




What is a Comprehensive Plan?

- ☐ A long-range planning document and decision-making guide
- ☐ A community-guided vision for the future
- ☐ A showcase of assets and areas for improvement
- ☐ The guiding framework for the community's planning tools: Zoning Ordinance, Subdivision Ordinance, Capital Improvements Program, and other plans/studies
- ☐ A legally required document by § 15.2-2223 of the Code of VA

Why Update a Comprehensive Plan?


- ☐ Local priorities & vision change with time

- ☐ Five-year review **legally required** by § 15.2-2223 of the Code of VA









Assessed the 2014 Comprehensive Plan for compliance with the Code of Virginia and general best practices

Comprehensive Plan Diagnostic

Code of Virginia Compliance Findings

1

The current plan thoroughly establishes existing conditions.
Update data to reflect current community conditions and population projections.

2

Bolster discussion of:

- Economic factors and trends
- Affordable, workforce, and manufactured housing options
- Broadband access

3

Update transportation section to continue meeting VDOT requirements and address regional land use considerations; break out into dedicated chapter.

4

Clarify plan structure, future land use map, and designations to address community needs; consider additional standards to guide desired growth patterns around village centers.

Comprehensive Plan Diagnostic

Best Practices

1

The current plan is strong in the areas of transportation planning, preserving the County's agricultural and rural landscapes, and protecting natural and historic resources.

2

Policies and strategies included in the current plan reflect clear preferences and vision for the future, but could be compiled and conveyed in a more effective manner.

3

The comprehensive plan will benefit from a more robust discussion of the public engagement process, key takeaways, and how they inform the plan.

4

Implementation should be more thoroughly addressed, with strategies assigned a priority timeframe and responsible party for completion.
