said.

Lane B. Ramsey, Chesterfield County administrator and a member of the authority, told residents that Amelia needs to plan ahead, noting that when Lake Chesdin was created, his county did not use it as a water source, but it does now.

Marie Wells owns about 350 acres, about 80 of which are expected to be affected by the project. Wells' daughter, Donna Horne, said her mother hopes the supervisors "will look out for her best interest, as do all the landowners." But many of the residents said they doubt that will happen.

Landowner Tucker Joyce said that earlier this year, residents proposed eight items they wanted included in the proposed agreement, but none was incorporated in the proposal.

High on that list was that instead of keeping lot sizes at 10 acres, the restriction be reduced to 5 acres.

"It is a very, very important issue for us," Joyce said. Some of the residents also complained that the \$1 million incentive is simply a way to "divide and conquer" them.

asked H.M. "Sonny" Henshaw, sitting beside his wife, Elizabeth Henshaw. "I own the land, and I'm the one who has to give it up for fair-market value."

Jimmy Borum, whose mother owns a 180-acre farm in Amelia that his father put together when he returned from World War II, said about a third of the farm would be taken by the reservoir project. Even more disconcerting, he said, is that it appears the bottom of the dam will be just several hundred feet from his mother's bedroom window.

"We don't want the money," he said. "We want our land."

In Re: Highway Matters

Mr. Alan Leatherwood, Resident Highway Engineer, reported work began earlier that day on the Slaydon Forest Road project. He added signatures are still required for the Miller Lake Road project.

Supervisor Jones asked for a full update on the Miller Lake Road project at next month's meeting.

Supervisor Ward asked for a report on the Hidden Lake Road project. Mr. Leatherwood said all signatures haven't been obtained, and some of the citizens have not responded to telephone calls or letters. Mr. Ward offered to contact those citizens.

Supervisor Moore asked for the status of Route 634; Mr. Leatherwood said the project is on schedule. Mr. Moore also asked about the dip in the road on Route 607; Mr. Leatherwood said he will look into it as that issue was to have been resolved.

Supervisor Jones said the logging activity is causing distress on the secondary roads in his district, particularly Route 636, Route 630, and Route 696. Mr. Leatherwood said some work will begin next month to repair roadways, but the new budget allows little for surface treatment.

Chairman Fore said he noticed a report that the project to widen Route 15 South has been fully funded, with construction beginning in 2011. Mr. Leatherwood said there is no schedule set at this time, but the estimate was based on funding, and said the design phase was almost complete. He added the project has an estimated cost of \$21 million.

Supervisor McKay inquired about Back Hampden-Sydney Road. Mr. Leatherwood said that project is at the top of their list. Chairman Fore asked how long the project would take. Mr. Leatherwood stated the section is a mile and a half, and would take a "good construction season."

A brief discussion on the revenue sharing project followed.

In Re: YMCA Update

Mr. Dan Albert, Director of the Southside Virginia Family YMCA, said the construction would begin on Thursday, July 11, 2007, and footers would be dug. He said they expect to have the building constructed before winter, and hope to be open and fully functional by May, 2008. Mr. Albert said the building and equipment has an estimated cost of \$4.1 million, and they have raised \$3.3 million to date.

Mr. Ward asked for clarification on the financial statement, and which other jurisdictions have contributed to the YMCA.

Mr. Albert said the YMCA serves Prince Edward, Buckingham, Cumberland, Charlotte and Nottoway counties; and Prince Edward, Buckingham and Cumberland Counties have representation on the Board. He added there have been meetings with Cumberland and a meeting with Buckingham County representatives was scheduled for July 11th. He said "no county, town or person will be left unturned." Mr. Albert said they followed the advice of their capital campaign counsel's strategy which was proven to work in other areas. He said they were hired prior to asking for any donations.

Mr. Ward asked why Prince Edward was contacted first, and other areas were not asked for funding support.

Mr. Albert said the recommendation of the campaign counsel and with the resources and guidance of YMCA of the U.S.A., the first step was to ask Prince Edward County and Farmville. He said he assumed it was because the facility is physically located in Prince Edward County.

Mrs. Gilfillan said she was concerned that there may have been no open bid process for the construction firms. Mr. Albert said that the Facility Committee looked at 13 or 14 different

companies and narrowed the selection to four, and negotiated bids from those four. Some of the criteria for that selection process included value-engineering and in-kind services.

In Re: Heartland Security Grant Funding

Mr. Jonathan Pickett advised the Board that the county recently received notification that 2006 Homeland Security Funds will become available within the next few months, and in order to be eligible for these funds, the County must enter into a "Memorandum of Understanding" with the Virginia Department of Emergency Management. He said funding distribution will be based on actual risk and not on a percapita basis. He added the first year, the County was awarded \$100,000 and the amount granted has gone down each year, with the County receiving \$40,000 last year.

Background

The Governor has appointed the Virginia Department of Emergency Management (VDEM) as the State Administrative Agency (SAA) for coordination of the Homeland Security Grant Programs.

Authority

This Agreement is authorized under the provisions of §§ 44-146.17 and 44-146.18 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.

Purpose

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into between the SAA and (jurisdiction) to address the training, exercises, interoperability, and planning initiatives identified in the 2006 Homeland Security Grant Program (2006-GE-T6-0018) awarded to the Commonwealth of Virginia on July 1, 2006. While the focus of this effort will be response to terrorism or threat of terrorism, an all-hazard perspective will be maintained throughout.

Objective

The Commonwealth's homeland security objective is to protect citizens against the threat of terrorism by detecting, preparing for, preventing, responding to and recovering from terrorist threats or attacks. In fulfilling the objective of this MOU, the parties will meet the intent of the Commonwealth's Homeland Security Strategy, and of the applicable local plans, as well as the homeland security grant requirements. The ultimate objective of this MOU is to satisfy the Department of Homeland Security requirement for all states to be completely National Incident Management System (NIMS) compliant to receive Homeland Security grant funds.

The SAA will accomplish the objectives by offering to local units of government in the Commonwealth projects including but not limited to a statewide exercise contract, the statewide NIMS and terrorism training programs, interoperability initiatives, and statewide planning efforts. The projects will be undertaken at the state level and delivered to local units of governments within the Commonwealth.

Nothing in this Agreement is intended to conflict with current laws or regulations of Virginia or the jurisdiction. If a term of this Agreement is inconsistent with such authority, then that term shall be invalid, but the remaining terms and conditions of this agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

Modification

This Agreement may be modified upon the mutual written consent of the parties.

Termination

The terms of this agreement, as modified with the consent of both parties, will remain in effect until June 30, 2008, in accordance with Award Document, dated July 1, 2006. Either party upon 30 days written notice to the other party may terminate this Agreement.

Source of Funding and Administration

The source of funding to accomplish the objectives is the 2006 Homeland Security Grant Program, CFDA # 97.067 (local share funding from State Homeland Security Program and Law Enforcement Terrorism Prevention Program). These monies will be sufficient to pay for cost of the exercise contract, training programs, and planning activities.

Effect of MOU

This document is not a contract and is not legally enforceable by either party. It does not create enforceable rights in any third party. As such it does not imply or assume any waiver of sovereign immunity by the Commonwealth. It may be terminated without any liability or other consequences by either party at any time upon written notice to the other, in accordance with the provisions of this MOU.

Legal Opinion, Poplar Hill CDA Special Tax Assessment – Mr. Ennis said the question was posed as to whether the County had an obligation to pass a requested special tax assessment for the Poplar Hill Community Development Authority. In reviewing the statutes, he said there is no specific language which addresses that question, but by implication, the statute indicates the CDA may request the assessment. He said it was his opinion that the Board is not legally obligated as it is a request. He said the Board must appropriate the money once it has been collected, meaning it must be voted upon, but there is a risk of violating the Constitution of Virginia if taxes are assessed that are excessive and the funds are not appropriated. He said the theory behind the CDA is to create a public and private partnership which benefits the community and county as a whole, by virtue of speeding up development which increases the tax base and in turn increases revenue to the County. He added that once the CDA has been approved and entered into the agreement, it would defeat the purpose of the CDA to not allow them to honor the special assessment request and fund the construction of the infrastructure which will speed development of the property and enhance the values of the properties by the installation of roads, curbs, gutters and sidewalks, making the property more valuable. He said it is intended to be a partnership to foster development, and makes good economic sense.

Mr. Ward said his concern was not if it was legal to allow the CDA to have a special tax levy, but specifically that Poplar Hill is so far from what had been intended. He asked for the status of the Poplar Hill project, and inquired as to whether Poplar Hill can continue collecting taxes if it consists of private owners, and if so, what infrastructure must be in place.

Mr. Ennis said as the project sells the properties, more of the private owners have to consent to the assessment. Currently there is one property owner and the CDA, but there will be multiple property owners, and until they constitute the majority, Mr. Ennis said the assessment will most likely continue to be requested.
