#### **Protocol for Public Participation**

- The Board of Supervisors sets aside twenty (20) minutes near the beginning of each regular board meeting for citizen comment.
- This regular agenda item is termed "Public Participation." During this period, the Board receives comment from any citizen of Prince Edward County on any matter not scheduled for a public hearing.
- This is an opportunity for citizens to speak and the Board to listen carefully to citizen expressions of concern and opinion.
- Citizens may ask questions of the Board or individual Board members; however, Public Participation is not designed to allow debate between Board members and citizens.
- Citizens are expected to conduct research on topics prior to Board meetings and this forum provides citizens with an opportunity to inform elected officials of their findings and positions on matters of public interest and concern.
- Citizens wishing to speak during Public Participation are asked to please sign the Public Participation register prior to the beginning of the meeting.
- Citizens may also participate remotely by using the call-in information: 1-844-890-7777, Access Code: 390313. Citizens participating remotely are asked to pre-register by calling the County Administrator's Office at 434-392-8837, prior to 4:00 p.m. the day of the meeting.
- Citizens are respectfully requested to state their full name and address for the record.
- The Chairman of the Board will establish the order of speakers and will maintain decorum.
- Citizens shall speak for a maximum of five (5) minutes, unless more time is granted by the Chair.
- In the event that more than four (4) speakers wish to be heard during citizen's time, the Chairman shall allocate the twenty (20) minutes among speakers in an equitable manner. An extension to the twenty (20) minute limit can be granted by the Chair.
- Comments from citizens who are not residents of Prince Edward County will be entertained once all County residents are heard.
- Signs, placards, posters or like material are not permitted in the Board Chamber, adjoining areas or County offices.
- The Board asks that citizens remain seated during the meeting unless called upon to stand for recognition as a speaker, official duties, physical necessity, or to enter or leave the meeting.
- The use of profane, vulgar, obscene or threatening speech is not permitted and can result in removal from the meeting.
- Citizens are requested to turn off or deactivate the sound from all cell phones, pagers, or other electronic communication devices.

#### COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA 2024 BYLAWS OF THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS

#### I. ATTENDANCE AND ADJOURNMENT

All members shall make a reasonable effort to attend meetings of the Board. If unable to attend, a member shall notify the Chair or County Administrator.

A majority of the members of the Board shall constitute a quorum and must be present to proceed to business. A smaller number of members may adjourn or send for absentees. Special meetings of the Board may be called in accordance with Section 15.2-1418 of the Code of Virginia, 1950, as amended.

The Chair shall take the chair at the hour set by the Board for regular or special meetings. He shall immediately call the Board to order and determine if a quorum is present; if so, he shall have the minutes of the preceding meeting submitted. Any errors or omissions shall, upon motion and carried, then be corrected. The minutes, being found correct, shall be signed by the Chair and Clerk and shall be the authentic record of the proceedings of the Board of Supervisors.

#### II. CHAIR AND VICE-CHAIR

Annually at the first meeting in January of the Board of Supervisors, the Board shall elect from its membership a Chair and Vice-Chair, each of whom shall serve a term for one year, expiring on December 31 of the year elected, or until their respective successors shall be elected. In the case of the absence of the Chair, the Vice-

Chair shall preside at the meeting; in the absence of both the Chair and Vice-Chair, the members present shall choose one of its members as temporary Chair.

The position of Chair and Vice-Chair of the Board shall be rotated annually among the Board members. The rotation process will commence with the most senior member, that is being the member from District 101 serving as Chair and the member from District 201 serving as Vice Chair. Seniority will be based on cumulative months/years of service on the Board of Supervisors, which need not be consecutive. In keeping with this policy, the selected Vice Chair will be elevated the following year to serve as Chair. Upon completion of serving a term as Chair that district's Board member would move to the end of the rotation list. A Board member shall have a minimum of one year of service on the Board decline to seek the nomination as Chair or Vice Chair that district's Board member of the Board decline to seek the nomination as Chair or Vice Chair that district's Board member would move to the end of the rotation would proceed to the next higher district number, unless the rotation is amended by a two-third vote of the Board of Supervisors. If a tie shall occur in the seniority of Board members, the Board member from the lower numbered district shall succeed as Vice Chair/Chair first.

Commencing with the organizational meeting held in January of 2016, a rotation for Chair and Vice Chair based upon the members in office shall be established at the annual organizational meeting of the Board. The rotation commencing January 1, 2024 is as follows:

If a Board of Supervisors meeting is cancelled due to inclement weather, the meeting will be held on the following Thursday, unless a holiday, in which case the meeting would be held on the following Tuesday. Pursuant to Virginia Code 15.2-1416, all hearings and other matters previously advertised shall be conducted at the continued meeting and no further advertisement is required.

#### III. CLERK

The County Administrator shall serve as Clerk to the Board. The minutes of the meetings of the Board shall be duly drawn by the Clerk and shall be submitted for approval at the next regular monthly meeting following their draft. The Clerk shall appoint a deputy as recording secretary if required or needed by the Board.

#### IV. ORDER OF BUSINESS

After the call to order the Board shall proceed to the agenda. The normal order of the agenda shall be as below, except at the January organizational meeting and as subject to rearrangement by the Chair, absent objection by the Board. At the organizational meeting in January, the first order of business shall be the election of the Chair and Vice-Chair and approval of the Board's operating procedures.

#### V. PREPARATION OF AGENDA

The County Administrator shall see that the preparation and printing of Board papers, ordinances, resolutions, petitions, and other applicable documents, be completed within such time that members of the Board may receive the documents at least 72 hours before the meeting of the Board.

The County Administrator shall close the upcoming Agenda on the Wednesday prior to the meeting of the Board. Any item submitted after this deadline will not be considered for action unless recommended by the County Administrator.

#### VI. CONSENT AGENDA

The Chair and County Administrator shall style routine, non-controversial matters requiring Board action on a Consent Agenda. Items may be removed from the Consent Agenda and placed on the Regular Agenda on recorded vote by a majority of the Board members present. Only one motion is necessary to adopt all recommendations and action items on the Consent Agenda.

There shall be no debate or discussion by any member of the Board or the public regarding any item on the Consent Agenda, beyond asking questions for simple clarification.

#### VII. CONDUCT OF BUSINESS

The Chair shall preserve order and decorum. When two or more members speak at the same time, the Chair shall name the person who shall speak first.

A motion or proposition shall be reduced to writing, if desired by the Chair or any member. Any motion or proposition may be withdrawn by the mover at any time before a decision, amendment, or other action of the Board upon it, except a motion to reconsider, which shall not be withdrawn without leave of the Board. Otherwise, meetings shall be conducted in accordance to <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>, <u>Newly Revised</u> (Procedures for Small Boards).

#### VIII. TAKING THE VOTE

When a motion in order is made, a second shall be required. The Chair shall then state the exact motion and indicate that it is open to debate. After the motion has been debated, the Chair shall put the question in the following forms: "As many as agree that, etc. (as the question may be) let it be known by raising your right hand", and "Those opposed by the same sign."

According to the Constitution of Virginia, a majority of all elected members shall be necessary to adopt any ordinance or resolution appropriating money exceeding the sum of \$500.00, imposing taxes, or authorizing the borrowing of money. Otherwise, a resolution, ordinance, or other proposition shall be adopted by vote of the majority of Board members present and voting. A tie vote shall mean the defeat of the motion voted on.

A member may abstain and be entered in the minutes as present and abstaining.

The *Code of Virginia*, 1950, as amended, Title 2.2, Chapter 31, (State & Local Government Conflict of Interest Act) shall control with respect to a member's participation and voting.

#### IX. RECONSIDERATION

After a question has been decided, it may be reconsidered on the motion of any member who voted with the prevailing side, provided the motion is made on the same day as the decision carried. All motions to reconsider shall be decided by a majority of the votes of the members present and voting.

#### X. WITHDRAWAL OF EXHIBITS

Original papers, filed as exhibits with any ordinance or resolution, may be withdrawn by the patron or upon his order. In such case, he shall leave attested copies, and shall pay the Clerk for the cost of copying.

#### XI. MANUAL AND RULES

The rules of parliamentary practice in <u>Robert's Rules of Order</u>, <u>Newly Revised</u> shall govern the Board in all cases to which they are applicable, except when they are inconsistent with the rules established by the Board.

The Rules of the Board shall be reviewed and adopted in January of each year. These Rules may subsequently be suspended or amended by a two-third vote of the entire Board. Upon a motion to suspend or amend, the mover shall be allowed two minutes to state the reasons for his motion, and one member opposed to the motions shall be allowed an equal time to object.

#### XII. APPOINTMENTS

All appointments of Board representatives to commissions, authorities, committees, etc. shall be made once the individual leaves the position or on expiration of his term, and not later than two meetings after the individual has left. The Board shall attempt to honor appointments from representative districts and shall not discriminate based on sex, age, handicap, race, or origin.

At the January meeting of each year, the Board shall vote whether to operate with a system of standing committees during the year. If it does, the Board shall specify the name, composition, and function of each of the several committees. The committees shall meet at the regular times and in conformity with the Virginia Freedom of

Information Act. In selecting members of committees, the Chair of the Board shall make nominations after soliciting from members of the Board their preferences as to committee assignments. The Board may amend the Chair's nominations and shall confirm the assignments. Standing committees shall consider such matters as referred by the Board, and shall report at regular meetings of the Board.

If the Board votes not to have standing committees, it may act as a committee of the whole on matters normally referred to standing committees. However; the Chair after consulting with the County Administrator, may appoint special (ad hoc) committees to carry out specific tasks. This shall be done after soliciting from members of the Board their preferences as to committee assignments. A special committee shall automatically cease to exist once it has completed its specific task.

#### XIII. PUBLIC HEARINGS

The Chair may, at his/her discretion, set an appropriate and consistent time limit on all speakers at a public hearing. All speakers shall come forward and identify themselves by name and address before stating their position. If a public hearing becomes disruptive, the Chair may adjourn or continue, in accordance with the *Code of Virginia*.

#### XIV. CLOSED SESSIONS

All discussions held in Closed Session as outlined in the Virginia Freedom of Information Act shall represent privileged information held by those involved. Release of such information by a Board member outside the session shall be considered a breach of these by-laws, and the member shall be subject to censure. Specific purposes of a closed session shall be stated in accordance with Section 2.2-3711 of the *Code of Virginia*, 1950, as amended.

Upon return to regular session after a closed session, the County Attorney and/or Board Chair shall state the nature of the closed session in as specific terms as appropriate.

In open session, a roll call vote shall be recorded in the minutes, certifying that only public business matters lawfully exempted from open meeting requirements and only such business matters as were identified in the motion were discussed or considered. Any member of the public body who believes there was a departure from the requirements shall so state prior to the vote. The statement shall be recorded in the minutes.

#### **ROBERT'S RULES OF ORDER, NEWLY REVISED**

#### PROCEDURE IN SMALL BOARDS

In a board meeting where there are not more than about a dozen members present, some of the formality that is necessary in a large assembly would hinder business. The rules governing such meetings are different from the rules that hold in other assemblies, in the following respects:

--Members are not required to obtain the floor before making motions or speaking, which they can do while seated.

--There is no limit to the number of times a member can speak to a question, and motions to close or limit debate generally should not be entertained.

--Informal discussion of a subject is permitted while no motion is pending.

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--Sometimes, when a proposal is perfectly clear to all present, a vote can be taken without a motion having been introduced. Unless agreed to by general consent, however, all proposed actions of a board must be approved by vote under the same rules as in other assemblies, except that a vote can be taken initially by a show of hands, which is often a better method in such meetings.

--The Chair need not rise while putting questions to vote.

--The Chair can speak in discussion without rising or leaving the chair; and, subject to rule or custom within the particular board (which should be uniformly followed regardless of how many members are present), he usually can make motions and usually votes on all questions.

#### EFFECT OF PERIODIC PARTIAL CHANGE IN BOARD MEMBERSHIP

In cases where a board is constituted so that a specific portion of it is chosen periodically (as, for example, where one third of the board is elected annually for three-year terms), it becomes, in effect, a new board each time such a group assumes board membership. Consequently, all unfinished business existing when the outgoing portion of the board vacates membership falls to the ground; and if the board is one that elects its own officers or appoints standing committees, it chooses new officers and committees as soon as the new board members have taken up their duties, just as if the entire board membership had changed. The individual replacement of persons who may occasionally vacate board membership at other times, however, does not have these effects.

- 2. Following discussion of all matters to be considered and once the public hearing has been closed, the Board will consider one of the following three actions regarding each matter:
  - a. Approval (with conditions, as applicable);
  - b. Denial; or
  - c. Table for further review.

#### PUBLIC HEARING GUIDELINES

• Individuals wishing to speak should register using the sign-in sheet posted outside the Board of Supervisors room on the night of the meeting. Individuals wishing to participate remotely may register in advance with the Deputy Clerk or call into the meeting and remain on the line until acknowledged by the Board Chair.

- Speakers will be asked to stand at the lectern and address the Board, if able, unless participating remotely, and to provide their name and district.
- Speakers arriving after the commencement of the hearing or who are participating remotely, and who are not on the sign-up sheet, will be recognized after the registered speakers have finished and at the discretion of the Chair.
- The Chair may establish a time limit for each speaker and to limit or decrease time for any portion of the public hearing due to the number of potential speakers, or repetition, or any other concern.
- All comments shall be directed to the members of the Board of Supervisors. Debate is prohibited. This includes debate among speakers or speakers/Board members/staff. Citizen comments may be supplemented by written comments and/ or handouts and should bring ten copies for distribution to the Board of Supervisors.
- Speakers are asked to keep comments brief and to avoid repetitive testimony. Each speaker may speak once at a hearing. Remarks shall be confined to the matter under discussion and shall be relevant.
- The Chair has the authority to vary these guidelines as may be necessary and to end a presentation or comments that violate the rules or for other cause. The Board will not tolerate personal attacks by anyone on any participant in the proceedings.
- Once the public comment period has been closed, no further public input will be permitted unless clarification is requested by a Board member. The response shall address only those questions raised by the member.

- The Chairman of the Board will establish the order of speakers and will maintain decorum.
- Citizens shall speak for a maximum of five (5) minutes, unless more time is granted by the Chair.
- In the event that more than four (4) speakers wish to be heard during citizen's time, the Chairman shall allocate the twenty (20) minutes among speakers in an equitable manner. An extension to the twenty (20) minute limit can be granted by the Chair.
- Comments from citizens who are not residents of Prince Edward County will be entertained once all County residents are heard.
- Signs, placards, posters or like material are not permitted in the Board Chamber, adjoining areas or County offices.

#### In Re: Constitutional Officer Report

Crystal Hensley, Commissioner of Revenue, presented a report on the changes in the Commissioner of Revenue's Office. She stated Mrs. Beverly Booth, former Commissioner of the Revenue, has agreed to assist with training. Ms. Hensley said one of the goals is to get the bills out on time. There is new technology available in the office that will help. She said she is updating the office procedures to be more efficient and better serve the taxpayers of the County. She said currently real estate records are about 14 months behind and they are working hard to get records up to date and get everything out in a timely manner.

Mr. Stanley added the goal ultimately is to implement twice a year billing and proration, and the staff is getting things in order.

according to law in the Wednesday, January 3, 2024 edition of THE FARMVILLE HERALD, a newspaper published in the County of Prince Edward.

Mr. Stanley said that as the Board is aware, the Prince Edward County Public Schools have received a total of \$6,237,616.37 of additional CARES Act Funding for addressing unfinished learning, before and after school programs, and other programs.

Prior to the expenditure and in accordance with 15.2-2507 of the Code of Virginia, the Board will hold a public hearing to increase the FY 24 County and School Budgets, accepting the distribution of federal funds and appropriate the funding to the FY 24 County and School Budgets.

Superintendent Johnson presented information on what the funds has been used for, including coaches; services with literacy, math and science; Fulcrum counseling; playground equipment; buses; signing bonuses and full reimbursement of tuition; Zoom accounts; hotspots and GoGuardian (Child Internet Protection Act); Chromebooks, PPE supplies; HVAC; window shatterproof film; safety doorknobs (intruder deterrent); and to improve instruction and safety.

Chair Cooper-Jones opened the public hearing.

# In Re: Economic Development Update

Chelsey White, Director of Economic Development and Tourism, presented her department update for 2023:

#### **2023 Economic Development and Tourism Highlights:**

IDA brought on marketing consultant, Rhett Weiss, of Dealtek Ltd., to market the HIT Park site.

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- Economic Development Director participated in the Data Center Dynamics Connect Virginia conference, which had close to 1,000 attendees, to market the HIT Park for development.
- Completed the Industrial Access Road at Prince Edward Business Park.
- Onboarding of new Marketing Assistant, Molly Kinahan.
- Approval of MOU with the Town of Farmville for sewer line at Industrial Access Road.
- The sale of two PEC Business Park lots for the development of 5 Pillar Meats and a new car wash, followed by the start of construction of the two lots and WaWa.
- \$25,000 AFID grant was received and appropriated to the IDA and then awarded to Sandy River Distillery for its development.
- \$20,000 AFID Planning grant was awarded to fund the development of an economic development strategic plan.
- \$50,000 AFID Planning grant was awarded to awarded to 5 Pillar Meats for its development.
- \$75,000 TRRC grant was awarded to 5 Pillar Meats for its development.
- Awarded a \$10,000 VTC Microbusiness Marketing Leverage Program (MMLP) grant titled Forever Starts in Prince Edward County. The campaign will market Prince Edward County as a premier wedding destination. The marketing campaign is mixed media and will feature and promote wedding-related local venues, retail shops, and vendors.
- Awarded a \$10,000 VTC VA250 grant titled Celebrating Virginia's History: A Look at Prince Edward County which will support a new exhibit in the Visitor Center about local history and will help bolster market the county as a tourism destination.
- In 2023, five Economic Development and Tourism Grants were awarded totaling \$165,000. (1. AFID Planning Grant, 2. TRRC 5 Pillar Meats, 3. VTC MMLP, 4. VTC VA250, 5. AFID 5 Pillar Meats)

#### **Economic Development:**

- Held a meeting with RKG Associates to coordinate the launch of the IDA's economic development strategic plan which will launch in January 2024.

The projects that this grant will fund if awarded include connecting the site to the Town of Farmville water system, elevated tank and booster pump construction, connecting the site to the Sandy River Reservoir water source, and site optioning/acquisition/control.
- Participated in the Data Center Dynamics Connect Virginia conference in Loudoun to connect Prince Edward County directly with data center owner-operators looking to expand their portfolio of sites. #### In Re: 2023 Planning Commission Annual Report

Mr. Stanley said an annual report is submitted as required by Title 15.2, Chapter 22, Section 2221 of the

Code of Virginia, which requires an annual report be submitted to the Governing Body concerning the operation of

the Planning Commission and the status of planning within Prince Edward County.

The 2023 annual report provides a summary of the Planning Commission's public hearing activities concerning zoning cases & special use permit, code amendments, major activities, and accomplishments over the

past year. Also included is Community Development permitting activities and progress made on items contained in the Capital Improvement Plan (CIP).

Mr. Stanley stated there were 12 Special Use Permits, 212 Zoning permits, 889 building permits, 1,437 building inspections performed, and 14 Capital Improvement Plan projects either completed or in progress. He added that 46 one- and two-family homes and 26 manufactured homes were issued.

### In Re: Highway Matters

Mrs. Sarah Elam Puckett, Assistant County Administrator, stated staff would record any concerns from the Board to report to Scott Frederick, P.E., VDOT. She stated that currently, there were six secondary roads with closures and portions of [Route] 360 were under water. ### In Re: Community Policy Management Team Appointments

The General Assembly created the Children's Services Act (CSA) to create a collaborative system of services and funding that is child-centered, family focused, and community based to address the needs of troubled at-risk youths and their families. Chapter 52 of Title 2.2 of the Code of Virginia outlines the requirements of this program.

To receive CSA funds from the Commonwealth of Virginia Section 2.2-5204 of the Code, directs every County to establish a Community Policy and Management Team (CPMT). Membership of the CPMT is specified in Section 2.2-5205 of the Code and shall include:

One elected official or an appointed official (presently the County Administrator)

- The local agency heads or their designees of the following (1) Community Services Board, (2) Juvenile Court Services Unit, (3) Department of Health, (4) Department of Social Services, and (4) Local School division.
- Representative of a private organization or association of providers for children's or family services if such
  organizations are located within the locality.
- A parent representative.

The CPMT is requesting the Board appoint Ms. Kandy Hayes to serve as the representative of a private organization. Ms. Hayes is employed by Strategic Therapy Associates, located at 217 W. Third Street, Suite 5. She has served on numerous Family Assessment Planning Teams (FAPT) and CPMT teams in the region. She is aware of the challenges faced by families and their youth who will require services administered through the CSA program. She is engaged in the community and has successfully found cost effective solutions for families facing mental health challenges. The appointment will be effective immediately and expires on June 30, 2026.

- 4. Landlord agrees to pay water and sewer. Tenants are to pay all other utilities.
- 5. Landlord will be responsible for normal repairs to the heating, plumbing, electrical systems, and basic structure unless due to negligence or misuse on the part of the Tenants.
- 6. Tenants are to replace all broken glass and light bulbs. Tenants are responsible for changing air filters for the HV AC system on routine basis.
- 7. The property is not to be sublet.
- 8. Tenants accept the premises as they are with any representation as to its suitability or desirability for the purposes contemplated and Tenants shall maintain the premises in good repair and good order, normal wear and tear expected. Tenants shall not make any changes in structure of the said building without first obtaining the written consent of the Landlord and Tenants agree that they will not store on the premises any articles which will endanger the building or increase hazards of fire.
- 9. Landlord is to carry insurance on the building. Tenants are to carry insurance on their possessions.

### In Re: County Administrator Update

Mr. Stanley presented his report:

**County GIS** - Prince Edward County geographic information system (GIS) data will be available online by the end of the week. The County's mapping data was updated and a web application added by The Timmons Group, an engineering and consulting firm based out of Richmond. Timmons is also hosting the site for the County. The site has been in development since 2017 and we will have some data issues but we realize that it can still be a tool for local realtors, surveyors, and the general public.

The GIS browser will provide access to geographic and tax record information currently maintained by Prince Edward, Virginia for individual parcels of property. The maps and data are for illustration purposes and should not be used for making financial or other commitments. These maps are not designed or intended to be used as a substitute for an accurate field survey, as performed by a Registered Land Surveyor. Prince Edward County, Virginia and Timmons Group assume no responsibility for errors or omissions.

**Kinex Broadband Project** - As of December 3rd, a total of 205 miles of middle-mile conduit and fiber have been installed in Prince Edward County (3 7 miles/VA TI and 178/RDOF) and 2,680 passings have been completed with a total of 301 customer installs. Kinex indicated on their call today that customer installs should start ramping up to 100 per month starting after the first of the year.

**Employee Evaluations** - I am pleased to report that for the 3rd year in a row, all of our employees have received their annual evaluations. We have a dedicated and hard working staff and the annual evaluation process provides an opportunity for the supervisors and employees to have a conversation about performance, required support, and setting expectations for the coming year.

**Sandy River Project** - DEQ issued a letter on our permit stating that, even though the project did not meet the regulatory threshold for convening a public hearing for the permit, given the significant interest raised by the neighboring jurisdictions, the DEQ Director has recommended that that a hearing be held. We anticipate that to happen in February.

**Solar Project/Old Ridge Road** - After the public hearing on December 16th, the Planning Commission voted unanimously to recommended denial of the special use permit application for the 3MW project located on Old Ridge Road in part to its determination that the project is not in compliance with the County comprehensive plan. The applicant subsequently asked staff to postpone the planned Board public hearing in January to give them additional time to talk with the neighbors. They have subsequently appealed the Planning Commission's determination that the project was not in substantial accord with the County's Comprehensive Plan.

**Comprehensive Plan** -The Comprehensive Plan survey has received approximately 800+ responses. We are looking to extend deadline to January 15<sup>th</sup>

**Five Pillars Meats, LLC** - The Governor's Office announced AFID grant the last week of December. Coupled with their groundbreaking last week we are excited to see this project get off the ground and going. It will be a great boost to the local farmers to get their product to market and provide citizens with a local meat source. Congrats to the IDA Board and Chelsey for their support of the project. We will plan a ribbon cutting probably early summer with the Governor in attendance.

**2023** Accomplishments List- Attached is list of County Administration Accomplishments during 2023. I am particularly proud of the nearly \$1.5 million in grant funds received, the progress made on capital improvements, and the economic and tourism achievements. A copy of this list will be published on the County's website and social media.

**Sandy River Project** - The Commonwealth of Virginia issued a Request for Information (RFI) soliciting proposals for the provision of water for the state facilities in Nottoway on December 19th Proposals are due on March 8, 2024. Prince Edward will be putting our proposal together. We have reached out to Crewe to see if they want to partner on the response. We are expecting them to decline.

Landfill/Cell F - Bid request for Cell F will go in the January 3rd edition of the Farmville Herald. Plan is to award bid this spring and start construction by summer. Completion of Cell F will provide an additional 12 years of operational life at the landfill.

**Solar Community Meeting** - CEP Solar will be holding a community meeting on January 17th from 5:30 pm to 7:00 pm at Salem Chapel at 327 Rice's Depot Road. The purpose of the Community Meeting is to provide information and answer questions regarding the two proposed Solar Farms:

- The Miller Lake project will contain up to 5 MW ac. The project is located on Parcel IDs: 069-A-16 and 069-A-15 off Miller Lake Rd and Piney Grove Rd. in Prince Edward County, VA.
- The Piney Grove project will contain up to 8 MW ac. The project is located on Parcel IDs: 069-A-9, 069-A-10, 069-A-3 off Taylor Rd and Piney Grove Rd. in Prince Edward County, VA.

Worsham Road Closure - Beginning on January 29th, the portion of Worsham Road over Briery Creek will be closed for bridge replacement. VDOT will be putting out a public notice and installing message boards to alert motorists.

#### MODIFICATION 1 TO INTERIM AGREEMENT NO DIVED WATED TREATMENT & DISTRIBUTION PROJECT

# SANDY RIVER WATER TREATMENT & DISTRIBUTION PROJECT

THIS MODIFICATION 1 TO INTERIM AGREEMENT (this "Modification to Interim Agreement" or "Modification"), is entered into as of 9 January, 2024, (the "Effective Date"), between the:

THE COUNTY OF PRINCE EDWARD, VIRGINIA, a political subdivision of the Commonwealth of Virginia (the "Owner" or the "County"), and PRINCE EDWARD COUNTY INFRASTRUCTURE, LLC, a Virginia limited liability company ("Design-Builder" or "PECI"), licensed to perform construction contracting in Virginia. PECI is a joint venture of MEB General Contractors, Inc. and Faulconer Construction Company, Inc., and PECI will subcontract work under this Agreement to them.

The County and Design-Builder are referred to individually as a "Party" and collectively as "the Parties.

# **RECITALS:**

- 1. On September 6, 2022, the County and PECI entered into an Interim Agreement pursuant to the Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act of 2002 (Va. Code §56-575.1, et seq.) ("PPEA"), and the County's PPEA Implementation Guidelines.
- 2. The Purpose of the Interim Agreement was to have PECI prepare a detailed proposal for the design and construction of the Sandy River Reservoir Water Treatment and Distribution Project ("Project").-
- **3.** The Project design prepared by PECI included systems to deliver water to facilities owned by the Commonwealth of Virginia in Nottoway County.
- 4. On or about December 19, 2023, the Commonwealth issued a Request for Information (RFI) entitled: "Water Needs for Department of Corrections and Behavioral Health Facilities in Nottoway County," seeking proposals from interested applicants for the design and construction of a water treatment system to serve the Nottoway Correctional Center, Piedmont Geriatric Hospital, and Virginia Center for Behavioral Rehabilitation.
- 5. The County intends to submit a proposal in response to the RFI, and is seeking the assistance of PECI in preparing that proposal or submission. The services to be provided by PECI in support of the County's proposal or submission are an extension of, and integrally related to, the work performed by PECI for the County under the Interim Agreement, and therefore execution of this Modification to the Interim Agreement is deemed by the Parties to be the most efficient and cost- effective means of providing the proposal assistance needed by the County to respond to the RFI.

NOW THEREFORE, for and in consideration of the mutual promises, conditions, and covenants herein set forth, the Parties agree as follows:

1. The foregoing Recitals are incorporated as terms of this Modification. Except as specifically stated herein, the terms of the Interim Agreement remain unchanged and in effect.

### 2. Design-Builder's Responsibilities.

- a. Design-Builder shall perform all Services set forth in the Scope of Work below (the "Services").
- 3. <u>County's Responsibilities.</u> The County, as Owner of the Project, shall perform the following functions under this Interim Agreement:
  - a. Furnish available information pertinent to the Project and the County's Proposal, as is reasonably requested by Design-Builder to enable it to complete its Services.
  - b. Pay Design-Builder for the Services in accordance with the terms of this Modification and the Interim Agreement.

# 4. Price and Payments

a. Owner shall pay Design-Builder as set forth below for the Services described in Exhibit Ml.

#### b. Progress Payments.

- i. Owner shall pay Design-Builder for the Services set forth in Exhibit Ml, on a time and material basis, including all related expenses, as follows:
  - (1) Reimbursement of costs paid to Timmons Group (billed at Timmons Group standard rates and multiplier); and
  - (2) Markup for overhead and profit on such costs at fifteen percent (15%).

Payments to PECI for reimbursement of costs plus markup shall be capped at \$100,000.00.

- ii. The Modification Services Price includes compensation for Design-Builder's Services and services of Design-Builder's Subcontractors, engineers, and consultants, if any.
  - iii. Payment for Modification Services shall be paid as a lwnp swn upon completion of the Services. Design-Builder pay Design-Builder's Invoice for Modification Services within 30 days of receipt.

#### 5. <u>Schedule.</u> a.

- The Design-Builder shall complete performance of all Services by March 7, 2024. This completion shall be extended day for day on account of any revision to the Commonwealth's RFI extending the required date for submission of Proposals.
- b. No actual or liquidated damages are assessable against Design-Builder for failure to accomplish the Services to be provided in this Interim Agreement in accordance with the Schedule.



**SUMMARY:** The County has received an event permit application from Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity at Longwood University for its annual Alumni/Social Event, tentatively scheduled for Saturday, April 20, 2024 from 11:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The rain date is Sunday, April 21, 2024. The event location is a privately-owned field just past the 911 address of 873 Vaughan Road, Prospect.

Trey Grzelecki and Ryan Campbell, both members of Alpha Sigma Phi Fraternity, will be present at the Board meeting to help answer any questions the Board may have.

Attached for the Board's consideration are supporting documents, to include: (1) a copy of the event permit application and (2) an Event and Logistics Brief prepared by the fraternity. As some Board members will recall, there were similar events held in April of 2023 and 2022. Below are a number of items for the Board's deliberation:

- 1. **ATTENDANCE**: The fraternity is asking for an attendance of 900 tickets, which is 50 fewer than the number of participants for 2023.
- 2. **SANITATION:** Per the Virginia Department of Health regulations one port-o-john per 100 people and they recommend one handwashing station per five port-o-johns.;
- 3. **TRASH**: The Fraternity indicates that its members will clean the property and surrounding roadways after the event and the following day. No trash complaints were received last year.
- 4. **FOOD/WATER**: The fraternity will provide water and catering from Fishin' Pig and Food Lion.
- 5. **MEDICAL**: The fraternity's plan for adequate medical facilities, as required by the County's ordinance, is to contract with PEVRS for an on-scene/stand-by unit for the duration of the event.
- 6. **PARKING**: All parking will be on private property, not along Vaughan Road. VDOT has noted and as required by Section 46.2-1209 of the Code of Virginia, "No person shall leave any motor vehicle, trailer, semitrailer, or part or combination thereof immobilized or unattended on or adjacent to any roadway if it constitutes a hazard in the use of the highway." There were no parking/traffic complaints in 2023.
- 7. **SECURITY/SAFETY:** The "Event and Logistics Brief" indicates the fraternity will hire four private security officers that are trained for event management and crowd enforcement. Additionally, to supplement the private security, fraternity brothers will be scheduled in shifts throughout the event.

8. **PRESENCE OF ALCOHOL**: In 2022, when I spoke with the local ABC Officer, he indicated that no ABC permit is required, as the event is on private property. <u>Please note the paragraph in the Fraternity's Event and Logistics Brief concerning alcohol</u>. Underage possession by consumption and driving under the influence are two of the most significant concerns of the event.

To the best of our knowledge, there were no neighborhood complaints or other reported issues related to the 2022 of 2023 events. Additionally, to the best of our knowledge, there were no alcohol-related accidents or incidents either year.

The fraternity has indicated they will have designated drivers and that other Greek organizations will also assign chapter specific designated drivers.

Again, if approved, the County will share a copy of the permit with the Virginia State Police, Virginia ABC, the Sheriff and the Town and University Police Departments.

- 9. **NOISE**: In 2023, there was a band, but there were on noise complaints. The Noise Ordinance requires that music should not be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from its source.
- 10. **NEIGHBORS**: The closest neighbor is approximately 900-1,000 feet from the estimated location on the 28-acre parcel that is hosting the event. There are six 911 addresses on Vaughan Road, including the event location.
- 11. **UNIVERSITY INVOLVEMENT**: As noted in the Event and Logistics Brief, the Office of Fraternity and Sorority Life, the Vice President for Student Affairs and the Longwood University Chief of Police are all aware of the date, location and details of the event.
- 12. **RIGHT OF ENTRY:** The County Ordinance states: No permit shall be issued under this article unless the applicant (and in this case the owner of the property) shall furnish to the board written permission for the board, its lawful agents, or duly constituted law enforcement officers to go upon the property at any reasonable time for the purpose of determining compliance with the provisions of this article. The board shall have the right to revoke any permit issued under this article upon noncompliance with any of its provisions and conditions.

# **Event Context:**

Pig Roast began in the early days of the Delta Iota Chapter's existence and serves as both an end-of-year social event for Longwood students, and a fundraiser for the chapter's operating and philanthropic endeavors.

Occurring in the same private field in the recent past the event has historically been an "anyone can come" event with minimal oversight or governance, a disregard for associated risk and mediocre planning. Given the success of the past two years, the Delta Iota chapter of Alpha Sigma Phi plans to continue the success of these events with 2024's. The following logistics and details of Pig Roast 2024 are seen below.

# Sanitation and Waste:

- Porta-Potties: The chapter will rent several porta-potties for this year's event, following a 1:100 ratio of porta-potties to people, per county requirements. Also, we will be renting handwashing stations, following a 1:500 ratio of handwashing stations to people, per county requirements. We will round up to 2 handwashing stations.
- Waste Cleanup: The chapter's members will be responsible for picking up all trash and waste, including but not limited to cans, bottles, food waste, and any other trash that may be left behind at the site. The chapter is also buying plastic, reusable trash cans for guests to use instead of littering. The members will clean up after the event happens and before they leave, as well as come back the next day to complete a final walk through of the venue and pick up any remaining trash.
- Private Road Waste Reduction: A big complaint concerning Pig Roast in years past was the presence of waste alongside the roads leading from the field to 460. The chapter will also be responsible for cleaning up ditches and collecting any trash guests may leave after leaving the event.

# **Food/Drinks**

• The chapter is going to have a stock of bottled water and snack food set aside for guests who may need food or water due to 1) no access to either or 2) becoming too intoxicated. In addition to the snacks and water, the chapter will solicit 2 forms of catering at the cost of event attendees and not the chapter. It is the chapter's intention to cater from Fishin' Pig and Food Lion.

# **Ticketing**

• Like in the past two years, the chapter plans to continue to use eventbrite as our way of selling the tickets. This allows attendees to agree to the terms of the liability waiver and consolidates all of the event proceeds online. Eventbrite also allows the chapter to utilize a digital attendee and check-in system. The online domain also allows the chapter to gather attendee contact information, age, and chapter points of contact.

# Security and Safety

• The chapter is going to hire private event security that is trained in event management and crowd enforcement. Like 2023's Pig Roast, the chapter will hire 4 security guards. 2 will be at the door with brothers to help check tickets and bags, and 2 will be in the field.

# **Band**

• Like last year, the chapter is looking to have a band at this year's Pig Roast. The chapter will face the speakers away from the neighboring properties in order to avoid disturbances. There was no issue that the chapter knew of from last year's Pig Roast, so we plan to do the exact same thing.

# **Presence of Alcohol**

• Individuals of legal drinking age may be able to bring alcohol with them to the field if they are 1) not driving to and from the venue, 2) follow all university and social greek regulations around the presence of alcohol, and 3) bring no hard liquor. Like the last 2 years, the chapter WILL NOT provide alcohol to guests. Providing alcohol to guests would be breaking numerous University, State, and fraternity policies and puts the chapter at great risk.

# **Transportation**

• The chapter will have its own designated driver for brothers only. Most of the guests in attendance will be other Greeks and their organizations will assign chapter specific designated drivers.

# **Liability Release**

• At the point of purchase (Event brite), all event attendees will be required to agree to a liability release provided by the national fraternity.

# **University Involvement**

• The office of Fraternity and Sorority Life, the Vice President of Student Affairs, and the Longwood University Chief of Police are all aware of the date, location and details of the event.

# **Proceeds**

• The proceeds from the event will be split evenly between the chapter's operating budget (to pay for the event), and one of the chapter's five philanthropic organizations.

# ARTICLE III. MUSICAL OR ENTERTAINMENT FESTIVALS

## Sec. 6-66. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this article, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

Musical or entertainment festival means any gathering of groups or individuals for the purpose of listening to or participating in entertainment that consists primarily of musical renditions conducted in open spaces not within an enclosed structure.

(Ord. of 8-1-70, § III(10-10))

## Sec. 6-67. Penalties.

Any person who violates any provision of this article shall be guilty of a class 3 misdemeanor. The board may bring suit in the circuit court of the county to restrain, enjoin, or otherwise prevent violation of this article.

(Ord. of 8-1-70, § III(10-14))

## Sec. 6-68. Permits.

- (a) No person shall stage, promote or conduct any musical or entertainment festival in the unincorporated areas of the county unless there shall have been first obtained from the board a special entertainment permit for such festival. Application for such special entertainment permits shall be in writing on forms provided for the purpose and filed in duplicate with the clerk of the board at least 21 days before the date of such festival. Such applications shall have attached thereto and made a part thereof the plans, statements, approvals and other documents required by this section. A copy of such applications shall be sent by certified mail by the clerk to each member of the board the day such applications are filed.
- (b) The board shall act on such applications within ten days from the filing of the same. If granted, the permit shall be issued in writing on a form for the purpose and mailed by the clerk to the applicant at the address indicated. If denied, the refusal shall be in writing and the reasons for such denial stated therein, and mailed by the clerk to the applicant at the address indicated.
- (c) Such permit shall not be issued unless the following conditions are met and the following plans, statements and approvals submitted to the board with the application:
  - (1) The application for special entertainment permit shall have attached to it a copy of the ticket or badge of admission to the festival, containing the date and time of the festival, together with a statement by the applicant of the total number of tickets to be offered for sale, and the best reasonable estimate by the applicant of the number of persons expected to be in attendance.
  - (2) A statement of the name and address of the promoters of the festival, the financial backing of the festival, and the names of all persons or groups who will perform at the festival.

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- (3) A statement of the location of the proposed festival, the name and address of the owner of the property on which the festival is to be held, and the nature and interest of the applicant.
- (4) A plan for adequate sanitation facilities and garbage, trash and sewage disposal for persons at the festival. This plan shall meet the requirements of all state and local statutes, ordinances and regulations and shall be approved by the county health director.
- (5) A plan for providing food, water and lodging for the persons at the festival. This plan shall meet the requirements of all state and local statutes, ordinances and regulations and shall be approved by the county health director.
- (6) A plan for adequate medical facilities for persons at the festival, approved by the county health director.
- (7) A plan for adequate parking facilities and traffic control in and around the festival area.
- (8) A plan for adequate fire protection. This plan shall meet the requirements of all state and local statutes, ordinances and regulations and shall be approved by the county forest warden.
- (9) A statement specifying whether any outdoor lights or lighting is to be utilized, and if so, a plan showing the location of such lights and shielding devices or other equipment to prevent unreasonable glow beyond the property on which the festival is located.
- (10) A statement that no music shall be played, either by mechanical device or live performance, in such a manner that the sound emanating from the performance shall be unreasonably audible beyond the property on which the festival is located.
- (d) No permit shall be issued under this article unless the applicant shall furnish to the board written permission for the board, its lawful agents, or duly constituted law enforcement officers to go upon the property at any reasonable time for the purpose of determining compliance with the provisions of this article. The board shall have the right to revoke any permit issued under this article upon noncompliance with any of its provisions and conditions.

## Sec. 6-69. Acceptable hours for entertainment.

Music shall not be rendered nor entertainment provided between the hours of 12:00 midnight and 8:00 a.m. each day.

## Sec. 6-70. Minors.

No person under the age of 18 shall be admitted to any festival unless accompanied by a parent or guardian, who shall remain with the minor at all times.

# ARTICLE II. NOISE<sup>1</sup>

## Sec. 46-31. Enumeration of loud and disturbing noises.

It shall be unlawful for any person to create, cause to be created or allow on property under the person's control or ownership any unreasonably loud or disturbing noise in the county. Noise of such character, intensity or duration as to be detrimental to the life or health of any person or as to unreasonably disturb the quiet, comfort or repose of any person, is hereby prohibited. For purposes of this article, a tenant shall be deemed to be in control of the property contained within his or her tenancy.

The following acts shall be deemed to be loud and disturbing noise in violation of this article, but such enumeration shall not be deemed to be exclusive:

- (1) Horn or signaling devices: The sounding of any horn or signal device on any automobile, motorcycle, bus or other vehicle except as a reasonable warning; the creation by means of any such signal device of any unreasonable loud or harsh sound; and the sounding of such device for any unreasonable period of time.
- (2) Televisions, radios, compact disc players, or musical instruments: The playing of any television, radio, record, tape or compact disc player, MP3 player, digital audio player or other electrical device or any musical instrument in such a manner or with such a volume:
  - a. To permit sound to be heard across a residential real property boundary or through partitions common to two dwellings within a building;
  - b. To be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet the building in which it is located;
  - c. The sound is plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from its source.
- (3) Vehicles: The use of any automobile, motorcycle or vehicle so out of repair, so loaded or in such manner as to create loud, grating, grinding, rattling or other noises. Repairing, rebuilding, or modifying any motor vehicle or other mechanical device in the outdoors between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day. Operation of sound amplifying equipment in a motor vehicle at a volume sufficient to be plainly audible at a distance of 50 feet from the vehicle.
- (4) *Exhausts:* The discharge into the open air of the exhaust of any steam engine, stationary internal combustion engine, or motor vehicle engine except through a muffler or other device which will effectively prevent loud and explosive noises therefrom.
- (5) *Loading, unloading and opening boxes:* The creation of loud and excessive noise in connection with loading or unloading any vehicle or the opening and destruction of bales, boxes, crates and containers.
- (6) Loading, unloading trucks: The loading or unloading of trucks in the outdoors within 100 yards of a residence between the hours of 11:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. the following day.

- (7) Construction: The erection, including excavation, demolition, alteration, or repairs of any building or improvement that creates noise that can be heard at adjoining property lines from sunset until 6:00 a.m. the following day except in the case of an emergency.
- (8) Loudspeakers, public address systems and sound trucks: Use, operation or permitting the operation of any loudspeaker, public address system, mobile sound vehicle or similar device amplifying sound therefrom for any purpose in such a manner as to permit sound to be heard across a residential real property boundary, or through partitions common to two dwelling units within a building.

#### Sec. 46-32. Penalty for violation.

A violation of any provision of this chapter shall constitute a class 3 misdemeanor. Each separate act on part of the person violating this article shall be deemed a separate offense, and each day a violation is permitted to continue unabated shall constitute a separate offense.

(Ord. of 6-10-08)

#### Sec. 46-33. Complaint required.

No summons or warrant charging a violation of this article shall be issued except upon the sworn complaint of two persons, each a resident of a separate household, and each alleging facts within his or her own personal knowledge, or upon complaint by a law enforcement or animal control officer.

No person shall be convicted of a violation of this article, unless there shall have been before the court, competent evidence that at least one of the complainants, animal control or law enforcement officer had, prior to the issuance of any summons or warrant, requested the abatement of the noise complained of, and that such noise continued after such request.

#### Sec. 46-34. Exemptions.

Nothing in this chapter shall apply to law enforcement, ambulances, or other emergency vehicles and personnel, aircraft or any noise or sound created thereby or to any noise or sound crated by any person to sound a warning or call attention to a bona fide emergency.

The provisions of this chapter shall not apply to the following:

- (1) Music, bells or chimes that are part of a bona fide religious service, observation or other such religious event.
- (2) Bona fide agricultural activity.
- (3) Sound generated from a school or county sponsored athletic or recreational event.
- (4) Locomotives and other railroad equipment.
- (5) Lawful discharge of firearms.
- (6) Military activities of the commonwealth or of the United States of America.
- (7) Activities sanctioned by a college or university which take place within the confines of the main campus of such college or university.

**Summary**: Attached for the Board's consideration are proposed amendments to Article II and Article III to *Chapter 10-Animals* of the *County Code*, as follows:

- Section 10-30 The amendments change the ordinance to align with the practice the County currently follows regarding the hiring of county animal control officers by the County Administrator.
- Section 10-41 The amendments update the County Ordinance with unlawful acts enumerated in the Code of Virginia.
- Section 10-42 The amendments clarify and update the County Ordinance with respect to the requirement of individuals to report to local animal control when finding a companion animal.
- Section 10-43 The amendments clarify and update the County Ordinance with respect to the abandonment of animals.
- Section 10-50 The amendments clarify and update the County Ordinance with respect to the requirement of individuals to a dog license (tag).
- Section 10-51 The amendments update the County Ordinance on how to obtain a county dog license (tag).
- Section 10-52 and 10-53 The amendments correct errors from when the County Ordinance was published.
- Section 10-61 The amendments update the County Ordinance on rabies clinics.
- Section 10-70 The amendments update and clarify the County Ordinance with respect to running at large and removes the requirement that an animal control office will first provide notice to an animal owner or custodian that a dog is or has been running at large. The amendments also insert the violation of any dog running at large in a pack.

The proposed amendments have been reviewed by the County Attorney.

# ARTICLE II. ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICERS

#### Sec. 10-30. Position created.

The position of county animal control officer is hereby created, as provided for in the Code of Virginia, § 3.2-6555, The county administrator, for and on behalf of the board of supervisors, shall appoint an officer to be known as the chief animal control officer and deputy animal control officers to assist the chief animal control officer in his duties. The chief animal control officer and deputy animal control officers shall have the power to enforce the comprehensive animal laws of the state, this chapter, and all laws for the protection of domestic animals. When in uniform or upon displaying a badge or other credentials of office, the chief animal control officer and deputy animal control officer as defined in Code of Virginia, § 9.1-101, to any person found in the act of violating any of the comprehensive animal laws of the state, this chapter, and any law for the protection of domestic animals. The animal control officer and their deputy animal control officer shall have the power to issue a summons or obtain a felony warrant as necessary, provided the execution of such warrant shall be carried out by any law enforcement officer as defined in Code of Virginia, § 9.1-101, to any person found in the act of violating any of the comprehensive animal laws of the state, this chapter, and any law for the protection of domestic animals. The animal control officer and their deputy animal control officers shall complete all training as required by Code of Virginia, § 3.2-6556 , within the time prescribed.

#### **ARTICLE III. DOGS**

## DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

#### Sec. 10-40. Disposal of dead dogs.

The owner of any dog which has died from disease or other cause shall forthwith cremate or bury and dispose of the dog. If after notice any owner fails to do so, the animal control officer or other officer shall bury or cremate the dog; and he may recover on behalf of the county from the owner the cost of his service as provided in Code of Virginia, § 3.2-6554.

- (6) Failure to secure license. It is unlawful for any person to fail to secure and exhibit the licenses required by this chapter.
- (7) Failure to confine diseased dog or cat. It is unlawful for the owner or custodian of any dog or cat with a contagious or infectious disease to permit such dog or cat to stray from his premises if such disease is known to the owner.
- (8) Removing collar and tag. It is unlawful for any person, except the owner or custodian, to remove a legally acquired license tag from a dog without the permission of the owner or custodian.
- (9) Concealing dog or cat. It is unlawful for any person to conceal or harbor any dog on which the license tax has not been paid, or to conceal a mad dog or cat to keep the animal from being killed.
- (10) Permit a dog or cat that he owns or is in his custody to stray from his premises when he knows or has been told by the local health department, law-enforcement agency, animal control agency, or any other person who has a duty to control or respond to a risk of rabies exposure that the dog or cat is suspected of having rabies.
- (11) Other violations. Any other violation of this article for which a specific penalty is not provided.
- b) The following are unlawful acts punishable as Class 1 misdemeanors:
  - Animal abandonment. It is unlawful for any person to abandon or dump an animal in violation of section 10-43.
  - (2) False claim. It is unlawful for any person to present a false claim or to receive any money on a false claim under the provisions of section 10-91.
  - (3) <u>Removing electronic or radio transmitting collar.</u> It is unlawful for any person to remove an electronic or radio transmitting collar without the permission of the owner of the dog and with the intent to prevent or hinder the owner from locating the dog.
- (c) The following is an unlawful act punishable through civil penalties:
  - (1) Allowing doa to run at large or running at large in a pack. It is unlawful to permit a dog to run at large or run at large in a pack in violation of section 10-70. A civil penalty of twenty-five dollars (\$25.00) shall be imposed for the first offense, fifty dollars (\$50.00) for the second offense, and one hundred dollars (\$100) for each subsequent offense. The civil penalty may be charged once per dog for each twentyfour-hour period. Each violation charged for every twenty-four-hour period shall be deemed a separate and subsequent violation.

# Sec. 10-42 Notification by individuals finding companion animals; penalty.

A. Any individual who finds a companion animal and (i) provides care or safekeeping or (ii) retains the companion animal in such a manner as to control its activities shall within 48 hours:

 Make a reasonable attempt to notify the owner of the companion animal if the owner can be ascertained from any tag, license, collar, tattoo, or other form of identification or markings or if the owner of the animal is otherwise known to the individual; and

C. Any individual who violates this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of \$50 per companion animal.

#### Sec. 10-43. Abandoning animal on highway or elsewhere.

No person shall abandon or dump any animal. A violation of this section is a Class 1 misdemeanor. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the release of an animal by its owner to a public or private animal shelter or other releasing agency.

# DIVISION 2. LICENSE TAX<sup>1</sup>

#### Sec. 10-50. Unlicensed dogs prohibited.

It shall be unlawful for any person other than a releasing agency that has registered as such annual with county animal control to own a dog four (4) months or older within the county unless such dog is licensed as required by the provisions of this division. No license tax shall be levied on any dog that is trained and serves as (i) a guide dog for a blind person, (ii) a hearing dog for a deaf or hearing-impaired person, or (iii) as a service dog for a mobility-impaired person or otherwise disabled person. As used in this division, "hearing dog," "mobility-impaired dog," otherwise disabled person" and "service dog" have the same meanings as assigned in §51.5-40.1, Code of Virginia.

Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, § 3.2-6587

It shall be unlawful for any person to own a dog or domesticated cat, age four months or older unless such dog or cat has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises. No license tags shall be issued for any dog unless there is presented to the treasurer at the time application for license is made evidence satisfactory to the treasurer, showing that such dog has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises, and that such inoculation or vaccination remains valid for the time application for license is made. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.2-6587 , 18.2-403.1 , 18.2-403.2 , and 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section. 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### Sec. 10-61. Rabies clinic authorized.

The board of supervisors <u>authorizes the chief animal control officer to ensure that a rabies vaccination clinic</u> is <u>conducted to serve the county at least once every two years in accordance with Code of Virginia § 3.2-6521, if he</u> finds that the number of <u>rabies clinics or</u> resident veterinarians is inadequate to meet the need

### Sec. 10-62. Dogs or cats not vaccinated.

Any dog or cat found in the county not vaccinated and identified as described in this subdivision shall be impounded by the animal control officer, and such dogs shall be held for a period of five days. The dog or cat may be returned to its owner upon proof of ownership, vaccination of the dog or cat, and payment of the cost of impounding the dog or cat at usual rates, and payment of any fines assessed under the provisions of this division. ### DIVISION 4. RUNNING AT LARGE

  - (4) Formally sanctioned field trials; or
  - (5) Bona fide hunting or field trial dog training.
- (d) A violation of this section shall constitute a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.2-6527, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, and 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section; however, if the dog is a dangerous or vicious dog, a violation of this section shall constitute a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.2-6527, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, and 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.
- Should the animal control officer or any law enforcement officer have reason to believe that any dog found (e) running at large is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person, such officer may order the confinement of such animal by delivering a confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal and any person who thereafter permits such animal to run at large or remain unconfined, unrestricted or not penned up shall be deemed to have violated this section. Should the animal not be confined within six hours after the delivery of the confinement order or should the animal control officer or other officer, after due diligence, be unable to deliver the confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal, the animal control officer or any other law enforcement officer shall impound any such vicious or destructive dog pursuant to the provision of Code of Virginia § 3.2-6540. Upon the issuance of the confinement order, or the impoundment of such animal to appear in the general district court of the county where the matter shall be heard on criminal warrants and the animal shall remain confined until the final disposition of the court proceeding; However, for the purposes of this section the owner or custodian of such dog shall be conclusively presumed to have known the dog to be vicious or destructive if at any time prior to the running at large of such animal the owner or custodian has received from any person a complaint that the animal is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person.

Any dog not wearing a collar bearing a license tag of the proper calendar year shall prima facie be deemed to be unlicensed and a stray; and in any proceedings under this division, the burden of proof of the fact that such dog has been licensed or is otherwise not required to bear a tag at the time shall be on the owner of the dog.

Dog license receipts shall be displayed and dog license tags shall be worn as required by Code of Virginia, § 3.2-6531.

Payment of the license tax subsequent to a summons to appear before the general district court or other court for failure to do so within the time required shall not operate to relieve such owner of the penalties provided.

# DIVISION 3. RABIES CONTROL<sup>2</sup>

## Sec. 10-60. Vaccination required.

It shall be unlawful for any person to own a dog or domesticated cat, age four months or older unless such dog or cat has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises. No license tags shall be issued for any dog unless there is presented to the treasurer at the time application for license is made evidence satisfactory to the treasurer, showing that such dog has been inoculated or vaccinated against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinarian or licensed against rabies by a duly licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian or licensed veterinary technician who is under the immediate and direct supervision of a licensed veterinarian on the premises, and that such inoculation or vaccination remains valid for the time application for license is made. Any person violating this section shall be guilty of a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.2-6587, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, and 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.

# Sec. 10-61. Rabies clinic authorized.

The board of supervisors finding that the number of resident veterinarians is inadequate to meet the need, the county shall ensure a rabies clinic is conducted at least once every two years, in accordance with the provisions of the Code of Virginia, § 3.2-6521.

### Sec. 10-62. Dogs or cats not vaccinated.

Any dog or cat found in the county not vaccinated and identified as described in this subdivision shall be impounded by the animal control officer, and such dogs shall be held for a period of five days. The dog or cat may be returned to its owner upon proof of ownership, vaccination of the dog or cat, and payment of the cost of impounding the dog or cat at usual rates, and payment of any fines assessed under the provisions of this division. At the expiration of the five-day period, any dog or cat not so claimed by its owner may disposed of by giving it into the possession of any person willing to pay the cost of impounding, vaccination and license. If not so disposed of, the dog or cat shall be euthanized in a humane manner by the impounding officer or other designated official.

# Sec. 10-63. Quarantine authorized.

When the board of supervisors finds that there is sufficient reason to believe that a rabid animal is at large, the board shall have the power to pass an emergency ordinance requiring all owners of all dogs in the county to keep the dogs confined on their premises, and may further adopt such ordinances, regulations or other measures as it may deem reasonably necessary to prevent the spread within the county of the disease of rabies in accordance with the provisions of the Code of Virginia, § 3.2-6522 (4).

# DIVISION 4. RUNNING AT LARGE

## Sec. 10-70. Prohibited.

- (a) It shall be unlawful for any person to permit any dog, belonging to him or under his control, to run at large in the county at any time. For the purpose of this division, a dog shall be deemed to be running at large while roaming or running or self-hunting off the property of its owner or custodian and not under the owner's or custodians' immediate control. Any person who is the owner or custodian of the dog found running at large shall be deemed to have violated the provisions of this section, if said owner or custodian has previously been notified by any animal control officer or other officer of the law that the dog is or has been running at large.
- (b) This section shall not apply to any person or persons while engaging in the following activities:
  - (1) Lawful hunting with a dog or dogs;
  - (2) Law enforcement or search and rescue activity;
  - (3) A supervised formal obedience training class or show;
  - (4) Formally sanctioned field trials; or
  - (5) Bona fide hunting or field trial dog training.
- (c) A violation of this section shall constitute a class 4 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.2-6527, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, and 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section; however, if the dog is a dangerous or vicious dog, a violation of this section shall constitute a Class 1 misdemeanor and shall be punished in accordance with the provisions of Code of Virginia, §§ 3.2-6527, 18.2-403.1, 18.2-403.2, and 18.2-403.3, which sections are adopted by reference and made a part of this chapter as if fully set forth in this section.
- (d) Should the animal control officer or any law enforcement officer have reason to believe that any dog found running at large is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person, such officer may order the confinement of such animal by delivering a confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal and any person who thereafter permits such animal to run at large or remain unconfined, unrestricted or not penned up shall be deemed to have violated this section. Should the animal not be confined within six hours after the delivery of the confinement order or should the animal control officer or other officer, after due diligence, be unable to deliver the confinement order to the owner or custodian of such animal, the animal control officer or any other law enforcement officer shall impound any such vicious or destructive dog

pursuant to the provision of Code of Virginia § 3.2-6540. Upon the issuance of the confinement order, or the impoundment of such animal to appear in the general district court of the county where the matter shall be heard on criminal warrants and the animal shall remain confined until the final disposition of the court proceeding; However, for the purposes of this section the owner or custodian of such dog shall be conclusively presumed to have known the dog to be vicious or destructive if at any time prior to the running at large of such animal the owner or custodian has received from any person a complaint that the animal is dangerous to the health, safety or property of any person.

## Sec. 10-71. Unlicensed dogs prohibited.

The running at large of dogs not duly licensed and displaying tags pursuant to the provisions of this article is prohibited.

## Sec. 10-72. Fowl running at large.

It shall be unlawful to permit any fowl, including all domestic fowl and any game birds raised in captivity, to run at large in the county at any time.

**SUMMARY**: The Properties Committee met February 6, 2024 and makes the following report and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.

The County is currently utilizing Cell E at the Prince Edward County Landfill. Cell E, as of December 2023, had an estimated life of <u>1.9 years</u>. The Board of Supervisors elected last year to proceed with the construction of Cell F and authorized the issuance of an Invitation For Bids.

The Cell F Construction project will include items related to the expansion of the existing landfill facility into Cell F and will also include related infrastructure work at the Prince Edward County Landfill. The work includes, but is not limited to, the following:

- Clearing and Grubbing;
- Erosion and Sedimentation Controls;
- Site Preparation;
- Unclassified Excavation;
- Placement of Structural Fill;
- Subtitle D Liner System Construction, including liner tie-in;
- Leachate Collection and Conveyance System Construction;
- Access Road Construction and,
- Stabilization and Revegetation.

The County received and opened on February 2, 2024, a total of five (5) bids:

A Recommendation for Award Letter is attached, and indicates that LaBella has evaluated the bids received. All bids contained the mandated 5% Bid Bond. The low bid of \$1,550,518 submitted by Red Oak Excavating failed to include a Qualification Statement. The mandatory Qualification Statement is the form on which the contractor provides information that they have landfill

construction experience. Given the lack of a Qualification Statement, <u>LaBella is recommending</u> <u>award of the contract to the second lowest bidder, Sargent Corporation at \$1,594,000.00</u>. This bid is approximately 13.86% higher than the engineer's August, 2023 estimate of \$1,400,000. Based on the interest in the project, the five competitive bids, and the County's previous experience with Sargent (they constructed Cell E in 2016) LaBella feels the County has received a fair bid that is commensurate with the work involved. For those reasons, LaBella recommends award of the bid to Sargent.

The County currently (as of June 30, 2023) has a Landfill Construction Fund balance of \$3,576,845. This fund was created by the Board and captures payments from Buckingham County for disposal of Buckingham County trash at the landfill. The current balance will cover the cost of this project and purchase of a new/used dump truck to replace the current one at the landfill.





Prince Edward County solicited bids for the above-referenced project on January 3, 2024. Bids were received on February 2, 2024, from five bidders. The table below shows the three lowest Total Bids as reported on the bid forms:

Bidder	Bid
Red Oak Excavating, Inc.	\$1,550,518.00
Sargent Corporation	\$1,594,000.00
Atlantis Commercial Group, Inc.	\$1,685,082.55

Bids were also received from Haymes Brothers, Inc. (\$1,965,432.60) and Harnden Group, LLC (\$1,976,000.00).

All bids were reviewed for accuracy and completeness. The lowest bid price for the construction project was submitted by Red Oak Excavating. Red Oak Excavating unfortunately failed to submit the contractor's qualification statement and is thus considered an unresponsive bidder.

Sargent Corporation, the second lowest bidder, submitted all the qualification documentation and has successfully completed several landfill cell construction projects with Subtitle D liner systems.

Based on the bids received and project qualification documentation provided by Sargent Corporation, it is our recommendation that **Sargent Corporation** be awarded a contract in the amount of **\$1,594,000.00**.

At the request of Prince Edward County, LaBella Associates, D.P.C., P.C. (LaBella) performed and evaluated a topographic survey of the Prince Edward County Sanitary Landfill. This topographic survey was performed on December 7, 2023. The results of this survey event were compared to the results of the January 27, 2023 survey event. This comparison was used to determine the volume of airspace consumed and the in-place compaction rate achieved between January 27, 2023 and December 7, 2023 at the Prince Edward County Sanitary Landfill.

As of Thursday, December 7, 2023, Prince Edward County was performing operations in Cell E of the PN 584 facility. The compaction results are presented below.

Net Volume of airspace consumed*:	35,744 CY
Amount of waste placed:	29,684 tons
Study Period In-place Compaction*:	1,661 lbs/CY

\* Airspace consumed includes the volume of daily cover soil.

The results of this compaction study indicate a good compaction rate for waste in comparison to compaction rates for MSW landfills.

Comparing the December 7, 2023 topographic survey to the constructed area intermediate grading plan (Drawing No. 2), the remaining gross airspace volume of the constructed footprint of the facility is approximately 143,483 CY. This gross airspace value includes the volume of waste, daily cover, intermediate cover, and final cover soils. Given the average waste acceptance rate (based on previous five annual reports) of 30,858 tons/yr and the calculated Average Airspace Utilization Rate (Since December 2021) of 1,794 lb/CY, the total remaining life of the constructed facility is approximately **1.9 years**.

Comparing the December 7, 2023 topographic survey to the permitted final cover grading plan (Drawing No. 3), the remaining gross airspace volume of the permitted facility is approximately 584,310 CY. This gross airspace value includes the volume of waste, daily cover, intermediate cover, and final cover soils. There is approximately 4,270 CY of fill placed above the final cover grades. Any overfill remaining after settlement or incorporation into a new permit modification that provides additional airspace will need to be relocated.

The remaining volume for waste disposal is approximately 463,977 CY for the permitted facility. Given the average waste acceptance rate (based on previous four annual reports) of 30,858 tons/yr and the Averaged Airspace Utilization Rate (Since December 2021) of 1,794 lb/yd<sup>3</sup>, the total remaining life of the permitted facility is approximately **13.5 years**.

**SUMMARY**: The Properties Committee met February 6, 2024 and makes the following report and recommendations to the Board of Supervisors.

Currently, the County Solid Waste Department is without an operational off-road dump truck. The current dump truck is a 1972 DJB 250. Repair and maintenance parts are obsolete.

A dump truck is critical for landfill operations as Virginia DEQ requires three days of daily cover be on the working face at all times. Jeff Jones and his staff use the dump truck to move soil from the on-site borrow area to the working face and for sediment basin and sediment pond maintenance.

Jeff obtained bids for both new and used dump trucks. The Committee reviewed the bids with Jeff and the County Administrator. It was determined that it was more financially justified to purchase a used dump truck at this time. Note: The cost of a new truck is \$551,000 to \$575,000.

An evaluation of the used truck bids, which ranged from \$198,500 to \$350,000 determined that a 2018 John Deere 410E at a cost of \$198,500, with 7978 hours and under warranty until 9,000 hours or until 8/23/25, was the best opportunity and economic decision for the County.

**RE: Proposed Solar Energy Facilities** 

We are writing to express our concern and opposition to the proposed solar facility for Old Ridge Road and possibly other similar projects in the county. Our opposition to the Old Ridge Road project is based primarily on concerns about the project's proximity to residential areas as well as a nearby waterway.

We agree with the following policies approved by the Virginia Farm Bureau Federation regarding solar facilities:

We support requiring all utility-scale solar facilities to maintain a nutrient management plan prior to construction and throughout the existence of the facility.

We support classifying solar panels as impervious surfaces for utility scale solar facilities.

If a utility scale solar facility is to be installed, we recommend it being located on brownfields, landfills, or mine reclamation sites.

We support a requirement to avoid prime farmland when locating utility scale solar facilities. If these facilities are located on prime farmland, the solar developer should be mandated to return the land to productive farmland at the end of the project's life cycle.

We believe more studies should be done on the impact that utility-scale solar energy has on agriculture, and the potential environmental impacts and lifecycle costs for the manufacture, disposal, re-use, or recycle of material inputs, before any additional projects are approved on agricultural lands.

We support requiring a minimum of a 50-foot riparian buffers around all utility scale solar facilities.

## CRC'S JANUARY ITEMS OF INTEREST

#### **Grant Assistance:**

- Tobacco Commission Invitation Only: Congratulations to the Town of Blackstone on being awarded \$121,383.29 in funds to purchase hospitality training equipment for the training program that will be located in the Harris Memorial Armory. The CRC assisted with the application.
- SCRC, State Economic and Infrastructure Development (SEID) Grant Program: The CRC is assisting the Town of Blackstone with an application to fund construction costs for the renovation and rehabilitation of Harris Memorial Armory.
- USDOT FTA, Innovative Coordinated Access and Mobility grant: The CRC is assisting Piedmont Senior Resources with an application to purchase a vehicle.
- VDACS, AFID Planning Grant: The CRC is assisting Virginia Food Works with a grant application to purchase a new liquid goods filling machine and dry goods filling machine for the Prince Edward County Cannery.
- Update on TRRC Grant Request for the Creation of the Central Virginia Poultry Cooperative: Due to this project being an ongoing Economic Development Project, the TRRC cannot make a comment at this time.

#### **Updates:**

 CRC Creation of New Economic Development Organization (REDO): The CRC has established a working committee of the County Administrators and Longwood University representatives to further discuss moving forward with a fundraising campaign for the CRC REDO.



LUREF issued an Invitation for Bids (IFB) for the construction of the Innovation Hub on December 8th. LUREF held a pre-bid Conference on January 4th at 10:00 a.m. in Midtown Square. The pre-bid conference was well attended. Bids were due on 1/25 at 2:00 p.m. in the LUREF Office. The Bids were opened on 1/25 at 2:15 p.m. in the LUREF Conference Room. Two bids were submitted. Longwood is currently reviewing both bids.

DHR Emergency Supplemental Historic Preservation Funds (ESHP) Charlotte County Courthouse Drainage Project


Charlotte County was awarded funds to address moisture issues for the Charlotte Courthouse Complex that flooded and was damaged during Hurricane Micheal. The contractor has completed the Plaster Repairs work within the building. CRC staff is working with County staff to assemble and submit any final reimbursement requests, set up a final site visit, and complete the close out report.

#### Virginia Telecommunications Initiative (VATI) Grant



As of January 7, 2024, a total of 4,021 passings (out of 10,734 total passings) and 872 installs for new customers have been completed. Kinex and their contractors are working in parts of all three counties where middle-mile fiber is in place to complete installations for new customers. James Garrett, Kinex Telecom, has advised that there is currently a backlog for new installations due to staffing issues. He has added new staff and hopes to see installs ramp up over the course of the coming weeks.

#### Drakes Branch Acquisition Project Update



CRC Community Emergency Preparedness Outreach Campaign



The CRC was awarded a State Homeland Security Program (SHSP) grant in November 2022 to fund community outreach and preparedness activities related to disaster and emergency preparedness. After evaluating different options with the project management team, it was decided to procure and purchase emergency kits to disseminate to local emergency managers for distribution. Each locality received 50 kits, with each kit containing 71 items and multiple informational packets. Each County determined the method of how they would like to distribute these kits. The CRC coordinated with each County's Emergency Planner to pick-up the kits, and date(s)/ location(s) of kit distribution. The kits are still in the process of being distributed.
