#### TRANSIENT OCCUPANCY TAX ORDINANCE

\*Cross references: Commissioner of revenue to be administrator of tax imposed by this article,

#### ARTICLE VIII.

#### SECTION 70-183. Violations of article.

Any person violating or failing to comply with any of the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor. Conviction of such violation shall not relieve any person from the payment, collection or remittance of the tax provided for in this article.

Cross references: Penalty for Class 3 misdemeanor. Code of Virginia Sec. 18.2-11

#### SECTION 70-184. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Hotel means any public or private hotel, inn, hostelry, tourist home or house, motel or rooming, boarding or lodging house, or camp ground within the county offering lodging as defined in this section, for compensation, to any transient as defined in this section.

Lodging means the rental of room or space to any transient for compensation, by a hotel as defined in this section, or the occupancy of such room or space by such transient. If the charge made by any hotel to such transient includes any charge for meals, parking or other services or accommodations in addition to lodging or the use of such room or space, then such portion of such total charge as represents only room or space rental shall be distinctly set out and billed to such transient by such hotel as a separate item.

Transient means any person who, for a period of not more than thirty (30) consecutive days, either at his own expense or at the expense of another, obtains lodging for which a charge is made at a hotel, as defined in this section.

Cross references: Definitions and rules of construction generally. Code Sec. 1-2

#### SECTION 70-184 Levied.

There is hereby imposed and levied upon every transient obtaining or occupying lodging within the county, in addition to all other taxes and fees of every kind now imposed by law, a tax equivalent to five (5) percent of the amount charged for such lodging.

State law references: Authority of county to impose tax on transient room rentals. Code of Virginia, Sec. 58.1-3819

#### SECTION 70-185. Exemptions

No tax shall be payable under this article in any of the following instances:

On any charge for lodging in, and during care or treatment in, any hospital, medical clinic, nursing or convalescent home, extended health care facility, sanatorium or sanitarium, home for the aged, infirmed, orphaned, disabled, or mentally retarded or other like facility; or in any educational institution.

#### SECTION 70-186. Collection.

Every person receiving any payment for lodging with respect to which a tax is levied under this article shall collect the amount of such tax so imposed from the transient on whom such tax is levied, or from the person paying for such lodging at the time payment for such lodging is made. The taxes so collected shall be deemed to be held in trust for the county by the person required to collect them, until they have been remitted to the county as provided in this article.

#### SECTION 70-187. Reports and remittances generally.

Every person collecting any tax levied by this article shall make out a report thereof, upon such forms and setting forth such information as the commissioner of revenue may prescribe and require, showing the amount of lodging charges collected and the amount of tax required to be collected thereon, and shall sign and deliver the same to the commissioner together with a remittance of such tax, made payable to the county treasurer. Such reports and remittances shall be made on or before the tenth day of each month, covering the amount of tax collected during the preceding month. All remittances received under this article by the commissioner shall be promptly turned over to the treasurer.

#### SECTION 70-188. Collector's records.

It shall be the duty of every person liable for the collection and remittance of any tax imposed by this article to keep and preserve for a period of two (2) years such suitable records as may be necessary to determine the amount of charges for lodging, and tax thereon as he may have been responsible for collecting and paying to the county. The commissioner of revenue shall have the right to inspect all such records at any reasonable time.

#### SECTION 70-189. Duty of collector going out of business.

Whenever any person required to collect and remit to the county any tax imposed by this article shall cease to operate or otherwise dispose of his business, such tax shall immediately become due and payable, and such person shall forthwith make a report and remittance thereof.

#### SECTION 70-190. Penalty for late remittance.

If any person, whose duty it is to do so, shall fail or refuse to make a report and remit the tax as required by this article within the time and in the amount required, there shall be added to such tax by the commissioner of revenue a penalty in the amount of five (5) percent of such tax, or a minimum of \$2.00, if such failure is for not more than thirty (30) days in duration. In addition thereto, any such tax not fully paid within said thirty days shall bear interest at the rate of ten (10) percent per annum until paid in full.

#### SECTION 70-191 Procedure upon failure to collect, report, etc.

- (a) If any person, whose duty it is to do so, shall fail or refuse to collect the tax imposed under this article and make timely report and remittance thereof, the commissioner of revenue shall proceed in such manner as is practicable to obtain facts and information on which to base an estimate of the tax due. As soon as the commissioner has procured such facts and information as may be obtainable, upon which to base the assessment of any tax payable by any person who has failed to collect, report or remit such tax, the commissioner shall proceed to determine and assess against such person the tax, penalty and interest provided in this article, and shall notify such person by registered mail sent to his last known address, of the amount of such tax, penalty and interest, and the total amount thereof shall be payable within ten (10) days from the date such notice is sent.
- (b) It shall be the duty of the commissioner of revenue to ascertain the name of every person operating a hotel in the county, liable for the collection of the tax imposed by this article, who fails, refuses or neglects to collect such tax or to make the reports and remittances required by this article. The commissioner may have issued a summons for such person, which summons may be served upon such person by any county police officer in the manner provided by law, and one (1) return of the original thereof shall be made to the general district court for the county.

#### INTRODUCTION

The Strategic Plan for 2007 – 2011 will guide the direction of the Prince Edward School division in the coming years. This document is a comprehensive short and long range plan for improving the achievement of all students and establishes a strong culture and collaboration between schools and parents.

This will be accomplished by six main goals:

- 1. Improve academic achievement for all students while closing the achievement gap
- 2. Build capacity of the school division through an infrastructure of support and for teaching and learning
- 3. Provide strong home, school, business and community engagement that supports student achievement
- 4. Establish and maintain school facilities that are safe, orderly, nurturing and supportive of quality teaching and learning
- 5. Hire, support and retain highly qualified teachers and staff
- 6. Establish a positive, healthy and inviting school culture conducive to learning

The Strategic Plan is built on a thorough analysis of the regional division needs, expectations for student achievement input from the community and direction from the chool board. It is intended to be a road map and guide for the leadership team of the school division, teachers, staff and community as they work towards creating the best environment and implementing best practices for student achievement. The strategic plan is important for the following reasons:

- First, it is the vision that guides the work of the school division and the community's dedication of expectations for the schools.
- Second, it is a statement of accountability. We are establishing a focus, priorities, targets and expected results for the school board and the entire school division staff.
- Third, it provides direction for the future. It establishes how Prince Edward County Public Schools will evolve in the next year. The strategic goals, objectives and strategies were developed with the intention of responding to the changes of society. It is a dynamic document. Also, on a regular basis it will be reviewed to determine if we are accomplishing our objectives and revisions will be made.

#### **Community Input and Assessment of the School Division Needs**

In October of 2006, the Superintendent of schools conducted two community forums to obtain feedback form all stakeholders. In each community forum, members of the community described their vision for the Prince Edward Public Schools. As a result of the two community forums and analysis of the school division data, six critical areas emerged:

- Academic Achievement
- Parent/Community Engagement
- Safe Schools
- Retention of Teachers
- Healthy/Prescriptive and Inviting School Culture
- Infrastructure of support for Teaching and Learning

These six cultural areas were then presented to the School Board who in collaboration with the Superintendent and administrative team finalize the six major goals for the strategic plan.

#### **Development of the Strategic Plan**

The strategic planning process is an opportunity for citizens, parents, the business community, school division employees and students to connect their vision for Prince Edward County Public Schools with what actually will happen in the classroom and programs. The strategic plan is a road map to guide, direct and shape the future of this school division over the next few years.

For several months, the central office staff, teachers and support staff worked together to identify objectives, strategies, timelines/and specific outcomes. The process for development of the strategic plan included the following eight phases:

Phase I: Building and Reaffirming the Vision and Goals:

 School Board Provides strategic planning input regarding school division goals, objectives and values at its July retreat. (July 2006)

Phase II: Gathering of Data

- Superintendent formulates priorities for a quality education and outlines instructional priorities. (August-September 2006)
- Different departments in the district initiate the collection of data. (September October 2006)

Phase III: Gathering Community Input

- Two/Focus community groups are planned for the purpose of obtaining input regarding the vision for the school division. (October 2006)
- Input from teachers regarding the vision for the school division will be obtained through the Superintendent's Advisory Council. (November 2006)

Phase IV: Analysis of Data

• The different departments will analyze data, identify key issues, and provide research data. (October – November 2006)

Phase V: Establish Priorities:

The board and superintendent will meet to establish priorities. (November 2006)

Phase VI: Development of Committees:

• Committees will be established to prepare action plan. (November 2006)

Phase VII: Development of Action Plan:

 Committees prepare a preliminary report of Strategic Plan for School Board review. (December 2006 – January 2007)

Phase VIII: Presenting Strategic Plan:

• Strategic Plan is presented to the Board for approval. (February 2007)

#### Monitoring of the Strategic Plan

An important aspect of the strategic plan deals with the specific monitoring and assessment of the strategic plan. This process will ensure that the strategic plan remains current and that we are accountable to the community. Annually, the Superintendent and the central office staff will assess the following:

HISTORIC PROSPECT DEPOT

Attached for your consideration is a copy of a grant contract between the County and VDOT for a third Transportation Enhancement Grant in the amount of \$63,000 that has been awarded to the Prospect Historical Society. This grant award requires a 20% local match from the Historical Society and will be used for the renovation of the Historic Prospect Depot. As you may recall, the Prospect Historical Society has received two previous grants totaling \$250,000.

VDOT requires that the County serve as the fiscal agent for the project and the grant contract stipulates that the County is responsible for the 20% matching funds. Originally, the Historical Society was planning to use a land donation from Norfolk Southern as its 20% match. However, it is my understanding that in light of the land donation by Norfolk Southern to the Commonwealth of Virginia for High Bridge Trail State Park that the Historical Society and Virginia State Parks now intend to work together on this grant and negotiate a mutual use agreement for the Depot. (The Historical Society owns the depot building, and the Commonwealth of Virginia owns the land on which the building is located.)

In December 2001, the Board approved the original grant agreement between the County and VDOT. At that time the Board placed two stipulations on its approval of the grant contract: (1) the Prospect Historical Society could not incur any costs prior to securing land from Norfolk Southern Corporation; and (2) the County will not approve any reimbursement requests until the land was appraised and its value approved by VDOT for the 20% grant match.

Due to the change in the land ownership and should the Board wish to proceed with approving the third grant contract, it may wish to consider the following actions:

- 1. Approve the contract with VDOT and authorize the Chairman and/or County Administrator to sign all necessary grant contracts;
- 2. Stipulate that the Prospect Historical Society may not incur any expenses for which it will request reimbursement from VDOT, until such time as an agreement with Virginia State Parks has been executed to provide for required the 20% matching funds.

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of Prince Edward County, Virginia (hereinafter referred to as "County"), is the owner of certain property located in the Town of Farmville, Prince Edward County, Virginia, and shown on the attached drawing; and

WHEREAS, the Trustees of the Farmville Baptist Church, Farmville, Virginia, (hereinafter referred to as "Church") are the record owners of certain property located adjacent to the property of the County and shown on the attached drawing; and

WHEREAS, the County and the Church desire to establish their respective rights and obligations associated with their joint use of these properties as parking areas.

#### WITNESSETH:

THAT FOR AND CONSIDERATION of the mutual covenants and agreements contained herein and other good and valuable consideration, the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged, the County and the Church agree as follows:

- 1. The layout of the spaces in the two parking areas shall be as shown on the attached drawing.
- 2. The Church shall have exclusive use of the parking spaces numbered 1 through 16 inclusive as shown on the attached drawing.
- 3. The County shall have the exclusive use of the parking spaces numbered 41 through 52 inclusive, 63 through 69 inclusive, 73 and 74 as shown on the attached drawing.
- 4. Parking spaces numbered 61, 62, and 70 through 72 inclusive shall be designated as handicap spaces as shown on the attached drawing.
- 5. All other spaces not allocated in Paragraphs 2, 3 and 4 above shall be available for use by the general public for Courthouse business only from Monday to Friday inclusive.
- 6. The Church shall notify the County at least three days in advance of special events occurring at the Church Monday through Friday inclusive which will require the Church to close off its parking lot for exclusive use by the Church.

- 7. Traffic flow patterns shall be as shown on the attached drawing, however, the Church reserves the right to change the traffic pattern on its portion of the parking lot for special events.
- 8. The parties hereby agree on behalf of themselves, personal representatives, successors, and assigns, to maintain said parking lot and to perform repairs so as to maintain the parking lot in good and safe condition in accordance with standards set forth below. The parties hereby agree to share in the cost of such maintenance and repair on the following basis: the County shall be responsible for eighty percent (80%) of the costs of said repairs and the Church shall be responsible for twenty percent (20%) of the costs of said repairs; provided, however, that in the event a party's agent or business or professional invitee causes damages to the parking lot other than ordinary wear and tear, said party shall be required to repair such damage and bear the cost thereof exclusively.
- 9. The terms "maintenance" and "repair" shall include, but not be limited to, repairing the parking lot surface, clearing obstructions, grading or scraping the parking lot as necessary, removing snow, unplugging or opening culverts or drainpipes, and performing any and all other necessary work required to maintain the parking lot in a condition that will allow for the reasonable and safe access of standard passenger vehicles.
- 10. The County will be responsible for routine snow removal on the entire parking lot, which will occur at the earliest possible time, including weekends.
- 11. There shall be no obligation on the undersigned to upgrade the parking lot to a superior condition then exists on the date of completion of the improvements; provided, however, that any party shall have the right to upgrade said parking lot to a superior condition at such party's sole expense.
- 12. Each party hereby grants to the other parties hereto a temporary construction easement across the lot owned by such party for the purpose of maintaining, repairing, or upgrading the parking lot, as provided for in this agreement.
- 13. This Agreement shall be in effect for a period of three (3) years and shall be renewable for additional three (3) year terms unless otherwise amended or cancelled.
- 14. This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties pertaining to the subject matter contained in it and supersedes all prior and contemporaneous agreements, representations, and understandings of the parties. No supplement, modification, or amendment of this Agreement shall be binding unless executed in writing by all parties hereto. No waiver of any of the provisions of the Agreement will be deemed, or will constitute, a waiver of any other provisions, whether or not similar, nor will any waiver constitute a continuing waiver. No waiver will be binding unless executed in writing by the party making the waiver.

- 15. The terms of this Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto, their successors and assigns, and their heirs and legal representatives.
- 16. All notices, demands or other communications given under this Agreement shall be in writing, and shall be either hand delivered or mailed to the address of each party as set forth below, said mailing to be by certified United States government mail notice to be effective upon such delivery or mailing.

#### ARTICLE I. IN GENERAL

#### Sec. 10-1. Adoption of state comprehensive animal laws.

The provisions of *Code of Virginia* of 1950, § 3.1-796.66 et seq., are adopted and made a part of this chapter as fully as though set forth in this section.

#### **DIVISION 1. CONTAINMENT OF LIVESTOCK**

# Sec. 10-2. Purposes; legislative authority.

- (a) The purpose of this division is to provide for the containment of livestock in the county and to prescribe the penalties for its violation.
  - (b) This division is adopted under the provisions of Code of Virginia, § 55-310, et. seq.

# Sec. 10-3. Lawful fence.

(a) The boundary line of each lot or tract of land or any stream in the county shall be a lawful fence as to any livestock domesticated by man.

- (b) It shall be unlawful for any person who is the owner or manager of any livestock domesticated by man to permit any such livestock, as to which the boundaries of lots or tracts of land have been constituted a legal fence, to run at large beyond the limits of his own lands within the county; and such animal shall be deemed to be running at large while roaming or running off the property, whether owned or rented, of its owner or manager, and not under their owner's or manager's immediate control.
- (c) Any such owner or manager, after having been notified by an officer of the law that such animal is running at large, permits such animal to continue to run at large, shall be deemed to have violated this section and shall be guilty of a Class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

#### **DIVISION 2. MISCELLANEOUS ANIMAL REGULATIONS**

# Sec. 10-16. Killing of coyotes permitted; bounty established; procedures for claims.

- (a) The killing coyotes within the boundaries of the county is hereby authorized for bounties upon the following conditions: A bounty of \$50.00 shall be paid by the county, from available funds, for each coyote killed within the boundaries of the county.
- (b) All payments shall be contingent upon the furnishing of such identifying information as requested by the county's designated agent (county animal control). The board of supervisors shall be the approving authority for payment of all claims presented.
- (c) Available funds not to exceed \$2,500.00. The total amount of bounties to be paid under this division shall not exceed the sum of \$2,500.00 per calendar year, except by additional appropriation by the board.
- (d) Unlawful acts; penalties. It shall be unlawful for any person to present a false claim or to receive any money on a false claim under this division, which act shall constituted a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

# ARTICLE II. ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS

# Sec. 10-56. Position created.

The Animal Control Officer shall discharge the duties provided for in *Code of Virginia*§ 3.1-796.66, et seq., and such other duties as are provided in this chapter. The Animal Control Officer(s) shall be paid as the Board of Supervisors may determine.

#### ARTICLE III. DOGS

#### **DIVISION 1. GENERALLY**

# Sec. 10-91. Disposal of dead dogs.

The owner of any dog which has died from disease or other cause shall forthwith cremate or bury and dispose of the dog. If after notice any owner fails to do so, the animal control officer or other officer shall bury or cremate the dog; and he may recover on behalf of the county from the owner the cost of his service.

#### Sec. 10-92. Unlawful acts.

The following shall be deemed unlawful acts the violation of which shall be a Class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§

- 3.1-796.128, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section:
- (1) Diseased dogs. For the owner of any dog with a contagious or infectious disease to permit such dog to stray from his premises if such disease is known to the owner.
- (2) Female dog in season. For the owner of any female dog to permit such dog to stray from his premises while such dog is known to such owner to be in season.
- (3) Removing collar and tag. For any person except the owner or custodian to remove a legally acquired license tag from a dog without the permission of the owner or custodian.
- (4) Concealing a dog. For any person to conceal or harbor any dog for which the license tax has not been paid or to conceal a vicious or dangerous to prevent the same from being destroyed.

#### **DIVISION 2. LICENSE TAX**

#### Sec. 10-111. Unlicensed dogs prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person to own a dog four months or older unless such dog is licensed as required by the provisions Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.85, and this division. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of *Code of Virginia*, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

#### Sec. 10-112. How to obtain license.

Dogs shall be licensed as provided by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.86, by reference, which section is adopted and made a part of this chapter by reference as fully as though set forth at length in this section.

#### Sec. 10-113. Amount of license tax.

(a) Pursuant to the authority of Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.87, any person licensing a dog in the county shall pay an annual license tax on the ownership of the dog according to the following schedule:

Male dog. . . \$10.00 Unsexed (castrated) male dog . . . \$5.00 Female dog . . . \$10.00 Unsexed (spayed) female dog . . . \$5.00

(b) No license tax shall be levied on a guide dog for a blind person, service dog or dogs under four months of age.

#### Sec. 10-114. Kennel license tax.

The tax for a licensed kennel shall be according to the following schedule:

5--20 dogs . . . \$35.00 Over--20 dogs . . . \$50.00

# Sec. 10-115. When license tax payable.

The license tax imposed by this division shall be payable to the treasurer of the county, as required by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.88, which section is adopted and made a part of this chapter as fully as though set forth at length in this section.

#### Sec. 10-116. Effect of dog not wearing collar as evidence.

Any dog not wearing a collar bearing a license tag of the proper calendar year shall prima facie be deemed to be unlicensed and a stray; and in any proceedings under this division, the

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burden of proof of the fact that such dog has been licensed or is otherwise not required to bear a tag at the time shall be on the owner of the dog.

#### Sec. 10-117. What dog license shall consist of.

The county dog license shall consist of a license receipt and a metal tag. The tag shall be stamped or otherwise permanently marked to show the jurisdiction issuing the license, the sex of the dog and the calendar year for which issued, and shall bear a serial number.

#### Sec. 10-118. Duplicate license tags.

Duplicate license tags shall be obtained by the owner of a dog as provided by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.91, which section is adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

# Sec. 10-119. Displaying receipts; dogs to wear tags.

Dog license receipts shall be displayed and dog license tags shall be worn as required by Code of Virginia, § 3.1-796.92.

#### Sec. 10-120. Payment of license tax subsequent to summons.

Payment of the license tax subsequent to a summons to appear before the general district court or other court for failure to do so within the time required shall not operate to relieve such owner of the penalties provided.

#### **DIVISION 3. RABIES CONTROL**

#### Sec. 10-141. Vaccination required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to own a dog or domesticated cat, age four months or older unless such dog or cat has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises. No license tags shall be issued for any dog unless there is presented to the treasurer at the time application for license is made evidence satisfactory to the treasurer, showing that such dog has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises, and that such inoculation or vaccination remains valid for the time application for license is made. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

#### Sec. 10-142. Rabies clinic authorized.

The board of supervisors finding that the number of resident veterinarians is inadequate to meet the need, the county health department shall provide a rabies clinic at least once per year.

#### Sec. 10-143. Dogs or cats not vaccinated.

Any dog or cat found in the county not vaccinated and identified as described in this subdivision shall be impounded by the animal control officer, and such dogs shall be held for a period of five days. The dog or cat may be returned to its owner upon proof of ownership, vaccination of the dog or cat, and payment of the cost of impounding the dog or cat at usual rates, and payment of any fines assessed under the provisions of this division. At the expiration of the five-day period, any dog or cat not so claimed by its owner may disposed of by giving it into the

possession of any person willing to pay the cost of impounding, vaccination and license. If not so disposed of, the dog or cat shall be euthanized in an humane manner by the impounding officer or other designated official.

# Sec. 10-144. Quarantine authorized.

When the board of supervisors finds that there is sufficient reason to believe that a rabid animal is at large, the board shall have the power to pass an emergency ordinance requiring all owners of all dogs in the county to keep the dogs confined on their premises, and may further adopt such ordinances, regulations or other measures as it may deem reasonably necessary to prevent the spread within the county of the disease of rabies.

# **DIVISION 4. RUNNING AT LARGE**

#### Sec. 10-166. Prohibited.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any dog, belonging to him or under his control, to run at large in the county at any time from March 1 to August 31. For the purpose of this division, a dog shall be deemed to be running at large while roaming or running or self-hunting off the property of its owner or custodian and not under the owner's or custodians' immediate control. Any person, after having been notified by any animal control officer or law enforcement officer that the dog is running at large, who is the owner or custodian of the dog thereafter found running at large shall be deemed to have violated the provisions of this section.
- (b) This section shall not apply to any person or persons while engaging in the following activities:
  - (1) Lawful hunting with a dog or dogs;
  - (2) Law enforcement or search and rescue activity;
  - (3) A supervised formal obedience training class or show;
  - (4) Formally sanctioned field trials; or
  - (5) Bona fide hunting or field trial dog training.
- (c) A violation of this section shall constitute a Class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of *Code of Virginia*, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section; however, if the dog is a dangerous or vicious dog, a violation of this section shall constitute a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of *Code of Virginia*, §§ 3.1-796.128, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.
- (d) Should the animal control officer or any law enforcement officer have reason to believe that any dog found running at large is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person, such officer may order the confinement of such animal by delivering a confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal and any person who thereafter permits such animal to run at large or remain unconfined, unrestricted or not penned up shall be deemed to have violated this section. Should the animal not be confined within six hours after the delivery of the confinement order or should the animal control officer or other officer, after due diligence, be unable to deliver the confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal, the animal control officer or any other law enforcement officer shall impound any such dog pursuant to the provision of section 6-197. Upon the issuance of the confinement order, or the impoundment of such animal to appear in the general district court of the county where the matter shall be heard on criminal warrants and the animal shall remain confined until the final disposition of the court proceeding; However, for the purposes of this section the owner or custodian of such dog shall be conclusively presumed to have known the dog to be vicious or destructive if at any time prior to



the running at large of such animal the owner or custodian has received from any person a complaint that the animal is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person.

# Sec. 10-167. Unlicensed dogs prohibited.

The running at large of dogs not duly licensed and displaying tags pursuant to the provisions of this article is prohibited.

# **DIVISION 5. IMPOUNDMENT**

# Sec. 10-196. County dog pound.

The animal control officer shall cause to be maintained a pound or enclosure as required by *Code of Virginia*, § 3.1-796.96.

# Sec. 10-197. Confinement and disposition of dogs.

It shall be the duty of the animal control officer to confine and dispose of dogs pursuant to provisions of *Code of Virginia*, § 3.1-796.66 et seq.

#### Sec. 10-198. Fees for confinement.

The legal owner of any dog seized and confined by the animal control officer shall pay to the animal control officer a charge for the confinement of the dog, the amount of such charge to be in accordance with the fees established by the board of supervisors. All fees received by the animal control officer shall be paid over to the county treasurer.

#### Sec. 10-199. Unlicensed dogs.

- (a) It shall be the duty of the animal control officer, or any other officer, to capture and impound any companion animal found running at large on which the license tax has not been paid. A reasonable effort will be made to find the owner. After five days, if the owner is not found, the animal shall be declared abandoned. If the owner is known, the animal will be held an additional five days. The provisions of *Code of Virginia*, § 3.1-796.96 shall apply where applicable to the disposition of the dog. Any person, animal control officer or other officer euthanizing a dog under this chapter shall cremate, bury or sanitarily dispose of the dog. Prior to the disposition by euthanasia or otherwise, all of the provisions of *Code of Virginia*, § 3.1-796.66 et seq., shall have been complied with.
- (b) If the animal control officer or other officer exercises his option to deliver such dog to any person in his jurisdiction who will pay the required license tax and cost on such dog, the person accepting delivery of such dog shall, within five days after such delivery, furnish to the animal control officer evidence of the inoculation and licensing of such dog as required by this article; and the failure to provide such evidence shall be a violation of this article and shall constitute a separate offense.

#### **DIVISION 6. DAMAGE BY DOGS**

# Sec. 10-221. Disposition of funds.

The treasurer shall keep all money collected by him for dog licenses in a separate account as part of the general fund; and such funds shall be used for the purposes designated by *Code of Virginia*, § 3.1-796.101, which section is adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

Sec. 10-222. Compensation for livestock and poultry killed or injured by dogs.

- (a) Any person who has any livestock or poultry killed or injured by any dog not his own in the county shall be entitled to receive as compensation the fair market value of such livestock or poultry not to exceed \$400.00 per animal or \$10.00 per fowl, provided that:
  - (1) Within 72 hours of discovery of the death or injury, the claimant gives notice of the incident to the animal control officer.
  - (2) Within 60 days of the discovery of the death or injury, the claimant shall furnish such evidence of the quantity and value of the dead or injured livestock or poultry and the reasons the claimant believes that death or injury was caused by a dog to the board of supervisors.
  - (3) The claimant first has exhausted his legal remedies against the owner, if known, of the dog doing the damage for which compensation under this section is sought. Exhaustion shall mean a judgment against the owner of the dog upon which execution has returned unsatisfied.
- (b) Upon a determination by the board that a claim meets the criteria set forth in this section for compensation, the board shall approve the same and forward the approval to the treasurer. Upon payment under this section, the board shall be surrogated to the extent of compensation paid to the right of action to the owner of the livestock or poultry against the owner of the dog and may enforce such compensation in an appropriate action at law.

#### DIVISION 6. DANGEROUS OR VICIOUS DOGS

# Sec. 10-246. Control of dangerous or vicious dogs; penalties.

(a) As used in this section:

"Dangerous dog" means a canine or canine crossbreed that has bitten, attacked, or inflicted injury on a person or companion animal that is a dog or cat, or killed a companion animal that is a dog or cat. However, when a dog attacks or bites a companion animal that is a dog or cat, the attacking or biting dog shall not be deemed dangerous (i) if no serious physical injury as determined by a licensed veterinarian has occurred to the dog or cat as a result of the attack or bite, (ii) if both animals are owned by the same person, (iii) if such attack occurs on the property of the attacking or biting dog's owner or custodian, or (iv) for other good cause as determined by the court. No dog shall be found to be a dangerous dog as a result of biting, attacking, or inflicting injury on a dog or cat while engaged with an owner or custodian as part of lawful hunting or participating in an organized, lawful dog handling event.

"Vicious dog" means a canine or canine crossbreed that has (i) killed a person; (ii) inflicted serious injury to a person, including multiple bites, serious disfigurement, serious impairment of health, or serious impairment of a bodily function; or (iii) continued to exhibit the behavior that resulted in a previous finding by a court or, on or before July 1, 2006, by an animal control officer as authorized by local ordinance, that it is a dangerous dog, provided that its owner has been given notice of that finding.

(b) Any law-enforcement officer or animal control officer who has reason to believe that a canine or canine crossbreed within his jurisdiction is a dangerous dog or vicious dog shall apply to a magistrate of the jurisdiction for the issuance of a summons requiring the owner or custodian, if known, to appear before a general district court at a specified time. The summons shall advise the owner of the nature of the proceeding and the matters at issue. If a law-enforcement officer successfully makes an application for the issuance of a summons, he shall contact the local animal control officer and inform him of the location of the dog and the relevant facts pertaining to his belief that the dog is dangerous or vicious. The animal control officer shall confine the animal until such time as evidence shall be heard and a verdict rendered. If the animal control officer determines that the owner or custodian can confine the animal in a manner that protects the public safety, he may permit the owner or custodian to confine the animal until such time as evidence shall be heard and a verdict rendered. The court, through its contempt powers, may

compel the owner, custodian or harborer of the animal to produce the animal. If, after hearing the evidence, the court finds that the animal is a dangerous dog, the court shall order the animal's owner to comply with the provisions of this section. If, after hearing the evidence, the court finds that the animal is a vicious dog, the court shall order the animal euthanized in accordance with the provisions of § 3.1-796.119 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended. The procedure for appeal and trial shall be the same as provided by law for misdemeanors. Trial by jury shall be as provided in Article 4 (§ 19.2-260 et seq.) of Chapter 15 of Title 19.2 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended. The Commonwealth shall be required to prove its case beyond a reasonable doubt.

- (c) No canine or canine crossbreed shall be found to be a dangerous dog or vicious dog solely because it is a particular breed, nor is the ownership of a particular breed of canine or canine crossbreed prohibited. No animal shall be found to be a dangerous dog or vicious dog if the threat, injury or damage was sustained by a person who was (i) committing, at the time, a crime upon the premises occupied by the animal's owner or custodian, (ii) committing, at the time, a willful trespass upon the premises occupied by the animal's owner or custodian, or (iii) provoking, tormenting, or physically abusing the animal, or can be shown to have repeatedly provoked, tormented, abused, or assaulted the animal at other times. No police dog that was engaged in the performance of its duties as such at the time of the acts complained of, was responding to pain or injury, or was protecting itself, its kennel, its offspring, a person, or its owner's or custodian's property, shall be found to be a dangerous dog or a vicious dog.
- (d) If the owner of an animal found to be a dangerous dog is a minor, the custodial parent or legal guardian shall be responsible for complying with all requirements of this section.
- (e) The owner of any animal found to be a dangerous dog shall, within 10 days of such finding, obtain a dangerous dog registration certificate from the local animal control officer or treasurer for a fee of \$50, in addition to other fees that may be authorized by law. The local animal control officer or treasurer shall also provide the owner with a uniformly designed tag that identifies the animal as a dangerous dog. The owner shall affix the tag to the animal's collar and ensure that the animal wears the collar and tag at all times. All certificates obtained pursuant to this subsection shall be renewed annually for the same fee and in the same manner as the initial certificate was obtained. The animal control officer shall provide a copy of the dangerous dog registration certificate and verification of compliance to the State Veterinarian.
- (f) All dangerous dog registration certificates or renewals thereof required to be obtained under this section shall only be issued to persons 18 years of age or older who present satisfactory evidence (i) of the animal's current rabies vaccination, if applicable, (ii) that the animal has been neutered or spayed, and (iii) that the animal is and will be confined in a proper enclosure or is and will be confined inside the owner's residence or is and will be muzzled and confined in the owner's fenced-in yard until the proper enclosure is constructed. In addition, owners who apply for certificates or renewals thereof under this section shall not be issued a certificate or renewal thereof unless they present satisfactory evidence that (i) their residence is and will continue to be posted with clearly visible signs warning both minors and adults of the presence of a dangerous dog on the property and (ii) the animal has been permanently identified by means of a tattoo on the inside thigh or by electronic implantation. All certificates or renewals thereof required to be obtained under this section shall only be issued to persons who present satisfactory evidence that the owner has liability insurance coverage, to the value of at least \$100,000, which covers animal bites. The owner may obtain and maintain a bond in surety, in lieu of liability insurance, to the value of at least \$100,000.
- (g) While on the property of its owner, an animal found to be a dangerous dog shall be confined indoors or in a securely enclosed and locked structure of sufficient height and design to prevent its escape or direct contact with or entry by minors, adults, or other animals. The structure shall be designed to provide the animal with shelter from the elements of nature. When off its

owner's property, an animal found to be a dangerous dog shall be kept on a leash and muzzled in such a manner as not to cause injury to the animal or interfere with the animal's vision or respiration, but so as to prevent it from biting a person or another animal.

(h) The owner of any dog found to be dangerous shall register the animal with the Commonwealth of Virginia Dangerous Dog Registry, as established under § 3.1-796.93:3 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended, within 45 days of such a finding by a court of competent jurisdiction.

The owner shall also cause the local animal control officer to be promptly notified of (i) the names, addresses, and telephone numbers of all owners; (ii) all of the means necessary to locate the owner and the dog at any time; (iii) any complaints or incidents of attack by the dog upon any person or cat or dog; (iv) any claims made or lawsuits brought as a result of any attack; (v) tattoo or chip identification information or both; (vi) proof of insurance or surety bond; and (vii) the death of the dog.

- (i) After an animal has been found to be a dangerous dog, the animal's owner shall immediately, upon learning of same, cause the local animal control authority to be notified if the animal (i) is loose or unconfined; or (ii) bites a person or attacks another animal; or (iii) is sold, given away, or dies. Any owner of a dangerous dog who relocates to a new address shall, within 10 days of relocating, provide written notice to the appropriate local animal control authority for the old address from which the animal has moved and the new address to which the animal has been moved.
  - (j) Any owner or custodian of a canine or canine crossbreed or other animal is guilty of a:
  - 1. Class 2 misdemeanor if the canine or canine crossbreed previously declared a dangerous dog pursuant to this section, when such declaration arose out of a separate and distinct incident, attacks and injures or kills a cat or dog that is a companion animal belonging to another person;
  - 2. Class 1 misdemeanor if the canine or canine crossbreed previously declared a dangerous dog pursuant to this section, when such declaration arose out of a separate and distinct incident, bites a human being or attacks a human being causing bodily injury; or
  - 3. Class 6 felony if any owner or custodian whose willful act or omission in the care, control, or containment of a canine, canine crossbreed, or other animal is so gross, wanton, and culpable as to show a reckless disregard for human life, and is the proximate cause of such dog or other animal attacking and causing serious bodily injury to any person.

The provisions of this subsection shall not apply to any animal that, at the time of the acts complained of, was responding to pain or injury, or was protecting itself, its kennel, its offspring, a person, or its owner's or custodian's property, or when the animal is a police dog that is engaged in the performance of its duties at the time of the attack.

- (k) The owner of any animal that has been found to be a dangerous dog who willfully fails to comply with the requirements of this section is guilty of a Class 1 misdemeanor.
- (l) All fees collected pursuant to this section, less the costs incurred by the animal control authority in producing and distributing the certificates and tags required by this section, shall be paid into a special dedicated fund in the treasury of the locality for the purpose of paying the expenses of any training course required under § 3.1-796.104:1 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.

#### ARTICLE VI. WILD OR EXOTIC ANIMALS

#### Sec. 10-301. Display or exhibition.

No person shall keep or permit to be kept on his premises any wild or exotic animal for display or for exhibition purposes, whether gratuitously or for a fee. This section shall not be construed to apply to zoological parks, performing animal exhibitions, circuses or veterinary

clinics which are properly licensed by the federal government or Commonwealth of Virginia. In no case, however, shall such wild or exotic animals be exhibited or displayed in such a manner that persons other than their handlers can pet, fondle or otherwise come in direct physical contact with such animals.

# Sec. 10-302. Keeping as a pet.

No person shall keep or permit to be kept any wild or exotic animal as a pet.

# Sec. 10-303. Notice required at place of sale.

Any person, who offers for sale a wild or exotic animal, as defined by Section 4-1 of this chapter, shall post conspicuously at the place of sale or display the following notice:

"No person may lawfully keep or permit to be kept in Prince Edward County any live monkey (nonhuman primate), raccoon, skunk, wolf, squirrel, fox, leopard, panther, tiger, lion, lynx or any other warm-blooded animal, poisonous snake or tarantula, crocodile or alligator, which can normally be found in the wild state or any other member of the crocodilian, including but not limited to alligators, crocodiles, caimans and gavials."

# Sec. 10-304. Penalty.

Any person violating any of the provisions of this article shall be deemed guilty of a Class 3 misdemeanor. Each day a violation of this article shall continue constitutes a separate offense.

#### Sec. 10-305. Enforcement.

The provisions of this article shall be enforced by the animal control officer or other officer as provided in § 3.1-796.104 of the *Code of Virginia*, 1950, as amended.

#### Sec. 10-306. Effective date.

- (a) Any person who keeps a wild or exotic animal in contravention of this article may dispose of the animal by removal of the animal from the county, by giving or selling the animal to a zoological park, or by releasing the animal to the animal control officer. The animal control officer is authorized to release the animal to the wild, to a zoological park, or to a responsible adult, or euthanize the animal, if the circumstances warrant.
- (b) This article shall be effective immediately; provided, that any person currently keeping any wild or exotic animals in the county shall dispose of same within five (5) years of the date of adoption of this article; and provided further, that such wild animals shall be registered with the animal control officer within sixty (60) days from the date of adoption of this article.

#### ARTICLE V. HYBRID CANINE.

### Section 10-401 Definitions. As used in this article:

- 1. "Hybrid canine" means any animal which at any time has been or is permitted, licensed registered, or otherwise described or represented as a hybrid canine, wolf or coyote by its owner to a licensed veterinarian, law enforcement officer, animal control officer, humane investigator, official of the Department of Health, or representative of the State Veterinarian.
- 2. "Adequate confinement" means that, while on the property of its owner and not under the direct supervision and control of the owner or custodian, a hybrid canine shall be confined in a humane manner in a securely enclosed and locked structure of sufficient height and design to (i) prevent the animal's escape; or if the hybrid canine is determined to be a dangerous dog pursuant to § 3.1-796.93:1, the structure shall prevent direct contact with any person or animal not authorized by the owner to be in direct contact with the hybrid canine, and (ii) provide a minimum of 100 square feet of floor space for each adult animal. Tethering of a hybrid canine not

under the direct supervision and control of the owner or custodian shall not be considered adequate confinement.

- 3. "Responsible ownership" means the ownership and humane care of a hybrid canine in such a manner as to comply with all laws and ordinances regarding hybrid canines and prevent endangerment by the animal to public health and safety.
- 4. "Owner" means any person who (a) has a right or property in an animal, (b) keeps or harbors an animal, (c) has an animal in his care, or (d) acts as a custodian of an animal.

# Section 10-402. Hybrid canine ordinance; penalty.

- 1. It shall be unlawful for the owner or custodian to allow any hybrid canine to run at large in the country during the period of January 1 through December 31 inclusive of any year. For the purpose of this section, a hybrid canine shall be deemed to be running at large while outside of any pen or enclosure as provided in subsection 2 of this section, however, any owner or custodian of a hybrid canine may be allowed to remove a hybrid canine from any pen or enclosure for purposes of transportation to another pen or enclosure or for the purpose of obtaining medical attention. In no event shall any hybrid canine be allowed to be set free on any property within the county whether or not the hybrid canine is under its owner's or custodian's immediate control.
- 2. It shall be unlawful to own or possess a hybrid canine unless such hybrid canine is kept and maintained in a pen or enclosure as follows:
- (a) The pen or enclosure shall contain at least 200 square feet of space per adult hybrid canine.
- (b) Any fencing used in the construction of the pen or enclosure shall be at least eight (8) feet in height with an additional overhang of fencing or barbed wire angling a minimum of three (3) feet into the pen or enclosure. Such wire enclosure shall be of such strength as to prevent the escape of any hybrid canine enclosed therein.
- (c) To prevent digging out along the fence, concrete footers at least one (1) foot wide and six (6) inches deep shall be installed along the perimeter of the pen or enclosure or a wire footing of 12-gauge wire buried six (6) inches in the ground with at least three feet of wire on the inside of the pen or enclosure, bending the remaining one (1) foot of wire up in a 90° angle and connect every six (6) inches to the bottom outside of the pen or enclosure.
- (d) The pen or enclosure shall provide shelter which affords complete protection from all elements of nature.
- (e) A violation of this ordinance shall be a Class 3 misdemeanor for the first violation and a Class 1 misdemeanor for any second or subsequent offense. Upon a conviction of a second violation of this ordinance, the owner shall surrender the hybrid canine to the animal control officer for euthanasia in accordance with § 3.1-796.119 of the *Code of Virginia*, 1950, as amended.

AMENDMENTS TO COUNTY PERSONNEL POLICY

At its February meeting, the Board requested that staff draft three revisions to the County Personnel Policy. The referenced sections of the Personnel Policy are attached.

Below is the proposed new language for the Personnel Policy:

1. Section 1.4(A) 3

Employees specifically exempted by actions of the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors, as follows: County

Administrator.

2. Section 4.10(B) 2

Non-exempt employees who work approved overtime shall receive compensatory time off at the rate of one and one-half (1½) for each hour worked. The maximum accrual of

compensatory time shall be 40 hours.

3. Section 4.10(B) 4

Department directors shall take all necessary actions to allow employees to use their accrued compensatory time. Department directors are also responsible for ensuring that an employee under his/her supervision does not accrue more than 40 hours of

compensatory time.

Board action is requested.

Attachment

B. This Manual is intended to address most personnel situations and actions for which the County Administrator is responsible. However, those situations not specifically covered shall be interpreted and acted upon by the County Administrator in keeping with the intent of these policies and procedures.

# 1.4 SCOPE

#1

- A. These policies and procedures shall apply to all departments, positions and employees of Prince Edward County except for the following groups:
  - 1. Constitutional Officers and employees;
  - Department of Social Services' employees; and,
  - Employees specifically exempted by actions of the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors.
- B. Groups identified in Section 1.4.A-1 and 2 may elect to participate in the County's personnel policies by written agreement between the County and the requesting official.

#### 1.5 COMPLIANCE

Department directors shall take necessary and prompt action to ensure compliance with these policies within their respective departments.

# 1.6 **LIMITATIONS**

- A. The policies set forth herein are not intended to create a contract, nor are they to be construed to suggest any express or implied contractual obligations of any kind with the County. Any non-mandated benefits outlined within this policy are subject to approved annual appropriation by the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors. The County retains the right to amend, cancel or otherwise change any of these policies and procedures at any time as circumstances may warrant with the approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- B. Employment with the County is voluntarily entered into and the employee is free to resign at any time. Similarly, the County may terminate the employment relationship and such termination or any other form of discipline shall be a judgment reserved to the County at its sole discretion.

# 1.7 AVAILABILITY AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF PERSONNEL POLICIES

The County Administrator shall be responsible for maintaining a complete and current set of personnel policies and for bringing these policies to the attention of all County employees. In addition, a copy shall be maintained in the office of each department director. Each County employee shall be given a copy of the personnel policies upon adoption of these policies by the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors. Future employees shall receive a copy of the current personnel policies when they begin their employment service with the County. All employees will

# 4.9 ACTING CAPACITY

- A. When an employee is required to work in the capacity of a higher-level supervisory position due to an anticipated absence over a prolonged period of time, such employee may be paid additionally for assuming the higher-level duties.
- B. Requests for "acting pay" shall be made in writing by the department director and submitted to the County Administrator for approval.
- C. The temporary salary adjustment for the period of assignment to the higher-level position shall be determined by the County Administrator.
- D. Retroactive requests shall not be considered.

# 4.10 OVERTIME AND COMPENSATORY TIME

# A. Policy

It is the policy of the County to adopt and implement the provisions of the Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA), as amended, as the fundamental wage and hour policy of the County. Further, it is the policy of the County that any overtime work necessary for the continued effective operation of the County shall be managed in the most efficient and economical manner possible.

# B. Authorization For Overtime

 Overtime work shall be authorized to cover emergencies, inclement weather conditions and unusual working requirements, and may be authorized only by the employees Department Head prior to such work being performed.



Both Exempt and Non-exempt employees who work approved overtime shall receive compensatory time off at the rate of one and one-half hours (1½) for each hour worked. The maximum accrual of compensatory time shall be 240 hours.



3. It is the policy of Prince Edward County that overtime shall be accrued on the basis of hours worked in excess of 40 hours per week.

Department directors shall take all necessary actions to allow employees to use their accrued compensatory time. Department directors are also responsible for ensuring that an employee under his/her supervision does not accrue more than 240 hours of compensatory time.

- 5. It is the responsibility of each department director to determine that overtime pay is administered in the best interest of the County. Department directors shall ensure that, whenever possible, overtime assignments are distributed as equitably as practical to all employees qualified to perform the required work. In addition, it is equally important for the department director to eliminate unauthorized overtime. Failure by a department director to eliminate unauthorized overtime will result in disciplinary action, up to and including dismissal.
- 6. No employee shall start work before the authorized starting time, work through the meal period or work past the authorized ending time without prior authorization from the County Administrator.

"After evaluating all of the information currently available regarding the construction of an Immigration and Customs Enforcement Detention and Removal Operations (referred to locally as INS) Facility, the Board of Directors of the Farmville Area Chamber of Commerce stands opposed to the proposal of such a facility."

With ten of thirteen Board members attending, and with the exception of one abstention, the vote of your Board of Directors was unanimous.

At the March 12 meeting of the full membership, scheduled for Charley's at Noon, this recommendation will be presented to the membership and a vote of the attending members will be taken. That vote of the membership will determine the official position of the Farmville Area Chamber of Commerce concerning the construction of an Immigration and Customs Enforcement Detention and Removal Operations facility.

Members who want to state a position, for or against the recommendation of the Board of Directors, will be given the opportunity to speak. # Moton Museum Part of Virginia's new Civil Rights in Education Heritage Trail

Founded in 1754, Prince
Edward County is centrally
located in the Heartland
Region of Virginia and is rich in
history, telling a story of
courage and perseverance of
our ancestors. Prince Edward
County is 356 acres of rolling
green pasture lands and majestic scenery, attributing to the
County being home to many
outdoor enthusiasts, who take
full advantage of all available
recreational opportunities.

Several state parks in Prince Edward County boast numerous hunting and fishing opportunities, portage to canoeing and kayaking of the Appomattox River and other water locations. The Sandy River Reservoir is a 740-acre countyowned lake that is stocked and managed by the Virginia Department of Game and Inland Fisheries. The nationally regarded 845-acre Briery Creek Lake and 3,100-acre Wildlife Management Area located in Prince Edward County appeals to hunters and fisherman alike. Wilck's Lake, a 35-acre lake and 175 acre natural area is a lovely retreat positioned just a few blocks from downtown Farmville, in Prince Edward County. The historic Twin Lakes State Park in the heart of central Virginia, offers a full array of cultural, environmental and recreational activities such as swimming, camping, picnicking and hiking/biking trails.

The Civil War left it's mark on Prince Edward County, with its

last major battle of the war being fought at nearby Sailor's (Sayler's) Creek National Park, in 1865. By dusk of that historic day General Lee had lost more than 7,700 men and eight generals, the largest number of men to ever surrender in a single action on this continent. With such a drastic reduction in troops and supplies, Lee's situation was critical. Seventy-two hours later, Lee surrendered to General Grant at Appomattox.

On Lee's retreat to Appomattox, he marched through the Town of Farmville in Prince Edward County. After crossing the Appomattox River, the Confederates attempted to burn the railroad's impressive High Bridge, a 120-foot high, nearly half-mile long bridge span, where a critical battle ensued. Public access to this important historic site will soon be available for the first time with the forthcoming development of the new High Bridge Trail State Park stretching approximately 39 miles from Burkeville to Pamplin. All these Civil War sites are part of Virginia's Civil War Trails system known as "Lee's Retreat".

After the Civil War, citizens of the freed black community of Prince Edward County became well known for their creativity, and commerce ability. Black leaders, such as Robert Russa Moton, who was born in 1867, left marks of bravery for their dedication to the development of the new south. R.R. Moton learned to read and write at the William Vaughan Plantation known as Pleasant Shade and later went to a free school for Blacks operated by an ex-officer of the Confederate Army.

In 1915 Moton became the President of Tuskegee Institute, a predominantly Black College in Alabama where under Moton's leadership Tuskegee grew. By World War I, he was a major influence in improving conditions for Black Officers serving in the armed services. Today there is a museum dedicated to the Civil Rights movement in the old black high school that bears Moton's name.

History continued to play an intricate part in the development of Prince Edward County through their involvement in the Civil Rights Movement of the 1960's. It is here that a student walkout on April 23, 1951, set in motion more than a decade of struggle for fair education in Virginia. The stories of the events of the civil rights movement in education are interpreted at the R. R. Moton Musuem.

The Moton Museum is also part of Virginia's new Civil Rights in Education Heritage Trail, which is the only self guided tour of it's kind. The trail depicts the struggle for fair and equal education for African Americans, Native Americans and women, and their right to an education that equaled that of white males.

For the visitor who is interested in outdoor recreation and historical sites, Prince Edward County is a leisure vacation destination and a real VIRGINIA'S RETREAT. The Virginia's Heartland Regional Visitor Center and Transportation Heritage Museum is a wonderful source of tourism and recreation information, serving Prince Edward County and the Town of Farmville, Virginia.

Sally Gilfillan stated the committee's first concern is the Needs Assessment, and stated that Dr. Frank Moore would be willing to do the assessment if the committee agrees. Sarah Puckett moved to have the Needs Assessment completed by Dr. Frank Moore, seconded by Sharon Carney.

Mr. Whiting stated that he would be working on the basic architecture, and could include such things as links for podcasts and e-commerce. In addition, Virgina.gov will host and design the site, which includes the template, architecture, a rough organization, and migration of the existing site to the new site.

Sarah Puckett said her understanding was he would be setting the structure and such things as the banner for the main page, and county employees would add the details.

After some discussion, it was agreed that the Needs Assessment is the first priority. At a later date, all departments will be contacted to request graphics and updated information for inclusion on the new site.

Sarah Puckett directed the committee's attention to the Loudoun County site and pointed out key items and links, and how they work within that site. After discussion from the committee on the various pages and the desired changes, she stated that she and Karin Everhart would review the Loudoun County's site content and assess which items can be used for the Prince Edward site.

Mrs. Puckett asked Sharon Carney to contact Kirk Whiting and update the committee on any discussion and comments. Mrs. Carney agreed.

Chairperson Sally Gilfillan asked if there was any further comment or discussion, and being none, stated the next meeting will be held March 28, 2007 at 12:30 p.m. in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Floor Conference Room. The meeting was adjourned at 1:23 p.m.

#### Treasurers Report

December 2006 Financial Statement: President Fore stated the CRC is on track with budgeted expenditures. President Fore briefly went over the December Financial Statement enclosed in the CRC's board packet. President Fore stated while expenditures were slightly higher than revenues received during the period of July thru December, the CRC has not drawn down funding from the Special Appropriation from the General Assembly as of this date. This funding will bring expenditures in line with revenues.

# Report of Officers & Committees

Chairman's Report & Executive Committee Report: The Chairman stated Mr. Smyth resigned from the Lunenburg County Board of Supervisors effective December 31, 2006. Therefore, he will no longer serve on the CRC as the Treasurer. The Chairman stated he has requested that Mr. Moore serve as the Treasurer as well as the Secretary until June 2007. Mr. Moore has accepted this position. The Chairman also stated the Budget Committee will be meeting in the coming weeks to begin work on the 2007-2008 budget.

Mr. Walker requested that Mr. Fore prepare a resolution of appreciation to be presented to Mr. Smyth at the February CRC meeting.

The Chairman stated the Executive Committee did not meet in December.

#### Old Business

#### President & Staff Reports

Report on Zoning – Regional Service Approach: President Fore stated at a recent Chief Administrative Officers meeting there was interest in seeking a regional approach to conduct local zoning reviews. President Fore stated letters were sent to all of the member localities requesting their interest in this approach.

Ms. Hickman reported that letters were sent to all member localities on December 20, 2006. Ms. Hickman stated as of this date, Charlotte and Cumberland Counties have both indicated interest in procuring a Consultant to review their zoning ordinance. Buckingham has noted interest, but will evaluate the initiative after obtaining information concerning the cost. Lunenburg and Prince Edward indicated they are almost finished with their review of zoning and would not be interested at this time but may be interested in the future. The CRC has not received a response from Amelia or the Town of Farmville.

The Chairman asked if there has been any indication of interest of also seeking a regional approach on local assessments? There was discussion on this item. Several Council members voiced interest in this concept. Ms. Hickman pointed out this item has been discussed previously. A representative from the Virginia Department of Taxation met with the Chief Administrative Officers last December to provide information on this concept. Ms. Hickman stated she has information from that discussion and would provide it to any member interested.

Economic/Planning Allocation Activity Update: President Fore stated the CRC received a special appropriation of \$250,000 from the General Assembly for FY 2007. This funding has been utilized thus far for marketing activities, office furniture up fit and staffing. President Fore stated he has joined VEDP staff in attending 3 Trade Shows and has conducted 3 independent marketing trips.

President Fore stated a new Economic Development Marketing Associate has been hired. Ms. Pat MacKenzie joined the staff on January 8, 2007. Ms. MacKenzie has worked previously with private contractors and the Community College system specializing in Information Technology. Ms. MacKenzie stated she has been living in the area for the past 14 years but is originally from a rural area in New York State. Ms. MacKenzie also worked for a family owned landscaping business for many years and continues to have interest in this field.

President Fore stated the CRC requested and received bids for office furniture. Key Office Supply was the low bidder at \$14,922, which was well within the State funding of \$35,000 approved by the General Assembly. President Fore stated the next task would be request bids for presentation equipment, GIS software and computer upgrades as needed. Mr. Ingram moved and Dr. Bortz seconded to accept the low bid from Key Office Supply at \$14,922. Motion carried.

President Fore stated he distributed a copy of the Draft CRC Ethics Policy for review at the December CRC meeting. President Fore stated he had not received any comments on the proposed policy. However, this may have been due to the Holidays and asked the Council if they would like to have more time to review the Policy before adoption. Mr. Moore moved and Mr. Walker seconded to table this matter until February to allow members more time to review the policy. Motion carried.

President Fore stated he has contacted the VCU Center for Public Policy to provide continuing assistance in facilitating sessions with the Council membership in developing a regional economic development strategy. A cost proposal has been provided totaling \$20,057 to facilitate 7 local government sessions of 2 hours each, 1 higher education session of 2 hours and 1 plenary session to present all findings and a final report. President Fore stated this cost is well within the funding level of \$35,000 provided by the General Assembly's Special Appropriation for strategy development. President Fore stated this effort needs to move forward at the earliest possible date. President Fore sought approval of the contract with VCU to conduct the facilitation. It was pointed out that localities will be working on budgets in the coming months and it may be difficult to schedule some of these sessions. Mr. Walker stated he thought the local IDA's should be involved in the meeting. Ms. Atkins moved and Mr. Ingram seconded to authorize the President to execute the contract between VCU and the CRC for \$20,057 for the facilitation of meetings to develop a Regional Economic Development Strategy. Motion carried.

### **Actions Pending:**

- President Fore stated he would be submitting a Request For Proposals for an advertising & marketing agency within the next two to three weeks.
- The CRC Budget Committee will be meeting in the coming weeks to work on the FY 2008 budget.
- The CRC is currently providing prospect assistance to 4 localities: Lunenburg, Charlotte, Prince Edward and Cumberland Counties.
- The Key Legislative Issues Committee formation & funding by local governments. Information has been sent to all of the member localities.
- Kemper Consulting has submitted a request for the second \$250,000 in special funding for the CRC to the General Assembly.

#### New Business

#### President & Staff Reports:

1) Local Government Request:

a. Agreement to Provide Administration Services to Town of Dillwyn Business District Revitalization VCDBG Planning Project: Ms. Hickman stated included in the Council packet is an agreement totaling \$3,500 for the CRC to provide technical assistance

- (\$3,000) and grant writing services (\$500) to the Town of Dillwyn for the Town of Dillwyn Business District Revitalization VCDBG Planning Project. The activities include a strategic thinking and visioning session for the business district utilizing a skilled facilitator; procurement of professional services to develop an Economic Restructuring Plan and A/E assessment and design to assist the Town in identifying and developing solutions to their needs; identifying a project that can be complete with local resources and completion and submission of a Planning Grant proposal to DHCD. Mr. Ingram moved and Mr. Moore seconded to authorize the President to execute the Agreement between the CRC and the Town of Dillwyn. Motion carried.
- b. Prince Edward Request for Grant Research & Grant Writing Services: Ms. Hickman stated the CRC received a request from Prince Edward County to assist the Youth Empowerment Center, Inc. in grant research and grant writing. Ms. Hickman stated the Center needs \$30,000 for operational and program expenses as well maintenance & renovations of the current building. This non-profit program provides after-school academic programs, summer programs and parent workshops. This Center is located in Farmville, Virginia. Mr. Moore moved and Mr. Ingram seconded to authorize the President to execute an Agreement between the CRC and the Youth Empowerment Center once specific services have been identified. Motion carried.
- New VDOT Multi-Modal Planning Grant Program: Ms. Foster stated Mr. Kessler with 2) VDOT was unable to attend the CRC meeting to discuss this new program. Ms. Foster stated VDOT is offering a new Multi-Modal Planning Grant Program, which is divided into two parts. This first program is the Local and Regional Corridor Planning Grant Program. There is \$1,990,000 available for this program. This program will provide grants to help local and regional governments perform multimodal planning and integrated studies of transportation and land use. This program would utilize either local, regional, state staff or consultants already employed by the locality to perform the work. The Multimodal and Land Use Plan Development Assistance Program will provide training and support for development of implementable plans that advance multimodal planning and better land use. The goals of this program are to provide education and training in multimodal and land use planning and development of implementable plans. The Multimodal office will provide consultants to perform this work. There is \$1,250,000 available for this program. Grant letter of intent are due by March 1, 2007. Ms. Foster stated she would be requesting more information on these two new programs and providing the information at the next Chief Administrative Officers meeting in January.
- Adoption of CRC's Transportation Rural Technical Committee Recommendation:
  Goals, Objectives, and Measures: Ms. Foster stated the CRC's Rural Transportation
  Technical Committee met and recommended the Goals, Objectives, and Measures included in the CRC's packet for adoption for the CRC's Rural Transportation Long Range Plan process. Mr. Walker moved and Ms. Atkins seconded to approve the recommended Goals, Objectives, and Measures as submitted by the Rural Transportation Technical Committee. Motion carried.
- 4) Status Update on EDA Pre-Application: President Fore stated he went to Philadelphia and met with officials from EDA concerning the CRC's EDA Pre-Application for funding. President Fore stated officials were not very forthcoming with indications on whether the CRC will receive funding. President Fore stated he would be contacting them again in the coming weeks to find out if a final decision has been made. It was suggested that Congressman Goode's office be contacted to provide support on this matter.

Commonwealth Intergovernmental Review Process: Ms. Foster reported there were 3 submitted CIRPs for review:

- STEPS, Inc. Purchase of 14-passenger van with wheelchair lift.
- Crossroads Community Service Board Purchase 6 passenger vans with wheelchair lifts.
- Charlotte County Request for Planning Funds from DHCD from the Rural Broadband Planning Initiative Program.

The Chief Administrative Officers did not meet in December and therefore the staff recommended a level one

comment. Mr. Moore moved and Mr. Walker seconded to give the listed CIRPs a level one comment. Motion carried.

Council Member Comments: Mr. Moore asked that President Fore make some comments on his recent trip to the United Kingdom. President Fore stated he recently went to the United Kingdom with Ms. Sharon Carney, Economic Development Director of Prince Edward to meet with two prospective clients. President Fore stated the trip went well.

# Mississippi Man Tells How His Hometown Rewrote Its Tragic History

FARMVILLE, Va. -- Once known as a bastion of the Klan, Philadelphia, Mississippi, was recently praised on a network television news program as a "shining example" of racial tolerance and cooperation.

Leroy Clemons, a Philadelphia native, told an audience at the Farmville Methodist Church on Tuesday night (Jan. 23) that the transformation of his hometown's reputation was due, in large part, to the successful efforts of a local, multi-racial group known as the Philadelphia Coalition.

"This is a town that is moving forward," boasted Clemons, 44, who serves as cochairman of the coalition along with Jim Prince, publisher of the local newspaper.

The Philadelphia Coalition was established in 2003 prior to the 40<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the infamous 1964 murders of three civil rights workers, Andrew Goodman, Michael Schwerner and James Cheney. The key to the group's success, according to Clemons, was a new willingness among community members to talk candidly about the racial tensions that had plagued the town for many decades.

Before the coalition was formed, Clemons said, the media portrayed the town as unchanged from the days when Klansman regularly terrorized black citizens and the civil rights workers in the 1960s. The media based its reporting on quotes from outsiders who visited Philadelphia no more than once a year on the anniversary of the murders.

"The local people knew there had been a change in our community," he said. "We knew there was a new generation in charge that did not share the prejudices of their elders. But the local people had failed to speak up. We finally decided it was time that we spoke. We wanted to let people know that we'd moved on."

Clemons and Prince began their work by inviting all citizens of the community to come to a meeting. After agreeing they needed to do something to begin "writing our own history," he said, the members of the group had two very different ideas for how to proceed.

"One of the black members said, "I know what we can do. We can have a march'," Clemons recalled. "I looked around the room and I could see every white person in the meeting turning pale. Then, later on, a white man said, 'Why don't we write a resolution?' And all of the black people in the room exchanged looks of disbelief. But nobody said anything."

After the meeting, Clemons, who is black, and Prince, who is white, were discussing what happened at the meeting. "What was wrong with the idea of a march?" Clemons recalls asking his friend. "Do you know what a march means to white people?" Prince said. "Marches make white people uncomfortable.""

Then Prince asked Clemons why the black folks seemed to be opposed to the idea of a resolution. "Do you know what a resolution means to black people?" Clemons replied. "To us, it's nothing more than a piece of paper."

At that moment, he said, the two men realized that the black and white folks in Philadelphia did not know how to communicate, even though they were talking to each other. They resolved to be more honest with each other during their meetings.

What followed was a series of meetings in which every member of the group was given an opportunity to express his or her feelings about the town's racial history without being contradicted by anyone else. Everyone also got a chance to say what they wanted to happen in the future. As a result, he said, they built a relationship based on honesty and trust that has led to many positive developments in Philadelphia.

The next thing the group did was to ask the state to prosecute the men who had committed the 1964 murders. "Nobody, nobody in Philadelphia, black or white, had ever stood up and asked for justice," he said. And that led to the conviction in 2005 of Edgar Ray Killen.

More than 60 Farmville residents attended Clemons' speech, and some of them wanted to know whether a similar coalition could help to write a new chapter in the racial history of Prince Edward County. Clemons was asked how day-to-day life in Philadelphia had changed as a result of the coalition's work.

Prior to the establishment of the coalition, Clemons said, virtually every controversy that arose in Philadelphia was seen as having racial overtones. Just recently, however, when a white man murdered two black teenagers, member of the coalition were able to dispel those suspicions. Clemons said the murders, in fact, were the result of a disagreement between three drug dealers and had nothing to do with race.

#### February 13, 2007

At a reconvened meeting of the Board of Supervisors of Prince Edward County, held in the Third Floor Conference Room of the Court House, on Tuesday the 13<sup>th</sup> day of February, 2007; at 5:00 p.m., there were present:

Pickett, Director of Planning and Community Development; Sharon Carney, Director of Economic Development and Tourism; Mr. Alan Leatherwood, Resident Highway Engineer, VDOT; Keith Halbohn, Transportation Contract Administrator; and Mark McKissick, Assistant Resident Engineer.

Chairman William G. Fore, Jr., called the meeting to order.

In Re: Changes to Six-Year Transportation Improvement Plan

Mr. Alan Leatherwood stated that the upcoming changes to the Six-Year Transportation Improvement Plan are not good. Funds have been cut dramatically for Prince Edward, and in fact, are cut for everyone. He said that all county-wide incidental items such as fertilization and seed, pipes and pipe installation, subdivision plan review, rural additions, engineering and survey, traffic surveys, right of way engineering, plan review, and all future budget items have no funding. All state funds now have to go to Federal qualifying projects to allow the state to get the maximum match from the Federal government.

Mr. Leatherwood continued, stating that these are the best numbers that VDOT has today. VDOT will know more when the General Assembly adjourns. Mr. Leatherwood added that the estimate for driveway costs is between \$500.00 - \$600.00 in labor and material and that depends on how much ditching is necessary. The individual buys the pipe. VDOT will bond the property owner, and these changes will take effect on July 1, 2007. Property owners will need a formal permit, an application and a surety form, with either cash, an irrevocable letter of credit, or a \$1,000.00 bond. The homeowner would get the money

back upon satisfactory completion. He added that he feels that VDOT has enough to go a few months, maybe into December; the funds carry over. VDOT will use the funds until depleted, and they will remain in Prince Edward County. Some of it could be used for railroad crossings.

Mr. McKay asked if the Department of Conservation and Recreation could do some of the railroad crossings. Sarah Puckett said that DCR can, but they are trying to get funds to build the Trail, so any funding that the County can find from another source to do the crossings would be a savings for the Trail.

Mr. Leatherwood continued, stating that funds for roads have to be used on federally-qualifying roads. Route 643 is a qualifying road.

Sarah Puckett asked about a start-date for Route 643. Mr. Leatherwood told her that 70% of construction funds must be in place first.

Mr. Leatherwood stated that currently the cost is better than a million and one-half dollars per mile for road construction.

Discussion followed regarding the Secondary System Construction Program. Mr. Keith Halbohn discussed the current project and stated that he hopes to have the project advertised and underway this fall.

(Supervisor Sally Gilfillan arrived at this time.)

Supervisor Lacy Ward asked about the progress on the Hidden Lake Road project. Mr. Halbohn said that two of the three remaining deeds are signed; one was previously signed, but not correctly.

Discussion turned to the Aspen Hill Road project, and the use of Recreational Access Funds to upgrade that road because of High Bridge Trail State Park. The Millers Lake project will probably also be done for the amount stated in the Plan (\$875,341.00).

Mr. Lacy Ward said that there seems to be a major shift in funding, and if the state publicized what was going on, this wouldn't have had to be explained.

Sarah Puckett said that there will need to be some publicity about the driveway process, which will be a significant change in the way the construction process is done.

Chairman Fore asked about the Revenue Sharing Program possibility being expanded. He also asked if small rural counties have to put up a million dollars to be considered for funding. Supervisor McKay asked the Board to think about setting aside money per year in the budget to plan for the future use of Revenue Sharing.

Mr. McKay asked if there was any way to do parts of Route 658 as was done on Route 696. Mr. Halbohn said that the problem is funding. Mr. Leatherwood said that he feels that the method that the projects are addressed needs to be changed. Route 643 will have to be rebuilt.

Mr. Halbohn stated that there is no additional funding for rural additions, but that Slaydon Forest is "safe right now."

Supervisor Gilfillan asked if VACo has done anything in opposition to the funding changes, as it is not cost effective to have an engineer to do the roads if the funding isn't available.

A discussion followed on the Slaydon Forest project, regarding speculative interest and property boundaries. Sarah Puckett said that County Planner Jonathan Pickett could review the properties on the road and report back at the March meeting. As a follow up to Mr. Pickett's report, the Board of Supervisors could adopt a resolution stating that there is no speculative interest.

It was reported that there is federal bridge money in the Plan: \$49,540 the first year and \$67,000 in 2009 for qualifying bridge replacement. Further discussion on bridges followed; only qualifying bridges would be considered for funding. The double bridges for consideration are on Route 623 (Norfolk Southern), Route 624 (Bush River), Route 619 (Saylor's Creek) and Route 633 (Bush River). One needs to be designated. Sarah Puckett asked which would qualify. Alan Leatherwood stated that each bridge qualifies.

Chairman Fore asked if the Route 619 bridge should be put on the Six Year Plan for bridge repair knowing that it will take two years to fund. Keith Halbohn said that it would still qualify in the Designated Bridge Fund, and explained the rating system.

Chairman Fore queried the Board and all were in consensus for the Route 619 bridge. Sarah

Puckett was authorized to advertise the County's Six-Year Plan for a public hearing at the March 13, 2007

Board Meeting.

#### In Re: County Administrator's Position

The Supervisors reviewed the draft job description for the County Administrator's position as well as the County Profile that will be made available to applicants. After a few minor revisions, the Board authorized the Acting Administrator to post the position on the web sites of the professional organizations cited during the January 30, 2007 meeting. These include: International City/County Management Association, National Association of County Administrators, National League of Cities, National

Association of Counties, National Forum for Black Public Administrators, American Society for Public Administration, Virginia Association of Counties, and Virginia Municipal League.

Chairman Fore then stated that the table packet was light, and since the weather was inclement, the Board may swap, table or postpone agenda items as the meeting progresses.

Mrs. Shanaberger directed the Board's attention to the November report, to the revenue from tax collection. She added that these revenues took the County from a negative to a positive unencumbered General Fund balance. Mrs. Shanaberger told the Board that the December report was almost complete, and she expected to be up-to-date at the next meeting.

Mrs. Shanaberger also reported that the County held a delinquent land sale earlier in the day and it had been very successful. All eleven parcels offered were sold, with eight of those being sold for more than the appraised value, and the other three were not far below appraised value. The County will receive the taxes, penalties, interest, and any additional costs associated with the sale within 30 days. The

remaining monies will be held in trust for two years, then will be turned over to the County. While in trust, the heirs may come to claim the money. She added that another sale will be held in the spring.

Vice-Chairman Simpson asked for the total amount of back taxes, penalties and legal fees collected from the sale. Mrs. Shanaberger was unable to provide the figure, but indicated she would gather the information for the Board members. She added that one property sold for \$252,000. During further discussion, Mrs. Shanaberger added that the lots sold were all clear property with no improvements, and the largest lot was 62.25 acres more or less, which sold for over \$200,000.00. The next largest lot was 57.0 acres, which sold for \$195,000.00.

#### In Re: Park Properties

During its January 9, 2007 meeting, the Board approved a conditional use request permitting Park Properties, Inc., to construct a 44-unit age-restricted apartment complex on Zion Hill Road, and a letter of support for the project.

Mr. William Park of Park Properties, Inc., was present at the meeting and explained the process of obtaining tax credits through the Virginia Housing Development Authority. He indicated rural areas of the state only receive 8% of available funding, and 50 counties in Virginia qualify for that 8%. Mr. Park discussed the ranking system, stating the Park Properties project now stands at 420 points, 45 points less than last year's minimum application that received a tax credit. Mr. Park said if the area is classified as a revitalization area, it would receive 25 points, and if a real estate tax abatement were available, it would receive 10 additional points. In order to be declared a revitalization area, the County would have to apply to the Department of Housing and Community Development. DHCD would then look to see what local incentives were given to encourage individuals to provide housing in the revitalization area. Those incentives could include real estate tax exemptions, reduction of tap fees, reduction of permit fees, or a direct cash outlay.

Mr. Park asked the Board to consider a revitalization classification and a real estate tax abatement. Mr. Park stated the project, when built out, will have an estimated value of \$2.5 million. The form of real estate tax abatement would be as follows: during the first year, the tax would be assessed on the land without improvements. During the second year, the tax would include 50% of the improvement value, and the third year, the full value would be assessed. In total, the tax abatement would be \$18,750.00. Mr. Park added there are two objectives mentioned in the Comprehensive Plan supporting affordable housing for low and moderate income individuals. He said in Strategies, Objective #2 states: "Evaluate the County Zoning Ordinance to insure that regulatory barriers do not exist that restrict the construction of well-planned adult living retirement housing." Mr. Park continued with Objective #5: "Support affordable housing opportunities for low to moderate income citizens... Consider participation in Department of Housing and Community Development, and Virginia Housing Development Authority public/private partnership programs, to develop affordable housing opportunities for low and moderate income individuals." He also

added Prince Edward is one of four counties in the state deemed by the IRS as a "difficult to develop area" in regard to affordable housing.

Mrs. Gilfillan stated she would want to have a guarantee on the rental costs remaining low. Mr. Park explained there will be a deed restriction running with the land requiring rents remain affordable for 15 years. Mrs. Gilfillan asked if the prices would go up on the 16<sup>th</sup> year. Mr. Park said the development could be rented to someone that makes 60% of the area median income or less. Mr. Park added that VHDA would see if the development could be sold to someone such as a non-profit or Housing Authority to keep it affordable.

Mr. Ward inquired as to why Mr. Park had not brought these issues to the Board's attention in January. Mr. Park explained he didn't feel as though he'd need more points, and reviewed the point ranking system. He also clarified the grant program and assured the Board that the tax abatement is not a request for money.

Mrs. Gilfillan asked if she understood correctly that the County would be giving up one and a half years of real estate taxes to get 15 years of low income housing; Mr. Park said that was correct. Mr. McKay pointed out that in addition to providing affordable housing, the project would generate additional tax revenue for the County after the first year.

Mr. Ward stated that the Board needed to be certain of what it was voting on and felt there were still questions that needed answers.

Mr. Jones asked about the time frame. Mr. Park stated the application is due on March 10, and the latest to submit additional information is March 30.

Chairman Fore said that the Board has an inherent responsibility for the quality of life for the residents of Prince Edward County, and that he sees this as an opportunity - with very little investment of Prince Edward County money - to create something for the betterment of senior citizens and low income residents. He added he felt the Board could vote for the project without doing harm, and would be doing a lot of good for the senior citizens. He asked for a motion to grant Mr. Park's request for tax abatement and to designate the area as a revitalization area with a resolution to be drafted for adoption at the March meeting.

Chairman Fore stated he would like to word the motion to indicate the Board's intent to pass the resolution. Mr. Jones added that he would like a stipulation in the motion that it will be to assist the elderly

for 15 years. Mr. Park said that is a standard deed restriction recorded by VHDA. Mr. Ward said he is not against low income housing, but this seems to have been done piecemeal. Mr. McKay stated if he understood correctly, Mr. Park felt that he'd have enough points at the last meeting, and is now coming to see if he can get more points; Mr. Park confirmed this.
