# In Re: Conflict of Interest Act

Supervisor Townsend made the following statement:

As a member of the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors, I, Jerry R. Townsend, am disclosing that I have a personal interest in the transactions for the adoption of the FY 24 County and the approval of local funding for the FY 24 School Budget. My wife is an employee of the Prince Edward County Public Schools and I am an employee of the Piedmont Regional Jail. I am able to participate pursuant to Section 2.2-3112(B)1 of the Code of Virginia, because the FY 24 County Budget and the local funding for the FY 24 School Budget affects groups of three or more, which are all County-funded employees, all county agencies funded by the County budget and all employees of the Prince Edward County Public Schools. The Board recognized Vicki Cardwell for her 17 Years of Service with the Commonwealth Attorney's Office, Larry Franklin for his 25 Years of Service in the Sheriff's Office, and Robert Goldman for his 18 Years of Service with the Sheriff's Office.

# In Re: Public Participation

Public Participation is a time set aside for citizens to share their thoughts, ideas and concerns. An official record is made of each person's contribution tonight and will be directed to the County Administrator for follow-up; any necessary follow-up will be noted and tracked. Follow-up may consist of an immediate response, or planned action by the County Administrator or Board, or by placement on a future Board agenda. Tonight's agenda cannot be changed, because the public needs advance knowledge of and the opportunity to review related materials regarding items addressed by the Board. To further assist public information, the Board requests the Administrator, Attorney or county staff to immediately correct any factual error that might occur.

Dallas Tinsley expressed his concern regarding the action taken on the Zoning Ordinance as it is related to flags in 2022. He stated he is a Vietnam veteran, recipient of the Purple Heart, and feels it is disrespectful to limit the size of the American flag. He said it is a symbol, not a sign, and the size of the flag should relate to the size of the pole.

Derek Coblentz, Prospect District, expressed his concern regarding the restriction on the flag size of the American flag. He asked that the restrictive language in the ordinance be eliminated and the sole limiting factor for the size of the flag should be the pole height. Mr. Coblentz also stated he opposes the yearly fee and required permit.

Earl Wallace stated he is a Vietnam veteran; he said many died in service to the [American] flag and the County needs to leave the flag alone.

Wayne "Spike" Zumbro expressed his concerns about the flag issue because people "dig in their heels." He said [people can] get along as the County and region, and people have to come to a common ground and be civil.

Vicky Page, Leigh District, stated the Friends of the Barbara Rose Johns Farmville/Prince Edward Community Library are holding a program to fight "Summer Slide." She sated the Friends Little Free Library, which was started in 2015, has begun filling the Little Free Libraries maintained by the Committee with summer reading books using the Prince Edward County Public Schools Summer Reading List to guide the purchase of books. She said books will cover grades Pre-K through 12, and will be added on a weekly basis throughout the summer. The Little Free Libraries are located in Darlington Heights, Meherrin, Prospect, Rice, and Worsham.

Jesse Yates reported the dump site in Rice looks very nice, but is concerned about the height of the dumpsters. He said it is difficult to get the trash up that high to get it over the dumpster's edge. Mr. Stanley stated that the County is looking at providing steel platforms to allow people to get the trash into the recycling bins more easily.

Ian Brock expressed his opposition to limiting the size of the flag on his own property.

Joshua Amos, Leigh District, stated the pole size should determine the size of the flag, and the County is pushing citizens to have to attend the meeting "and waste our time" discussing this issue. He said people are offended by a little bit of everything; he said people need to leave [other] people alone, and as long as they are not encroaching on his property, it is fine.

Chris Burks, Lockett District, said the emergency ordinance to signage that was adopted by the Board on April 12, 2022. He said this is a tool the County of Prince Edward has used to harass taxpayers. He said there is so much other stuff that the Board needs to do. It is the citizens' private property, and [they] should be able to fly a flag of any size to apply to size of pole. If a flag blocks visibility, then it is deemed unsafe and something needs to be addressed. He reviewed Amelia County's stance on flags. He said a new flag of the same size on the same flagpole is a continuation of the flag. He said he agrees with Supervisor Jones that the size of the pole should determine the

size of the flag; the County should suspend the nonsense against the citizens and asked those in attendance to stand in support of this ordinance.

Dr. Peter Gur, Farmville District, stated on May 29, he participated in the [National] Memorial Day Parade in Washington DC. He said the American flag is fixed, front and center, and when with other flags, it is always on the right. The American flag is always bigger or the same size as other flags, and no flag is bigger than the American flag. He said there were 170 organizations in attendance [for the parade]. He said he supports the emergency ordinance.

Rex Williams stated he loves this flag and wants no limits on the American flag. He said the American flag is everything that is independent to us and stands for freedom. He said if it is limited, it limits our freedom.

Stan Smith stated that what is at stake is freedom. He said freedom is very important, and Virginia is the birthplace of the nation. He said he can't imagine anyone that has the heart for America and Virginia to vote against freedom. He stated that of the four options, Option #2 has no restrictions whatsoever, and he urges [the Board to choose] that option.

Susan Allen asked what the Board has to gain by limiting the flag size and if there can't be compromise.

Jerry Barton, Farmville District, said he doesn't feel he is being represented. He stated he worked hard all his life, paid taxes, but the Board doesn't help working citizens. He added he feels the Board is listening to a few people and denying the majority their rights.

Robert "Quarter" Bradshaw stated he is in support of Supervisor Jones' suggestion and spoke on General Washington's crossing of the Delaware River.

Sharon Dotson said this country was founded on freedom but politicians took freedom, they had laws, ordinances and provisions, and said it was for safety. She said [the politicians] take freedoms and ask how fast can they be taken, and how much can they get. She expressed her displeasure about the increased taxes, the water system project which will cost people for the water. She said freedom is just about gone and asked that Prince Edward County get their freedoms back.

Supervisor Jones made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Cooper-Jones, to move Agenda Item #10 up to address the topic; the motion carried:

In Re: Zoning Ordinance Amendment

Mr. Robert Love stated that the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors requested that staff review the

existing Zoning Ordinance as it related to flags in the Spring of 2022 after numerous calls and emails to members of

the Board and Planning Commission from County residents. After researching how other localities in the region

regulate flags, an emergency ordinance was drafted. The ordinance placed a maximum limit on the size of flags at 40

square feet (5'x8') and a maximum height of flagpoles in all districts of 20 feet. There is an allowance for the issuance

of a special use permit for a taller pole in the Al, A2, Cl, I1 and CR zoning districts but excluded all residential zoning

districts from the option for a taller pole.

The Board of Supervisors adopted the Emergency Ordinance at its April 12, 2022 Meeting. Section 15.2-

1427 of the Code of Virginia outlines the procedures for adoption of an emergency ordinance. The emergency

ordinance may be adopted without prior notice; however, no such ordinance shall be enforced for more than 60 days

unless readopted in conformity with the provisions of the code. As a zoning ordinance amendment, it required that the

ordinance be sent to the Planning Commission for a public hearing and recommendation. To comply with the time

requirement, the Board of Supervisors directed staff to advertise a joint public hearing with the Planning Commission

on May 12, 2022, at which the zoning ordinance amendment was adopted. No one from the public spoke in opposition

at that meeting.

Since the adoption of this ordinance last year, the County has written three notices on flag poles that were

erected without a zoning permit, all of which applied for and were approved to erect a pole of up to 20 feet. Three

oversize flag violations and two advisory notices have been sent out to landowners with oversize flags. Of those five

notices, four were for American flags. Prince Edward County allows every property owner to display up to three flags,

each with a maximum size of 40 square feet and allows for a flag pole up to 20 feet in height without needing to obtain

a special use permit. This allows for a total of 120 square feet of free expression for each property. A zoning permit

is required prior to the installation of a flag pole, as an accessory use with a fee of \$10.00.

Several speakers spoke out during public participation at the May 9, 2023 regular meeting concerning the maximum allowed size of flags and asked the Board to consider exempting the American flag. Since the County can only regulate the size of flags, but not flag content, it cannot exempt any particular flag regardless of what it may signify. To do so has been seen by the courts as a violation of constitutional rights.

There are several options that could be looked at in response to concerns from citizens. It is important to note that any amendment to the zoning ordinance requires it to be sent to the Planning Commission for a hearing and recommendation.

- Option 1: Make no change. This would require any single flag to have a maximum square footage of 40' with a limit of three flags per site.
- Option 2: Remove the language that limits flag size. This would allow flags of any size to be placed on a parcel with a limit of three flags per site.
- Option 3: Provide new language to allow for a Special Use Permit for an oversize flag. This would allow permitting through the public hearing process on a case-by-case basis with consideration based on appropriateness of the site location, but with no consideration or discussion of content.
- Option 4: Increase the maximum size of each flag to a certain maximum with an overall total site square footage for flags. This would allow for a larger individual flag but also specify an overall site square footage maximum much like what is required for signs in zoning districts.

Mr. Stanley reviewed the available options and stated that Option 3 would not allow for consideration of content; he added the County must treat each the same from a legal standpoint regardless of content. He said the flag pole should be in correlation with a specific size flag and is based on a ratio.

Chairman Gilliam stated there is not a soul in here that respects the [American] flag more than he does, adding that his father and grandfather served in the military. He said he has the flag that was presented at his father's funeral. He said he will not allow the disrespect of the American flag as people have been doing. He said the American flag must be lit at night if it remains up all night, and told of conversations he has heard of people openly defying the standards for flying the American flag.

Chairman Gilliam then reported he was at his place of business on Saturday [June 10] when a citizen came in and "lit in" to him. He said that is not how we live in a community He said he is guilty as well as the Darlington Heights Fire House had broken lights, and asked [Chief] Dallas Tinsley how long they were broken. That was wrong and disrespected our flag. He said one of the ladies personally purchased two flags because our flag got raggedy. He said he will buy as many as he needs to. He stated he drove by several [American flags] in the County that are raggedy.

He said that if anyone thinks that he does not respect the [American] flag or what it represents, he is sorry, but we are going to do what needs to be done to protect that flag.

Chairman Gilliam said there have to be regulations and if there are not, it will be disrespected more and more.

He stated he was initially appointed to fill a seat and then ran unopposed twice. He said he is trying to do his best, along with every member of the Board of Supervisors.

Supervisor Emert said he says during each meeting that if citizens want change, they must show up. He said he served in the military and has to abide by *all* the rules of the United States. He said the Board has heard the plea and will make a decision where some will be happy and some will not, but that is part of democracy and history; he added history shows us that there are things that don't always please the masses, even if the masses might be right. He said regardless of that, he asked that the citizens be respectful. Supervisor Emert gave his phone number and asked anyone to call with concerns; he then said this issue has become a sore spot. He said he cannot go anywhere that the issue doesn't come up, and he assured the citizens that the Board has heard a lot about it. He said the best thing to do is go to the polls.

Supervisor Townsend said he has heard what has been stated, and at the last meeting moved so that the Board would have time to research in order to make an informed decision. He asked the citizens to be respectful and said to go to the polls.

Supervisor Jones said one of the first to address this issue; he thanked the citizens for the time to go through the nuts and bolts of the issue. He said in his opinion, Option 2 represents the most freedom, while Option 3 has active red tape and Option 4 has passive red tape. He said this gives the Board the opportunity to cut all the red tape and support freedom. He stated he supports Option 2.

Supervisor Cooper-Jones said her father, brothers and cousins all served; some returned from Vietnam in a box with the dog tags and rocks and they did not get their remains. She said she does understand military [service] and that she does represent Prince Edward County, and she will vote in the way she feels is best suited for Prince Edward County.

Supervisor Watson gave an example of two neighbors, one of which erected a barrier against the property line until the other neighbor sold their house, when the first took the barrier down. He said if there are no rules, anything could happen; there need to be some measure [of rules] in place. He said this is not just talking about the American flag, as the law says we cannot differentiate, and you could have any kind of flag you want right up against

your neighbor's property. He said he is not [in favor of] the \$10 fee or the paperwork, but not to have limits would allow monstrosities of any flavor.

Supervisor Pride stated she agrees with others; she said the options cover sizes that are amenable to everyone. She said as a high school and middle school principal, one of the first things she requested from the students was respect. She said we are entitled to say and feel what we feel in a respectable way. She said her father told her that once something comes out of your mouth, it's out there and cannot be taken back. She said she respects the comments made, and that the decision that is made tonight will not please everyone; she encouraged everyone to come to the meetings.

Supervisor Jenkins stated there have been good questions and remarks. He said there has to be rules or someone will abuse it; he added that three or four years down the road there may be a large flag of a type that you do not appreciate, but there it is. He said the pole must be erected correctly. He asked if the citizens would like to see a flag with vulgar content being flown in their neighborhood. He said he sometimes goes to Burkeville just to watch the American flag.

Supervisor Jones agrees with Supervisor Watson that the example was not a neighborly thing for a person to do, to push the limits that far. He said being neighborly is the same concept that Supervisor Jenkins is referring to with vulgar profanity. What prevents free speech from degrading in vulgar profanity is not the government but the moral fabric of society; it should not be the government but the community that holds free speech to a higher standard.

Chairman Gilliam asked if anyone looked at the flag in front of the Courthouse on their way into the building. He stated that when he came to be on the Board, the American flag in front of the Courthouse was on a two-inch piece of galvanized pipe that was stuck in the ground and the wind would [wobble the pole]. He said the Board has taken steps to install a correct flagpole. He said that is what this ordinance is intended to do, to take care of the American flag.

Supervisor Jones made a motion to adopt Emergency Ordinance Option 2, to amend 3-104.1 to eliminate the limit on the size of flags at 40 square feet (5'x 8') and to refer the amendment to the Planning Commission for formal consideration.

Supervisor Emert asked if this would repeal the current ordinance.

Mr. Stanley said there are still some sections of the ordinance that would stay in place, regarding the pole height. He said this would still have to go back to the Planning Commission but does not change the pole height requirements. He said whatever change the Board adopts would make it effective immediately throughout.

Supervisor Emert seconded Supervisor Jones motion, to adopt Emergency Ordinance Option 2, to amend 3-104.1 to eliminate the limit on the size of flags at 40 square feet (5'x 8') and to refer the amendment to the Planning Commission for formal consideration; the motion failed:

Supervisor Jones asked that if this motion passes, will staff stand down on all flag sizes that have been out of compliance, and would it automatically grandfather in every flag. Mr. Stanley said if they are under 120 square feet, yes.

Supervisor Watson made a motion, seconded by Supervisor Townsend, to adopt the Emergency Ordinance Option 4 to amend 3-104.1 to add that flags be subject to an overall site square footage of up to a maximum 120 total square feet and to refer the amendment to the Planning Commission for formal consideration; the motion carried:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND APPENDIX B OF THE PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY CODE (ZONING)TO AMEND SECTIONS 3-104.1 TO AMEND THE LANGUAGE FOR SIGNAGE AND TO SEC. 6-100 TO ADD DEFINITIONS FOR SIGNS, FLAGPOLES, TEMPORARY SIGNS, AND STRUCTURES

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY BOARD OF SUPERVISORS that the Prince Edward County Code - Appendix B (Zoning) be amended as follows:

# Sec. 3-104.1. - Sign placement and general provisions.

- 1. No sign may be placed within the right-of-way of a highway or street, other than duly authorized governmental signs.
- 2. No sign may be placed off the immediate platted lot of the business or civic use without a special use permit.
- 3. No sign may be placed so as to impair vision at an intersection or sharp highway curve.
- 4. All signs shall be maintained in good condition at all times. The pedestal of any sign may not be wood unless it is clad with vinyl or metal, painted, or stained.
- 5. No sign shall be painted on or attached to any trees, rocks, fence posts, utility poles, or similar structures or objects.
- 6. The light from any illuminated sign shall be so directed, shaded, or shielded that the light intensity or brightness shall not adversely affect surrounding or facing premises, nor interfere with the safe vision of operators of moving vehicles. Light shall not be permitted to shine or reflect on or into any residential structure.
- 7. Storefront windows: no more than 25 percent of the glass area may be covered by signs. This is recommended by emergency response personnel to provide sight into building.
- 8. Temporary signs are permitted in all districts as follows:
  - (a) Temporary signs warning of construction, excavation, or other hazard, for as long as the hazard shall exist;
  - (b) Signs in the nature of seasonal decorations, clearly associated with a national, local, or religious holiday;
  - (c) Temporary signs must be removed within 20 days of the event or election to which the temporary signs relate.

# 9. Flags and Flagpoles:

- (a) The official flag of a government, governmental agency, public institution, religious body, or other similar entity, or flags flown on a temporary basis for the purpose of honoring holidays. Flags may also be used as part of a permanently maintained entrance or inner design feature of a residential or commercial development, provided that the number off flags is no more than three. The maximum area for a flag is 40 square feet. for flags shall be subject to an overall maximum site allowance of 120 square feet. Flagpoles shall have a maximum height of 20 feet except in the A1, A2, C1, 11 and CR districts in which a taller flagpole will be allowed with the issuance of a special use permit;
- (b) Flags attached to a structure shall not project beyond-the façade of the building or more than 20 feet from the roofline in any direction and in no case exceed the maximum permitted height of the structure upon which it is located;
- (c) Flags or cloth or other flexible material, used to attract attention to a commercial use or activity and attached to a pole shall be included in the definition of and calculation of freestanding signage on the property;

10. Any business closing operations must remove its signs within 12 months.

### Sec. 6-100. Definitions.

- (A) For the purposes of this ordinance, the following rules of language shall apply:
  - FLAG, A piece of cloth or similar material, typically oblong or square, attachable by at least one edge to a pole or rope or by one side to a surface, and used as the symbol or emblem of a country or institution or as a decoration during public festivities.
  - FLAGPOLE, A pole used for flying or otherwise displaying a flag.
  - SIGN, Any display of letters, words, symbols, numerals, figures, devices, emblems, pictures, or any parts or combinations thereof visible for the purpose of making anything known; whether such display be made on, attached to, or as a part of a structure, surface, or any other thing, including but not limited to the ground, rocks, trees, or other natural objects, which display is visible beyond the boundaries of the parcel of land on which the same is located. For the purposes of this chapter, the term "sign" shall include all portions of the sign structure.
  - SIGN, FREESTANDING or GROUND-MOUNTED, A sign which is supported or held directly by, or affixed to, a structure built on the ground primarily for that sign and independent of any building.
  - SIGN, MARQUEE, A sign attached to and made part of a marquee.
  - SIGN, MONUMENT, A sign which is completely affixed to a masonry, granite, limestone, marble, or similar structure built on grade and which is an integral part of the structure.
  - SIGN, PORTABLE, Any sign which is mounted perpendicular to a building and is supported only by the wall on which it is mounted.
  - SIGN, PROJECTING, Any sign which is mounted perpendicular to a building and is supported only by the wall on which it is mounted.
  - SIGN, ROOF, A sign painted, erected or constructed in whole or in part upon any portion of a roof of any building.
  - SIGN, TEMPORARY, A sign intended to be displayed for less than 30 days.
  - SIGN, WALL, A sign which is 100% attached to, supported by, or painted on a wall or any flat vertical surface of a structure.

# ANNUAL RESOLUTION OF APPROPRIATION OF THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2024

A resolution to appropriate designated funds and accounts from specified estimated revenues for FY 2024 for the operating budget and the Capital Improvements Program for the County of Prince Edward and to authorize and empower County officers to expend funds and manage cash assets; and to establish policies under which funds will be expended and managed.

The Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors does hereby resolve on this 6<sup>th</sup> day of June 2023 that, for the fiscal year beginning on July 1, 2023, and ending on June 30, 2024, the following sections are hereby adopted.

- Section 1. The cost centers shown on the attached letter labeled FY 2023-2024 Appropriations are hereby appropriated from the designated estimated revenues as approved by the Board of Supervisors on April 25, 2023 for FY 2023-2024.
- Section 2. Appropriations, in addition to those contained in this general Appropriations Resolution, may be made by the Board of Supervisors, only if deemed appropriate and there is available in the fund unencumbered or unappropriated sums sufficient to meet such appropriations.
- Section 3. All appropriations herein authorized shall be on the basis of cost centers for all departments and agencies and by Category.
- Section 4. The Social Services Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. By this resolution the Social Services Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within its respective funds in any amount.

- Section 5. The School Board is separately granted authority for implementation of the appropriated funds for their respective operations. Appropriations for the School Board are by Category. By this resolution the School Board is authorized to approve the transfer of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within a category.
- Section 6. The County Administrator is expressly authorized to approve transfers of any unencumbered balance or portion thereof from one classification of expenditure to another within the same Fund with the exception of Constitutional Officers for the efficient operation of government. Transfers into or out of a department of a Constitutional Officer requires prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 7. All outstanding encumbrances, both operating and capital, at June 30, 2023 shall be re-appropriated to the FY 2024 fiscal year to the same cost center and account for which they are encumbered in the previous year.
- Section 8. At the close of the fiscal year, all unencumbered appropriations lapse for budget items other than those involving ongoing operational projects, or programs supported by grants or County funds, which must be preapproved by the County Administrator or his designee and submitted to the Board of Supervisors for final approval. Such funds must be applied to the purpose for which they were originally approved.
- Section 9. Appropriations previously designated for capital projects will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until the completion of the project if funding is available from all planned sources, or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate ordinance, resolution or other action changes or eliminates the appropriation. Upon completion of a capital project, the County Administrator is hereby authorized to close out the project and return to the funding source any remaining balances. This section applies to all existing appropriations for capital projects at June 30, 2023 and appropriations as they are made in the FY 2024 Budget. The County Administrator is hereby authorized to approve construction change orders to contracts up to an increase of \$10,000.00 or five percent, which ever is greater, as long as funds are available from the funding sources and approve all change orders for reduction of contracts.
- Section 10. The approval of the Board of Supervisors of any grant of funds to the County shall constitute the appropriation of both the revenue to be received from the grant and the County's expenditure required by the terms of the grant, if any. The appropriation of grant funds will not lapse at the end of the fiscal year but shall remain appropriated until completion of the project or until the Board of Supervisors, by appropriate action, changes or eliminates the appropriation. The County Administrator may increase or reduce any grant appropriation to the level approved by the granting agency during the fiscal year. The County Administrator may approve necessary accounting transfers between departments and funds to enable the grant to be accounted for in the correct manner. Upon completion of a grant project, the County Administrator is authorized to close out the grant and return to the funding source any remaining balance. This section applies to appropriations for grants outstanding at June 30, 2023 and appropriations in the FY 2024 Budget.
- Section 11. The County Administrator may reduce revenue and expenditure appropriations related to programs funded all or in part by the Commonwealth of Virginia and/or the Federal Government to the level approved by the responsible state or federal agency.

- Section 12. The County Administrator is authorized to make transfers to the various funds for which there are transfers budgeted. The County Administrator shall transfer funds as deemed necessary up to amounts budgeted or in accordance with any existing bond resolutions that specify the matter in which transfers are to be made.
- Section 13. The Treasurer may advance monies to and from the various funds of the County to allow maximum cash flow efficiency. The advances must not violate County bond covenants or other legal restrictions that would prohibit an advance. The Treasurer is authorized and directed to credit all interest received from the investment of all County funds to the General fund, with the exception of the School Construction Fund, Economic Development Fund, Recreation Fund, Forfeited Assets Fund, Landfill Fund, D.A.R.E. Fund, VDOT Revenue Sharing Fund (non-local money only) and the Piedmont Court Services Fund, wherein all interest earned will be credited to the respective funds.
- Section 14. All procurement activities with funds appropriated herein shall be made in accordance with the County purchasing policy and applicable state statutes.
- Section 15 It is the intent of this resolution that funds be expended for the purpose indicated in the budget; therefore, budgeted funds may not be transferred from operating expenditures to capital projects or from capital projects to operating expenses without the prior approval from the Board of Supervisors. Also, funds may not be transferred from one capital project to another without the prior approval of the Board of Supervisors.
- Section 16. The County Administrator is authorized, pursuant to State statute, to issue orders and checks for payments where funds have been budgeted, appropriated, and where sufficient funds are available. A listing of vendor payments shall be presented to the Board of Supervisors for information not less frequently than monthly.
- Subject to the qualifications in this resolution contained, all appropriations are declared to be maximum, conditional and proportionate appropriations the purpose being to make the appropriations payable in full in the amount named herein if necessary and then only in the event the aggregate revenues collected and available during the fiscal year for which the appropriations are made are sufficient to pay all the appropriations in full. Otherwise, the said appropriations shall be deemed to be payable in such proportions as the total sum of all realized revenue of the respective funds is to the total amount of revenue estimated to be available in the said fiscal year by the Board of Supervisors.
- All revenues received by an agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board not included in its estimate of revenue for the financing of the fund budget as submitted to the Board of Supervisors may not be expended by said agency under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors or by the School Board or by the Social Services Board without the consent of the Board of Supervisors being first obtained, and those sums appropriated to the budget. Any grant approved by the Board for application shall not be expended until the grant is approved by the funding agency for drawdown. Nor may any of these agencies or boards make expenditures which will exceed a specific item of an appropriation.

- Section 19. Allowances out of any of the appropriations made in this ordinance by any or all County departments, commissions, bureaus, or agencies under the financial control of the Board of Supervisors to any of their officers and employees for expense on account of the use of such officers and employees of their personal automobiles in the discharge of their official duties shall be paid at the same rate as that established by the internal revenue service and shall be subject to change by the County Administrator from time to time to maintain like rates.
- Section 20. All previous appropriation ordinances or resolutions to the extent that they are inconsistent with the provisions *of* this ordinance shall be and the same are hereby repealed.
- Section 21. This ordinance shall become effective on July 1, 2023.

## In Re: Highway Matters

VDOT Resident Engineer, Scott D. Frederick, P.E., reported progress on the work on the westbound lanes of Route 460 and Route 307 intersection. He said following the work, there were fewer rear-end collisions but there

were angle-crashes or road departures. He said Engineering is studying the area and the Board's request to reduce the speed limit is not off the table. He said everything should be complete in a few weeks. Further discussion followed.

Suggestions included increasing the number of warnings of the upcoming lane closure, reduced speed limit, and dynamic flashers.

Mr. Frederick said additionally, he reviewed a letter from the residents of Whisperwood Subdivision asking for consideration for their subdivision roads to be taken into the State System of Highways. He stated their covenants specify that the roads in the subdivision cannot be taken into the state system.

Supervisor Pride stated the roundabout at Hampden-Sydney seems to be going well.

Supervisor Townsend reported limbs need trimmed back on Meherrin Road (Route 630), as well as striping and a speed limit reduction. Mr. Frederick said a speed study takes several months.

Mr. Frederick reported crews are currently mowing secondary roads and will then mow primary roads; he said there are typically five tractors running.

Supervisor Townsend reported the sight distance is being blocked off at the dumpster site on Virso Road, looking towards Route 360; brush needs cut back. He said it needs to be cut around the Virso bridge and New Bethel bridge.

Mr. Stanley reported the trash trucks were being hit by branches going along Prospect Road and Pin Oak Road.

Supervisor Jenkins reported potholes on Miller's Lake Road.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that since said Plan appears to be in the best interests of the Secondary Road System in Prince Edward County and of the citizens residing on the Secondary System, said Secondary Six-Year Plan (FY 2024 through 2029) and Construction Priority List (FY 2 024) are hereby approved as presented at the public hearing.

## In Re: Public Hearing & Public Input Period – PPEA Project Final Agreement

Chairman Gilliam announced that this was the date and time scheduled for a public hearing to receive citizen input prior to considering an unsolicited proposal from Prince Edward County Infrastructure, LLC (PECI) under the Public-Private Educational Facilities and Infrastructure Act of 2002, as amended (PPEA), which Proposal offered a public-private partnership to provide the County engineering design and construction services for the development of a water intake and pump station, water treatment facility, and water distribution system that would utilize the existing Sandy River Reservoir as the water supply. Notice of this hearing was advertised according to law in the Wednesday, May 17, 2023, and Wednesday, May 31, 2023 editions of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

On December 9, 2021 the Prince Edward County Board of Supervisors accepted the unsolicited proposal of Prince Edward County Infrastructure, LLC (PECI) for the design and construction of a water system serving the County. The Board made a determination to use competitive negotiation in selecting a contractor; to authorize the County Administrator to post the non-confidential portions of the proposal and advertise for the receipt of competing proposals for a period of not less than 45 days. The County received no competing proposals.

County staff and our selected consultants negotiated an interim agreement with PECI for the development, design and construction of water treatment plant and distribution system consistent with the Design-Builder's proposal and the County's guidelines and procedures concerning the Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act of 2002 as adopted by the Board on July 8, 2008. At its meeting on August 23, 2022, the Board approved the Interim Agreement for the project. Since that time, the County has expended the maximum of \$1 million on the services identified in the agreement.

PECI has submitted a draft final agreement to the County. Staff has considered the Proposal and has determined with the Board's intent of developing a water supply system it is in the best interest of the County to proceed and establish a 30-day period for public comment. The draft final agreement has been reviewed by our PPEA Legal Counsel, Sharon Pandak (Pandak & Taves, PLLC), and our Engineering consultant, Tom Frederick (Pennoni Engineering). In addition, the County will want to be in a position to approve a contract with the Department of General Services (DGS) for the provision of water to the States three facilities in Nottoway PRIOR to acceptance and approval of the final interim agreement.

Per Section IX.C of the County's guidelines, 30 days prior to entering into a final agreement the County shall provide an opportunity for public comment. Such public comment shall include a Public Hearing held by the Board of Supervisors. Accordingly, at its May 9, 2023 meeting, the Board authorized the 30-day public comment on this final agreement to commence May 12, 2023 and the Board authorized a public hearing to be held June 13, 2023 at 7:30 pm. Mr. Stanley said the Board will not need to take any action at this time; he said staff is still negotiating with DGS and with the Virginia Resource Authority regarding financing of the project.

Chairman Gilliam opened the public hearing.

Rhett Weiss stated the County and IDA engaged his consulting firm to help on economic development matters concerning the Heartland Innovative Technology (HIT) Park. He said about a year ago, he started looking into data centers and their operation in conjunction with this particular site, he said the top three concerns are power, fiber and water. He encouraged the County to have a plan and agreement to have these three be in place to better allow him to market the lots.

Mr. Weiss said the main reason for a data center to have water is for cooling the computers.

Dr. Peter Gur stated he supports the Sandy River distribution plant, which will provide water for Nottoway County to the mental hospital and the regional jail, and in Burkeville, and may extend to Hampden Sydney College. He said it may cost a million dollars, but Wawa is being built with a gas station, and more businesses will come there.

There being no one further wishing to speak, Chairman Gilliam closed the public hearing.

Mr. Stanley said no action will be taken at this time.

#### In Re: Community Partner Updates

Donald Williamson, Director, Piedmont Court Services, presented background information on the local probation and pretrial services provided. He said they serve nine localities; he said during the probation supervision, they use evidence-based practices. He explained the process they follow to provide services to the offender. Mr. Williamson stated PCS wants to add moral recognition therapy, which is a moral reasoning group for higher-risk people that may have some antisocial beliefs and/or prolonged history. He said at the end of the third quarter, the agency had received 406 total placements; he said the success rate for misdemeanants is 80%; there were 6,560 community service hours completed.

Mr. Williamson stated pretrial services provide investigations and do a risk-assessment. He said that will indicate a risk of pre-trial failure, and make a recommendation to the court as to whether to release the offender or not. The other service to ensure the offenders meet their bond conditions.

The PCS Board includes two Board of Supervisors members and Mr. Stanley, and meet quarterly. He thanked his staff for their hard work; he added there are several open positions.

#### In Re: Courthouse Air Handler

Mr. Randy Cook, General Services Director, presented a proposal from HAVTECH HVAC Service Solutions to replace the supply fan assembly on Air Handler Unit #1 (AHU #1) in the Courthouse. This unit is one of nine which control the heating and air conditioning in the courthouse. AHU #1 has had a bad variable speed drive for the last 6+ months, and the replacement parts have been on backorder and hard to obtain. In the interim the squirrel cage housing has also come apart twice and has been repaired by staff.

This proposal will provide a permanent repair for all of the age-related problems to the supply fan of AHU #1, which is original to the courthouse. The total cost is \$29,702.

In Re: County Attorney Update

Mrs. Terri Atkins Wilson, County Attorney, reported work continued on the 2025 reassessment contract, several contracts related to the IDA for the Industrial Development property; she said work continues on the ordinances for review and bringing them up-to-date. She said she also dealt with an unclaimed remains case.

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# In Re: County Administrator Update

## Mr. Stanley presented his report:

- IT Director On June 1<sup>st</sup>, Shawn Howard started his position as IT Manager for Prince Edward County. Shawn is the County's first full-time IT Manager. He will be working side-by-side with our consultant for the next year as he assumes the responsibilities of the position and establishes the Department. Over the course of his first few months on the job he will be meeting with each Department Head/Constitutional Officer to determine needs and incorporate that information into an overall needs assessment. The hiring of an in-house IT person was the top priority of our Department Heads and Constitutional Officers when I came on board.
- Domestic Violence Services DSS Director Kim Allen and I participated in a regional call with the Department of Criminal Justice Services (DCJS) to talk about the closing of Madeline's House this past year and their efforts to identify a local option for services. DCJS stated they are working with VDSS to look at options and are currently conducting a needs assessment. We stressed the need to work with localities as part of this process and not simply give us a "top down" answer. With no local resources, our DSS staff is forced to transport domestic violence victims to Lynchburg, Danville, and Richmond locations; this is costing us time and money.
- Juror Payments One of the bills adopted by the General Assembly this year (HB2317/SB789) is an increase in jury duty allowance from \$30 to \$50 per day. This will go into effect on July 1st.
- CRC/REDO As part of the REDO concept analysis, our consultant reported by to the CRC and region on our local regional economy. Prince Edward, like the region, saw a drop in jobs with the COVID-19 pandemic. Prince Edward is certainly the economic engine of the region. Some of the takeaways include that the region has not fully revived from the COVID-19 lockdowns and that 2/3's of employees who live in our region, are employed outside the region. In addition, private sector wages in the region have outpaced the statewide average over the past 5 years. We also highly dependent on manufacturing and agriculture. The REDO group will be meeting again in June.
- Industrial Access Road Project The contractor is nearing completion of underdrain installation and will begin placing the roadway subbase stone early next week. Contractor expects to have it paved by July 1st. Project will be completed by August 1st.
- Rice Convenience Site The contractor will begin paving the site in the next week. Contractor has started on landscaping installation. Project is slated to be completed by July 1<sup>st</sup>. County staff will work to relocate the temporary site at the Lee's Retreat Wayside upon completion and acceptance of the project. On tonight's table pack, we have added purchase of a new compactor for the site. We are currently working on rehabbing the existing compactor unit and will use that until delivery of the new compactor. Once delivered, the rebuilt compactor will serve as our backup spare.
- Piedmont SWCD I participated with the Piedmont Soil and Water Conservation District Tour on June 13<sup>th</sup>. The tour included the Secretary of Natural Resources and the Director of the Department of Conservation and Recreation. As part of the tour, we visited Glen View Farm which totals over 2,650 acres of owned and leased land. Approximately 1,000 acres of the farm is in a conservation easement held by the Virginia Outdoors Foundation. We also toured the Buffalo #2 dam on Stockton Lake.
- Landfill/Cell F The County's Landfill Engineer, LaBella, is currently working on design/construction documents for Cell F at the landfill. We anticipate being ready to bid the project later this fall. Based on our capacity study completed in January 2023, we have approximately 3-years of life left in Cells A-E. Cell F will provide approximately 12 additional years of life beyond that at our current rate of compaction.

Solar Site/Thomas Jefferson Highway – The County received a building permit application for community solar site (Prince Edward CSG LLC – May 2021) previously approved by the Board on Route 47 (Thomas Jefferson Highway). The permit fees, under the new County fee schedule, totaled \$85,000+.

— Courthouse/Replacement Doors – Several sets of doors have been replaced at the Courthouse to meet fire code requirements. The original doors had internal cracks.

Chairman Gilliam asked about the current capacity at the landfill; Mr. Stanley said the County received temporary approval of 300 tons per day; he said the County is waiting approval to make that rate permanent.

## In Re: Purchase of New Compactor for Convenience Site

Mrs. Puckett stated staff presented a Sourcewell Proposal from Mid-Atlantic Waste Systems for the purchase of a new compactor for the Rice Convenience Site.

It was discussed with the Properties Committee at its May 9th meeting to purchase one new compactor, which would enable Mr. Jeff Jones to have a "spare" for when a compactor goes out of service for repairs. The current Rice compactor will be "renovated" and will then be placed at one of the convenience sites where that current compactor is in need of repairs.

As the cost exceeds \$20,000, this purchase requires Board approval. No additional appropriation is needed.

## In Re: Community Development Permitting Software

Mr. Stanley said that the County and Town Community Development staffs participated in a Zoom demonstration on Cloudpermit. Cloudpermit is a software system that would provide a much more modem permit platform for both staff and the contractor community. The software would allow for remote permit applications as well as real-time inspection reporting directly back to the contractor. The software would replace the current Bright System software that the County currently uses. If the Town and County were to both go with the software, it would

be an easier transition for the public. Staff also looked at iWorQ Systems, another software vendor. iWorkQ was

slightly more expensive and staff was more comfortable with the Cloudpermit product.

As noted above, the big advantages over the current permitting software are the ability to conduct mobile

inspections with immediate reporting and the ability for contractors and homeowners to submit permit applications

on-line. This will be particularly useful to parties that are not located in Prince Edward who will now not have to travel

to Farmville to file for a permit. The software is also cloud-based which provides greater flexibility in the event of a

hack or computer interruptions at the County.

Cloudpermit is new to Virginia. The Town of Pulaski is currently the only locality in the State using the

software. Mr. Stanley stated he has previously been involved in the implementation of a new software product that

was significantly more expensive (x15) and was specialized to fit the operations of the locality. With Prince Edward

being a smaller operation with fewer staff, we feel that we can modify our operations to fit the software. This will

allow for a quicker transition to the new software and save on implementation cost.

The Town of Farmville has indicated that they will be moving forward with implementation of Cloudpermit

for their building inspections functions as well. Due to the fact that they are only currently in one other locality in

Virginia, Cloudpermit has agreed to rebate 100% of the software license cost within six months if the County and/ or

Town decide that we do not like the product. The County would still be responsible for the setup fee. In addition,

Cloudpermit has agreed to cap renewal increases at no more than 5%.

Staff anticipate being able to cover the Year One costs of the implementation and software costs with our

existing Building Inspections and Planning budgets.

RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, VIRGINIA DECLARING ITS INTENTION TO REIMBURSE ITSELF FROM THE PROCEEDS OF ONE OR MORE TAX-EXEMPT FINANCINGS FOR CERTAIN EXPENDITURES MADE AND/OR TO BE MADE IN CONNECTION WITH SCHOOL PROJECTS FOR THE COUNTY

WHEREAS, Prince Edward County, Virginia (the "County") is a political subdivision organized and existing under the laws of the Commonwealth of Virginia; and

WHEREAS, the County has paid, beginning no earlier than (60 days prior to adoption of this resolution), or will pay, on and after the date hereof, certain expenditures (the "Expenditures") in connection with the various capital projects, including an elementary school renovation project in the County (the "Project"); and

WHEREAS, the Board of Supervisors of the County (the "Board") has determined that those moneys previously advanced no more than 60 days prior to the date hereof and to be advanced on and after the date hereof to pay the Expenditures are available only for a temporary period and it is may be necessary to reimburse the County for the Expenditures from the proceeds of one or more issues of tax-exempt bonds (the "Bonds"); and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY, VIRGINIA, AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Board hereby declares, in accordance with U.S. Treasury Regulation Section 1.150-2, as amended from time to time, the Board's intent to reimburse the County with the proceeds of the Bonds for Expenditures with respect to the Project made on and after the date which is no more than 60 days prior to the date hereof. The County reasonably expects on the date hereof that it will reimburse itself for the Expenditures with the proceeds of the Bonds.

Section 2. Each Expenditure was and will be either (a) of a type properly chargeable to a capital account under general federal income tax principles (determined in each case as of the date of the Expenditures), (b) a cost of issuance with respect to the Bonds, (c) a nonrecurring item that is not customarily payable from current revenues, or (d) a grant to a party that is not related to or an agent of the County so long as such grant does not impose any obligation or condition (directly or indirectly) to repay any amount to or for the benefit of the County.

Section 3. The maximum principal amount of the Bonds expected to be issued for the Project is \$34,000,000, which may be reduced from grant funding and other sources.

Section 4. The County will make a reimbursement allocation, which is a written allocation by the County that evidences the County's use of proceeds of the Bonds to reimburse an Expenditure, no later than 18 months after the later of the date on which the Expenditure is paid or the Project is placed in service or abandoned, but in no event more than three years after the date on which the Expenditure is paid. The County recognizes that exceptions are available for certain "preliminary expenditures," costs of issuance, certain deminimis amounts, expenditures by "small issuers" (based on the year of issuance and not the year of expenditure) and expenditures for construction projects of at least 5 years.

Section 5. This resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage. PASSED AND ADOPTED

### SITE PLAN

- 1. Development activities on the site shall be limited to those as specified in the Special Use Permit Application and Site Plan. The final locations of incidental facilities may be adjusted provided no such adjustment violates any buffers, setbacks, or other statutory requirement. The concepts reflected in the filed special use permit dated 5/16/2023 are hereby made part of these development conditions.
- 2. Final site plan approval for the Restaurant & Brew Pub shall be submitted to the Prince Edward County Community Development Department for final review and approval pursuant to Appendix B of the Prince Edward County Code (Zoning Ordinance).
- 3. Any proposed expansion of the operation, change of activities or additional facilities or activities shall be submitted to the Prince Edward County Planning and Community Development office for review prior to implementation. Any changes may be subject to Permit amendment procedures, including Public Hearings.
- 4. All buildings within the property shall be developed as a cohesive entity ensuring that building placement, architectural treatment, parking lot lighting, landscaping, trash disposal, vehicular and pedestrian circulation and other development elements work together functionally and aesthetically.
- 5. All landscaping shall be mulched and maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the Prince Edward County Planning and Community Development Director. Any vegetation found to be of poor condition shall be replaced and/or improved at the reasonable direction of the Planning and Community Development Director or his designee.

### **ENVIRONMENTAL**

- 6. All pollution control measures, erosion and sediment control measures, storm water control facilities, and all construction activities shall comply with the requirements of the appropriate federal, state, and local regulations and ordinances.
- 7. All facilities for the provision of potable water and sanitation and wastewater disposal systems and food preparation shall be approved by the appropriate local, state, or federal agency including but not limited to Virginia Department of Health, Virginia Departments of Environmental Quality, Environmental Protection Agency, etc.
- 8. Any development activities of a structural or land disturbing nature not specifically addressed by these Conditions shall be in conformance with applicable provisions of federal, state, and local statues and regulations.

### **TRANSPORTATION**

- 12. Restaurant hours of operation shall be limited to 12 a.m. until 10 p.m. Monday through Saturday and 12 a.m. until 5 p.m. on Sunday.
- 13. All exterior lighting shall be designed and installed so as to minimize glare onto adjoining properties or any public access road. All lighting shall be full cut-off type fixtures.
- 14. Outdoor storage of trash containers shall be situated at the rear of buildings and shall be appropriately screened.
- 15. The Permittee is responsible for the appearance of the site including litter pick-up and other orderly site appearance.
- 16. This Permit is non-transferable, except and unless written notice from the Permittee regarding the transfer, and a signed document from the proposed new Permittee is received by the Planning and Community Development Office which states that the new Permittee agrees to comply with all terms and Conditions imposed with the original Permit Issuance. If the proposed new Permittee desires to amend the original Permit Conditions, amendments must be addressed by the Prince Edward County Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors through the Special Use Permit process.
- 17. Failure of Permittee to full conform to all terms and conditions may result in revocation of this Special Use Permit if said failure or failures are not corrected or addressed to the satisfaction, not to be unreasonably withheld, of the County within thirty (30) days of written notice from the County.

The following is an excerpt of the minutes of the regular meeting of the Prince Edward County Planning Commission held June 20, 2023.

### In Re: Public Hearing - Special Use Permit, Mark Smith, DBA Sandy River Distillery

Chairman Prengaman announced this was the date and time scheduled to receive citizen input prior to considering a request from Mark Smith, DBA Sandy River Distillery, for a Special Use Permit for a restaurant and brew pub along with provisions for mobile food establishments on Tax Map Parcels 053-A-27C2 and 053-A-27C3 at 147 Monroe Church Road, Farmville, VA. Notice of this hearing was advertised according to law in the Wednesday, June 7, 2023 and Wednesday, June 14, 2023 editions of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

Mr. Love stated the County has received an application for a Special Use Permit from Mark Smith DBA as Sandy River Distillery for a Special Use Permit for a restaurant and brew pub along with provisions for mobile food establishments on Tax Map Parcels 053-A-27C2 and 053-A-27C3 at 147 Monroe Church Road, Farmville, VA. which is zoned A-1, Agricultural Conservation.

The purpose of the Special Use is to construct a restaurant & brew pub along with a designated area for up to five (5) mobile food establishments. County staff is of the opinion the use is compatible with the zoning district and will have minimal impact on surrounding properties.

Mr. Love stated he received two calls regarding this public hearing; Amy Alliston also sent a letter, a copy of which was placed at each Commissioner's seat. He said Terry Chadwick left a voice message requesting information regarding the public hearing, he attempted to return her call but left a very detailed voice message to her. He has received no other communication. Mr. Love then stated the prepared conditions were included in the packet.

Chairman Prengaman opened the public hearing.

Mark Smith, Applicant, stated this would provide a more viable business; he said this would not be a large restaurant but something for his patrons. Mr. Smith said there may be one to two food trucks during an event, and added things are going well at his Distillery. He stated he would like to have a "pizza truck" which would serve Neapolitan pizza.

Commissioner Peery questioned the hours of operation. Mr. Smith said currently he operates from 12:00 p.m. - 9:00 p.m., and would like to have the option to be open seven (7) days a week. He said the hours would diminish in the winter months, as business dictates.

Commissioner Fuller asked if all food prep will be done within the truck. Mr. Smith said it would, but his facility could be used and there will be picnic tables; he added that there is no indoor space to eat and in winter it may be limited but on nice days people could have the pizza. He said he would also like permission to have a restaurant.

Commissioner Weiss asked if he is also requesting a permanent restaurant at this time. Mr. Smith said he is, with the pizza truck first, then the restaurant.

Chairman Prengaman asked if the food trucks would be permanent; Mr. Smith said it would be semi-permanent, over the summer season and into the fall. He said this adds a service.

Commissioner Weiss asked about parking. Mr. Smith said there is parking for 20 vehicles at the Distillery and 40 more spaces across the street.

Commissioner Wiess then questioned traffic impacts on Monroe Church Road. Mr. Smith said traffic has dropped significantly after COVID as people are going to hotels again, and traffic will not be much different; he said if traffic becomes an issue he will move [the establishment] to his 100-acre property.

Mr. Fuller asked if Mr. Smith would have people cross Monroe Church Road at signs that indicate foot traffic. Mr. Smith said VDOT has already installed pedestrian signs, although some do not follow the signage.

Commissioner Gilliam said that one photo shows Conex boxes, and asked if that is what is intended for use. Mr. Smith said that in the future, that is likely what it would be. He said the idea is to bring spirits from all over the world to Rice, Virginia; agave spirits from Mexico, rum from the Caribbean, grapes from California. He said the idea for Conex boxes are to show that they are mixing the old with the new. He added he said another idea is to use a grain silo to make into a restaurant, in keeping with the rustic farm aspect of the county.

Julie Maserjian, Lockett District, said she sent a letter to Supervisor Jenkins and Supervisor Gilliam who also serves on the Planning Commission. She expressed her concerns about the speed limit on Monroe Church Road. She said while she supports the proposed venture, she has reservations because of traffic concerns. She stated the road is narrow and curved, and sometimes drivers "play chicken" with pedestrians or bikers, and there is no shoulder or berm to go onto. She said VDOT has had a complaint for two years [from her] but VDOT has not yet done a speed study. Ms. Maserjian said speed limits in residential and commercial areas are normally 25 mph.

Carolyn Bowman, Farmers Daughters, expressed her support for this business expansion.

Chairman Prengaman read the letter from Amy Alliston:

Dear Planning Commission,

I am a close neighbor to Mark Smith and have adjoining property which is my home. I have no problem with the current retreat but have had to get used to the frequent activity, noise and events going on which includes a lot of traffic, frequent live music, the bustle of human activity and large gatherings. Myself and other neighbors have had wandering guests come into our properties looking for the resort or exploring at night and even making camp fires. I do have concerns about expansion as the traffic will be dangerous on our small road which is very narrow and fast with no shoulder, not to mention the light and noise pollution is appreciated from inside my house since I am near the street. I am not thrilled with the idea of living next to a restaurant and bar with 5 food trucks also offering take out. The level of activity does not seem to comply with a rural lifestyle for those of us who want to enjoy the peaceful countryside of our community.

Sincerely, Amy Alliston

Rex Williams said he owns Lost Creek Cabins on the same road and stated it is dangerous. He said he doesn't think progress should be stopped and people should be able to do what they want on their property.

Chairman Prengaman stated a speed study will be requested.

Mr. Stanley, County Administrator, said previously there was not enough traffic to justify the study, but since [traffic] has increased, the speed limit may be lowered.

There being no one further wishing to speak, Chairman Prengaman closed the public hearing.

Chairman Prengaman asked the Commissioners to review the potential conditions. He said there is an opportunity for additional business, but also road issues.

Commissioner Sandlin said the property also fronts Green Bay Road, and the entrance could change to Green Bay Road. Discussion followed.

Commissioner Leatherwood asked about attendance on the weekends. Mr. Smith stated the hours are currently Thursday, 4:30-8:30 p.m., Friday and Saturday, 2:30-8:30 p.m., and Sunday 12:00 noon -5:00 p.m. He added that in the summer, the Distillery hours will change to 2:30-8:30 p.m. seven days a week, with the same Sunday hours. Mr. Smith said he would like to hold more events but they would not go beyond 5:00 p.m. on Sundays; he requested 12:00 noon -9:00 p.m. with a 5:00 p.m. close on Sunday.

Commissioner Gilliam asked if special events would use up to five different food trailers. Mr. Smith said they have had two in the past, and would likely not increase over three [trailers], but he would like that ability.

Commissioner Gilliam then asked about the maximum number of people; Mr. Smith said that most people would arrive and then leave, but he would estimate 100 at the restaurant. He said most likely it would be fewer than 50 [patrons]. Mr. Smith then stated he has a 3,000 square foot building that was brought over to the Clearwater resort area which is where the big restaurant will be located.

Commissioner Womack questioned the number of vehicles. Mr. Smith said the most they have had is 200 cars, and 500 people at the big events. He said they like to hold three or four a year; he announced their big event for the Rice Volunteer Fire Department, which will be held on Saturday from 4:00 - 8:00 p.m., with all proceeds going to the volunteer fire department.

Commissioner Weiss made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Paige, to recommend to the Board of Supervisors approval of the Special Use Permit request by Mark Smith DBA Sandy River Distillery for a restaurant and brew pub along with provisions for mobile food establishments with the following conditions and to include hours of operation of 12:00 p.m. – 9:00 p.m. Mondays through Saturday, and 12:00 p.m. – 5:00 p.m. on Sundays; the motion carried:

All buildings within the property shall be developed as a cohesive entity ensuring that building placement, architectural treatment, parking lot lighting, landscaping, trash disposal, vehicular and pedestrian circulation and other development elements work together functionally and aesthetically.
- 5. All landscaping shall be mulched and maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the Prince Edward County Planning and Community Development Director. Any vegetation found to be of poor condition shall be

replaced and/or improved at the reasonable direction of the Planning and Community Development Director or his designee.

### **Summary:**

The County has received an application for a Special Use Permit from James Robert Napier to establish a truck yard for a towing and recovery operation on Tax Map Parcel 115-A-36 at the intersection of State Route 630 (Free State Road & Price Gee Road) State Route 630 with their intersection with US 360, which is zoned A-1, Agricultural Conservation, Attachment (1).

The public hearing notice was published in the June 28, 2023 and July 5, 2023 editions of the Farmville Herald, Attachment (2). The list of adjoining property owners and the sample letter sent to each can be found in Attachments (3) and (4). Attachment (5) is a copy of the tax map page that depicts the tax map parcel of the parcel and surrounding property. The parcel is outlined in blue.



The following is an excerpt of the minutes of the regular meeting of the Prince Edward County Planning Commission held June 20, 2023.

### In Re: Public Hearing - Special Use Permit, James Robert Napier, Truck Yard for Towing & Recovery

Chairman Prengaman announced this was the date and time scheduled to receive citizen input prior to considering a request from James Robert Napier, for a Special Use Permit to establish a truck yard for a towing and recovery operation consisting of a 200' x 130' fenced area with an office building on Free State Road and a future 200' x 200' overflow lot on Price Gee Road on Tax Map Parcel 115-A-36 at the intersection of State Route 360 (Free State Road & Price Gee Road) with their intersection with US Route 360. Notice of this hearing was advertised according to law in the Wednesday, June 7, 2023 and Wednesday, June 14, 2023 editions of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

Mr. Love said the County has received an application for a Special Use Permit from James Robert Napier to establish a truck yard for a towing and recovery operation on Tax Map Parcel 115-A-36 at the intersection of State Route 630 (Free State Road & Price Gee Road) and US 360, which is zoned A-1, Agricultural Conservation.

The purpose of the Special Use is to construct a 200' x 130' fenced area with an office building on Free State Road and a future 200' x 200' overflow lot on Price Gee Road for the purpose of temporary vehicle storage. The vehicles will be brought and stored onsite as needed. Any security lighting shall be installed and properly angled to avoid light spillage onto adjoining properties.

County staff is of the opinion the use is compatible with the zoning district and will have minimal impact on surrounding properties.

Mr. Love said Route 460 bisects the property.

James Napier, Applicant, stated he has a smaller lot on Patrick Henry Highway, in Charlotte County, and plans to move from his current location. He said he intends to fence in the area, which will take some time to accomplish. Mr. Napier discussed the potential project and the expansion to include storage of electric vehicles. He said one reason for the expansion is the electric vehicles; they require a  $50^{\circ}$  x  $50^{\circ}$  space. He said they need to be stored safely and so the Fire Department can get to it if needed. This location is about a mile and a half from the Fire Department. He said the office will be open from 8:30 a.m. -4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday.

Chairman Prengaman asked how long his operation has been in Charlotte County. Mr. Napier said he started there in 2016; his father ran a shop there for years. He said a lot of people don't have insurance and it takes 30-90 days to process a car through the DMV; this would allow the storage of the vehicle while waiting on the paperwork to go through.

Commissioner Gilliam stated that as a volunteer firefighter, he would set the electric vehicles as far away from everything else as possible. Mr. Napier said he wants to have the electric cars set away from everything; he said he is learning the technology. Mr. Napier stated he is also on the fire department, and there are a lot of places that won't take electric cars. He said he has a hazmat company on standby.

Discussion followed on the location of the proposed lot.

Commissioner Fuller then asked if the infrastructure would be in place prior to opening; Mr. Napier said the privacy fence would be installed prior to opening. Discussion followed. He said he intends to plant hay on the remaining land and leave the timber standing.

Chairman Prengaman opened the public hearing.

Connie Faircloth said her property is adjacent to Mr. Napier's property. She stated her main concern about the overflow lot is that the groundwater could be contaminated by the vehicles as they are stored. She said this could pose a serious environmental and health threat due to the fluids that often leak from the vehicles. She said where the overflow lot is marked on the map, it is at the top of a hill and there is a small stream at the bottom of the hill, which runs into a larger stream that crosses both properties. She said she is concerned about the rain washing the toxins into the stream, soil and well water. She then stated the map that was used is a hunting map and not a survey map.

Sammy Faircloth stated he has a problem with the map as the lot size is inaccurate; he said Mr. Napier said the lot needs surveyed.

Chairman Prengaman asked if a survey has been done. Mr. Napier said he has not yet had a survey completed, but plans to before doing anything. Mr. Napier said he does have an entrance approval from VDOT.

Mr. Love said that the applicant will meet the required setbacks, and stated that he includes Condition 6 on any application that includes vehicles: All pollution control measures, erosion and sediment control measures, storm water control facilities, and all construction activities shall comply with the requirements of the appropriate federal, state, and local regulations and ordinances. Mr. Love said it would also require going through the ENS procedure as well, and would be subject to OSHA and EPA.

Mr. Napier said that most of the time, the fluids in the vehicles leak out when they are crashed. He said if there is leaking, he will make sure to use pads. Some discussion followed.

There being no one further wishing to speak, Chairman Prengaman closed the public hearing.

Chairman Prengaman asked the Commissioners to review the potential conditions.

Commissioner Sandlin made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Gilliam, to recommend to the Board of Supervisors approval of the Special Use Permit request by James Robert Napier to establish a truck yard for a towing and recovery operation with the following conditions; the motion carried:

The concepts reflected in the filed special use permit dated 5/8/2023 are hereby made part of these development conditions.
- 2. Final site plan approval for the Truck Yard Towing and Recovery Lot shall be submitted to the Prince Edward County Community Development Department for final review and approval pursuant to Appendix B of the Prince Edward County Code (Zoning Ordinance).
- 3. Any proposed expansion of the operation, change of activities or additional facilities or activities shall be submitted to the Prince Edward County Planning and Community Development office for review prior to implementation. Any changes may be subject to Permit amendment procedures, including Public Hearings.
- 4. All buildings within the property shall be developed as a cohesive entity ensuring that building placement, architectural treatment, parking lot lighting, landscaping, trash disposal, vehicular and pedestrian circulation and other development elements work together functionally and aesthetically.

5. All landscaping shall be mulched and maintained to the reasonable satisfaction of the Prince Edward County Planning and Community Development Director. Any vegetation found to be of poor condition shall be replaced and/or improved at the reasonable direction of the Planning and Community Development Director or his designee.

This Permit is non-transferable, except and unless written notice from the Permittee regarding the transfer, and a signed document from the proposed new Permittee is received by the Planning and Community Development Office which states that the new Permittee agrees to comply with all terms and Conditions imposed with the original Permit Issuance. If the proposed new Permittee desires to amend the original Permit Conditions, amendments must be addressed by the Prince Edward County Planning Commission and Board of Supervisors through the Special Use Permit process.
- 17. Failure of Permittee to full conform to all terms and conditions may result in revocation of this Special Use Permit if said failure or failures are not corrected or addressed to the satisfaction, not to be unreasonably withheld, of the County within thirty (30) days of written notice from the County.

### **Summary:**

The County has received an application for a Special Use Permit from James Robert Napier for two illuminated signs, one pole sign on US 360 E at its intersection with State Route 630 (Free State Road) and one pole sign on US 360 W at its intersection with State Route 630 (Price Gee Road), on Tax Map Parcel 115-A-36, which is zoned A-1, Agricultural Conservation, Attachment (1) Due to the intended height and illumination of the signs, the approval of a Special Use Permit is required.

The public hearing notice was published in the June 28, 2023 and July 5, 2023 editions of the Farmville Herald, Attachment (2). The list of adjoining property owners and the sample letter sent to each can be found in Attachments (3) and (4). Attachment (5) is a copy of the tax map page that depicts the tax map parcel of the parcel and surrounding property. The parcel is outlined in blue.

The Planning Commission held a public hearing on June 20 2023, where there were comments in opposition. 

### In Re: Public Hearing - Special Use Permit, James Robert Napier, Two Illuminated Signs

Chairman Prengaman announced this was the date and time scheduled to receive citizen input prior to considering a request from James Robert Napier, for a Special Use Permit for two illuminated signs, one on US 360 E at its intersection with State Route 630 (Free State Road) being 40 square foot pole sign with a total height of 15 feet and a 40' square foot pole sign on US 360 W at its intersection with State Route 630 (Price Gee Road) a total height of 8 feet for a towing and recovery operation. Notice of this hearing was advertised according to law in the Wednesday, June 7, 2023 and Wednesday, June 14, 2023 editions of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

The County has received an application for a Special Use Permit from James Robert Napier for two illuminated signs, one pole sign on US 360 E at its intersection with State Route 630 (Free State Road) and one pole sign on US 360 W at its intersection with State Route 630 (Price Gee Road), on Tax Map Parcel 115-A-36, which is zoned A-1, Agricultural Conservation.

The purpose of the Special Use is to construct a 40 square foot pole sign with a total height of 15 feet on US 360 E at its intersection with State Route 630 (Free State Road) and a 40 square foot pole sign on US 360 W at its intersection with State Route 630 (Price Gee Road) a total height of 8 feet. Sign lighting shall be installed and properly angled to avoid light spillage onto adjoining properties or the roadways.

County staff is of the opinion the use is compatible with the zoning district and will have minimal impact on surrounding properties.

Commissioner Weiss asked if the heights of the two signs be the same. Mr. Love stated that they will match which will be measured from grade.

Mr. Napier said he wants to match the aesthetic of his neighbors, and will shift the signs for sight distance. Mr. Love added that no signage can be put in the right of way.

Commissioner Paige asked if both signs will be placed at the same time. Mr. Napier said he will place the first sign now and once the survey is done he would place the second; he said he will order the survey tomorrow.

Chairman Prengaman opened the public hearing.

Sharon Dotson, Lockett District, stated that she doesn't understand why a person that wants to operate a business or wants to do something on their private property would have to come to the County to get a special permit for a sign or a flag, or pay a fee, as long as he is respectful of the road and not block the view, [why] does he have to do all that. She said it doesn't make sense that you have to come in and ask permission for everything that you do, for everything that you own in the County. It looks like you're taking rights away from everybody whether it's private, personal or business.

Chairman Prengaman said the County requires a special use permit for signage. Discussion followed.

Carol Conrad expressed her concerns about sight distance getting onto the road. Chairman Prengaman said that is one of the guidelines and assurances the County gets from VDOT, that line of sight still has to be there for traffic.

Connie Faircloth expressed her concern regarding the placement of a sign on the Price Gee side of the highway; she said she doesn't want anything distracting a driver such as a lit up sign as is proposed. She said she doesn't understand the necessity of these two large signs on both sides of the highway. She said people would look for the office at the overflow lot, and doesn't want people coming to her front door looking for his business.

Chairman Prengaman said the County will look at the signage and it must be consistent with what is done within the County; he added that VDOT does not permit any signs within the right of way or any signage that would impact or interfere with sight distance, or impede that for any drivers on the highway. That is a condition on this special use permit.

Commissioner Weiss asked the purpose of the sign on the Price Gee side of the highway. Mr. Napier said it would be for east and west traffic. He said he will indicate the location of the office on the signs.

Mr. Love said that in working with Trey Pyle, because of vehicle storage will require an address for fire and emergency reasons. He said if there is a fire, there should be a sign out to ensure the fire department goes to the correct lot.

Commissioner Weiss said the signs are not just advertising but are also directional and for safety. Discussion followed.

There being no one further wishing to speak, Chairman Prengaman closed the public hearing.

Chairman Prengaman asked the Commissioners to review the potential conditions.

Commissioner Fuller made a motion, seconded by Commissioner Peery, to recommend to the Board of Supervisors approval of the Special Use Permit request by James Robert Napier for the installation of two illuminated pole signs with the following conditions; the motion carried:

## **Summary:**

As the Board may be aware, Cheryl Stimpson, Director of Finance/HR has been serving as the County's CSA Coordinator since she was employed with the County in 2015. Although she has done a tremendous job, the CSA Coordinator position is not in line with her current duties as the Director of Finance/HR. In discussion with staff, including the DSS Director, it has been determined that DSS has an individual that is highly qualified and is willing to perform the duties of the CSA Coordinator, as well as her current duties. Staff is recommending that the Board consider a change in a Self-Sufficiency position in DSS to a Program Coordinator position and include the CSA Coordinator duties in the position. Prince Edward County receives approximately \$13,000.00 for administrative support from the Office of Children's Services. The County would transfer up to \$7,500 to cover the additional duties of CSA Coordinator to DSS at the beginning of the fiscal year, if approved by the Board. Fiscal responsibility for the CSA Program would reside within the Finance/HR department of the County.

Staff are also recommending that Doug Stanley continue as the BOS representative on the CPMT and appoint Cheryl Stimpson as the alternate.

Unpaid Leave for Organ Donation and Bone Marrow Leave

## Summary:

On May 22, 2023, One Digital provided information on SB1086, which states that Virginia has passed the Unpaid Leave for Organ Donation legislation. SB 1086 requires employers with 50 or more employees to provide organ donation and bone marrow donation leave to any "eligible" employee starting July 1, 2023.

"Organ donation leave" provides for leave of an eligible employee for the purpose of donating one or more of their organs, including bone marrow, to be medically implanted in another individual. An employee's organ donation leave will not impact an employee's ability to take federal FMLA leave within the same year. Virginia law expressly states that organ donation leave is separate from federal FMLA leave. The leave is unpaid and requires employers to restore employees to the position they hold prior to taking their leave, or to an equivalent position with equivalent pay, benefits, and other terms and conditions of employment.

The law also includes a schedule for violations, including up to \$5,000 for repeat offenses.

# Virginia Passes Unpaid Leave for Organ Donation

## **Overview of SB 1086:**

- Virginia provides eligible employees with up to 60 business days of unpaid organ donation leave within a 12month period.
- Virginia provides eligible employees with up to 30 business days of unpaid bone marrow donation leave within a 12-month period.
- Virginia organ donation and bone marrow leave is separate from federal FMLA leave.

# Who qualifies for SB 1086?

SB 1086 requires employers with 50 or more employees to provide organ donation and bone marrow donation leave to any "eligible" employee starting July 1, 2023.

"Organ donation leave" provides for the leave of an eligible employee for the purpose of donating one or more of their organs, including bone marrow, to be medically transplanted into the body of another individual. To be considered "eligible" for this leave, an employee is required to have worked for the employer for at least a 12-month period and at least 1,250 hours during the preceding 12 months.

While these eligibility requirements largely mirror the eligibility requirements under the <u>Family and Medical Leave Act (FMLA)</u>, an employee's organ donation leave will not impact an employee's ability to take federal FMLA leave within the same year. Virginia law expressly states that organ donation leave is separate from federal FMLA leave (i.e., organ donation leave cannot run concurrently with federal FMLA leave).

## **Details of SB 1086**

The leave is unpaid and requires employers to restore employees to the position they held prior to taking their leave, or to an equivalent position with equivalent pay, benefits, and other terms and conditions of employment.

During an eligible employee's organ donation and/or bone marrow donation leave period, the employer must maintain coverage of the employee's health plan benefits. The law also requires the employer to pay out any commissions due to the employee that become due during the employee's leave period, and which result from the employee's work prior to commencing their leave.

Employers are prohibited from treating organ donation and/or bone marrow donation leave as a break in the employee's continuous service for purposes of their right to salary adjustments, sick leave, vacation, paid time off, annual leave, seniority, or other applicable employee benefits. Employers are also prohibited from retaliating against employees for requesting or exercising their right to organ donation leave, or employees who have alleged a violation of the organ donation leave law.

The law outlines a schedule for violations, including up to \$5,000 for repeated offenses. Employers should prepare now for this new leave benefit to go into effect this summer.

# **Action Steps for SB 1086:**

- 1. Have applicable employee leave policies updated.
- 2. Have appropriate personnel trained on the new leave requirements.

### 2023 SESSION

#### **CHAPTER 751**

An Act to amend the Code of Virginia by adding in Chapter 3 of Title 40.1 an article numbered 2.2, consisting of sections numbered 40.1-33.7 through 40.1-33.12, relating to unpaid organ donation leave; required; civil penalty.

[S 1086] Approved April 12, 2023

Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Virginia:

1. That the Code of Virginia is amended by adding in Chapter 3 of Title 40.1 an article numbered 2.2, consisting of sections numbered 40.1-33.7 through 40.1-33.12, as follows:

Article 2.2.
Organ Donation Leave.

§ 40.1-33.7. Definitions.

As used in this article, unless the context requires a different meaning:

"Eligible employee" means an individual who has requested that an employer provide organ donation leave and who, as of the date that the requested organ donation leave begins, will have been employed by that employer for at least (i) a 12-month period and (ii) 1,250 hours during the previous 12 months.

"Employer" means any employer as defined in § 40.1-2 that employs 50 or more employees. Notwithstanding § 40.1-2.1, "employer" includes the Commonwealth and its agencies, institutions, and political subdivisions. "Employer" does not include any agency of the federal government.

"Organ donation leave" means leave of an eligible employee for the purpose of donating one or more of such employee's human organs, including bone marrow, to be medically transplanted into the body of another individual.

#### § 40.1-33.8. Organ donation leave.

- A. An employer shall provide an eligible employee (i) up to 60 business days of unpaid organ donation leave in any 12-month period to serve as an organ donor and (ii) up to 30 business days of unpaid organ donation leave in any 12-month period to serve as a bone marrow donor.
- B. To receive organ donation leave, the eligible employee shall provide written physician verification to the employer that (i) the eligible employee is an organ donor or a bone marrow donor and (ii) there is a medical necessity for the donation of the organ or bone marrow.
- C. No employee shall take organ donation leave concurrently with leave taken under the federal Family and Medical Leave Act (29 U.S.C. § 2601 et seq.).
- D. Nothing in this article shall be construed to:
- 1. Discourage an employer from adopting or retaining leave policies more generous than required by this article;
- 2. Except as provided in subsection C, prohibit an employee from taking paid sick leave or other paid time off to which the employee is otherwise entitled in addition to or in lieu of organ donation leave; or
- 3. Diminish the obligation of an employer to comply with a collective bargaining agreement or an employment benefit program or plan that provides an amount of organ donation leave sufficient to meet the requirements of this article and that may be used for the same purposes and under the same conditions as organ donation leave under this article. 200

§ 40.1-33.9. Employee's right to benefits; restoration of position.

- A. No employer shall consider any period of time during which an eligible employee takes organ donation leave to be a break in the eligible employee's continuous service for the purpose of the eligible employee's right to salary adjustments, sick leave, vacation, paid time off, annual leave, seniority, or other employee benefits.
- B. An eligible employee who returns to work after taking organ donation leave shall be entitled to restoration by the employer of (i) the position of employment held by the eligible employee when the organ donation leave began or (ii) an equivalent position with equivalent employment benefits, pay, and other terms and conditions of employment. An employer may deny restoration of the eligible employee's position of employment under this subsection because of conditions unrelated to the exercise of rights established under this article.
- § 40.1-33.10. Health benefit plan; commission.
- A. During any period that an eligible employee takes organ donation leave, an employer shall maintain coverage of a health benefit plan for the duration of the organ donation leave and in the same manner that coverage would have been provided if the eligible employee had continued in employment continuously for the duration of the organ donation leave.
- B. If an eligible employee works on a commission basis, an employer shall pay to the eligible employee during any period of organ donation leave any commission that becomes due because of work the eligible employee performed before taking organ donation leave.
- § 40.1-33.11. Retaliatory action prohibited.

No employer shall discharge, discipline, threaten, discriminate against, or penalize an employee, or take other retaliatory action regarding an employee's compensation, terms, conditions, location, or privileges of employment, because the employee (i) has requested or exercised the benefits provided for in this article or (ii) has alleged a violation of this article.

- § 40.1-33.12. Enforcement; civil penalty.
- A. The Commissioner shall enforce the provisions of this article and shall adopt appropriate guidance for the implementation and enforcement of this article.
- B. Any person alleging a violation of this article shall have the right to file a complaint with the Commissioner within one year of the date the person knew or should have known of the alleged violation. The Commissioner shall encourage reporting pursuant to this subsection by keeping confidential, to the maximum extent permitted by applicable laws, the name and other identifying information of the employee or other person reporting the violation, provided, however, that with the authorization of such person, the Commissioner may disclose the person's name and identifying information as necessary to enforce this article or for other appropriate purposes.
- C. Upon receiving a complaint alleging a violation of this article, the Commissioner shall investigate such complaint and attempt to resolve it through mediation between the complainant and the subject of the complaint, or other means. The Commissioner shall keep complainants notified regarding the status of their complaint and any resultant investigation. If the Commissioner believes that a violation has occurred, he shall issue to the offending person or employer a notice of violation and the relief required of the offending person or entity. The Commissioner shall prescribe the form and wording of such notices of violation, including any method of appealing a decision of the Commissioner.
- D. The Commissioner shall notify any employer who he alleges has violated any provision of this article by certified mail. Such notice shall contain a description of the alleged violation. Within 15 days of receipt of notice of the alleged violation, the employer may request an informal conference with the Commissioner regarding such violation.
- E. Any such employer who knowingly violates this article shall be subject to a civil penalty not to exceed \$1,000 for the first violation and, for subsequent violations that occur within two years of any previous violation, not to exceed \$2,500 for the second violation and not to exceed \$5,000 for each successive violation. In determining the amount of any civil penalty to be imposed, the Commissioner shall consider the size of the business of the employer charged and the gravity of the violation. The decision of the Commissioner shall be final.

F. Civil penalties owed under this article shall be paid to the Commissioner for deposit into the general fund. The Commissioner shall prescribe procedures for the payment of proposed assessments of civil penalties that are not contested by employers.

#### **Project Narrative**

#### **Demonstration of Need\*:**

The Prince Edward County Sheriff's Office has to protect and serve over 21,931 citizens plus two colleges that house over 5000 students. We have 43 staff members plus the Sheriff. Most of the time our County is mild, laid back and a place to come for shopping, eating, and etc. Since COVID in 2020, we have been severely short staffed with staff members or their families out sick. We have had several homicides plus and abundance of narcotics activity. We have also had an increase in traffic citations that include Driving under the influence of alcohol and \or narcotics. Our office has had a shortage of vehicle due to our budget. Our Deputies have to change up vehicles constantly as we do not have enough reliable vehicle for each person on our road staff. Also we have been hit hard with mental health patients that we have to transport throughout the state of Virginia. The funds provided will help our agency tremendously with reliable vehicles and other equipment that we desperately need to prevent and deter crime.

#### **Project Description\*:**

We have included 4 new vehicles in our request. These vehicles will serve as a major factor in preventing crime as our Deputies will have reliable service vehicles and increases visibility in our County and on our road ways. The repeaters that we asked for will provide better and faster communications so that Deputies can receive clearer and more precise information to ensure safety. The tactical gear requested will help our agency put in to place a tactical team that will effectively ensure a more safe environment as well as a more secure Sheriff's Office response to violent crimes. Another request was a Leads Online Tracker. This service will help our agency track criminals. We can also rely on the help of other agencies throughout the country and this is at our fingertips. This service will provide quicker leads and better information. License readers will read a person's license plate and quickly gather information about the vehicle driven as well as the driver. We asked for one radar as we will need it in our new vehicle. Radars help our Deputies stop speeders and therefore deters crime and possible saves someone's life. Last but not least we asked for a ballistic vest as this will ensure our Deputy's safety while fighting or preventing crime.

As of June 6th, Kinex has completed 2,673 passings and 452 installs for new customers. Kinex hopes to see installs for new customers ramp up within the next one to two months.



### **Buckingham County Community Meeting**

The CRC held a community meeting on June 15th at the Buckingham County Community Center. This meeting was intended to provide citizens with an opportunity to provide input for the long-term vision for the future and to inform citizens about the Comprehensive Plan.



### Office Move to Heartland Industrial Park

As of July 1st, the CRC will have officially moved into the Heartland Building in Keysville. The move will take place the last week of June. Our new address is at 200 Heartland Drive, Keysville, VA.



### Contract Executed for Amelia Co. Comprehensive Plan

Amelia County has executed a contract for the CRC to complete modified Comprehensive Plan services for noted sections. This project is estimated to take about 6 months to complete.

### Prince Edward Access Road Project

The Contractor, J.R. Caskey, Inc. is continuing to work on the access road. The contractor is nearing completion of underdrain installation and has begun placing the roadway subbase stone. Paving will begin next week (weather permitting).
